Florence Park Shelter House Project

Renovation work on Florence Park, in Milford, has been completed and it's time to celebrate with a come and go open house Wednesday, April 14, from 5:00 to 6:00pm.

"We are truly excited about the great renovation to the city's favorite park. Florence Park is used by hundreds of persons annually so it just seemed natural to make a great space even better," said Susan Reiser, a member of the Renovation Committee.

The renovation work, which totaled near \$120,000, was made possible by generous donations from the Milford Commercial Club, Milford Parks Board, City of Milford, Okoboji Youth in Philanthrophy, Farmers Savings Bank, Northwest Bank, United Community Bank, Waste Management, Black Hills Energy, Campus Women's Club, Wedeking Construction in memory of +Roy Wintz and the Milford American Legion.

After the quasquicentennial in 2017, the Milford Commercial Club discussed possible uses for the proceeds. The idea for an expanded and updated Florence Park Shelter House was born. The club tucked away the proceeds totaling just over \$46,000 to be used, someday, for the shelter house renovation.

The idea sat dormant for two years before community members revisited the idea of expanding the Florence Park Shelter House to a year-round facility late in the fall of 2019. Work started. Covid came and now the project has been completed.

Five people served on the Florence Park Shelter House Renovation Committee including Milford Mayor Steve Anderson, City Clerk LeAnn Reinsbach, Jason Simpson of the Park Board, Chris Hinshaw of the Milford City Council and Susan Reiser representing the Milford Commercial Club. After several meetings, the group came to terms of the project.

The project included a 30 by 35 foot addition onto the south end of the existing Florence Park Shelter House, with a kitchenette, a safety three-divided sink, heating and cooling and restrooms, for convenience, so persons using the facility will not have to walk to the north end of the property to use the restrooms.

Patterson Construction, of Milford, was hired to complete the renovation. Wedeking Construction, of Spirit Lake, handled the grading and installation of water and sewer. Electrical work was completed by Pederson Electric, of Milford. Leichti Plumbing and HVAC, of Milford, completed the plumbing. Matt Loerts, a Milford Park Department employee, served as supervisor for the project.

According to history records, the Florence Park property was conveyed to the City of Milford by John C. and Phebe Guthrie on Jan. 22, 1895 with the expressed condition that the land be used as a park. Later, Guthrie requested the park be named in memory of his daughter, Florence Fuller Guthrie, who died in 1913. The earliest newspaper mention of use of the park was in 1927 when a family had a gathering there.

An open pole structure was built in 1968 and became a shelter house. It was here that thousands of persons ate their picnic lunch through the years. In 2009 the building was enclosed. While the structure has served the community well, community members believed it was time to update the facility.

According to Park Board Member Sherri Jones, the Park Board plans to add a driveway to the south side to aide vendors and a sidewalk to the south for the convenience of the public. In addition, the floors need to be refinished where the renovation joins the original building and that is expected to be completed just before Pioneer Days.

"I am very excited about the addition to the shelter house. It's a great asset to our parks department. Since the renovation, the city has seen an increase in rentals since last fall," said Milford City Administrator LeAnn Reinsbach.



Mass COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic | Lake Park Mobile Food Pantry

As all Iowans ages 16 and older become eligible to be vaccinated against COVID-19 starting next week, a large-scale vaccination clinic is planned in Spencer on Saturday, April 10, at the Spencer High School Fieldhouse. This vaccination clinic is open to anyone regardless of county or state residence to schedule an appointment to be immunized.

Clay County Public Health, Avera Medical Group Spencer, and Spencer Hospital are collaborating with Estherville Pharmacy to offer this large-scale vaccination clinic. The Estherville Pharmacy secured a federal allocation 1,170 doses of Pfizer vaccine, which is approved for ages 16 and older. Pfizer is a two-dose vaccine with the second dose given three weeks after the first dose so a corresponding vaccination clinic for the boost dose is set for Saturday, May 1.

"We're excited for the opportunity to get more people in our region vaccinated against COVID-19 and the timing is great, since any Iowan over age 16 will be eligible to be vaccinated next week,' said Colette Rossiter, Clay County Public Health coordinator.

"As healthcare providers, we often hear how anxious people are for a return to normalcy. Getting immunized to help protect you and others from COVID-19 also helps curtail the spread of the virus, which is necessary for a return to normalcy," said Dr. Amanda Young, family practice physician with Avera Medical Group Spencer. "Also, getting vaccinated helps prevent serious disease and as a physician, I can't stress enough that you do not want to be someone who is facing long-term consequences a COVID-19 illness may have."

