Cooper, TX- What better place to enjoy the beginnings of summer while learning about the natural world? Educational programs are back at Cooper Lake State Park and will begin again on Saturday, June 19th and run throughout the summer. We have hired two new seasonal Park Rangers that will focus their efforts on producing and delivering nature programs crafted for our ecosystem in Northeast Texas.

Breeanna Hick is our new Seasonal Park Ranger - Interpreter. Breeanna is from rural Hopkins County where she has lived for 20 years. She is currently enrolled at Texas A&M - Commerce working on her Bachelor's degree. She enjoys spending time with her family and being outdoors with her dog and horse. She has spent many years visiting Cooper Lake and is excited to be working at the park and serving her community and state.

Callie Shell is our Summer Intern. She is from Franklin, Texas. Callie just graduated from Texas A&M University – College Station with a Bachelor's degree in Veterinary Medicine with two minors - Psychology and Tourism Management. During her free time, she loves to read and go kayaking. Callie hopes to fulfill her dream and make a career with Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

As a result of these two outstanding hires, we are again able to offer educational programming at both park units. Our highlighted programs for June are our Underwater Discovery program, guided nature hikes, and Mammals of Cooper Lake State Park program. Attend one of these and other programs and learn all about our amazing natural Texas.

Bring each fun and learning packed Saturday to a fitting conclusion with your family and friends by relaxing on a picnic table watching your food cook on one of our many day-use picnic grills. If you are camping, relaxing around a campfire at the park in the evening is unbeatable! The flickering light and warmth of a campfire will lift your spirits and reconnect you to feelings shared by past generations. There is no better place to share a story or eat a meal!

Fish from the bank, off our pier, fishing wall, or rent a kayak and try your luck along the shoreline. Fish attractors have been placed around the Doctor's Creek floating fishing pier and the fishing wall at South Sulphur to help increase fishing success. Also, the park has feeding stations to draw catchable fish nearshore for bank fishermen. At Cooper Lake State Parks, a fishing license is not required if you are fishing from the bank or on a park pier. Crappie, bluegill, white bass, hybrid striped bass, large mouth bass, channel catfish, flathead catfish, and blue catfish are commonly caught at both park units. June is a great time to fish at Cooper Lake! Other popular activities are hiking our trails or just resting under a giant Post Oak tree or camping at one of our tree-canopied campsites. Texas State Parks are great places to relax, recreate and recharge!

Park entrance fees are \$5 for adults with kids 12 and under always free. Senior Texans 65 or older will only pay \$3 to enter the park daily with a Bluebonnet Pass. Unlimited park entrances for you and everyone in your vehicle can be accomplished with the purchase of a Texas State Park Annual Pass for \$70 which is good for over 12 months. All pro-



animated expressions of extreme satisfaction. No one has said, "O, yeah, let me tell you about this place." It is indeed rare to have a perfect meal in a restaurant.

Usually when you ask a question like the one mentioned above it's because you want to compare the answer to something you want to say. Well I want you to know I have had only one perfect dining experience. It happened at a place called Stevenswood in Mendocino, California. Even though it happened a few years ago the memory is still as fresh today as it was the morning after the meal.

We were in California visiting wineries along the Russian River. We stopped at a motel called River's End, where the Russian River empties into the Pacific. When the proprietor asked us the reason or our visit, we said we were visiting wineries. He gifted us a split bottle of a red wine from the area. We sat on the deck outside our room and watched the sunset while enjoying the delicious pinot noir.

The next day we took a leisurely drive up Highway One along the Pacific Coast, one of the most scenic roadways in America. We checked into a motel in Mendocino near the spot where a symphony orchestra was performing an outdoor concert.

As dinnertime approached we were walking around and saw an inviting establishment called Stevenswood that had lodging, a restaurant and a bar. When we entered the restaurant we were impressed with the cleanliness, modern furniture, welcoming atmosphere and art that decorated the walls. When we were seated the friendly waiter handed us menus and a wine list. At the top of both were some printed words from the executive chef: "In order to live well, love well and sleep well you must first dine well." The place was more cozy than fancy and the prices were reasonable.

As soft music put us in a relaxed mood, the waiter came over and asked if we were ready to order. As an appetizer, my wife Susan chose akvavit cured gravlax tartar. I had a salad with endive, field greens, crisp leeks and pistachios.

For the entrиe Susan had pine nut crusted salmon. I had crusted ahi tuna. We chose a Chardonnay to accompany the food. For desert Susan chose an apricot dish while I enjoyed стите brulee.

Every bite and sip was delicious. The waiter was attentive, the silverware, linens, glassware and comfortable seating made the diners enjoy being there. Everything was perfect. It is not often all the elements come together like that.

The enchanted evening continued. After the meal we went to the bar and had conversations with some park rangers who told us where the tallest trees in America were located. We hiked to them the next day. We kept the Stevenswood menus and wine list. I had forgotten about doing that but ran across them recently. We've eaten in famous places all over the globe but Stevenswood stands out. Such great memories.
