SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue the fourteenth week in our study of our United States Constitution. This week we study Article I - Section 9 - Clause 2 which reads: "The Privilege of the Writ of Habeas Corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in Cases of Rebellion or Invasion the public Safety may require it."

The "Writ of Habeas Corpus" is a privilege and is used to bring a prisoner or other detainee before a court to determine if the person's imprisonment or detention is unlawful. A habeas petition proceeds as a civil action against the State agent who holds the defendant in custody.

As was mentioned above, a Writ of Habeas Corpus can be suspended when rebellion and invasion are imminent for the safety of our country.

Article I - Section 9 - Clause 3 reads "No Bill of Attainder or ex post facto Law shall be passed." This would allow capital punishment for treason and capital felonies without trial and conviction by a court and is illegal. Many countries of the world imprison and execute people without trial by jury.

Our republic protects all its citizens from unlawful trial and imprisonment for which we should all be very appreciative.

Article I - Section 9 - Clause 4 reads "Capitation, or other direct, Tax shall be laid, unless in Proportion to the Census or enumeration herein before directed to be taken." The United States Census was the source for determining any new taxes, but as you know, taxes today are based upon each individual person.

Originally, an income tax would not have been allowed, but this was authorized by the 16th Amendment on Monday, February 3, 1913.

As I study history, I have seen that the majority of Americans believe that there would never be an income tax. It is funny, and also very sad, to see how we have added to the Constitution to facilitate the expansion of "Big Brother" and the government.

Article I - Section 9 - Clause 5 reads "No Tax or Duty shall be laid on Articles exported from any State." This clause prevents taxes from being levied on trade between states. After our victory in the American Revolutionary War, our country experienced problems with individual states competing with one another by levying taxes on other states to compete in commerce.

The Articles of Confederation were very weak and did not address this issue so it was necessary for our founding fathers to solve this problem in the Constitution.

The Department of Commerce was established on Saturday, February 14, 1903, to provide a federal agency to regulate commerce. Article I - Section 9 - Clause 6 reads "No Preference shall be given by any Regulation of Commerce or Revenue to the Ports of one State over those of another: nor shall Vessels bound to, or from, one State, be obliged to enter, clear, or pay Duties in another."

Favoritism was not allowed of a port in one state over a port in another state, and therefore, no individual ship was to be favored over any other ship. It was emphasized that we are a country and not a group of states competing against one another.

Article I - Section 9 - Clause 7 reads "No Money shall be drawn from the Treasury, but in Consequence of Appropriations made by Law; and a regular Statement and Account of the Receipts and Expenditures of all public Money shall be published from time to time."

The Executive Branch cannot spend monies which were appropriated for other purposes. The Records of Congress contain all revenues and expenditures received and spent by the federal government.

Lord willing, we will continue our study next week.

Letter from the Superintendent



Dear Community,

In my last article for the moment, I've been asked by the Board of Education to share with you that the District is going to propose, in the upcoming budget vote/board election, a proposition for the establishment of a capital reserve. This reserve would be used for future maintenance of the buildings and grounds and to upgrade existing buildings and infrastructure that supports such things as technology, heating, ventilation, and air conditioning, and other structural needs.

As with any home, school buildings must be maintained and as equipment grows older and begins to reach its age of usefulness, repairs become more costly or items may even reach a point of failure. These conditions lead to safety issues with our students and staff. In order to avoid these problems, it is our obligation to maintain and improve our facilities and the equipment our students have at their disposal so they are first safe and second, so they have the tools they need to compete with students from other districts and communities.

The Board is proposing that the District create a \$5,000,000 capital reserve so that we will be able to set aside enough money over the next several years in order to be able to maintain our facilities and renovate them as necessary. There are many reasons why the Board would ask you to establish a \$5,000,000 reserve fund, but I'd like to share the three main ones with you.

