



THE FIRST MTEET

Tennesseans have a long history of rising to the occasion. Whether it was the overwhelming response to a call for military service during the War of 1812 or lending a helping hand in the aftermath of a tornado, they are known for showing up in a time of need. Volunteering is a way of life passed down through the

took place at Camp Blount, two miles south of downtown Fayetteville. In 1813-14, Camp Blount served as the location of a military training encampment. It was also a rallying point for soldiers like Sam Houston and David Crockett. Camp Blount is Horseshoe Bend in March 1814 that ended the Creek Indian War. Once again, Jackson gathered troops for the march to New Orleans in December 1814 to participate in winning the Battle of New Orleans on January 8, 1815. Camp Blount originally encompassed approximately 200 acres. Situated adjacent to the Elk River, the site was ideal for a large gathering with access to water and plenty

Who were those early volunteers who answered the call? The First Volunteer, a beautiful bronze statue handcrafted by sculptor Wayne Hyde, features exquisite details that give us a few clues. With a bedroll slung over his shoulder, a canteen, and a rifle modeled after David Crockett's rifle, he was ready to serve. The volunteers were brothers, sons, and fathers attempting to carve out a way of life for themselves and their families. They were men of resolve and determination who were ready to take action, even if it meant risking their lives. Dr. Farris Beasley, the co-chair of the Camp Blount Historic Site Association (CBHSA), comments, "According to the state, there is no other statue in the state of Tennessee dedicated to the Tennessee Volunteer."

Today, Camp Blount Historic Site encompasses 40 acres of the original site and is Tennessee's 8th historic site. The First Volunteer statue, which can be seen from a distance, draws visitors into the Volunteer Plaza. Flags waving from nearby flagpoles, a replica War of 1812-era artillery piece, and a nearby pavilion offer up a standing invitation to take a walk through history. From there, several trails wind through the historic grounds. The Volunteer Trail highlights key historical figures including, Gov. Willie Blount; Andrew Jackson; Sam Houston; David Crockett; and Gov. William Hall. The War of 1812 Trail and the Creek War Trail offer additional insight into the timeline of events that would later write history. Plans are also in the works for a park-to-park pedestrian trail which includes a bridge spanning the Elk River, connecting the Camp Blount Historic Site with Stone Bridge Park. Two log cabins, one of which is the historic Greer cabin, are presently undergoing renovations and will soon be relocated to the site. Joseph Greer served at the Battle of Kings Mountain in 1780. After delivering the news of the American victory to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia, he became known as the "Kings Mountain Messenger."


Understanding Lincoln County's place in the story of America sheds new light on our development as a nation and the significant role of Camp Blount. History informs us how and why things change. The First Volunteer is a tribute to all volunteers - past, present, and future. It also stands as a reminder that building a strong community requires working together. Although Lincoln County may look different than it did in the 1800's when those first volunteers came together, one thing remains true. All change begins with one person, one volunteer.

THE CAMP BLOUNT VOLUNTEER DAYS

Save the date on the first weekend of October for the Camp Blount Volunteer Days. The annual celebration includes living historians; reenactments; cannon and musket firing demonstrations; military drills; authentic period clothing; lectures; arts and crafts; music from the era; and much more.

There are several ways you can support the ongoing efforts at the Camp Blount Historic Site. Memberships are available at \$10 per year for individuals, \$20 per year for families, and \$100 for a lifetime membership. Applications are available at the Register of Deeds office at the Lincoln County Courthouse. T-shirts are also available for purchase, and donations are always welcome.

The Camp Blount Historic Site is located at 1124 Huntsville Hwy, Fayetteville, TN, adjacent to the River Oak Shopping Center. For more historical information about the site and news on current developments, visit campblount.com or follow @campblount on Facebook.



THE TERM "VOLUNTEER STATE" was first used by a Nashville newspaper during the War of 1812 because of the incredible Tennessee volunteer turnout for the Creek War and Battle of New Orleans.

ALTHOUGH THE NICKNAME "Volunteer State" has been widely used throughout the years, it officially became a Tennessee statute in 2020.

GENERAL ANDREW JACKSON kept a diary during the Creek Indian War and time leading up to the Battle of New Orleans, and he often used the term "my Tennessee Volunteers."





Leading the Way

HONORING THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF EXTRAORDINARY WOMEN WHO HELPED SHAPE THE COMMUNITY

It's hard to imagine now, but there was a time when women weren't allowed to cross the Fayetteville downtown square unattended. In the mid-1800's, several saloons were located around the square, and it simply wasn't safe. However, one woman decided that the dangerous environment that existed just a few blocks from her front door was not acceptable, and she set out to change it. That woman was Silena Moore Holman.