For those who do not have the ability to schedule online, the appointment scheduling call center will open at 1 PM on Tuesday, April 6, to provide scheduling assistance. The call center can be reached at (712) 264-6514.

· Identification card (examples: driver's license, government issued ID)

· Insurance card (If do not have insurance, bring social security card and ID. There is no charge to anyone getting vaccinated. The pharmacy is reimbursed by Medicare or insurance for vaccine administration.)

· Completed consent form. A link to the consent form is included in the online registration process and also available on the vaccination information page at www.spencerhospital.org.

Also, please wear a mask when entering the facility and throughout your vaccination experience.

Get a Head Start on Spring Lawn Care

by Adam Thoms, Assistant Professor and Extension Turfgrass Specialist

Adam Thoms, assistant professor in horticulture and turfgrass extension specialist with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, offers the following tips on how to get your lawn off to a good start this spring.

First, remove any twigs or debris from your lawn so that they don't get stuck in the mower or dull the mower's blade. If your grass is matted down and has a fungus on it, it is likely caused by Gray Snow Mold. The large amounts of snow Iowans received over the winter months can cause this issue.

Thoms said the first step to reviving your lawn from the mold is to rake the grass until it stands up. Fertilizer and warm weather usually do the rest. It is too late in the season for a fungicide application.

A spring fertilizer is a great way to green up the yard quickly. Typically, apply three-fourths of a pound per 1,000 square feet of nitrogen using a "slow-release" fertilizer. The slow release will help avoid burning and other injuries to the lawn.

Lingering drought conditions from last year may delay the release of your fertilizer and the lawn may take longer to grow. If you seeded your lawn last fall, it will likely need to be reseeded this spring. The fall drought may have dried out the seedlings.

If you are seeding this spring, avoid applying a crabgrass preventer. Although effective at preventing crabgrass, this product will also keep the regular grass seed from germinating.

Once the lawn starts to green up and the ground is firm, then it is time to take the mower out.







tel. Not only did I get to try a few of the unique drinks they serve, but they also put me behind the bar to make some cocktails! I didn't realize my arms were going to get such a workout shaking drinks this week!

The Beach Club Lounge has an extensive drink menu. There is something for almost every taste, and many drinks can also be prepared non-alcoholic. A special touch at The Beach Club is that many of the drink ingredients are made in-house, like their simple syrups and fruit purées. This helps create unique flavors that you won't find many other places. The first drink I learned to make was the Picante Margarita. I combined fresh squeezed lemon and lime juice with tequila and jalapeño simple syrup. I shook it until ice cold, and served it over ice in a salt rimmed glass garnished with lime and jalapeños! This margarita was more labor-intensive than the pre-mixed version I serve at home, but it also tasted better.

The next drink I attempted to make was a Hook and Ladder. This is a whiskey drink that I poured into a small bottle after combining the ingredients and shaking intensely. Next, I put a tube in the bottle to "smoke" the cocktail with hickory wood chips. There's a real art to getting the tube out and sealing the smoke in. It took me 3 attempts, but I finally got it! Customers can then choose how "smokey" they want their whiskey by releasing the lid and pouring it over ice garnished with a spiral orange peel. I learned that I'm slow, but skilled at making spiral orange peels! I also made The Botanist which used freshly made strawberry purée, and looked (and tasted) incredibly refreshing.

The best part of my adventure this week was actually trying the cocktails! All were unique and delicious. They won't put you to work making drinks, but it's fun to watch The Beach Club Bartenders work their magic as they shake up a special drink for you! This is a fun spot for visitors, but we get to enjoy it all year long! March Madness Musings

Wow, how good was that Gonzaga/UCLA game on Saturday night? For those of you living under a rock or with family in town over the Easter Holiday who wouldn't let you watch the game, Minneapolis native (who had Iowa and Iowa State among his final five choices) Jalen Suggs banked in a 40-foot shot at the buzzer to send the Zags to a thrilling 93-90 victory over the Bruins. This was one of the most entertaining games of the tournament as well as recent Final Fours, with both teams absolutely laying it on the line for 45 minutes and neither team leading by more than seven points. This is not the UCLA of Steve Alford, who were very talented but also very soft; head coach Mick Cronin has brought a toughness and togetherness in this unit that propelled them from a First Four game to the Final Four and almost the championship game. This Bruin team never quits, as they were nearly knocked out in the First Four game by Michigan State, rallying from a 14-point deficit to win in overtime. While I would have loved to have seen #11 seed UCLA make the finals, it is pretty cool that the top two teams all season long are playing for the championship. The Women's NCAA Tournament also saw some amazing moments and big upsets.
