



If You've Been Injured, Give This To Your Doctor

In a personal injury or negligence case, it is the plaintiff's burden to prove by a *majority* of evidence that the injury complained of was **caused by the defendant's negligent act**. Negligence alone does not afford a cause of action. 'Liability is only imposed when negligence is the proximate cause of the injury and the natural and probable consequence of the negligent act.

There is a long held myth in the legal profession that the burden of proof for causation is greater than establishing the *probability* of the cause. This problem is compounded by the common legal term

"to a reasonable degree of medical certainty," which confuses the doctor and is misleading as to the proper burden of proof in a civil case. "A reasonable degree of medical certainty" sounds strikingly similar to a defendant's burden of proof in a criminal case or "beyond a reasonable doubt." It also negatively implies than that burden of proof in a civil case is absolute scientific certainty or 90%, as opposed to the 50.1 percent probability burden of proof required in a civil case. In *Western Ry. Of Ala. V. Brown*, the Alabama Supreme Court addressed the confusion and confirmed that the term "to a reasonable degree of medical certainty" is "an expression of an expert opinion that the plaintiff's condition was **probably** caused by his/her injury." Note therefore that the ambiguous term, "a reasonable degree of medical certainty" and the "probability of causation" both mean 50.1 percent or the probable cause of an injury in a civil case.

To establish the probable cause and effect of an injury, the doctor may testify to and base his/her expert opinion on the patient's statements and the patient's history of the case.

The doctor must understand that in Alabama an expert is allowed to testify whether certain facts *could or would* cause a result, but *not* whether they *actually* did. The expert does not have to personally witness the act that is alleged to have caused the injury and therefore the expert cannot testify that he or she has personal knowledge that specific act actually caused the injury. The expert can rely on the parties' facts to establish his/her expert opinion as to causation. The medical expert's testimony is not used to establish the patient's version of facts as the absolute truth, but in establishing an opinion, the expert can assume that patient's version of facts in the patient's history are true and taken as true, <u>would have probably caused</u> the resulting injury.


A BETTER BUFFET **OPTION**

Dear Athletic Support: My husband and I have two daughters, ages 7 and 10. They are both very tall for they are bold very full for their age so we enroll them in sports like basketball and volleyball when offered. They enjoy these activities once they get there, but we end up having to force them to follow through with the commitment. How far do we go in pushing them? Looking back, I was a little lazy and I wish my parents had pushed me more. My husband views team sports as a vital part of childhood, and I do not disagree, to a point. — Dragging Them To Practice

Dear Dragging: I've told this story before, but it bears repeating here: My dad used to make me throw one hundred pitches a day all through the summers of my youth. Yes, this included weekends and vacations. Yes. I hated it.

In the end, I didn't go on to become a professional baseball player. I did, however, have a decently successful athletic career, and even more importantly, I took the lessons I learned throwing those hundred pitches and applied them

to many aspects of my professional life. Without sounding too cliché, I'm a grinder. Regardless of what I'm doing, I give it my best. Looking back, I can't help but think I learned that lesson from Dad and

his bucket of weathered baseballs. For your situation, I'd urge you and your husband to lay some ground rules when it comes to your daughters and their athletic activities. One good rule might be to always make

them finish a season if they start it. Ón top of that, you could also sit down and have a discussion with

While in Belize, John hired local gang members as bodyguards, tried to start up a pharmaceutical company, hired prostitutes to live with him, was accused of rape, probably murdered one of his neighbors

over a spat about John's dogs, and generally lived life on the edge. John eventually made it back to the US and ran for president of the United States twice. Man, can you imagine a crazy person being president of the US? Whew, we sure dodged that one. Anyway, John hopped around the country until, in 2019, an arrest warrant was issued for tax evasion. John then hopped on a boat and went on the run.



Dear Savvy Senior,

Can you recommend some good smartphones for older seniors? I would like to get my 78-year-old mother to upgrade to a smartphone but want something that's easy for her to see and use. Shopping Around

Dear Shopping,

There are actually several smartphones I can recommend that will provide your mother a simpler, less intimidating smartphone experience. Here are my top three options.

Apple iPhones: Because of the quality and functionality of Apple products, an iPhone is a great choice for seniors who are inexperienced with technology. But, to make it easier for you mom to use, you'll need to set it up and customize it to meet her needs and preferences.

To set-up your mom's iPhone and make it senior-friendly, start by cleaning-up/decluttering the home screen, which you can do by deleting the apps your mom won't use and hiding the apps she'll rarely use in labeled folders or the App Library. The wer options the better!

You'll also want to set up a small number of contacts (with photos) to family and friends that your mom frequently communicates with and install some apps she would enjoy using

And finally, iPhones have a wide variety of built-in accessibility features you can turn on depending on your mom's needs. These features, which you access through the phone's settings, can help users that have diminished vision, hearing impairment, hand dexterity problems or cognitive lo

Some popular accessibility features among older iPhone users include larger text and icon display, zoom (screen magnification), magnifier (turns iPhone into a magnifying glass), increased volume and alerts, voice control, find my iPhone, and emergency SOS and medical ID set up. But there are dozens of other tweaks you can make to enhance your mom's experience with her iPhone.

