Do you think I should get a new hybrid car to save money on gas? A lot of my friends have done this, and



with the rise in gas and oil prices lately, they're telling me I should, too. According to them, I'll save a ton of especially топеу, since I have a bigger car and a

longer drive to work. What are your thoughts? Ďaneen

Dear Daneen,

I get lots of questions pout these kinds of about these scenarios, and how it plays into people's budgets. Many folks wonder if it would be better to go out and get a new vehicle with better gas mileage. Well, do you really want to lose more money?

Let's say you currently drive a vehicle worth \$10,000 that gets 15 miles per gallon. There's a \$25,000 hybrid you're thinking

a gallon. If you drive 100 miles a week, that's about a \$10 difference a week. That would be about \$40 extra you're spending a month rationalization for buying in gas if you stuck with the current car. A monthly car payment is a whole lot more than that! In short, the math doesn't work. You'd have to drive to the moon and back to make it worthwhile.

There are a lot smarter things you can do to cut down on your fuel bill. Have you thought about trading for something smaller? If you're driving a gas guzzler, trade it in on another car worth no more than your current car's selling price. This means better fuel efficiency without a car payment. Carpooling is an option, too, even if you split the driving just a few days a week.

If you want to get a little more radical with the money-saving ideas, you could think about moving closer to work. Spend some time doing the calculations and looking at the specifics to see if it makes sense in your case. Finally, and this may be a last ditch effort, you could consider changing jobs. No one's forcing you to work where you do, especially if you're spending a lot of time and money on the road just getting to and from your job. If you're really spending a



### A Rescission Needed ASAP

On Saturday, February 27 the Republican State Committee gathered in Montgomery for the 2021 Alabama GOP Winter Meeting. One resolution passed at the meeting asks the Alabama State Legislature to rescind all its applications to the U.S. Congress to call a convention for proposing amendments to the U.S. Constitution pursuant to Article V. This Article states that Congress shall call a convention on the application of the strategy, overview of legislatures of two thirds of the several States. However, it provides no other details about **See LETTERS... on Pg. 34** 

the state applications, nor does it provide any details about Congress' responsibilities in calling the convention.

As governmental bodies tend to do, both the U.S. Congress and the several Congress and the several State Legislatures have assumed that any powers not specifically forbidden in the Constitution are theirs to be exercised. Consequently, they both have shown they intend to take full advantage of the framers' failure to give more detail in that give more detail in that provision. But because the order of events necessarily requires that Congress call the convention after the required 34 states make their applications, Congress will have the opportunity to influence the outcome when it calls the convention.

At a time when Congress is drunk with power and the Supreme Court refuses to make critically needed judgements, it would be suicidal to demand that Congress call an Article V convention. Alabamians support the rescission of all state applications for an Article V convention by contacting their state legislators and asking them to act on rescission as soon as possible.



# **Ideas on How to Prevent Pipes From Freezing**

Frozen Pipes Could Be a Big Problem, One That May Be Prevented

What's worse than a major home maintenance disaster? Try several major home maintenance disasters at once. When a house's water pipes freeze, the situation is not as simple as calling a plumber. A 1/8-inch crack in a pipe can spew up to 250 gallons of water a day, causing flooding, serious structural damage, and the immediate potential for mold.

Frozen water pipes are a problem in both cold and warmer climates, affecting a quarter-million families each winter, and it can happen in homes with both plastic and copper pipes. It's all too common, especially considering this damage is largely preventable.

Here are a few steps you can take to keep your pipes from turning frigid nights into inconvenient, and expensive ordeals.

Tips to help prevent pipes from freezing

The three central causes of frozen pipes are quick drops in temperature, poor insulation, and thermostats set too low. You can prepare your home during the warmer months.

