SPEAK OUT!!!

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week seven of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we study Article I – Section 5 – Clause 2 which reads "Each House may determine the Rules of its Proceedings, punish its Members for disorderly Behaviour, and, with the Concurrence of two thirds, expel a Member."

We have seen in the past few weeks where members of Congress have been removed from certain committee assignments for behavior and statements which were deemed inappropriate. The last member excluded was in 1967, the last member expelled was in 2002, the last member censured was in 2010 and the last member reprimanded was in 2020.

Leaders compile rules of proceedings. One rule which was implemented at the beginning of the current 117th Congress in the House of Representatives was "gender neutrality". The Speaker of the House introduced a provision in which both male and female references be made in any statement in which another gender was mentioned. When the opening prayer of the 117th House of Representatives was given by an ordained minister and congressman, he said "May the Lord lift up the light of his countenance upon us and give us peace. Peace in our families. Peace across this land and, dare I ask...oh, Lord... peace even in this chamber now and ever more. We ask it in the name of the monotheistic God, Brahma, and gods known by many names by many different faiths. Amen and a-woman."

Since then, during the recent impeachment trial in the Senate, a congressman mentioned that he was told by the Speaker of the House to refer to any topics in a gender neutral context. So much for our Congress in its trail down the road to a non-Christian body!

Article I – Section 5 – Clause 3 reads "Each House shall keep a Journal of its Proceedings, and from time to time publish the same, excepting such Parts as may in their Judgment require Secrecy; and the Yeas and Nays of the Members of either House on any question shall, at the Desire of one fifth of those Present, be entered on the Journal."

The journal originally mentioned in the Constitution has been kept since the first session of Congress in 1787. The Library of Congress receives some 22,000 items each working day and adds approximately 10,000 items to its collections daily. No wonder it's the largest library in the world, with nearly 128 million items on approximately 530 miles of bookshelves.

Twenty percent of each house of Congress is necessary to release information. Items considered to be classified as top secret are not submitted to the Library of Congress.

All the information in the National Archives is available to everyone on the internet. Our founding fathers did not wish that the deliberations in Congress would be secret.

Article I – Section 5 – Clause 4 reads "Neither House, during the Session of Congress, shall, without the Consent of the other, adjourn for more than three days, nor to any other Place than that in which the two Houses shall be sitting." It was very important to our founding fathers that both houses of Congress worked together

and be in session at the same time in the event a law of great importance needed to be voted upon by both houses and sent to the president for his signature.

An informed populous in our constitutional republic should read and understand the bylaws upon which our country was founded and therefore be aware of our freedoms and of any infringements on our freedoms. Next week, Lord willing, we will continue our study of our U. S. Constitution.

Issues Determination Procedure: Pursuant to 19 NYCRR 900-8.3(b), a pre-adjudicatory issues determination procedure will be conducted by the assigned ALJs. The procedure will be conducted solely on papers and briefing unless the ALJs, in their sole discretion, determine that oral argument is necessary. The purpose of the issues conference is to determine party status for any person or organization that has properly filed a petition (as indicated below), and to narrow and define those issues, if any, that will require adjudication in this matter. Participation in the issues determination procedure is limited to ORES staff, applicant, and those persons or organizations requesting party status. Issues proposed for adjudication must be both substantive and significant in accordance with 19 NYCRR 900-8.3(c).

Filing for Party Status and Proposed Issues: Persons seeking to participate in the issues determination procedure and any subsequent adjudicatory hearing must register on DMM and file and serve a written petition explaining whether their request is for full party status or amicus status. Petitioners may also file and serve written briefs making arguments in support of their petitions.

All petitions requesting party status and briefs in support must be filed and served no later than **4:00 p.m. on May 19, 2021**. **Instructions for registering on DMM and filing and serving documents** may be accessed at <https://ores.ny.gov/permit-applications>. Click on Project DMM Matter Number 21-00025 and the document entitled "Combined Notice of Draft Permit Conditions, Public Comment Period and Public Comment Hearing, and Commencement of Issues Determination Procedure."

Statement of Compliance with Local Laws and Regulations: Any municipality, political subdivision or an agency thereof that received notice of the filing of the application must file a statement indicating whether the proposed facility is designed to be sited, constructed and operated in compliance with applicable local laws and regulations, if any, concerning the environment, or public health and safety. The statement must be filed and served by the same deadline and in the same manner as petitions for party status. Any municipality, political subdivision or an agency thereof that proposes to adjudicate any issues related to a facility's compliance with local laws and regulations must file a petition for party status as provided for in 19 NYCRR 900-8.4(c) and include the statement of compliance with local laws and regulation.

Applicant Statement of Issues: No later than **4:00 p.m. on May 19, 2021**, applicant shall file and serve on ORES staff and the ALJs a statement of issues applicant intends to raise with respect to any determination of the Office, and briefing in support. Applicant shall serve the statement of issues and brief on persons filing petitions for party status within five (5) days of such filing. For the required contents of an applicant's statement of issues, see 19 NYCRR 900-8.4(b)(1).

Responsive Briefing and Response to Comments: No later than **4:00 p.m. on June 3, 2021**, ORES staff may file and serve a response to any petitions for party status, any statement of issues by applicant, and the statement of compliance with local laws and regulations. By the same deadline, applicant may file and serve a response to any petition for party status or statement of compliance with local laws and regulations. In addition, the applicant shall file and serve on ORES staff a response to public comments received during the public comment period, including any supplemental information.