For a rundown of the different accessibility features and

instructions on how to set them up, see *Apple.com/accessibility*. If you're interested in this option, the iPhone 12 (5G, 6.1-inch display screen, \$800) or iPhone 12 mini (5G, 5.4-inch screen, \$700) are excellent choices. Or, for a more budget-friendly phone consider the iPhone SE (4.7-inch screen, \$400) that came out in 2020.

Samsung Galaxy: If you're an android phone user and would like to get your mom a phone that you're familiar with, you should consider a Samsung. All Samsung phones offer an "Easy Mode" feature in their

settings that boosts the text and icon size, and simplifies the home-screen layout and contacts, which makes these phones a nice option for seniors or tech-newbies.

These phones also have a variety of accessibility features see Samsung.com/us/accessibility/galaxy-mobile for instructions - that can accommodate your mom's needs. The Samsung Galaxy S21 5G (6.2-inch screen, \$800) or more

moderately priced Galaxy A71 5G (6.7-inch screen, \$600) are good choices to consider here.

Lively Smart: Another less expensive option to consider is to purchase your mom a smartphone that's specifically designed for seniors. The best one available is the new Lively Smart offered by Best Buy.

This phone has a 6.2-inch screen, large text and a simple listbased menu that provides one-touch access to frequently used features like video chat, camera, email and more. It also offers a nice variety of optional health and safety features you can add on like:

- Urgent Response, which is a mobile medical alert service that would connect your mom to a Lively agent in emergency situations, 24/7, who would confirm her location and get her the help she needs.
- Urgent Care, which would let your mom to speak to a registered nurse or board-certified doctor anytime. Lively Link, which is an app that sends alerts to family and
- friends if your mom calls urgent response.
- **Personal Operator Service,** who can assist your mom with tasks like helping find addresses, setting up appointments booking Lively Rides through a partnership with Lyft and

much more. The Lively Smart is available online at *Lively.com* or at Best Buy stores for \$150.

CLEANING "DRY ERASE" MARKERS

If you have some old dry erase marks or a permanent marker on a dry erase board, simply take a fresh drv erase marker and scribble over the old marks. Then rub out the whole thing. This will actually take it off much better than the commercial products.

I was helping to clean/pack up my kid's kindergarten room today and the teacher wanted to reuse many of the laminated items she had dry erase marked on. She was trying to use the commercial spray, but it was still pretty dingy and you could see faint marks. Í scribbled over it with a black dry erase marker, rubbed it out and the marks came up great. It was a bit dingy, so I then used the spray to "clean" it up a bit. And this was simply laminated paper! Loree





From what I understand, this is not Statom's first spiritually-inspired post. Christians should be allowed to show their





BLESS THEM, DON'T ENABLE THEM

Dear Dave,

My husband and I are both teachers, and we're on Baby Step 7. We're struggling with things where our wills are concerned. Three of our four adult children aren't being wise with their money, and my husband and I disagree on how to talk to them about it and how it may affect us re-structuring our wills. We don't want to be judgmental, but at the same time we agree something needs to be said or done.

Danielle

Dear Danielle,

Let's say someone is working at my company, and taking my money in the form of a paycheck. Let's also say this person isn't doing a good job. If I don't talk to them about their performance because I don't want to be seen as judgmental, I'm not doing my job. I owe them the feedback necessary for them to become a good team member. Otherwise, they could just get fired one day without really knowing what happened because I "judge" them. I refused to

You're supposed to judge people. The idea that you're not supposed to is ridiculous. But you don't have to be a jerk about it. There's a big difference between judging people and being judgmental. But it's unkind not to share insights or suggestions for a better way of life with those you love most. Holding back and telling yourself the way someone behaves is just the way they're made is wrong in most instances. Overspending and not saving money aren't character traits-they're decisions.

They're adults now, and *wealth and enhance* they're going to do what *He also serves as* they want. They don't have *Ramsey Solutions.*



to understand or support your ways of handling money, but you and your husband have every right to tell them they have to start behaving in certain ways if they expect to receive your money when the time comes. If they're misbehaving, and you give them money, you're funding that bad behavior. That's not love, that's enabling. And a big pile of money isn't going to heal the bad things—it's only going to magnify them.

Sit down with your kids, and have a loving, clear discussion about the situation. Remind them that they're adults, and you and your husband are no longer able to tell them how they have to live. But let them know in no uncertain terms, gently but firmly, they will not receive your money if they continue to behave in ways you both consider foolish or unreasonable. Let them know they'll always have your love, just not your money, unless they begin behaving more intelligently and maturely with their finances.

You can't *make* them do anything, Danielle. But you can ensure they understand you two won't be sharing your wealth with people who can't handle it and use it wisely. —Dave
