

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week twenty of our study of the United States Constitution. This week we begin the study of the Judicial Branch of our government. Article III – Section 1 – Clause 1 reads "The judicial Power of the United States, shall be vested in one supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may from time to time ordain and establish. The Judges, both of the supreme and inferior Courts, shall hold their Offices during good Behaviour, and shall, at stated Times, receive for their Services, a Compensation, which shall not be diminished during their Continuance in Office."

The Supreme Court of the United States is the highest court in the federal judiciary of the United States of America. It has ultimate appellate jurisdiction over all federal and state court cases that involve a point of federal law, and original jurisdiction over a narrow range of cases, specifically all cases affecting Ambassadors, other public Ministers and Consuls, and those in which a state shall be party.

The term "during good Behaviour" infers that a Supreme Court justice can be impeached for misconduct and for repeatedly violating our Constitution in his or her rulings. The Court holds the power of judicial review and the ability to invalidate a statute for violating a provision of the Constitution. However, it may act only within the context of a case in an area of law over which it has jurisdiction. The Court may decide cases having political overtones, but it has ruled that it does not have power to decide non-justiciable political questions. Presidential Executive Orders may be invalidated when the court decides that they violate the Constitution.

Article III – Section 2 – Clause 1 reads "The judicial Power shall extend to all Cases, in Law and Equity, arising under this Constitution, the Laws of the United States, and Treaties made, or which shall be made, under their Authority;—to all Cases affecting Ambassadors, other public Ministers and Consuls;—to all Cases of admiralty and maritime Jurisdiction;—to Controversies to which the United States shall be a Party;—to Controversies between two or more States;— between a State and Citizens of another State,—between Citizens of different States,—between Citizens of the same State claiming Lands under Grants of different States, and between a State, or the Citizens thereof, and foreign States, Citizens or Subjects."

Whenever there is a disagreement as to the application of common law, equity is applied. The most distinct difference between law and equity lies in the solutions that they offer. Common law usually awards monetary damages in certain cases, but equity can decree for someone to act or not to act on something.

Equity was not a complete system of law. It merely filled the gaps in the common law and softened the strict rules of the common law. The two systems of common law and equity operated quite separately, so it was not surprising that this overlapping of the two systems has led to conflict between them.

Admiralty and Maritime Jurisdictions comprise two types of these cases: (1) those involving acts committed on the high seas or other navigable waters, and (2) those involving contracts and transactions connected with shipping employed on the seas or navigable waters. I realize that these legal terms can be very confusing but are necessary in preserving our laws and freedoms.

Lord willing, we will continue the study of our wonderful Constitution next week.

Dear "Speak Out,"

This Saturday, June 19 is Juneteenth and the first time I know of that we are observing it as a country (by some places closing, like the school, on Friday the 18).

This holiday recognizes the day that abolishing enslavement was finally enforced in the state of Texas, where many slavers (people we would today define as human traffickers) had brought their captives after President Lincoln announced the Emancipation Proclamation in late 1862 (to take effect in 1863, freeing all enslaved people in Confederate states).

It took a few months after the end of the Civil War to actually enforce this in rebel states, and until late 1865 to actually abolish enslavement in states that weren't in the Confederacy. Immediately after the liberation of enslaved people, ex-Confederates dug in their heels with violence in the name of reasserting white supremacy, and that was just the beginning.

Despite this, Black people celebrated Liberation Day, Jubilee Day or Juneteenth every year--beginning in Texas and spreading elsewhere throughout the twentieth century as freed people fled the danger and violence in the south like refugees from a war. Across the country people and communities have celebrated our second, more genuine, Independence Day each June 19 ever since.

Since many of us White people may only have heard of this in the last few years, perhaps this year is time to admit we should start learning a bit more about our history--and by that I mean, about what really happened. We should know about about Juneteenth, and Fort Pillow, and redlining, and Emmet Till and Mary Turner--and we should realize there's a whole lot we weren't told and that's not our fault.

But refusing to be teachable and refusing to accept the true history of our country...that is indeed our fault, and to our detriment.




