

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week ten of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we continue our study of Article 1 - Section 8 with Clause 2 which reads that Congress has the authority "To borrow Money on the credit of the United States;..."

This clause is so often abused. Our National Debt has skyrocketed in the past year from about 24 trillion dollars and is now just a few billion dollars over 28 trillion. This amounts to over \$ 85,000 for every man, woman and child in the United States. America has the highest national debt of any country in the world.

Our federal spending is over 6.7 trillion dollars per year while our federal deficit is over 3.2 trillion dollars per year which means that we are borrowing almost half of what we are spending. Our total Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is over 21.6 trillion dollars per year which is surpassed by our national debt. The interest on our national debt is over 396 billion dollars per year.

What would eventually happen if each one of us were to spend twice as much per year as we earn? We would eventually go bankrupt just trying to pay the interest. Would you allow someone in your family to be in control of your finances who is as fiscally irresponsible as the House of Representatives? Social Security was originally created as an independent trust fund which means it was intended to be separate from the federal budget.

Later it was changed to a general fund which is a part of the federal budget and has been borrowed upon by the House of Representatives. This gave Congress another slush fund in which to dip. There needs to be a constitutional amendment limiting the House of Representatives from spending more than our revenues.

This would seem to infringe upon the Constitution which states that Congress is allowed "To borrow Money on the credit of the United States;..." I am not proposing that this clause in our Constitution be deleted but that a constitutional amendment provide limitations on borrowing by Congress. "Standard and Poors" lowered the credit rating of the United States of America from AAA to AA on Friday, August 5, 2011.

This was a definite indication that the faith in America's ability to repay its national debt was being called into question. America cannot continue to borrow more than its revenue as so many Americans believe.

A perfect example is the attitude by Americans that our federal government should continue sending Coronavirus stimulus checks to us indefinitely. We need to demand that Congress rain in its spending and we as Americans must stop spending more than we earn and stop expecting our federal government to continue to bail us out of our financial dilemmas.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 3 reads "To regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, and among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes;..." Regulating commerce was one of the primary topics which led to the need for the Constitution. England had been imposing regulations on our commerce without our approval. The Articles of Confederation did not solve this problem as states were competing and disputing with one another regarding interstate commerce.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 4 reads "To establish a uniform Rule of Naturalization, and uniform Laws on the subject of Bankruptcies throughout the United States;..." Naturalization is the responsibility of the Congress and not the President in his executive orders. Bankruptcy courts determine bankruptcies which have skyrocketed. Lord willing we will continue our study next week.





Keshequa's Instructional Plan 2020-21 And Instructional Plan for next year...



Dear Keshequa Family,

The District has every expectation that students in all grade levels will be back in school five days per week next year. We believe we created the best master schedule for our 7-12 grade students we could under the extremely difficult pandemic conditions we faced back in the spring, summer and fall of last year. At the time there was light at the end of the COVID tunnel. We believe that our students are still getting a high quality education and that we have given them the opportunity to achieve success just like every other district in the state has been attempting. This community has been amazingly supportive over the course of a very difficult year for everyone. We appreciate it perhaps more than you can know. The staff of KCS is looking forward to having our students back in person full time in as safe and as healthy a way as possible. The Administration, the Board of Education and the Staff of KCS is even now in the planning stages of bringing all students back in September.

With that in mind, the question has come up as to why have the Kindergarten through sixth grade students returned and 7th - 12th grade students have not.

We will explain the complicated nature of our schedule and why it is not possible to change our 7th -12th grade schedule at this time and what the implications of changing the schedule would have for our students. First, however; we would like to share some history and why we came to create the schedule we did.

History behind the Districts decision:

Back in August, about 90% of our families selected to send their students to our building and 10% decided on full remote learning. The parent survey showed that families wanted students in school, but did not want students to be required to wear masks all day. Taking that input, we found that the largest number of students who could be in a classroom without wearing a mask and maintaining six feet was 13 students. This meant that we could not have all of the students in the building on the same days, but rather we needed to make two groups, Monday/Tuesday or and Thursday/Friday. Each cohort needed to have about 135 students, with each cohort having 3 remote days.

Also in August, we learned that our BOCES students would not be attending BOCES as usual, which normally is five days a week for half days, but instead, would be attending two full days a week, Thursdays and Fridays. We have a little over 50 students who attend BOCES, which meant that these students had to attend Keshequa classes on Monday and Tuesday. In addition, these students would not be able to do remote work on the days they attended full day BOCES.