- Insulate pipes in your home's crawl spaces and attic, even if you live in a climate where freezing is uncommon. Exposed pipes are most susceptible to freezing.
- Heat tape or thermostatically controlled heat cables can be used to wrap pipes. Closely follow all manufacturers' installation and operation instructions.
- Seal leaks that allow cold air inside near where pipes are located. Look for air leaks around electrical wiring, dryer vents, and pipes, and
- use caulk or insulation to keep the cold out.

   Before winter hits, disconnect garden hoses and, if possible, use an indoor valve to shut off and drain water from pipes leading to outside
- A trickle of hot and cold water might be all it takes to keep your pipes from freezing. Let warm water drip overnight, preferably from a faucet on an outside wall.
- Keep your thermostat set at the same temperature during both day and night. Drops in the temperature - more common overnight could catch you off guard and freeze your pipes.

  Open cabinet doors to allow heat to get to un-insulated pipes under
- sinks and appliances near exterior walls.

#### Ways to help avoid frozen pipes while on vacation

Travelling in the winter months might be a break in your routine, but don't forget to think about your pipes before you leave.

- Set the thermostat in your house no lower than 55°F (12°C). Also be sure to replace the battery in your thermostat.
- Ask a friend or neighbor to check your house daily to make sure it's warm enough to prevent freezing.
- Shut off and drain the water system. Be aware that if you have a fire protection sprinkler system in your house, it may be deactivated when you shut off the water.

Your pipes freeze, what might you do?
What if your pipes still freeze, despite your best preventive measures? First step: Don't panic. Just because they're frozen doesn't mean they've already burst. Here's what you can do:

- If you turn on your faucets and nothing comes out, leave the faucets turned on and call a plumber.
- Do not use electrical appliances in areas of standing water. You could be electrocuted.
- Never try to thaw a pipe with a torch or other open flame because it could cause a fire hazard.
- You may be able to thaw a frozen pipe using a hair dryer. Start by warming the pipe as close to the faucet as possible, working toward the coldest section of pipe.
- If your water pipes have already burst, turn off the water at the main shutoff valve in the house; leave the water faucets turned on. Make sure everyone in your family knows where the water shutoff valve is and how to open and close it.

Protecting your pipes is one step in winterizing your home. Discover ways to reduce your energy use during cold winter months.



# **Medicare Minute** "Medicare Part A & B Review"

The past couple of weeks we have discussed Medicare Parts A & B in detail. These are the two parts of Medicare that are received through the federal government. This week let's review what we have discussed.

Although Medicare Part A and Part B are great programs that cover a lot of services there are some things Medicare does not cover. They include most dental care, eye exams related to prescribing glasses, dentures, acupuncture and hearing aids.

Medicare Part A is primarily used to cover your inpatient care. Part A has a \$1,484 deductible for each benefit period, meaning the deductible can be applied more than once in a calendar year. This deductible covers hospital services, including semi-private rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and supplies. Part A is "free" to most Medicare beneficiaries. "Free" meaning you may not have to pay Medicare to have Part A. It does not excuse the deductibles and co-insurance.

In most cases Part B is used to cover your outpatient services. These include visits to your primary care physician and/or specialist. It also may cover transportation by ambulance, durable medical equipment, preventive services and mental health treatment. Part B also entitles you to an annual "Wellness" visit to a qualified provider. Most Medicare beneficiaries joining Medicare Part B for the first time in 2021 pay a monthly premium to Medicare of \$148.50. Part B has an annual deductible of \$203 and a coinsurance the beneficiary pays of 20%, after the deductible is met.

To cover the deductibles and coinsurance that Part A and Part B have you would need to look at some type of supplemental policy sold through private insurance companies. These include Medicare supplement plans or Medicare Advantage Plans. If you want to study Part A or Part B in more detail you can look at previous Medicare Minute articles or give our office a call and we'll be glad to discuss this with you.

