1 teaspoon crushed garlic
$1 / 4$ cup fresh lime juice
$1 / 2$ teaspoon ground cumin
1 tomato, chopped
4 green onions, chopped
$1 / 2$ cup chopped fresh cilantro

$1 / 8$ teaspoon hot sauce
Sea salt

## Directions

Blend the peas, garlic, lime juice, and cumin in a food processor until smooth.
Transfer the mixture into a bowl and stir in the tomato, green onion, cilantro, and hot sauce. Add salt to taste. Cover and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes, to allow the flavors to blend.


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## GARDEN RISOTO

Ingredients
$1 / 2 \mathrm{lb}$. fresh asparagus, trimmed \&cut into 3/4-inch pieces $4-1 / 2$ cups reduced-sodium chicken broth
1 medium onion, chopped
2 teaspoons olive oil
1-1/2 cups uncooked arborio rice
$1 / 2$ cup dry white wine or additional reduced-sodium chicken broth
$1 / 2$ teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
3 cups fresh baby spinach
1 cup frozen peas
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

## Directions



1. Place asparagus in a steamer basket; place in a small saucepan over 1 in . of water. Bring to a boil; cover and steam for 2-3 minutes or until crisp-tender. Set aside.
2. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, heat broth and keep warm. In a large nonstick skillet coated with cooking spray, saute onion in oil until tender. Add rice; cook and stir for 23 minutes. Reduce heat; stir in the wine, salt and pepper. Cook and stir until all of the liquid is absorbed.
3 . Add heated broth, $1 / 2$ cup at a time, stirring constantly. Allow the liquid to absorb between additions. Cook just until risotto is creamy and rice is almost tender. (Cooking time is about 20 minutes.)
3. Add the spinach, peas, cheese and reserved asparagus; cook and stir until heated through. Serve immediately.


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GREEN PEA CASSEROLE

## Ingredients

1 (15 ounce) can baby peas, drained
1 (2 ounce) bottle diced pimento peppers, drained
1 (5 ounce) can sliced water chestnuts, drained


1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of celery soup
$1 / 2$ cup chopped onion
$1 / 2$ cup shredded Cheddar cheese
2 cups crushed buttery round crackers
$1 / 2$ cup margarine, melted

## Directions

1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees $F$ ( 190 degrees $C$ ).
2. In a medium bowl, mix together the peas, pimentos, water chestnuts, cream of celery soup and onion. Pour into a $11 / 2$ quart casserole dish. Top with shredded cheese. In a separate bowl, mix together the cracker crumbs and margarine; sprinkle evenly over the cheese. 3. Bake for 30 to 40 minutes in the preheated oven, until browned and bubbly.

# Claybank Master Gardeners 



Greeting Gardeners!
Haven't we been so blessed with the beautiful spring weather and opportunities to be outside in the sunshine, cool breezes, and more time to stay at home to work in the yard and garden? (Of course by the time this article is published the weather could be very different, but after all, this is ALABAMA! ) If you are in an apartment, you can use pots and seeds for those veggies and flowers. If you haven't ever tried gardening, and would like to try, start slow. It can be addictive! And good therapy! Every effort is a learning experience, maybe some positive, some negative, but for sure something has been learned.

Here are some of the lessons this gardener has learned:

- Over-watering kills more plants than under-watering!
- Plants in clay pots dry out faster.
- Some plants need a lot of sun, some need part shade, some need mostly shade.
- Soil in the pot or garden needs to be a healthy mix of sand, peat and/or sphagnum moss, clay, and compost (decaying leaves, manure, veggie scraps).
- Blueberries need very acid soil! Get your soil tested, it should be around pH 4.5 to 5.5. Coffee grounds are good for them.
- Herbs add lots of flavor and help eliminate the need for salt!

They are more tasty if not over-watered.

- Windy days dry out plants quickly.
- Fish emulsion is a good organic fertilizer for plants. Sprayed on or poured on the roots. BUT:
- Dogs, cats, raccoon, and foxes will dig up plants with fish emulsion poured on the roots!
- Compost piles are great for fertilizing everything organically. The bugs and earthworms help break down the scraps, and they aerate the soil. Never put meat or greasy cooked food in the compost. Add old decomposed leaves and grass, some shredded paper to keep your compost from smelling bad.
