PIEDMONT PETS

May 6., 2021 By Paulette Dean

We receive many notices about pets that have wandered away. We also see many more posts on social media about lost pets. Many owners tell us that their animal must have been stolen because their dog or cat has never just wandered away; however, most of the time the animal has become lost for a variety of reasons.

A dog will sometimes just follow a scent his nose has picked up, sometimes they have been scared by other animals, and sometimes they just wander away. Cats who are allowed outside can also become frightened by other animals or loud noises and run away in fear. In addition, cats do get into car engines and are given a very dangerous ride to destinations far away.

There are many reasons why dogs and cats become strays. The best line of defense is to provide a collar and identification information. Even in areas that permit dogs to wander require a current city or county tag. Microchipping a pet is becoming increasingly important because of the increase in people picking up strays and either keeping them or placing them in rescue groups.

If the worst happens and your dog or cat is missing, contact all animal shelters within a 50-mile radius. It may be very helpful to make copies of a recent picture and take them to the shelters. Sometimes, owners describe an animal and the person hearing the description gets a different picture in their mind. Coming to the shelter is wise.

People are beginning to rely just on social media, and this is not a good idea. Walk or drive through your

neighborhood several times each day, and ask mailmen, delivery people, and anyone you see if they have seen your

Most veterinary clinics will allow notices about lost pets to be placed on a bulletin board. advertisements in local newspapers and with radio stations. Include a lot of information about your pet, including age, sex, size, breed, and color. It is sometimes wise to leave out one identifying feature so if someone calls claiming to have found your pet, you would be able to spot calls from people who merely seek a monetary reward.

A reward for finding a returning a lost animal is always a good idea, and should be included on all notices and advertisements.

Life as a stray animal is not pleasant, and owners need to be diligent in doing everything they can to search for their pet and bring them safely home.

Lucky Elephant Head

Although we have gone to hundreds of antiques shows, shops and auctions, we are sometimes baffled by what we see. So, this 6-inch brass elephant head was a mystery. It wasn't an inkwell, although we have seen inkwells that size and shape. It had a tusk that could be pushed down, so it wasn't a paperweight. The antiques dealer knew it was a hotel service bell. The well-shaped brass head had glass eyes and bone tusks. Hold the tusks down, and a bell rang for hotel help.



This attractive elephant head is a mystery and a good luck totem. Its trunk turns up, not down, which is thought to be a lucky sign. And the lucky seller got over \$900

It kept on ringing as long as the tusk was held down. It probably will never again be used that way, but it will make an attractive paperweight or small figurine.

The elephant is a good luck charm, too, because, according the superstition, an elephant figure with the trunk up is lucky; the trunk down is bad luck. But what about the ivory tusks? Can it be sold with the current restrictions on ivory? The seller told us the tusks were made of bone, not ivory. So a lucky buyer paid \$944 at a Morford auction and will probably make friends guess what it was originally used for.

• My mother had this interest-ing glass bowl that I always called a juicer. I recently found out that they are called reamers and seem to be collectible. Can you tell me a little about reamers and how

much the one I inherited from my mother is worth?

A • Reamers, or juice squeezers, • have been known since 1767, although most of those collected today date from the 20th century. It is often a dish with a pointed-top cone in the center that squeezes the juice from the fruit held in the dish. Figural reamers are among the most prized. Reamers were invented out of need when it was discovered that citrus provided a cure for diseases like scurvy. They were first produced in Europe by Bayreuth, Meissen, Royal Rudolstadt and Limoges.

In the United States, a co-op was formed in 1907 called the "California Fruit Growers Exchange." The co-op marketed Sunkist. Sunkist reamers were marketed to the masses during the 1916 "Drink an Orange" campaign. Sunkist reamers were mainly white, but also came in green, pink, blue, yellow, black and white. They sell online for between \$12 to \$85. ***

Danville Lifesaving Crew Swiftwater Rescue Training

DANVILLE – On the brisk morning of Saturday, April 24, Swiftwater Rescue team members of the Danville Life Saving Crew embarked on a day of water training in the Dan River. Although it was a chilly, rainy day on all radars, that did not put a damper on the team's dedication to sharpen their skills in responding to our residents' needs. "When emergencies occur, it is rarely a beautiful,



sunny and 75F day. Anything can happen at any time, and we all have to be prepared to accomplish the task regardless of the elements," said Medic Charlotte Newnam who coordinated the day's training.

As the weather warms and more citizens venture outside looking for a way to cool down and enjoy Danville's beautiful Riverwalk,



it is expected that the potential for water-related emergencies will increase. With this in mind, Swiftwater team members spent their weekend participating in training both at the Danville Area Training Center and in the water.

"The Swiftwater Rescue team is called into action on all water-related emergencies within the city, as well as in surrounding areas in Pittsylvania or Caswell County," said Crew Chief Robbie Woodall. "Emergencies may occur because of stranded boaters, swimmers in distress, missing persons near bodies of water, stranded pets, or other conditions that place people and animals in jeopardy," added Battalion Training Chief Tommy Barber. The DLSC team generally responds to approximately 10 water rescue calls per year.

