





SPEAK OUT!!!

The Mount Morris Shopper feels that everyone has a right to be heard (or read, in this case) so we are offering this page each week (space permitting) for our readers to share their ideas, views, feelings or whatever. Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week twelve of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we study Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 11 which reads "To declare War, grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal, and make Rules concerning Captures on Land and Water;..."

This is a very, very important clause because it has been abused since the end of the Second World War. Congress is supposed to be approached by the President of the United States when there is sufficient time to request a declaration of war. I believe we will all agree that in the event of an imminent invasion or attack on our country that the President of the United States has the authority to respond.

However, when America entered the Korean War, the Vietnam War, several limited wars throughout the years, the Gulf War and the Iraqi War, presidents entered into wars without conferring with the Congress. The Congress represents the American people and should be contacted before a conflict is entered which is not imminent.

This is part of the reason for the phrase "endless wars" which has been a political topic recently. President Franklin Delano Roosevelt addressed a joint session of Congress on Monday, December 8, 1941, to request that Congress declare war on Japan. This is the last time this has happened in the past eighty years and should be remedied by the Congress demanding that the President of the United States confer with them before declaring war by himself when the situation is not imminent.

A "Letter of Marque" is the grant of authority by one country, to a private party, to cross into the territory of another country to seize a ship deemed by the authorizing country to be an enemy vessel or one that has traded with an enemy. This remains extremely important today as incidents in the South China Sea and the Middle East have made it necessary to work with other countries to enter into their sovereign territories to address issues recently.

The "Rules Concerning Captures on Land and Water" clause is also known as the "Captures Clause" and gives Congress the power to make laws concerning captures on land and water. A variety of courts, scholars, politicians, and others have recently cited the clause to support conflicting arguments about the scope of Congress's power to initiate and prosecute war. Therefore, this clause has been under attack as many other clauses have been in recent years.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 12 reads "To raise and support Armies, but no Appropriation of Money to that Use shall be for a longer Term than two Years;..."

This clause was intended to prevent the "endless wars" which have been a political hot button recently. Therefore, the President of the United States cannot use monies for non-defense purposes for the military and must confer with the Congress to continue funding of any military conflicts in which we are involved. When we hear that Congress is debating a "military appropriations bill", we know that our Constitution is being adhered to and that the bill is being studied for its content.

Article 1 – Section 8 – Clause 13 reads "To provide and maintain a Navy;...". The United States Navy was organized on Friday, October 13, 1775. Clause 14 reads "To make Rules for the Government and Regulation of the land and naval Forces;...". These two clauses are self-explanatory as it is the responsibility of Congress to maintain both our Army and Navy. All too often we take our men and women in the military for granted.

Lord willing we will continue our study next week.





Letter from the Superintendent

Good Day Community,

I'd like to share, in a series of articles with the Keshequa Community, that Phase One of the Capital Improvement Plan for both the Nunda and Dalton Campuses is substantially complete. In fact, with the completion of the Memorial at the front of the Nunda building this past week, there are only a very few items on the District's punch list that still need to be addressed.

In this second article within the series, I'll briefly highlight some of the main specifics of what Phase One accomplished at the Dalton building and at the Bus Garage. The Dalton cafeteria received a comprehensive makeover. A new ceiling was installed along with LED lighting and a cloud system, which helps with the acoustics in the space. The wall facing the parking lot was reconstructed as over the years some cracks had appeared along the cement lines. Another significant interior modification was the complete renovation of the main office space. While the layout is totally different from the previous arrangement, the District believes it created a friendlier, more welcoming environment while adding a great deal of security to the office.

A major undertaking was the removal and replacement of the boilers that were more than fifty years old. The new high energy efficient boilers should heat the building more efficiently and save on costs. Several banks of windows, also of the high energy efficient type, were installed to replace old windows from several capital projects ago.

Of primary importance was the upgrading of the Dalton camera, security, and emergency systems. Many outside doors and the framing were replaced throughout the building and a new inner door locking system was installed at the visitors entrance, which all visitors must pass through if they are to enter the building. Our camera system is now state of the art by moving from analog to digital. The District has also moved to a one master key system. This gives us better control over who can enter our buildings, which enhances our safety and security.