Silena was no stranger to overcoming obstacles and hardship. The oldest of five children, she went to work as a teacher after her father died from battle wounds in the Civil War. At the time, she was fourteen. Eventually, the young woman earned enough money to buy back the family home lost after her father's death.

In 1875, she married physician and elder T. P. Holman in the Washington Street Church of Christ in Fayetteville. From her home on Mulberry Avenue, Silena not only cared for her eight children, but she also served the public for over 35 years. She advocated for women's rights and passionately promoted prohibition. For 15 years, she served as president of the Tennessee Women's Christian Temperance Union (WCTU). Under her leadership, the organization grew to over 4,000 members. The Temperance Union was one of the first organizations of women devoted to social reform.

Selina was a skilled debater and certainly wasn't afraid to ruffle a few feathers. In addition to being a strong proponent of female leadership in the church, she also took on other issues, such as the use of wine in communion services. Silena insisted that wine was not biblical and that grape

juice should be used instead. Eventually, she persuaded local elders and deacons of the Christian Church (later the Church of Christ) to use grape juice instead of wine. A dedicated wife, mother, and churchwoman, Silena was highly educated, and was an eloquent speaker and an articulate writer, with over 100 published articles. When she died in 1815, over 1,000 people attended her funeral.

To date, only two portraits of women have graced the walls of the state capital. One was Silena, and the other, Rachel Jackson, wife of Andrew Jackson. Today, the original painting of Silena hangs in the Tennessee State Museum. A replica portrait created by the same Nashville company that copied the state constitution hangs in the Lincoln County Courthouse in recognition of her life's work.

Throughout history, women have played a prominent role in shaping Lincoln County, including establishing the hospital and beautiful library. The Women of Lincoln County, a committee recently formed to recognize the contributions of notable women, is on a mission to share these inspiring stories so that young girls of today and tomorrow can follow in their footsteps and become change-makers of the future. A portrait of each honoree selected by the committee will hang in the courthouse until the following year's celebration of another notable local woman. Portraits will then be moved to a special place of honor in the Lincoln County Museum. The committee welcomes suggestions and the history of other women who have made a difference in our community and beyond. Information can be given to the Chamber.



Female portraitist Willie Betty Newman painted the original portrait of Silena Moore Holman. Newman was born on a plantation during the Civil War and spent over a decade studying art in Paris. She regularly signed her paintings "W. B. Newman" to mask her identity. The Nashville Museum of Art awarded Newman the Parthenon medal, its highest honor.

WHAT IS LEADERSHIP LINCOLN?

Leadership Lincoln is a personal development program designed to motivate participants to develop leadership qualities for addressing community needs.

Leadership Lincoln began in 1987. The program has produced leaders who are actively involved in community organizations, local government and civic groups, all working toward improving the quality of life for our county. Developing leaders is a key ingredient to the continued progress of Lincoln County.

WHAT IS LEADERSHIP LINCOLN'S PURPOSE?

- To identify and develop potential leaders in business, government and the community and help prepare them for greater involvement in county affairs.
- To provide these leaders with a practical, clear and simple under standing of opportunities and problems facing Lincoln County.
- To enhance communication between future leaders and existing leadership, and improve networking among the participants.
- To increase participation and commitment in our community by meeting and exchanging ideas.

WHAT DOES LEADERSHIP LINCOLN INVOLVE?

Leadership Lincoln consists of a day and a half retreat and eight one-day seminars, plus a class project. All areas of the program are designed to present a wide range of options and perspectives that encourage thoughtful discussion through lectures, panel presentation and a variety of group activities. This process enables the participants to become visionary leaders in the community. Class participants are required to attend the opening two day retreat, at least seven

of the eight one-day seminars and participate in the class project to graduate from the program. Also, included in the graduation requirements are several out of class assignments such as attending local government meetings and board of education meetings.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

Anyone with interest in our community is welcome to apply. Participants are selected on their own merits and should meet the following criteria:

- Desire for personal growth.
- Commitment to qualify leadership in community activities.
- Desire to improve the quality of life in our community.
- Eagerness to learn about the challenges facing Lincoln County.
- The participant must live or work in Lincoln County. Leadership Lincoln will provide you with meaningful personal interaction and a learning experience for yourself and Lincoln County.