The comprehensive training included numerous components. According to Deputy Chief Bryan Fox, "team members reviewed boat operations and maneuvers, covering various sections of the river to plan different approaches based on the distinct characteristics of each section." With water temperature averaging approximately 53F, swiftwater technicians spent swim time in the water to acclimate to the different water conditions. Numerous boat types were utilized depending on the need, including motorized boats as well as paddle driven. "The technicians assessed different current flows along the river and incorporated the use of eddies," said Fox. The Crew's utility terrain vehicle was also incorporated as the Riverwalk trail was evaluated for potential hazards".

"The Swiftwater team is only one component of the Special Operations at the Danville Life Saving Crew. Other special operations teams include Dive, Drone, Extrication, and the Rescue Task Force," said Newnam.

The Danville Life Saving Crew is a 501(c)3 organization with a team of over 140 professionals serving the Danville, Virginia, region. Our mission is to be the leader in providing pre-hospital care to the sick and injured. The Crew is always ready to talk with those who are interested in volunteering or employment. SENIOR SCAM ALERT: Avoiding 'Trust Mill' Scams

From time to time, our offices will often receive a flurry of calls pertaining to seminars held in the Martinsville or Danville areas by out-of-state companies, extolling the virtues of incorporating Revocable Living Trusts into your family's Estate Planning.

The truth of the matter is, not everyone needs a trust! Furthermore, a Revocable Living Trust does NOTHING to protect assets in the case of someone going to a nursing home, or in regards to their long-term care expenses later on. In fact, it may even complicate Medicaid Planning/Asset Protection in a crisis situation! It is best to have a full understanding of the short and long-term consequences of that type of trust before proceeding.

How many times have you opened the newspaper and see an ad or a flyer falls out that advertises a "free living trust seminar"? Or perhaps you received a slickly-printed invitation to this type of seminar in the mail. They often offer a free breakfast or lunch and hold these meetings at a local restaurant, or hotel or event center in many cases. These seminars are often organized by non-attorneys, whose primary purpose is to sell a living trust to everyone who attends (regardless of whether a trust is actually needed), and to follow-up with the sale of annuities to the attendees. These are high-pressured events similar to how vacation timeshares are sold with many relentless follow-up telephone calls to each attendee who declines to purchase the trust package after receiving the free breakfast or lunch.

Make no mistake: There is no free lunch. There are lots of hidden costs here: The organizers of these events have spent money to design and purchase print materials for mailings as well as the actual mailing costs, newspaper advertisements, rent the meeting room, and pay for the travel of their representatives as well as these often elaborate meals for each attendee. They need to recoup their investment and make a profit. Thus, they aim to put the fear of God into each attendee by making them believe that they must have a trust at all costs or else their home and life savings are in dire jeopardy!

To avoid the accusation that they are practicing law without a license, they often contract with an attorney (and often these attorneys are from out-of-state to further compound matters) who may not be completely familiar with the Elder Law regulations in place with the state of the seminar being given in) who is to "supervise" the creation of the trust. In reality, that attorney never actually speaks or meets with the clients, but simply develop a checklist that the non-attorneys giving the seminar can follow in order to create a 'boilerplate' trust document.

It bears repeating: Not everyone needs a trust. The two primary purposes to establish a trust are for tax avoidance (where the estate is highly substantial) and to transfer title to property in order to avoid having to "probate" an estate. When these two goals are not involved, a trust may not be necessary. Again, the organizers of these seminars are not concerned with whether or not you truly need a trust. Their goal is to simply make a profit.

Many times, after a trust package has been sold at one of these free seminars, the so-called estate planning representative then makes a visit to the elderly couple in order to review the trust and obtain the required signatures. However, that representative also has an ulterior motive. That person is now armed with all of the elderly couple's financial information (remember - there is no actual attorney-client confidential relationship in this case) and makes a sales pitch to sell them an annuity. The annuity may not be at all appropriate as a financial investment for the elderly couple; however, the annuity salesperson doesn't care because s/he will stand to make a hefty commission on the sale.

This sort of high-pressured sales tactic continues to be used against unsuspecting senior citizens who thought they were simply going to spend an hour or so at a free lunch in order to gather general information about living trusts. They had no idea that they would be pressured into not only purchasing a trust package, but then investing their life savings into an annuity that makes no financial sense to them in their situation. but does line the pocket of an unscrupulous annuity salesman.

Remember that there is no such thing as a "free lunch". If you think that a trust may be beneficial to you and your family, then contact a local, certified elder law attorney, schedule a consultation, and bring along your spouse or other trusted loved one with you. Signs and symptoms of dementia



Dementia is a global issue that affects people's daily lives in myriad ways. According to the World Health Organization, dementia is a syndrome marked by deterioration in memory, thinking and behavior. That deterioration affects dementia patients' ability to perform everyday activities, potentially robbing them of their independence.

