Miner's Inc., owners of Super One Foods submitted to the City of Crosby Planning

Commission a conditional use permit and variance for the new multi-million dollar Super One Foods grocery store that is to be built east of Crosby at the former Hallett

mansion property.

The Planning Commission unanimously approved the conditional use permit at their March 15 meeting to construct a 54,100 square foot commercial building. The commercial building will consist of a grocery store (primary use), liquor store, clinic, and pharmacy in the B-2 Highway Commercial district. The CUP was approved with staff findings and 11 conditions.

The Planning Commission

also unanimously approved the variance request to exceed the allowable height in the B-2 zoning district. The Planning Commission approved the request to exceed the height limit by 7 feet 10 inches for the store entrance, a 52-foot wide segment of the façade. The variance was approved with staff findings.

The CUP and variance for the Super One Foods grocery will be brought to the City of Crosby Council on Monday for discussion and approval.

Area chambers ask Gov. for plan | Stop pretent

Dear Governor Walz,

On behalf of 1,500+ members in the Brainerd Lakes Area, we want to convey our appreciation for your recent announcement to loosen COVID-related business restrictions. While we are relieved about the progress, it is simply not enough.

Throughout this crisis, Minnesota's small businesses and chambers of commerce have consistently called for one simple courtesy—a plan.

Governor Walz, where is your plan?

It has been exactly one year since you enacted Minnesota's first business closures, followed by off-and-on restrictions that have been dizzying and expensive. Each decision was expressly designed to "flatten the curve," prevent a surge of hospitalizations, build testing capacity, and buy time for vaccinations. More than 100 executive orders later, our small businesses have made the tremendous sacrifices you have asked of them.

They have absorbed untold debt with an uncertain future. Some watched on the sidelines while other industries thrived. or their customers took their business to other states. They have shouldered almost the entire responsibility for ensuring and enforcing public safety under the constant threat of government fines and license revocations. They have endured the gut-wrenching experience of laying off employees, some multiple times, even right

before Christmas.

Some were forced out of business completely, and some are now teetering on the brink.

With our summer tourism season quickly approaching, we are gravely concerned. Seasonal businesses in our area can earn 75 percent or more of their annual income in just three short months. In 2020, we reaped the unexpected benefits of an extended fall season largely due to remote workers spending a few extra vacation days as their children participated in distance learning. That made up for some of the early summer losses, but that won't happen this year.

We cannot stress enough the critical importance of full reopening as soon as possible, especially before we welcome most of our visitors again. Events are also vital. They drive commerce and build community. Our economic success is tied to the ability to confidently plan and host these events, many of which are outdoors.

Small businesses have absolutely earned the right to demand clarity, and they need time to prepare. This includes hiring employees, securing inventory, preparing facilities, and planning their own events. It is not fair to keep them in limbo any longer.

While we realize that we cannot and should not declare victory over COVID-19 at this time, it is reasonable to expect a definitive reopening plan and timeline tied to scientific met-

rics such as positive cases, hospitalizations and vaccinations.

We need a plan. Please accelerate your efforts to pres-

Rep. Dale Lueck legislative update

Saturday, March 13, marks a full year since Gov. Walz imposed a peacetime state of emergency. Over the past 12 months he has issued nearly 120 executive orders. Those orders have dictated what individuals, schools, medical facilities and businesses may or may not do.

Today, as we look across the United States, Minnesota ranks in the top 10 of most restrictive states, along with New York and California. In contrast, 3 of the 4 bordering states, South Dakota, North Dakota & Iowa are in the top 10 of least restrictive states. Wisconsin is in the middle of the pack.

On a macro level, Minnesota's rate of COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, emergency room admissions and deaths are pretty much a mirror image of that found in our neighboring states here in Midwest. That suggests that regardless of whether an extreme shut-down or a more flexible approach was dictated, we are generally in about the same place with respect to those COVID-19 related metrics today.

We continue to make excellent progress on vaccinations and are only being limited by the amount of vaccine produced each week. We are seeing a steady reduction in hospitalizations, emergency room usage, and the case positivity rates are trending down. In recognition of that, effective March 15, the governor elected to loosen up some of the extreme restrictions that have been in place for a year.

That is welcome news. We have three highly effective vaccines and a steady increase in the availability of those vaccines. The Minnesota Department of Health indicates the timeline for expanding eligibility has been accelerated to include more people with specific underlying health conditions, in some cases as young as 16 years of age as a priority for vaccination.

We can be thankful for the amazing progress in developing effective COVID-19 vaccines in less than a year. We have witnessed major strides in the ability to detect and treat this disease. A well-focused medical research and development effort by an excellent government-private sector

partnership that was forged early back in 2020 has paid big dividends. That effort has been critical to producing the medical successes we enjoy today.

While it is strictly your individual decision, as you become eligible to be vaccinated please consider that option as a means to protect yourself and the overall health of our local communities.