As we began building the master schedule, we knew we had approximately 50 BOCES students who needed to take their Keshequa classes on Mondays and Tuesdays. Since we knew we needed to have 135 students in each cohort, we needed to bring in another 80 students for Monday and Tuesday. The rest of our 7-12 students would be coming on Thursdays and Fridays. We also wanted to take into account families wanting their children to come on the same days if possible.

Best programmatic practice for students:

Placing which classes to teach on which days was dependent on the classes students requested, along with the restrictions of our BOCES schedule. We have approximately 275 students, who take an average of 6.5 credits or 7 classes. Our students had requested 2,243 courses for this school year and our job was to find the best way to have students be able to take the classes they requested, while keeping the class size limited to 13 students. At the same time, we needed to adjust to the new BOCES schedule and try to keep students in the same family in the same cohort of either Monday/Tuesday or Thursday/Friday.

According to many experts, building a master schedule that allows 80% of its students to be able to get their requests for courses is a very good schedule. However, if we had built our master schedule on this percentage basis it would have meant that approximately 450 courses requested by our students would not be able to be scheduled. Instead, Keshequa was able to build two master schedules, one for Monday and Tuesday and one for Thursday and Friday, which allowed 92% of our students to get the courses they requested.

Another issue for us when building a master schedule is our class sizes. Our 7th grade has 40 students, where as our 8th grade has 58 students. We were able to bring in all of our 7th graders in one group, where as our 8th graders had to be broken into two groups to meet the requirement of no more than 13 students in a classroom without masking.

Now that I have shared the history and the challenges of how we developed our schedule, I have listed some questions and answers that you may have.

Questions and Answers:

1. Why can't we combine the two schedules so that Monday/Tuesday and Thursday/Friday becomes one?

Answer: Our schedules don't mirror each other. We don't have one master schedule where we divided the students in half. We built two separate master schedules. For example, on Monday/Tuesday, a teacher may teach 7th grade Social Studies for first period, but on Thursday/Friday that teacher may teach Global History during first period. If we were to combine, we would need to move one of those classes to a different period. Doing so would have a ripple effect, which would negatively affect many other subject areas and many students.

2. How hard is it to move classes?

Answer: It is very hard to create a new master schedule. It usually takes about a month to build a schedule. Think of a rubrics cube, you can almost get it, but then there is one color blocking. The same is true in scheduling. For example, a junior may be taking Chemistry or Physics or Cell Biology or Environmental Science, or more than one! These same students may be taking Business Math, Geometry, Statistics or three other math courses. We can almost get it to work, but then we have a student who is taking an engineering course, accounting, Spanish or an art class. The goal is to build the best schedule where all students are able to get as many of the classes that they have requested as possible.

3. What would be the impact if we were able to make a new master schedule?

Answer: There would be students who would not be able to finish the classes they are currently taking. For example, we have 19 students taking AP US History. These 19 students are taking 24 different classes. As there are 9 periods a day, even if we scheduled these 24 different classes every other day, that only allows for 18 slots or class periods. This leaves six classes that would not be able to be scheduled.

4. How are other schools able to bring students back?

Answer: Each district is unique. One district started the year five days a week, with all students wearing masks and behind barriers, and those students who were 100% remote had to join the live classes using their computers. Many districts who were hybrid like Keshequa built one master schedule, where teachers taught the same classes on Monday and Tuesday and taught the same class to different students on Thursday and Friday.

5. Why can't we bring back just the 7th and 8th Grade students?

Answer: Some schools have a 7th grade team of teachers or a 7th/8th grade team of teachers. We do not. Due to Keshequa's size, we have one teacher who teaches multiple grade levels. However, not every teacher has the same combination of grade levels. For example, one teacher teaches 8th and 11th, another teaches 8th and 10th while a third teaches 7th and 11th, and a fourth teaches 7th and 9th. The reason for this is certification areas and expertise.

6. What are we doing for students who are struggling with learning?

Answer: We have set up multiple supports for students. Students who have an IEP are scheduled for two additional half days for flex support. Students who are struggling with academics are able to attend part of or a full day on Wednesdays to receive support from teachers and staff. Teachers have set up multiple Google Meets where students can have individual conferences with a teacher to receive one on one instruction.

7. Are there any advantages to the schedule we have for our students?

Answer: There have been advantages. Last year, Keshequa 7th -12th grade students took 1,748 classes. This year, they are taking 1,947 classes. The fact that we have two master schedules allowed more opportunities for students to take more classes. For example, we have BOCES students who, for the first time, were able to take Chemistry and AP US History. Students have shared that they are enjoying the smaller classes and feel that the classroom climate is more conducive to learning. We have double periods of English and Social Studies for our BOCES students so they don't have remote work on BOCES days. Some of our junior and seniors have found employment on the days they are remote, doing their remote work in the evening.