The Dalton building has a new playground for use by our Pre-K - 3rd grade students during the school day. The District also stripped and resurfaced the track so our students would have access to a safe surface while at school. While the track was being resurfaced, our entire parking lot areas were being redone with full depth reconstruction. This was a vital component in our enhancement program for the site as our parking lots were in major need of improvement.

Lastly, all interior spaces had new LED lighting installed. This not only provides better lighting conditions for our students to work in, but there is also a significant savings in energy costs to the community.

As with all the parking lot areas and paving that was done at both buildings and at the Rymer Complex, the Bus Garage paved surfaces received complete full depth reconstruction and new cameras added to the site for better safety and security.

The Board of Education would like to thank the community for your overwhelming support for the capital improvement projects. These projects allow the District to maintain the buildings and grounds, which serve our students. Through capital projects we are also able to enhance safety and security for our students and staff.

In the near future, the District will host both in-person and virtual tours of the improvements that this project has allowed the District to make to its facilities. A format for in-person tours with dates, times, and safety protocols that must be followed will soon be posted to our website, as well as our virtual tour videos. Press Release: Sexual Assault Awareness Month 2021

For the seventh year, RESTORE is placing displays around the region to raise awareness for sexual violence. April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month, which gives RESTORE and rape crisis programs nationwide a spotlight on sexual violence and the resources people can turn to for help.

In each of five counties RESTORE serves there is a display of 1,183 small orange flags. The flags represent the national statistic that an American is sexually assaulted every 73 seconds, or 1,183 every day. The displays also include explanatory signage and RESTORE's 24-hour hotline number.

In addition to flags, RESTORE is hosting a plethora of Zoom-based programs, a gallery of "Letters of Hope" on our website, and a social media campaign for the nationwide #30DaysofSAAM content challenge.

The pandemic has brought many changes to our daily lives, which can include dangerous environments for survivors dealing with isolation or without trusted adults for support. One advantage has been an increase in access to technology. RESTORE is now working alongside TeleSAFE, a service that helps survivors get the acute care they need. Trained expert SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Examiner) professionals, will walk any medical provider or Registered Nurse through forensic exams using telemedicine. This is very exciting news since there can often be a shortage of trained SAFE providers at our local hospitals and partnering with TeleSAFE will help to bridge the gap so survivors won't need to travel to seek care.

RESTORE is partnering with multiple agencies across the region for the flag displays.

- In Wyoming County, the flags will be hosted at the Government Center in Warsaw through collaboration with the Wyoming County District Attorney's Office.
- In Orleans County, signage will be posted at the Pullman Memorial Universalist Church in Albion.
- In Genesee County, the flags will be displayed on the lawn of the County Courthouse in Batavia.
- In Livingston County, RESTORE's display has moved to a new home at the lawn of the County Courthouse in Geneseo.
- In Monroe County, flags are hosted at the Planned Parenthood health center on University Avenue in Rochester.

The flags remain on display throughout the month of April. Additional displays travel across the five-county region, hosted by the colleges with whom RESTORE partners for advocacy, education and support. Anyone can support survivors or take part in Sexual Assault Awareness Month. Sharing posts from RESTORE's social media (@RESTOREsas on Facebook, Instagram and Twitter) helps spread the word on local resources, and talking about consent and healthy boundaries with your loved ones is an important part of prevention.

This is an uncertain time, which can be difficult for many people in many different ways. Please reach out if you are in need of support, and take care in the coming weeks as we take our next steps together.

*The statistic comes from RAINN (the Rape, Abuse and Incest National Network), which uses data and victim surveys from the Department of Justice and advocacy programs to calculate how often, on average, someone is sexually assaulted in the United States. Given an annual total of people identifying as survivors of sexual assault, RAINN averages across months, days, hours, and minutes.

RESTORE leads the community response to sexual violence through advocacy and education, by providing the safety, support and validation that changes the lives of all those affected. During Coronavirus RESTORE continues to maintain the confidential hotlines and responding to hospital calls by phone. Counseling, referrals, and crisis support will continue via communication methods the survivor feels comfortable using, including phone calls, video chats, texting, and emails.


