

The fair will offer free cervical exams, breast exams, mammograms, and Pap smears with a few restrictions for women age 40-64 who do not have health insurance or a primary health care have provider, and for women 65 and over who do not have Medicare Part A. 



Dear Athletic Support: I'm a huge fan of the local high school teams. Always will be, but I do have one question: Why do we play smaller schools throughout the season? I mean, I like winning as much as everybody else but is it fair to play all these smaller schools? Based on population, we should win in every single sport! I'm not sure why or when this change occurred, but I just noticed it this year. It's weird. We play a bunch of smaller schools throughout the season, and then we play the same teams we used to in the playoffs. What's the point of the regular season? I don't get it. What say you, sir? —Cyclone At Heart

Dear Cyclone: There was a recent restructuring of the classifications in Arkansas. This happens every so often and can have a huge impact on the win/ loss column. There are some schools whose enrolment is right on the bubble. What I mean here is that, depending on the year, they could go from being the smallest school in a classification to being the largest.

Being a big fish in a little pond can definitely help when it comes to winning ball games. If you're wondering who makes these decisions and how they're made, well, let's just say it's complicated.

Each state has an activity board. These are the people in charge of organizing that state's athletic programs. When it comes time for a reclassification, the board considers many different factors, the main two being the

distance school has to travel and the size of the school. The recent

restructuring in Arkansas that you mentioned was a compromise of those two factors, and it mainly had to do with spring sports (basketball, baseball, softball, etc.)

They set up the regular season so teams could play the schools that are geographically closest to them. That way they could save money on gas and also keep the student athletes from having to spend so much time out of the classroom. Then, when it comes time for the playoffs, the schools go back to playing teams who are closest to their own size.

It's been awhile since I've been in a meeting where these sorts of topics are covered, so there's a good chance I might've botched some of the exact details of the latest reclassification. Nevertheless, the basic elements remain:

size of enrolment and geographical location.

Over the years, teams have moved up and down in class (private schools especially), which goes to show there's no easy answer to this question.

It also brings to light just how subjective sports can be. We place so much emphasis on high school coaches and whether or not they are doing a "good" job. When in reality, something as simple as moving up or down a class could completely change the outcome of the season, and many more seasons to come!

My husband and I are close to having our home paid off and being completely debtfree. Can we dip into our emergency fund to pay off the house? Enid

Dear Enid, I'm not

I'm not sure I'd recommend doing this. I might *think* about it if your emergency fund is way too big, plus you have a *very* small amount left to pay on your home. But remember, your emergency fund should be three to six months of *expenses*—not income. On top of that, paying off your home a few months earlier isn't exactly an emergency.



Believe me, I understand the feelings that go along with being so close to becoming completely debt-free. It can be tempting to throw a bunch of money at your house, and get rid of the mortgage payments. Still, even as much as I hate debt, I wouldn't put my emergency fund at risk to make it happen.

When you do things like that, Enid, you're just begging for Murphy to come visit. The moment you write a big check and weaken your emergency fund for something that isn't an emergency, the transmission in your car will go out or you'll have to replace the central unit on your home. It's not worth the risk! —Dave

GETTING STARTED

Dear Dave,

Should I catch up on my past due bills before saving up \$1,000 for Baby Step 1? Sharyn

Dear Sharyn,

That's exactly what you should do. Get current or make payment arrangements with everyone who's willing to work with you first. In the process, make sure you're keeping your own living necessities in mind—food, shelter, clothing, utilities, and transportation.

After you've done that, and saved a beginner emergency fund of \$1,000, start your debt snowball and pay off all your debts from smallest largest, except for your home. That's Baby Step 2. ANHA, AHA Advocate Masks After April 9 Joining Governor Ivy in Promoting Voluntary Common-Sense Precautions

MONTGOMERY–While Alabama's mask mandate is set to expire Friday, April 9, the Alabama Nursing Home Association and the Alabama Hospital Association are joining the Governor and others in calling on Alabamians to continue wearing masks to help the state sustain its progress in fighting COVID-19.

"We have made tremendous progress as a state, and we need to keep moving forward," Alabama Nursing Home Association president and CEO Brandon Farmer said. 'Research has shown that increasing community cases of COVID-19 lead increased cases in to nursing homes. Thanks to the vaccine and infection control practices, we have seen a dramatic decline in cases and have been able to open our doors to more visitors. Continuing to wear masks until the vaccine is widely available will help us lower the community spread."

"The number of COVID-positive hospital patients has also declined significantly," said Alabama Hospital Association President Dr. Don Williamson. "We realize that people are ready to leave their masks at home, but we can't let up and risk another surge of the virus when we've come this far. I hope Alabamians will continue to wear masks, keep a safe distance, and get their vaccine when it's offered. These are the precautions that will keep us safe and help us more quickly return to normal." Both Association

Association leaders added that masks will continue to be an important weapon in decreasing the spread of the virus in health care facilities. According federal regulations, to hospitals and nursing homes will have to continue to require masks for visitors following the expiration of the mandate. "We urge other businesses to follow suit in requiring masks for their employees and patrons," said Farmer. The Associations are also

reminding Alabamians of the limits on visitation. The amended Safer at Home Order updated in early March increased the number of visitors allowed in health care facilities to up to two (previously limited to one). However, all healthcare facilities operate under additional directives the from Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) that mandate certain precautions be taken with both COVIDpositive patients, as well

as those who are neither positive nor showing any symptoms.

Hospitals

Alabama hospitals must follow CMS Phase 2 visitation guidance issued last summer.

For patients who have not tested positive and experiencing not are symptoms-CMS provides direction to evaluate for limited visitation based on the prevalence of COVID-19 in the facility and in the community, staffing levels, personal protective equipment levels and the ability to follow all federally mandated infection control and prevention measures.

