



SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week thirteen of our study of our United States Constitution. This week we study Article I - Section 8 -Clause 15 which reads "To provide for calling forth the Militia to execute the Laws of the Union, suppress Insurrections and repel Invasions;"

The Second Amendment reads: "A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed." The militia of colonial times is the National Guard of today. We have seen the necessity for the National Guard during the past year to quell insurrection during the riots of 2020 and most recently for the invasion of the United States Capitol on Wednesday, January 6, 2021.

Article 1 - Section 8 - Clause 16 reads "To provide for organizing, arming, and disciplining the Militia, and for governing such Part of them may be employed in the Service of the United States, reserving to the States respectively, the Appointment of the Officers, and the Authority of training the Militia according to the discipline prescribed by Congress;..."

Congress appropriates funds for the military and authorizes the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) to discipline the military. Congress reserves to the governors of each state the authority to call the National Guard into action during local or statewide emergencies, such as storms, fires, earthquakes or civil distubances. In addition, the President of the United States can activate the National Guard for participation in federal missions.

Article I - Section 8 - Clause 17 reads "To exercise exclusive Legislation in all Cases whatsoever, over such District (not exceeding ten Miles square) as may, by Cession of particular States, and the Acceptance of Congress, become the Seat of the Government of the United States, and to exercise like Authority over all Places purchased by the Consent of the Legislature of the State in which the Same shall be, for the erection of Forts, Magazines, Arsenals, dockyards, and other needful Buildings;"

The words "...become the Seat of the Government of the United States..." demonstrated that the Second Constitutional Convention wished to be able to determine the location of the nation's capital. Our nation's capital has been in New York City, Philadelphia and finally Washington, D.C., throughout its history.

Article I - Section 8 - Clause 18 reads "To make all Laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into Execution the foregoing Powers, and all other Powers vested by this Constitution in the Government of the United States, or in any Department or Officer thereof." The Congress was given the power to make any laws which it deemed necessary to fulfill its responsibility to the Constitution.

We now continue with Article I as we begin Section 9 with Clause I which reads "The Migration or Importance of such Persons as any of the States now existing shall think proper to admit, shall not be prohibited by the Congress prior to the Year one thousand eight hundred and eight, but a Tax or duty may be imposed on such Importation, not exceeding ten dollars for each person."

This clause prohibited the federal governemnt from limiting the importation of slaves into America until 1808. The representatives from South Carolina to the Second Continental Congress refused to sign the Constitution if slavery was immediately abolished and asked for twenty years for the south to eliminate slavery which it did not. Next week, Lord willing, we will continue with our study.

Letter from the Superintendent

Good Day Keshequa Community,

In this last article in the series on the Capital Project, I'd like to share with you the areas that we will be addressing in the Phase II of the project. Some may wonder how and why the District is engaging in a Phase II, so first I will relate to you how we are able to proceed with more work above and beyond what was originally scheduled for the Capital Project.

As stated in the two previous articles, we will be hosting tours of the work done in both the Nunda and Dalton buildings. Tours are scheduled for Tuesday, May 11th. The first tours in both buildings will take place at 4:00 p.m. and the second tour will begin at 5:00 p.m. in each location. If you would like to participate in a tour, please contact Ms. Tammy Clark at 468-2900, ext 1105. Groups will be limited to 15 people.

All individuals must wear a mask at all times regardless of whether they have been fully vaccinated or not. Gators are not allowed. Should the District need to schedule more tours because of interest, it will do so and post additional dates and times on the District website. Please also note that the District will be posting to the website a virtual tour of the Capital Project improvements within the next few days if you would like to view the improvements in that format.

When we first went out to bid in the winter of 2019 we were advised by our architects to bid our project when work for contractors was limited. If we timed it correctly we believed we would be able to get more competitive bids for the work to be done. As it turned out we timed our process very well and bids came in under what we even anticipated they might be. This left the District with extra funds.

With the extra funds we determined to work with our architects, construction management firm, and our financial firm to submit a Phase II design to the New York State Education Department (NYSED). Since we had the voters' approval to spend a maximum of \$13,690,000 we felt it was in the best interest of the community to spend the extra funds now on needed improvements.

Now to the areas that we will address in this next part of the project. Our rooftop air handling units are more than twenty years old and have begun to show signs of their age. We have created a staggered replacement plan for all of these units. These units control the flow of air to our students within the school. We will replace seven of them this summer and the other units will be replaced in the next capital projects in the upcoming years.

At our Dalton property we have a drainage problem that has become a safety issue. We have cordoned off the area out behind the track in the wooded area for safety reasons and over the summer we will have a contractor come in from below the ridge, attack and fix the problem.

The third priority area that will be addressed is the Nurse's office in Dalton. We will completely renovate it to include a shower and new bathroom along with reorganizing the area to better serve our students.

Also with the three priority areas mentioned above, we have several alternates should bids come in competitively. These alternates will be accepted if there are funds available after priority work is completed. These alternates are: resurfacing the tennis courts as they are used extensively for physical education classes and during recess, converting all outside lighting to LED lights, and erecting a safety net at the front of the soccer field facing the road at the Rymer Complex so it will eliminate soccer balls going into the parking lot or into the road during practices and games.