# TRINITY EPISCOPAL CHURCH

Episcopal services in Florence began in 1824. Rev. Thomas Armstrong Cook organized Trinity Episcopal Church in 1836. The original building on the northwest corner of College and Cedar Streets, was consecrated Feb. 23, 1845, by Bishop Nicholas Hamner Cobbs. It burned in 1893, and this building was constructed in 1894, using the tower bell from the old church. Services have been held here since Easter Day, 1895. Building consecrated by Bishop Richard Hooker Wilmer June 12, 1898. Parish Hall added in 1929. Education Building and Mullen Hall erected 1967.

**Location:** 410 N. Pine St. Florence, AL 34.8025°N, 87.6789°W

This church began as the Episcopal Church in Florence just a few years after the founding of the town, however it was consecrated as Trinity Episcopal in 1845. This Gothic building on the corner of Pine and Tuscaloosa Streets features a carved wood alter and beautiful stainedglass windows.

# **Qualifying Seniors** Can Save at Area **Farmers Markets**

Senior Farmers Market Program Nutrition (SFMNP) is a federally funded program by the administered Department Alabama Agriculture and Farmers Industries' Market Authority Section. The SFMNP provides eligible seniors with \$30 in vouchers to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables from certified farmers at farmers markets and farm stands in the state of Alabama. This program has limited funding and food benefits are available on a first come, first serve basis until available funds are committed. Seniors are encouraged to complete an application as soon as

Eligibility:
• Age — Must be 60 years of age or older on the day of application, **AND** 

 Income — Applicants' gross household income must not exceed these

limits: \$1,756 monthly for a household of 1 \$2,371 monthly for a

household of 2

\$2,987.00 monthly for a household of 3

\$3,604.00 monthly for a household of 4

Applicants must online apply http://fma.alabama. Unfortunately, gov. applications cannot be taken over the phone or by mail. If seniors need assistance or do not have access to a computer, they are encouraged to ask a relative, friend, church member, etc. to complete the application for them with information provided by the senior. If approved, vouchers will be mailed to the address provided on the application. The vouchers are usually mailed out in late May or early June. Applicants must reapply every year.

If the purchase is less than the amount of one or more vouchers, the farmer will add more fruits and vegetables of the consumer's choice to make up the difference.

Evaluating your plan is necessary whenever major changes to your business or industry occur, including changes, leadership significant revenue decreases, or adopting new technologies.

Dear Viagra, It's true. If you're age 62 or older and are still raising young children, there's a Social Security benefit strategy that can put some extra money in your family coffers.

Here's how it works. When you file for Social Security retirement benefits, your minor children can get money on your work record equaling half of what you would receive at full retirement age, now gradually rising from 66 to 67. Even if you were to take a smaller benefit by claiming earlier, your kids will still get half of your full-

retirement age amount.

To qualify, your daughter – whether she's biological, adopted or a stepdaughter - must be unmarried and under age 18. Kids that are over 18 but still in high school, can collect too until they graduate or turn 19, whichever comes first. (Other rules apply to kids that are disabled.)

But that's not all.

Because one of your children is only 14, your wife (if you're married) can collect Social Security benefits on your work record too, and it doesn't matter if she's just 40 years old. The minimum age requirements to collect retirement benefits (62) or survivor benefits (60) does not apply when it comes to collecting benefits as the caregiver of a young child. The spouse's benefit, which is also worth up to half of your benefit, will stop when your daughter turns 16.

But note that there are limits to the amount of money that can be paid to a family. The Social Security "family maximum payment" is determined by a complex formula and can range from 150 to 180 percent of your full retirement benefit amount. If the total exceeds that, each person's benefit, except yours, is cut proportionately until it equals the maximum.

Here's an example of how that's figured. Let's say, for example, that your full retirement age benefit is \$2,400 per month. That would make your family maximum benefit (according to the Social Security formula at SSA.gov/oact/cola/familymax.html) roughly \$4,200 per month.

Subtract your \$2,400 benefit from the \$4,200 family maximum benefit, which leaves \$1,800. That's the monthly amount that can be split between your two children – \$900 each. If your wife wants in on it too, the individual checks are smaller, at \$600 a piece, but the family amount is the same.

