



SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speakout,"

We continue with week eleven of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we study Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 5 which reads "To coin Money, regulate the Value thereof, and of foreign Coin, and fix the Standard of Weights and Measures;..." Congress may charter banks and endow them with the right to issue circulating notes and it may restrain the circulation of notes not issued under its own authority. It may require the surrender of gold coin and of gold certificates in exchange for other currency not redeemable in gold. Establishing the Standard of Weights and Measures is extremely important as it mandates that all weights and measures be uniform in all the United States.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 6 reads "To provide for the Punishment of counterfeiting the Securities and current Coin of the United States;..." During the Second Constitutional Convention Gouverneur Morris of Pennsylvania suggested that the Constitution provide for punishment of counterfeiting. He believed that bills of exchange might be forged in one State and carried into another.

Today the Secret Service safeguards the payment and financial systems of the United States from a wide range of financial and cyber-based crimes. Financial investigations include United States currency, bank & financial institution fraud, mail and wire fraud, illicit financing operations and major conspiracies.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 7 reads "To establish Post Offices and post Roads;..." On Wednesday, July 26, 1775, the Postal System was established with Benjamin Franklin as its first Postmaster General.

In the late 1700s a post road was a road designated for the transportation of postal mail. Only major towns had a post house and the roads used by post riders or mail coaches to carry mail between them were particularly important ones.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 8 reads "To promote the Progress of Science and useful Arts, by securing for limited Times to Authors and Inventors the exclusive Right to their respective Writings and Discoveries;..." This clause is called the Intellectual Property Clause and also the Patent and Copyright Clause which provides for United States Patents of inventions and copyrighted materials.

After a copyright expires, it enters the public domain. The Copyright Extension Act of 1998 (CTEA) allows for an author's copyright to last for the life of the author plus 70 years, and for a work of corporate authorship to last 120 years after creation or 95 years after publication, whichever end is earlier.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 9 reads "To constitute Tribunals inferior to the supreme Court;..." District federal courts are located throughout the United States. Territorial courts are located in Guam, the United States Virgin Islands and the Northern Marianna Islands. Other federal courts are the United States Military Appeals Court for the Armed Forces, the United States Court of Veterans Appeals, the United States Court of Federal Claims and the United States Tax Court. Cases can be appealed to the United States Supreme Court.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 10 reads "To define and punish Piracies and Felonies committed on the high Seas, and Offences against the Law of Nations;..." Piracy on the high seas still occurs today so this clause is still very relevant. There are three branches of the law of nations: the law merchant, the law of state-state relations and the law maritime

Lord willing, we will continue with our study next week.


Thank You!

I'm healing slowly, but am reminded of our mantra: When you're old, DON'T FALL! I'm old, sometimes clumsy, a little beat up, but so very grateful to God and to all these Good Samaritans. It could have been so much worse.





Letter from the Superintendent

Good Day Community,

I'd like to share, in a series of articles with the Keshequa Community, that Phase One of the Capital Improvement Plan for both the Nunda and Dalton Campuses is substantially complete. In fact, with the completion of the Memorial at the front of the Nunda building this past week, there are only a very few items on the District's punch list that still need to be addressed.

In this first article within the series, I'll briefly highlight some of the main specifics of what Phase One accomplished at the Nunda building and at the Rymer Complex. The main gymnasium and cafeteria received complete makeovers. A new gym floor replaced the 50 year old floor that several generations of students had used. A new sound system, new bleachers, new scoreboards, new lighting, and new wall pads were installed. These new updates, along with a revised color scheme, in my humble opinion, make our facility the best in all of western New York. New scoreboard and sound systems were installed in our auxiliary gymnasium as well. While the gymnasium work was being accomplished the cafeteria had new tile, new paint and refurbished acoustic tiling placed on the walls to help the space not echo. The District also installed chain link drop down barriers to ensure safety of our serving areas during off hours as required by regulation.

