



of the Year of the UNA Woman.

State The Normal School at Florence, now UNA, opened its doors to women in 1872 – making Alabama's oldest four-year university the first statesupported co-educational institution in the southeast. The university is proudly observing this sesquicentennial year, the Year of the UNA Woman, 150 years later with events scattered through the coming year.

"It is wonderful for UNA to celebrate 150 years of admitting women to the University," Berry said. "Our successes as women represent a powerful array of accomplishments, and we must remain committed to opening doors for others. I'm proud to be a product of one of the best universities in the state of Alabama.

The Year of the UNA Woman launched June 1 with a website – www.una. edu/unawoman. The *UNA Magazine* was produced entirely by women. Further, the University brand has been updated to include Una, the beloved lioness who passed in 2020.

"This anniversary is a significant reminder of UNA's history of firsts. We opened in 1830 as Alabama's first public four-year institution on Mountain in LaGrange Colbert County and we began admitting women in 1872," said Dr. Ken Kitts, UNA President. "Both as students and among our faculty and staff, women like Ann Berry and others continue to be vital to the **Historic** ongoing success of UNA.

In preparation for the launch of the Year of the UNA Woman, a task force of more then the of more than two dozen campus and community members was convened in late 2020. In addition to planning events, the group is also coordinating a hardcover book and producing podcasts, both of which are designed to archive and commemorate this sesquicentennial anniversary.

"We are pleased to be able to celebrate the contributions of women to this great institution, and we invite the community to participate alongside us.

You see, I, Jim Fisher formerly not-so-humble geek who's been around computers since the stone ages and who should darn well know better -ignorantly gave my PayPal username and password to scam artists. I was the victim of a phishing scam.





I've had mild tinnitus - ringing in my ears - for years, but when I got COVID in January it got worse. Are there any treatments you know of or can recommend that can help? Almost 60

#### Dear Almost.

Unfortunately, new research indicates that tinnitus, a common hearing problem that affects around 50 million Americans, may be worsened by COVID-19 or possibly even triggered by it. Here's what you should know along with some tips and treatments that may help. What is Tinnitus?

Tinnitus (pronounced tin-NIGHT-us or TIN-a-tus) is the sensation of hearing a ringing, buzzing, roaring, hissing or whistling sound in one or both ears when no external sound is present.

The sounds, which can vary in pitch and loudness, are usually worse when background noise is low, so you may be more aware of it at night when you're trying to fall asleep in a quiet room. For most people tinnitus is merely annoying, but for many others it can be extremely disturbing.

Tinnitus itself is not a disease, but rather a symptom of some other underlying health condition. The best way to find out what's causing your tinnitus is to see an audiologist, or an otolaryngologist - a doctor who specializes in ear, nose and throat diseases (commonly called an ENT). The various things that can cause tinnitus are:

- Hearing loss, which is the most common cause.
- Middle ear obstructions usually caused by a build-up of earwax deep in the ear canal.
- · The side effects of many different prescription and nonprescription medicines like aspirin, ibuprofen, certain blood pressure medicines and diuretics, some antidepressants, cancer medicines and antibiotics.
- Various medical conditions such as high blood pressure, vascular disease, diabetes, allergies, thyroid problems, ear or sinus infections, Meniere's disease, Lyme disease, fibromyalgia, otosclerosis, temporomandibular joint (TMJ) disorder, a tumor, an injury to the head or neck, traumatic brain injury, depression, stress and more. Treatments

#### While there's no cure for tinnitus there are many ways to treat it depending on the cause. For example, if your tinnitus is caused by a wax build-up in your ears or a medical condition like high blood pressure or a thyroid problem, treating the problem may reduce or eliminate the noise. Or, if you think a medication you're taking may be causing the problem, switching to a different drug, or lowering the dosage may provide some relief. Or if you have hearing loss, getting a hearing aid can help mask your tinnitus by improving your ability to hear actual sounds.

Another good treatment option for tinnitus that can help suppress or mask the sound so it's less bothersome are 'sound therapies." These can be as simple as a fan or a white noise machine, listening to music or podcasts, or leaving the television on.

There are also apps created by hearing aid companies, like ReSound Relief (*ReSound.com*) or Relax by Starkey (*Starkey*. com), which allow you to stream customize sounds directly to your hearing aids, or (if you don't use hearing aids) through Bluetooth audio devices like headphones or speakers to help you manage your symptoms.

Cognitive behavioral therapy and psychological counseling can also be helpful. Your audiologist or ENT can help you figure out the best treatment options.

