to clean up area trails. The group cleaned trails for two hours and picked up two truck beds full of trash. We highly encourage you to get out and help keep our beautiful trails clean.



Wouldn't it be nice if people would look up the facts? A recent letter writer is blaming Republicans for a lack of COVID-19 vaccinations. As of April 28th, 2021, Iowa ranks 8th in the nation for percentage of vaccinations given. Iowa has received 2,711,175 doses and administered 2,306,511 doses. That is a rate of over 85%. 





Ricky Nelson -- whose twin sons, Matthew and Gunnar, will be performing again this summer at Arnolds Park -- was a May baby, being born on the 8th of May, in 1940. Nelson went from portraying the younger son of his real-life father and mother on The Adventures of Ozzie and Harriet television show, to star of the early rock and roll music scene with hits such as Travelin' Man, Young World, A WonderLike You, and It's Up To You, -- all composed by songwriter Jerry Fuller...

While Jimmy Dean -- the man of sausage fame -- had one of very few songs dedicated to mothers, we remind you that Sunday is the day to at least remember your mother with a phone call -- if not a visit, and maybe a nice brunch or dinner...





Much like traditional golf, part of the fun is hitting the course often and improving a little each time. I certainly have a lot of room to improve, and look forward to playing more often.





For the first time in two years, the Beef Improvement Federation's annual meeting and research symposium will be held in person. Dan Loy, Iowa Beef Center director and Iowa State University extension beef specialist, said ISU faculty and staff are excited to host this year's event, set for June 22-25 at the Iowa Events Center in Des Moines.

"We've been working for nearly two years on the program, speakers, tours and logistics of this great event," he said. 