For patients who are positive for COVID-19 or suspected of having it - CMS advises against allowing visitors and suggests the virtual option the safest method. is However, compassionate care, end-of-life visits may be possible on a limited basis, and according to evaluation of the same criteria – the health and high-risk factors of the visitor, prevalence of COVID-19 in the facility and the community, staffing levels, availability of the proper personal protective equipment and the ability to follow all federally mandated infection control and prevention measures.

Nursing Homes


Alabama nursing homes must follow visitation guidance issued March 10, 2021, by CMS.

The CMS guidance states that facilities should allow responsible indoor visitation at all times and for all residents, regardless of vaccination status of the resident, or visitor, unless certain scenarios arise that would limit visitation for:

• Unvaccinated residents if; 1) the COVID-19 county positivity rate is greater than 10 percent; and 2) less than 70 percent of residents in the facility are fully vaccinated;

• Residents with confirmed COVID-19 infection, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated until they have met the criteria to discontinue transmissionbased precautions; or

• Residents in quarantine, whether vaccinated or unvaccinated, until they have met criteria for release from quarantine.

Anyone who is on Medicare has the option of signing up for prescription drug coverage. This is also known as Medicare Part D. Some people with limited income and resources may be able to get "Extra Help" with the costs related to their Medicare prescription drug plan. This includes help with monthly premiums, annual deductibles and prescription co-payments.

To qualify for "Extra Help" your annual income must not exceed \$19,320 for an individual or \$26,130 for a married couple living together. Some of the things that count as income are: Social Security benefits, Railroad Retirement benefits, Veterans benefits, pensions or annuities and any wages you are earning from a job or self-employment.

You also must not exceed the resource limit to qualify for "Extra Help". Resources would include: bank accounts (including checking, savings and CDs), stocks, bonds, mutual funds, IRAs or any other investments. Cash and any real estate other than your home also counts. The amount of your resources must not exceed \$14,790 for an individual or \$29,520 for a married couple. The amounts listed for both the income and resource limits are for 2020.

Social Security has estimated that "Extra Help" is worth about \$5,000 per year for those who qualify. We meet with many people each year who qualify for this benefit and don't even know it. To find out if you qualify for "Extra Help" you can call or visit your local Social Security office, apply online at www.socialsecurity.gov or you can call or visit our office and we'll be glad to help. Regardless of the way you choose to apply, you will need your income and resource information available.





Follow these rainy weather safety tips to help you when driving in the rain:



Go Slow The first few hours during

and after a rainstorm are the most dangerous. The grease and oil from cars produces a film on roads during dry conditions and when it rains, this layer becomes extremely slippery. Drive defensively in the rain and reduce your speed to below the speed limit to prevent the chance of hydroplaning.

Stay Alert

When conditions are less than ideal, drivers need to stay alert and focused on what's going on around them.

Brake Cautiously

One primary reason cars collide during rainstorms is because drivers slam on their brakes as if it were dry, but the wet road causes the car to slide forward, often into the rear of another car. Brake gently and early to alert the driver behind you that you are slowing down.

Avoid the Splash

The big splash you get when you drive through a huge puddle can be costly. If water enters the engine compartment of your vehicle, it can damage the internal systems. Drive around large puddles, and avoid running water. Once you have safely passed, tap lightly on your brake pedal to dry off your brake rotors.

Beware of Hydroplaning

If you begin to hydroplane in slick conditions, take your foot off the gas and steer steadily in the direction of the skid. Wait for your car to regain control with the road and either continue with your trip or find a safe place to pull over to recover from the event

Increase Your Visibility

It's the law in all states to turn on headlights when visibility is low, and many states also require having the headlights on when the windshield wipers are in use. Drive in the middle lane as much as possible to increase visibility and also avoid deep water, which tends to run off to the sides of the road.

Check Your Tire Tread

If your tires have less than 1/16" of tread remaining, proceed with extra caution when driving in the rain. Tire performance is significantly reduced with the combination of wet roads and little tire tread, which can lead to hydroplaning, especially at high speeds and around turns.

No Cruise Control

Driving in the rain demands an extra level of concentration and less distraction. If the vehicle starts to hydroplane while cruise control is on, drivers may get confused on whether or not turn it off. Avoid the extra distraction by leaving it to





employed and to cover normal operating expenses during this ongoing COVID-19 crisis.

Two days before the program was set to expire, the PPP Extension Act of 2021 was signed into law This extended the sign up deadline to May 31, 2021. The Act also provides an additional 30-day period for the Small Business Administration to process applications that are still pending.

Businesses can use PPP Loans for payroll costs, mortgage interest, rent, utilities, worker protection costs, uninsured property damage costs by looting or vandalism, and certain supplier costs and expenses for operations.

There are two types of PP Loans: First Draw РРР Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loans are first-time program for have participants; а term of up to 5 years, 1% interest rate; and may be completely forgiven. Second Draw PPP Loans are for certain businesses who have previously received a PPP loan (for those who can demonstrate at least a 25% reduction in gross receipts between comparable quarters in 2019 and 2020).

Initially, one might conclude, so, what is the big deal with an \$8 fee? Well, as of today, the State Health Department reported that they have now administered 1.3 million shots statewide. You do the math-that is \$10.4 million in "service fees"! Nationally, the picture becomes even more revealing. The Center for Disease Control and the Food and Drug Administration report that 111 million doses of the vaccine have been given as of today! At \$8 per shot that means that \$888 million in service fees have been collected! If the vaccine were covered by the government, where did this money go? How can the Birmingham TV stations interpret this as being "free"?

Just remember. There are no free rides in this world! Someone, somewhere ALWAYS has to pay the bill. Billing your insurance carrier DOES NOT make it free!