You should also know that minor children can collect up to half of a disabled parent's Social Security disability benefit. And if the parent dies, they will get a survivor's benefit, which is up to 75 percent of the deceased

parent's basic Social Security benefit.

One Caveat

Social Security benefits for your kids may not be available before full retirement age if you are still working. In 2021, you will lose \$1 in benefits for every \$2 earned over \$18,960, except in the year you reach full retirement age. In that case, the earnings limit is \$50,520, with \$1 in benefits withheld for every \$3 earned over the limit.

If you lose your benefits, your dependents also lose theirs. You can recoup those payments later, but your kids can't.

Alabama was defrauded of a win the closing minutes with several phantom foul calls by the officials that went against them. That Indiana team was coached by Bobby Knight and it was the last NCAA team to finish as an undefeated National Champion in Division I.

• Alabama-Birmingham made a strong NCAA run under Gene Bartow in 1982, defeating a highlyfavored Virginia team led by Ralph Sampson in a close Sweet 16 match-up. That game was at the BJCC in Birmingham, and I was among the privileged to be in the building with as much energy at a live sporting event as I have ever experienced. UAB couldn't duplicate the same energy two days later in a loss to Louisville. The team and the crowd were both flat with a trip to the Final Four in the balance.

• Sonny Smith's Auburn teams made it into the Sweet 16 in '85 and in '86. That '86 team went a step further when, as a #8 regional seed, it notched wins over the #9, #1, and #4 seeds. The Tigers then gave second seeded Louisville a stiff test before falling in the regional final. The Cardinals went on to beat LSU and Duke in the Final Four to win the comeback by Auburn National Championship that season.

• Alabama's 2004 team made a run to the regional final before absorbing a convincing loss at the hands of eventual national champion, Connecticut. That season marked the 4th of 5 straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament by a Mark Gottfriedcoached Alabama team.

• Auburn coach Bruce Pearl had his 2019 team peaking at the right time as it won the SEC Tournament and four straight NCAA tournament games to reach the Final Four. The streak was cut short in a memorable national semieventual final game by champion, furious late-game

netted them a 5-point lead with under 10 seconds left. However, a missed call and a closely-contested Virginia shot with under second left gave the Cavaliers three free throw attempts. All were made and resulted in a 1-point UVA win.

As it stands now, the University of North Alabama in 1979 and 1991 and Jacksonville St. in 1985 are still the only teams from Alabama that can claim a national championship in college basketball. Those were in Div. II.

It will be nice if Alabama under Nate Oats or Auburn under Bruce Pearl Virginia. can bring one back home soon at the Div. I level.





I was injured on the job and called law firm I saw on TV about my on the job injury. They have not filed my case. Nothing is being done. What can I do? Eugene, Florence, AL

The first thing you can do is make sure that your workers compensation case is filed. It will have to be filed before you see a dime of settlement money. All workers compensation settlements in Alabama have to be approved through the court system.

Our standard practice is to file every workers compensation case we accept. That serves more than one purpose. First, most people who try to handle these cases

on their own experience a series of adjusters. Every single change of adjuster creates a delay and often creates a different way of handling the case.

Second, without a judge overlooking the case, medical issues which often arise have no means of resolution. If a judge is already assigned to the case it is much faster to have common issues resolved.

Third, workers compensation lawyers tend to be a lot more reasonable than adjusters as they answer to the court both as officers of the court and in maintaining their credibility with the court.

Fourth, as I've already stated, it's going to have to be filed anyway.

I don't think I would hire a lawyer who wouldn't agree to file the workers compensation case. I suppose that if you were receiving your weekly benefits and your employer was treating you the way they should, you might not even need a lawyer. There are certain types of workers compensation cases where people are made fair offers. In those cases, people will bring the letters by our office and we will tell them at no charge whether we can add value to their case or not. If we can make them money, we will tell them. If we can't, we will tell them that as well.