First, as with the most recent construction project, the Board wants the reserve to cover all local share monies so that a future capital project won't affect the tax levy. By setting aside this money in a reserve, to be used only for capital projects, the community won't have any additional taxes. Second, as with all things that we purchase, costs will continue to rise. I wish this were otherwise, but the simple fact is that a dollar just doesn't go as far as it did last year and certainly not five years ago. We must put more money into a reserve than we did previously because there will be an escalation of costs in materials and labor. Finally, it has been forecasted that state aid for capital projects is going to decrease sometime in the future. The current capital project, which is finishing Phase I and will soon begin Phase II, has a state aid ratio of 92%. This means that for every dollar spent on the project the state pays the District 88 cents. The other 12 cents was paid out of the last capital reserve you voted to create back in 2017. We have heard that state aid for future projects could decrease to somewhere between 75% to 80%. This is a very significant decrease and one of the reasons the Board is asking you to vote for such a reserve is so the District can cover this potential decrease without any additional tax increase.

If the voters approve of establishing this capital reserve the Board intends to fully fund it over the next several years. It will take time to set aside this money, but we believe it will allow us to maintain our facilities and renovate them so our students will continue to have the opportunity to be safe and to have the tools they need in order to be able to compete, as they must be able to, with other students when they leave the hallowed halls of Keshequa Central School.

Thank you for the opportunity for being able to share with you the vision we have for keeping Keshequa strong and independent. Go Indians!

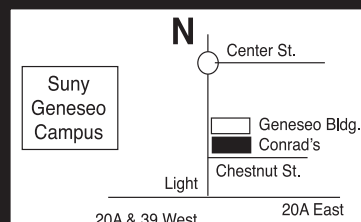

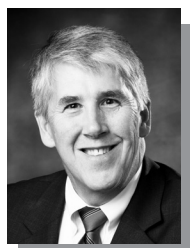

Questions and Answers

Q: What will the residents be voting on?

Proposition 1 – *authorization of the budget*

Proposition 2 – *the Mount Morris Public Library Election of two (2) School Board Trustees*

Q: What is the overall budget for 2021-2022 proposed in Proposition 1?

Proposition 1 asks residents to approve the district's budget of \$16,450,572. This is a budget increase of \$987,123 or 6.38% compared to the 2020-2021 budget and it contains NO INCREASE to the tax levy.

Q: How does this budget compare to prior budgets?

The proposed 2021-2022 budget once again continues the trend of the last four years of NOT increasing taxes. The 2021-2022 budget is built with increases in Foundation Aid and Building Aid while being supported by \$209,761 of Reserves and \$798,878 of Appropriated Fund Balance.

Q: What is this year's tax cap?

The tax cap legislation that passed a few years ago limits the local levy increase by a local tax growth factor and the lower of CPI or 2%. The proposed levy of \$4,150,936 (0% increase) for the 2021-2022 school year is under the cap by \$16,739.

Q: How are taxes remaining flat if the budget is increasing?

The tax levy generates support for general operations/programs and debt service related to voter approved capital projects. The total debt service expenditure budget is increasing by \$471,696; this is primarily due to bond principal and interest payments coming onto the books for the soon to be completed \$5.79M Capital Project.

However, with an almost 98% Building Aid ratio, the project will generate over \$480,000 in additional Building Aid in 2021-2022 which covers the budgetary expenditure increase. General operations and programs are supported by a combination of various State Aid programs and the local tax levy. The projected 2021-2022 State Aid begins by returning about \$600,000 to our aid base levels from the proposed 20% aid cuts that were expected to happen during the 2020-2021 fiscal year.

Furthermore, Mount Morris has been one of the most underfunded schools in the entire state in regards to Foundation Aid. Therefore, we were in the perfect position to benefit from the proposal to fully fund Foundation Aid over the next three fiscal years. This added an additional \$600,000 to our base. Along with expense driven increases in BOCES, Excess Cost, and Transportation Aids, the district is able to fully fund all its expected expenditures without having to raise taxes.

Q: How does leaving the tax levy flat affect my own property taxes?

The tax levy remaining flat means that the district won't collect any more in taxes from the current year to the next year. (continued...)

However, there are several factors that affect the distribution of the tax levy per municipality within the MMCSD boundaries. Any changes in total assessments, exemptions, or equalization rate by municipality can change the proportionate share of the tax levy and therefore the tax rate. The Board of Education will determine the tax rates once the assessment rolls are finalized by July 1st.

Q: Are we still doing a Capital Outlay Project?