There are also certain medications that may help. While currently there's no FDA approved drugs specifically designed to treat tinnitus, some antianxiety drugs and

antidepressants have been effective in relieving symptoms. Other things you can do to help quiet the noise is to avoid things that can aggravate the problem like salt, artificial sweeteners, sugar, alcohol, tonic water, tobacco and caffeine. And protect yourself from loud noises by wearing earplugs. For more information on tinnitus treatments, visit the

## **Medicare** Minute "Frequently Asked Questions"

We began in the Medicare business in 2010. Since that time we have been asked some interesting and unique questions about Medicare. However, the majority of the questions we are asked we get on a regular basis. Over the next few weeks we are going to discuss some of our most frequently asked questions

Do I have to sign up for Medicare Part B when I turn 65 if I'm still employed? This is one of the questions we get asked the most. In most cases the answer to this is "no". When you turn 65, if you are still working and on your employer's health insurance plan you probably will not need Medicare Part B. I say probably because most employer plans do not file on Medicare if you have a claim. Because you have to pay a premium for Part B, Medicare does not require a person to sign up for Part B as long as you are on your employer's plan. Also, because the rules are different for companies with less than 20 employees, the safest thing to do is check with the benefits coordinator at your place of employment for guidance or give us a call at our office.

I am on Medicare and Social Security Disability. I'm turning 65 soon. What are my options? Once you reach the age of 65 you have many more options than before. As you know if you go on Medicare and you are under the age of 65 your options for health plans are limited. When you turn 65 you will have another open enrollment period to sign up for any plan you wish to get. In other words, just because you are already on Medicare does not prohibit you from having all the options a person not on Medicare and turning 65 would have.



"In the studio the weather and the light don't change, and I can keep a regular schedule on rainy days. I have eight windows in my studio so I can balance the amount of natural light with artificial light using shades and blinds," he said.

"Watercolor is one of the oldest mediums in painting, possibly dating as far back as Paleolithic times," Stevenson added. "It was practiced notably in ancient Egypt, ancient Greece, and Rome. My first attempts began in 1978 and I quickly fell in love with the luminosity that was possible and the challenges it presented. It is worth noting there is only one painting that is devoted to referencing the pandemic and its

direct impact. In all the other paintings 1 was directing my energies in the direction of subjects that could potentially feed both mind and soul in a positive way. Stevenson's goal for the year was to paint every day using only subjects that were within the confines of his house and at hand. He only missed a couple of days.

"This presented a good creative challenge that 1 welcomed," Stevenson said.





Earlier this vear, Biden President Joe signed an executive order calling for strengthening vulnerable agricultural chains supply and encouraging production here at home.

In the past 18 months, the effects of the COVID-19

pandemic on agricultural producers, processors, and other small businesses revealed the dangerous effects of consolidation up and down the food supply chain. Farmers, processors, and retailers faced significant losses, and customers found product shortages and high prices.

The pandemic isn't the only issue. News of the recent cyberattack on meat processing company JBS makes the need for a more diverse food supply chain even sharper.

In addressing ways to make our food supply less vulnerable, we encouraged the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to offer proposed grants to small meat processors through the Consolidated Appropriations Act and the American Rescue Plan as soon as possible. The investment can bring small plants up to federal inspection standards and increase the capacity through building expansions, equipment upgrades, and technical

training. Additionally, the USDA can incentivize the development of alternative processing, packaging, and distribution hubs that can allow small, independent farmers to bring their products to market in a competitive way. USDA can also increase funding to several established programs aimed at promoting and developing new markets for local farmers under the Local Agriculture Market Program.

Whether the threat is pandemic or foreign hackers, it's clear that a resilient agricultural sector is a diverse one. This is the time to support independent farmers, businesses, and local markets.



I live near Bailey Springs. What law covers someone discharging sewage into Shoals Creek?

Albert, Killen, AL

The Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. §1251 et seq. [CWA] regulates discharge of pollutants into navigable waters of the Unites States. CWA regulates National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System [NPDES] permits and provides for citizen suits for violation of permit requirements. In Alabama, ADEM is authorized a federally approved state program in lieu of the federal program.

The Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. §7401 et seq. [CAA] was amended in 1990 regulates air pollution

and includes emission standards for such hazardous air pollutants as asbestos and benzene. ADEM is authorized to administer a federally approved state air quality program in lieu of the federal program in Alabama.

The Resource Conservation and Recovery Act [RCRA], 42 U.S.C. §6901 et seq. regulates the disposal, treatment, storage and transportation of hazardous waste. RCRA also contains landfill rules and covers underground storage tanks [UST]. The Alabama Department of Environmental Management [ADEM] administers a federally approved hazardous waste program and the UST program, RCRA is a cradle-to-grave statute design to work hand in hand with CERCLA.

The Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act 42 U.S.C. §9601 et seq. (ERCLA), known as "Superfund", involves cleanup liability for releases of hazardous substances at "facilities". Liability is strict, retroactive joint and several. CERCLA places liability on current "owners and operators" of a facility as well as those who owned or operated the property at the time of disposal or who arranged for the disposal of hazardous substances (known as "potentially responsible parties" [PRP's].

There are books and books of law regarding hazardous, toxic, and environmental waste. Most of the law is federal but Alabama has their own Alabama Department of Environmental Management. Based on what I read in the newspaper, they are already involved in this situation.


