

# SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week six of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we continue with the section regarding the Senate as we study Article I – Section 3 – Clause 7 which reads "Judgment in Cases of Impeachment shall not extend further than to removal from Office, and disqualification to hold and enjoy any Office of honor, Trust or Profit under the United States: but the Party convicted shall nevertheless be liable and subject to Indictment, Trial, Judgment and Punishment, according to Law."

An official convicted by the Senate in an impeachment case will be removed from that office and will be disqualified from holding federal office in the future. That person can also be indicted for that crime and can be subject to a trial and subsequent judgment and punishment as the law allows.

Article I – Section 4 – Clause 1 reads "The Times, Places and Manner of holding Elections for Senators and Representatives, shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof; but the Congress may at any time by Law make or alter such Regulations, except as to the Places of chusing Senators." Our Constitution differentiated between the authority of the state and the federal government.

It was agreed that any authority not specially outlined in our Constitution be the responsibility and authority of the individual states. However, if the Congress at any time decides that jurisdiction previously held by the individual states should be the responsibility and authority of the federal government, Congress may propose a law to that effect.

However, this happens rarely as the founding fathers were very concerned that the federal government not infringe on the rights of the states and therefore proceed to an autocratic government which they had just ridded themselves of in the case of England. The places of electing Senators was specifically omitted from this possibility. Article I – Section 4 – Clause 2 reads "The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and such Meeting shall be on the first Monday in December, unless they shall by Law appoint a different Day."

Most of the members of the Congress lived at home in their individual states in 1787. Traveling to New York City, which was the capital of the United States of America at that time, was an arduous and expensive undertaking. Therefore, legislation which did not require their immediate attention was left to the first Monday in December unless convening of the Congress was deemed necessary in the event of an emergency. In later years, with easier and less arduous modes of transportation, trips to New York City, later Philadelphia and finally Washington, D. C., convening Congress became more frequent in nature until the building of housing in Washington, D. C., enabled members of Congress to remain in the Capitol for longer periods of time.

Article I – Section 5 – Clause 1 reads "Each House shall be the Judge of the Elections, Returns and Qualifications of its own Members, and a Majority of each shall constitute a Quorum to do Business; but a smaller Number may adjourn from day to day, and may be authorized to compel the Attendance of absent Members, in such Manner, and under such Penalties as each House may provide." We saw how the Congress was the judge of the 2020 Presidential Electoral College votes. A majority of the Congress must be in attendance for Congress to legislate laws. Members can meet to deliberate potential legislation. When necessary, absent members may be compelled to attend. Lord willing, I will see you next week.







# IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

# The Town of Mount Morris Public Water Supply Has Levels of Haloacetic Acids (HAA) Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation. We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Sample results taken on **February 9, 2021** show that our system exceeded the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for Haloacetic Acids (HAAs). The standard for HAA's is 60 micrograms per liter. The average level of HAA's over the last year was 63.50 micrograms per liter. It is important to note that the sampling location for HAAs represents the location where the highest levels are thought to occur, and may not be representative of the entire system.

#### What are haloacetic acids (HAAs)?

HAAs are formed in drinking water during treatment by chlorine (the most commonly used disinfectant in New York State), which reacts with certain acids that are in naturally-occurring organic material (e.g., decomposing vegetation such as tree leaves, algae or other aquatic plants) in surface water sources such as rivers and lakes. The amount of HAAs in drinking water can change from day to day, depending on the temperature, the amount of organic material in the water, the amount of chlorine added, and a variety of other factors. Drinking water is disinfected by public water suppliers to kill bacteria and viruses that could cause serious illnesses. For this reason, disinfection of drinking water by chlorination is beneficial to public health.

Some studies suggest that people who drank chlorinated drinking water containing disinfection by-products (possibly including HAAS) for long periods of time (e.g., 20 to 30 years) have an increased risk for certain health effects. These include an increased risk for cancer. However, how long and how frequently people actually drank the water as well as how much HAAs the water contained is not known for certain. Therefore, the evidence from these studies is not strong enough to conclude that the observed increased risk for cancer is due to HAAS, other disinfection by-products, or some other factor. Studies of laboratory animals show that the individual HAAS, dichloroacetic acid and trichloroacetic acid, can cause cancer following exposure to high levels over their lifetimes. Dichloroacetic acid and trichloroacetic acid are also known to cause other effects in laboratory animals after high levels of exposure, primarily on the liver, kidney, and nervous system and on their ability to bear healthy offspring. The effects reported in studies of laboratory animals occur at exposures much higher than exposures that could result through normal use of the water. The risks for adverse health effects from HAAs in drinking water are small compared to the risk for illness from drinking inadequately disinfected water.

## What does this mean for you?

At present, the water is suitable to drink, cook with, and bath in. Some people may wish to take additional practical measures to reduce their exposure. We do not consider these measures necessary to avoid health effects, but they are provided as options. These include using bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes, or using water pitchers containing an activated carbon filter or a tap-mounted activated carbon filter. These filters are readily available in many grocery and home improvement stores. Ventilating bathroom areas (e.g., using exhaust fans or opening windows) when showering or bathing can also help reduce exposures from chemicals released into the air.

#### What happened? What is being done?

The Town of Mount Morris is working diligently with the Village of Mount Morris to improve the quality of water delivered to consumers, including a flushing program to help maintain fresh water in the system.
