

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week eight of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we study Article I – Section 6 – Clause 1 which reads "The Senators and Representatives shall receive a Compensation for their Services, to be ascertained by Law, and paid out of the Treasury of the United States. They shall in all Cases, except Treason, Felony and Breach of the Peace, be privileged from Arrest during their Attendance at the Session of their respective Houses, and in going to and returning from the same; and for any Speech or Debate in either House, they shall not be questioned in any other Place"

The starting salary of a United States Senator and a United States Congressman or Congresswoman is \$ 174,000. The President pro tempore of the Senate, Majority Leader of the Senate, Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, Minority Leader of the House of Representatives are all paid \$193,400 per year. Committee assignments add substantially to their salaries.

The salary of the Speaker of the House of Representatives is \$223,500 per year. The Vice President of the United States, who is also the President of the Senate, is paid \$255,800 per year. All members of Congress cannot be arrested for a crime, except Treason, Felony and Breach of the Peace, while they are in session or while they are traveling to or from the Capitol Building. Any speeches in which slander, defamation or perjury are judged to have occurred can only be judged by the Congress and not by any outside court.

Article I – Section 6 – Clause 2 reads "No Senator or Representative shall, during the Time for which he was elected, be appointed to any civil Office under the Authority of the United States, which shall have been created, or the Emoluments whereof shall have been encreased during such time; and no Person holding any Office under the United States, shall be a Member of either House during his Continuance in Office."

This is called the "Ineligibility Clause" (and sometimes also called the Emoluments Clause, or the Incompatibility Clause, or the Sinecure Clause). It makes each incumbent member of Congress ineligible to hold any other office established by the federal government while they are a member of Congress.

Article I – Section 7 – Clause 1 reads "All Bills for raising Revenue shall originate in the House of Representatives; but the Senate may propose or concur with Amendments as on other Bills." The House of Representatives is solely responsible for originating bills to raise revenue such as taxes, tariffs, etc. However, as a check and balance, the Senate, as it can in other bills, make amendments to a revenue bill. This limits the House of Representatives from having the final decision on a bill.

The beginning of Article I – Section 7 – Clause 2 reads "Every Bill which shall have passed the House of Representatives and the Senate, shall, before it become a Law, be presented to the President of the United States; If he approve he shall sign it, but if not he shall return it, with his Objections to that House in which it shall have originated, who shall enter the Objections at large on their Journal, and proceed to reconsider it."

We are all familiar with the word "veto". This is another check and balance which our founding fathers included in our Constitution which prevents the Congress from passing laws without first sending the bill to the President of the United States. Because of the size of this clause, we will continue with it next week, when Lord willing, we will continue our study.



Federal Court Rules Seneca Nation Must Pay Millions Owed to State and Local Governments

The United States Second Circuit Court of Appeals recently ruled that the Seneca Nation of Indians must pay approximately \$435 million in back casino revenue payments that it owes to state and local governments as part of an agreement that gives the Seneca Nation exclusive rights to operate gambling casinos in a multi-county region of Western New York State.

In 2017, the Seneca Nation stopped payments to the state and local governments because of a dispute with New York State over the terms of the agreement. The Senecas believe they are no longer obligated to make these payments.

According to a transcript from February 22, 2021, New York State Budget Director Robert Mujica said, of the \$435 million owed, over \$100 million is owed to local governments.

As part of the multi-county region under the agreement, Livingston County could receive hundreds of thousands of dollars in casino revenue payments currently in arrears.

According to Livingston County Administrator Ian M. Coyle, "We applaud the Second Circuit Court of Appeals for its ruling. This is positive news for Livingston and the other counties owed these back payments. These revenues are rightfully due the counties in the exclusivity zone."




Child Abuse Prevention Month