The auditorium had major renovations to its sound and lighting systems along with new curtains for the stage. Mr. Holtz, the District's expert on sound and lighting systems, played an integral role in selecting the best equipment we could find so that our musicians and theater students could provide the community with great performances in the best possible environment.

The District also converted several large classroom spaces into two rooms, in effect making three large classrooms into six regular sized classrooms. Each room has new tiling along with appropriate ventilation and the technology all other rooms now have in the building. In addition to new classrooms being constructed, the high school office received a complete makeover while a new intermediate office was constructed.

Of primary importance was the upgrading of the District camera, security and emergency systems. All outside doors and framing were replaced throughout the building and a new inner door locking system was installed at the visitors entrance, which all visitors must pass through if they are to enter the building. Our camera systems are now state of the art and have moved from analog to digital. The District has also moved to a one master key system. This gives us better control over who can enter our buildings, which enhances our safety and security.


The Nunda building has a new playground for use by our fourth through sixth grade students during the school day. Lastly our entire parking lot areas have been redone with full depth reconstruction. This was a vital ingredient in our enhancement program for the site as our parking lots were in major need of improvement.

The Rymer Complex has also received several improvements through Phase One of the Capital Improvement Plan. Five new dugouts have been constructed to replace those that were becoming unsafe to occupy. A new retaining wall replaces the wall which, over the last several years, had begun to lean farther and farther over making it unsafe to sit on. New roadways were installed and new roofs on both the concession stand and the utility shed. Both the varsity baseball and softball fields have new scoreboards and the softball field has a new fence. On the other side of the road, major work was done to the front soccer field with better drainage and new sod being installed while an emergency access way was built so that EMS vehicles could get to the far field.

Lastly, all interior spaces had new LED lighting installed. This not only provides better lighting conditions for our students to work in, but there is also a significant savings in energy costs to the community.

The Board of Education would like to thank the community for your overwhelming support for the capital improvement projects. These projects allow the District to maintain the buildings and grounds, which serve our students. Through capital projects we are also able to enhance safety and security for our students and staff.

In the near future, the District will host both in-person and virtual tours of the improvements that this project has allowed the District to make to its facilities. A format for in-person tours with dates, times, and safety protocols that must be followed will soon be posted to our website, as well as our virtual tour videos. Beyond the Numbers: How a Small Town Can Take Full Advantage of Solar Initiatives

Mount Morris is a place that is relatively unknown by anyone outside of the Western New York and Finger Lakes area. Located in Livingston county, it lies 40 miles south of the City of Rochester and 60 miles east of Buffalo, far from bustling urban communities. It is best known as being the home of the northeastern entrance to the beautiful Letchworth State Park, the "Grand Canyon of the East", and the Mount Morris Dam, the biggest dam east of the Mississippi. The landscape around the town is picturesque: hilly and forested to the east, the rushing Genesee river to the north, and rolling farmland bordering the south and west. It spans an area comparable to the size of the Bronx with a population of around 5,000 residents. During the summer, the village of Mount Morris welcomes tourists looking to explore the state park and Finger Lakes trail. For the remainder of the year, the residents enjoy a relatively quiet, tranquil lifestyle. Main Street has kept a nostalgic aesthetic, and the residents are proud of their historic and patriotic past of being the birthplace of Francis Bellamy, the author of the Pledge of Allegiance. Agriculture and mining from the rock salt mines located to the south are an important part of the local commerce, providing jobs to residents and capital to the town through taxes. Truly, Mount Morris is the quintessential rural community in Upstate New York. And this small town, like many others throughout the state, is taking advantage of their idyllic countryside by incorporating sustainable initiatives.