Yes. The Capital Outlay Program is an expense driven aid that allows the district to make necessary facility improvements one year and receive the full state aid on the work the following year. In other words, once you are into the cycle of completing an annual Capital Outlay Project, the aid from the prior year project significantly covers the cost of the project in the current year. The 2021-2022 general fund budget includes \$100,000 as a transfer to the capital fund for a project to continue to address some or all of the following: building security enhancements, replacement of control systems in various areas throughout the building, HVAC and mechanical improvements. The project and work will be completed upon submission of the scope to the State Education Department (SED) and receipt of the commissioner's approval. However, the project is almost 98% funded by aid generated from the 2020-2021 year. The net result is a cost to the community of about \$2.00 for every \$100 worth of work.

Q: When is the annual budget hearing & vote?

The hearing is the presentation of the budget and will be held on Wednesday, May 5, 2021, at 6 p.m. in the school auditorium. The vote is Tuesday, May 18, 2021, from 12:00 pm (noon) to 9 pm in the high school gym lobby.

Q: What happens if the budget is defeated?

The Board of Education can choose to: 1) Put the same budget up for a second vote; 2) Propose a different budget; or 3) Adopt a contingent budget without holding another vote. If the Board of Education selects either of the first two options and the second budget vote fails, the Board of Education must adopt a contingent budget.

Q: What is a contingent (austerity) budget?

A contingent budget includes only expenses necessary to provide the minimum services legally required to operate and maintain school buildings and educational programs, preserve the property of the school district and ensure the health and safety of the students and staff. A contingent budget requires that there be no increase in the tax levy over the previous year.

Q: Why is there a separate proposition for the public library?

New York State Education Law requires a separate proposition for the public library. The school district is obligated by law to levy taxes for voter approved library funding on the school tax bill. The school district collects the money and turns it over to the library. Our library, located on Main Street, is seeking approval of a library tax levy of \$110,262.

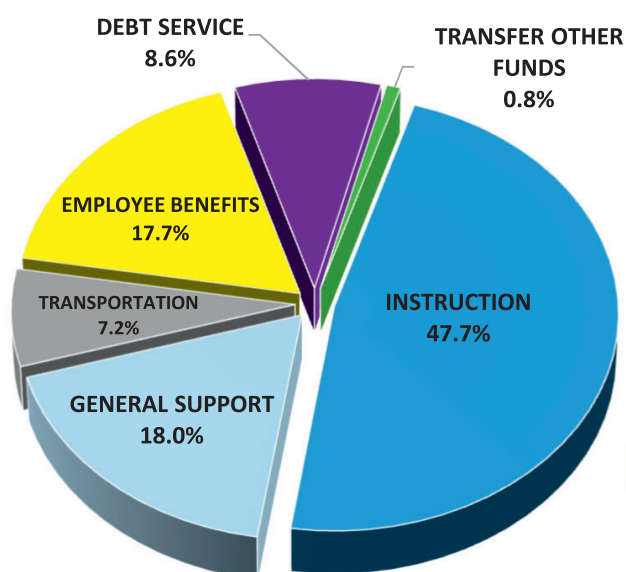

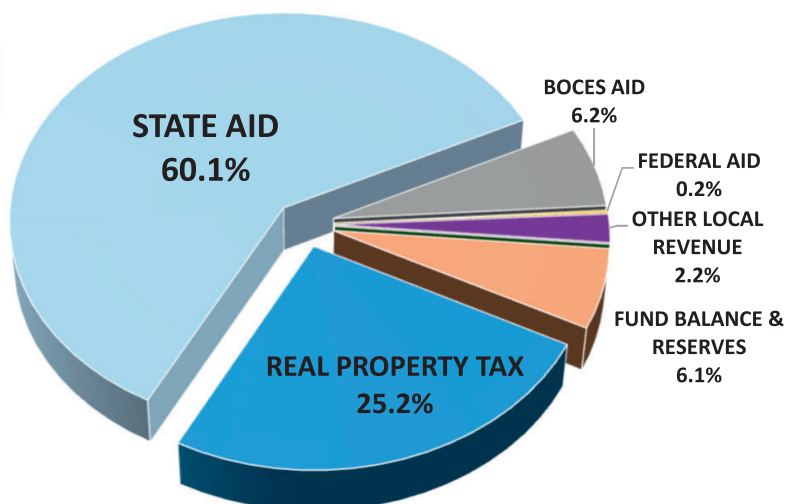
