Captain Gail Smith ASAR-Army Nurse Corps will speak on the 30th anniversary of Desert Storm at the Crosslake Lutheran Church outdoor worship service on Sunday, May 30 at 10 a.m.

Captain Smith was a member of the 311th Evacuation Hospital, which deployed to the Middle East during Desert Storm and served for 4 months in the United Arab Emirates. She served as the chief training officer for the medical unit and for the UAE joint medical team. During her 14 years as a reservist with the Army Nurse Corps she also served at Brooks Army and Walter Reed Medical Centers in the ICU. She was awarded an Army Commendation medal for her service in the Gulf war and a special award from the UAE Royal Guard for her work in training. She is a member of Crosslake-Fifty

500. In her civilian life, she has enjoyed a 47 year career in ER and ICU currently working at the Minneapolis Heart Institute in Baxter. Gail also serves as the Parish Nurse at Crosslake Lutheran Church and leads activities for the Health Ministry team. She and her husband Larry (also a Veteran) live in Crosslake. A Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) conservation officer has died in the line of duty following a two-vehicle crash Monday, May 24, near Grand Rapids.

Officer Sarah Grell, 39, was stationed in Grand Rapids and leaves behind a husband and three children.

til her retirement.


"The sense of loss we feel right now is indescribable," DNR Commissioner Sarah Strommen said. "We are heartbroken for her family. Our deepest sympathies and concerns are with them. Officer Grell leaves behind an

incredible legacy of service to Minnesota's people and natural resources."

"Officer Grell was the epitome of a public servant and served the Enforcement Division, the DNR, and the people of Minnesota with distinction," said Col. Rodmen Smith, DNR Enforcement Division director. "Her loss is devastating, and we ask the people of Minnesota to keep Officer Grell and her family in their thoughts during this difficult time."

Conservation officers have protected Minnesota's natural resources and people since 1887. Officer Grell is the 23rd Minnesota conservation officer to die in the line of duty. Funeral arrangements are still being made.

## -READER-RIBBETS Governing requires transparency

On Monday, May 17, 2021, Speaker Melissa Hortman adjourned the Minnesota House of Representatives. At the time of adjournment, no education policy and budget agreement existed.

This representative democracy-killing move removed the public and legislators from any further input to Minnesota's education budget bill—the largest budget item for the State of Minnesota. Moreover, the House Majority Party and Speaker are "going at it alone."

Passing bills and budgets at the Minnesota House of Representatives is supposed to be difficult. Our founders knew governing requires transparency, compromise, and a lot of time in committee debating the merits and outcomes of legislation. Yes, this is the messy side of legislating, but when legislators fully engage and debate a bill, Minnesotans get fair legislation. This is not happening in the House of Representatives under the current DFL majority party regime.

Because we have adjourned, without an agreed education policy and budget bill on the Governor's desk, further leg-

islating will be conducted by working groups, bureaucrats, lobbyists, and Education Minnesota—none of which have election certificates.

No matter how Speaker Hortman spins the conversation, this is not our constitutional process for creating and passing education bills. This is a "wake up and make it up" process that is changing daily.

To add insult to injury, Speaker Hortman proposes solving the problem with a "year-round legislature." To the contrary, we do not reward bad behavior with more opportunity for failure. Obfuscating the failures of this last legislative session by introducing a "year-round legislature" further decimates our legislative integrity and suggests Minnesotans are oblivious to the St. Paul elite tactics.

The solution Speaker Hortman seeks exists in the current, constitutional legislative process: January-May with committee hearings, debate, and conference committees. As elected officials we must not short-circuit the process so that Education Minnesota and the Governor and Lieutenant Governor's donors get special

So, we have identified the winners. Who are the losers?

Minnesota students, school leaders, and school board members are again locked out of discussions about education policy and budget. This is particularly hard on children who come from families suffering from socioeconomic challenges. These children, from all ethnic groups, are consistently ignored by BIG EDUCATION which prioritizes union-due revenue over improving education access, choice and a quality education for every student and will never solve the achievement gap and declining education outcomes.

Following the intended legislative process and representing constituents serves Minnesota students the best. Clandestine policy making is not Minnesota nice. The House DFL and Speaker Hortman won the 2020 election, but does the consequence have to result in the death of Minnesota's representative democracy?.

## Rep. Dale Lueck legislative update

Regular session ended on islature's responsibility as set Monday May 17 and, to retain his emergency powers, the governor will have to call the legislature back for a special session no later than June 14th, otherwise his emergency authority will automatically expire.

On May 16th, about 24 hours before mandatory legislature adjournment the governor, the Senate Leader and Speaker of House behind closed doors agreed to overall state agency budget funding targets. The conference committees in possession of the agency finance bills are expected to informally reconcile their bills with the numbers that were agreed upon by two legislators and the governor, ahead of the governor calling us back into session. That sidesteps the legislative process our Constitution sets forth and hides the decision making from the public.

All three individuals involved need to check the Minnesota Constitution and reexamine the rolls it sets forth for each. By that agreement, the governor was given preemptive veto authority over what the other 199 legislators are allowed to put in those final agency finance and policy bills. Very disappointing to see a continuing erosion of the leg-

forth in the MN Constitution.

Despite the majority leaders in both the House and Senate failing to steer their respective ships into port on time, please be assured I will continue to soldier on, as we still must get a common-sense, two-year state budget in place before July 1, 2021.

On more a more exciting note, as a newly appointed member of the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR), I have started working on reviewing about 220 LCCMR funding proposals that are now before the committee for consideration.

The LCCMR consists of 17 members: 5 Senators, 5 Representatives, 5 citizens appointed by the governor, 1 citizen appointed by the Senate, and 1 citizen appointed by the House. The LCCMR makes funding recommendations to the legislature for special environment and natural resource projects, that are primarily funded from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund (ENRTF).

The ENRFT was established by a constitutional amendment that dedicated Minnesota State Lottery proceeds and investment income toward projects that help maintain and enhance Minnesota's environment and natural resources. The LCCMR Commission will work through the summer narrowing down the project proposals and by the end of the year put together a recommended project list for the 2022 legislative session.