In 2019, New York State signed the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA), an ambitious goal of using 70% renewable energy by 2030. In order to reach this goal, large-scale development of wind and solar farms are needed across the state, primarily in sparsely populated, rural areas with lots of open land. The solar power developer EDF Renewables chose Mount Morris for the location for Morris Ridge Solar, which, once completed, will produce 177 megawatts of solar production and 83 megawatts of storage. This would provide enough energy to power 38,000 New York homes, the equivalent of nearly all of Livingston County and neighboring Wyoming County combined. Construction of Morris Ridge Solar is expected to provide jobs to up to 200 individuals across 12-18 months starting in 2021, and provide 3 permanent full time jobs once operational. Let's put that into perspective of what that means for the community: according to Data USA, the town's economy employs around 1,250 people. Bringing in another 200 jobs, although temporary adds a significant economic boost, and the project also expects to have a positive impact on material supply and construction services, two of the biggest employment sectors in Livingston and Wyoming counties, as well as the hospitality industry. These jobs also require training and the youth of the area offering lucrative solar career opportunities. The solar enterprise anticipates providing Mount Morris and the local school district with direct payments of \$10 million over the first 20 years. These payments will be meaningful to Mount Morris Central School District, whose entire annual budget is around \$15 million, and will not cost the residents a cent. The solar facility will cover an area of 1,000 acres of private, cleared land. Compare that to the same amount of farmland, that currently provides only about 10% of what Morris Ridge Solar's will contribute to the town and school budget.

But it doesn't stop there - by hosting a large-scale solar project, Mount Morris received charging stations, courtesy of New York State Energy Research and Development Authority (NYSERDA), along it's village's Main Street. There are only three other charging stations currently in Livingston County, so they will give the village a tourism advantage.

Having multiple charging stations right in town is a perk that attracts electric car drivers and sustainability-minded visitors, potential customers that might have otherwise visited one of the many other beautiful Finger Lake communities. Charging an electric car can take around 50 minutes, giving the drivers ample time to check out the eclectic antique shops that have congregated along Main Street.

Clearly, these initiatives are lucrative opportunities for Mount Morris, as are most clean energy projects for small towns and their economies. Mount Morris residents are coming up with more innovative and creative ways to make the most of hosting a large-scale renewable energy project. These ideas include how to ensure the next generation will continue to excel in the 21st century. Construction and installation jobs are ideal contracts for trade laborers, and employ electricians, operators, and construction laborers. Mount Morris is home to a campus of Genesee Valley BOCES, one of the biggest cooperative schools in the state. The school offers classes in electro-mechanical, construction, and metal trades, in addition to conservation. Being so close to Morris Ridge solar energy provides real-life opportunities for students to learn valuable skills that will enhance their resumes and make them competitive job seekers after graduation.

Members of the community are also looking forward to the opportunities that come with having a large plot of cleared land dedicated to solar panels. Developers have found innovative ways to productively utilize the space under the thousands of solar panels, making the space more efficient and enhancing the presentation of what would otherwise be a mundane field of reflective metal. Planting native wildflowers underneath and around the panels can effectively forge a meadow, attracting pollinators and creating a happy cooperation with local beekeepers. Berry bushes can be planted and harvested, providing local produce. Mount Morris residents envision the solar farm as a way for one of the several local breweries to produce a fruity summer beer or a honey flavored lager. The meadows could potentially house pesticide-free, agriculture practices resulting in sustainably and ethically raised livestock that have a smaller carbon-footprint than emission-heavy cattle. Goats and chickens, for instance, would be able to dwell beneath the panels, providing local lamb and goat's milk, chicken meat and eggs to distribute to grocery stores like Wegman's. The town has also began plans to use the money Morris Ridge Solar is saving it in utilities to extend it's public water supply beyond current boundaries and throughout the township. These plans not only contribute the ecosystems, but will create a better and more environmentally harmonious home for the residents of Mount Morris.

The benefits of accepting renewable energy initiatives into small town communities are boundless, especially when locals are engaged, and developers work to establish partnerships that advance the entire community. Mount Morris is just one of New York's small towns that have earned the designation of being a "Clean Energy Community". Sustainability initiatives are no longer only being pushed by the state government and downstate, big city dwellers. Rural communities are developing their own initiatives in their own right, and reap the prosperity of the outcomes. They are protecting the land that they love so much, and are creating stronger, more adaptive communities for it.