The WHO reports that approximately 50 million people across the globe have dementia and there are nearly 10 million new cases diagnosed each year. Though the hallmarks of dementia, such as memory loss, might be the same, the WHO notes that dementia affects each person differently. That's due to certain factors, including a patient's personality prior to becoming ill.

Are Alzheimer's disease and dementia the same thing?

There are many different forms of dementia, and Alzheimer's disease is one of them. In fact, the WHO notes that Alzheimer's is the most common form of dementia, potentially contributing to as many as 70 percent of dementia cases. But people diagnosed with dementia do not necessarily have Alzheimer's.

Though people will experience dementia differently, the signs and symptoms of the disease are typically categorized as being in one of three stages: early stage, middle stage and late stage.

Early stage

Signs and symptoms that mark the early stage of dementia are often chalked up as side effects of aging. But the WHO notes that dementia is not a normal part of aging, so its signs and symptoms, even if they are not yet severe or significant, should not be written off as a byproduct of growing old. Common symptoms in the early stage of dementia include forgetfulness, losing track of the time and becoming lost in familiar places.

Middle stage

Life becomes more difficult during the middle stage of dementia, when signs and symptoms become more apparent. The forgetfulness present in the early stage now becomes forgetfulness of recent events and people's names.

People in the middle stage also may become lost in their own homes and experience a growing difficulty with communication. People in this stage may need help caring for themselves, and some experience behavioral changes such as wandering and repeated questioning.

Late stage

Memory disturbances are significant in the late stage of dementia, when people are almost entirely dependent on others. People in late stage dementia may have difficulty recognizing relatives and friends and be unaware of the time and place. Many people in this stage need assistance with self-care and they may have difficulty walking. Behavioral changes may escalate, and some people in this stage become aggressive, even toward their loved ones.

Dementia affects tens of millions of people across the globe. Though there currently is no cure for dementia, the WHO emphasizes the importance of early diagnosis, which starts with learning the stages of dementia and the hallmarks of each stage.



How Seniors Can Learn New Technology Skills Online

Dear Savvy Senior,

Can you recommend some good technology classes or online learning resources for inexperienced seniors? I have a computer and a smartphone, but my knowledge and skills are pretty limited.

Tech Challenged Senior

Dear Senior,

There are many different technology teaching tools available to older adults that can help you learn new tech skills so you can better utilize your devices. Here are some good options to consider.

Local classes or workshops: Depending on where you live, there may be community resources that offer beginning computer and personal technology classes, be it online or in-person, for older adults that are new to technology. To find out what's available in your area, contact your local public library, senior center, college or university, or local stores that sell computers. Your Area Agency on Aging may also be able to help you. Visit the Eldercare Locator at Eldercare.acl.gov or call 800-677-1116 to get your local number.

GetSetUp.io: This is one of the best online learning websites that partners with guides to provide training on tech tools for adults 50 and older. They provide more than 350 online classes taught in real-time by retired educators and tech industry experts in a way that lets older adults learn-by-doing, versus just watching a video.

Their technology classes – all taught via Zoom – cover things like learning how to use smartphones and tablets, how to set-up and use Zoom, how to utilize Gmail features, how to recognize online scams, how to sell your stuff online and so much more. Most of their classes are free, however some charge a small fee.

SeniorPlanet.org: Created and sponsored by national nonprofit OATS (Older Adults Technology Services) and recently joining forces with AARP, Senior Planet offers 60-and-older adults a wide variety of free online courses, programs, and activities that are taught in real-time to help seniors learn new technology skills, as well as save money, get in shape and make new friends.

Some of their more popular tech classes include "All Things Zoom," "Everything Smartphones," and an "Introduction to Social Media." They even offer a "lunch & learn – tech discussion group" offered at various times throughout the year where you can ask questions as well as share your struggles and experiences.

And, if you ever have a technology question that pops up during the week, you can call their National Senior Planet Hotline for tech help at 920-666-1959 anytime Monday through Friday during working hours.

OasisEverywhere.org: This nonprofit educational organization for older adults provides more than 10 low-cost/free online computer, internet and mobile technology courses for beginners. And when the pandemic dies down, they will resume offering beginner tech classes in their 27 locations (located in nine states) throughout the country.

Candoo Tech.com: This company provides fee-based online tech support and training to help older adults feel more comfortable with phones, computers, tablets, home safety devices and more.

Their specially trained tech concierges will teach you how to use your technology, fix what's not working and install software, as well as learn how set-up and use email, video chat, social media, online shopping and entertainment, ride sharing services and more

They offer one-hour, one-on-one or small group sessions for \$50, or you can become a member and get two 90-minute training sessions plus unlimited quick support (30 minutes or less) for \$180 per year. They also provide device installation and set-up done remotely for \$180.

TechBoomers.com: This is a free educational website that provides video and article tutorials that teach older adults and other inexperienced technology users how to use the most popular and trusted websites, apps and devices.