DRIVER'S LICENSE

Tests for Driver's License and/or permits are given at the Driver's License Station, 4110 Thornton Taylor Pkwy. every Monday - Friday from 8:30 A.M. - 5:00 P.M., all testing is finished by 3:30 P.M. You must furnish the car for taking the test.* You can obtain a manual to study before you take the test by going by the Driver's License Station. Applicants must show proof of US citizenship; proof of any name change; 2 proofs of TN residency with name - NO PO BOXES; proof of social security number. *Do not do road tests in bad weather.

PET LAWS

The ordinance regarding pet laws within City Limits of Fayetteville states that dogs must be confined or controlled by a leash and all pets should be given rabies shots and must wear tags indicating they have had these shots. If, for any reason, an animal needs to be picked up off of the street, one can call the Animal Control Office number, (931) 433-3726. Rabies clinics are sponsored by the Health Department during the spring of each year and are announced in the newspaper and on the local radio stations. Rabies shots are given by any of the veterinarians in the City throughout the year.

VOTING LAWS

Newcomers to the City and County may register to vote after living in the state of Tennessee as soon as they become residents. Tennessee is the only state that has no durational requirement for becoming a resident. The Election Commissioner's Office is located at 208 E Davidson Drive. Anyone who is 18 years of age or who will be 18 on the day of the next election, can register to vote. The books for voter registration are closed 30 days before an election. The hours of the Election Commission Office are 8:00 A.M. until 4:00 P.M. Monday through Friday. Any registered voter can vote early.



Property taxes are due on the first day of October of each year, and are delinquent as of the first day of March. There is a 1.5% interest rate per month and a penalty charged to any delinquent taxes. City taxes are payable at the City Clerk's Office in the Municipal Building in downtown Fayetteville. County property taxes are payable in the Trustee's Office, Room 103, at the County Courthouse.

AUTOMOBILE TAG & TITLE

If you have moved to this area from outside of the state, you need to apply for a title and a Tennessee license plate. You should make the purchase as soon as possible. These licenses may be obtained from the County Court Clerk's Office, Room 102, in the Lincoln County Courthouse. The office is open Monday - Friday 8:00 A.M. - 4:00 P.M., and open the last Saturday of the month from 9:00 A.M.-12:00 Noon. You must also purchase a wheel tax sticker, which is \$110 per year. Registration and proof of insurance must be in the glove box of the vehicle at all times.

Lincoln County has a rich agricultural heritage. With forty Century Farms in the county, the oldest established in 1818, agriculture has been a way of life for generations of families. The Lincoln County Fair is a celebration that honors agricultural producers - past, present, and future. Throughout the seven-day event, there are livestock shows, horse races, carnival rides, pageantry, and much more. At the last fair, there were even dinosaur races!

The Darrell Hale Agriculture Building and Creative Living Building features exhibits by local 4H and FFA students, farmers, and gardeners who have worked hard all year to grow, sew and create works that showcase their talent and skills. Competitors vie for blue ribbons and other awards in a wide array of categories from creative writing, cartooning and computer technology to field crops, sewing, and canning.

At the Farmer for a Day display, children ages 8 and under can learn what it's like to be a farmer, and where some of their food comes from. Children can collect eggs, milk "Daisy" the cow and gather produce, sell their crops and spend the proceeds on a well-deserved snack. The Lincoln County Fair is the only harness race track in Tennessee and it is sanctioned by the United States Trotting Association, the governing body of harness racing. People travel great distances for the chance to see these graceful horses run the half-mile track. This form of horse racing dates back to 1889. In a harness race, a Standardbred horse harnessed to a two-wheeled cart called a sulky carries a driver (not to be mistaken for a jockey). Together, they

travel at speeds averaging 25-30 miles per hour. The beauty of these horses in full stride is a sight to behold, one that will have you coming back to the fair year after year.

The grandstand events begin on Saturday night September 18th, with a concert by a major touring music act and close on the following Saturday, September 25th with the loud roars and bangs of the demolition derby. The midway provides hours of fun for the whole family. Try your luck at the game booths or take a ride on one of the carnival attractions that are just your speed. A rainbow of sweet treats such as cotton candy and caramel apples are sure to satisfy your sweet tooth. For something more substantial, there are plenty of opportunities to feast at the fair.

There is something for everyone to enjoy at the Lincoln County Fair. Whether it is watching the rodeo; demolition derby; tractor pulls; monster truck show; livestock shows; pageants; big-name stars on the entertainment stage, or holding the winning ticket for one of the big giveaways, it's always exciting and fun. There is also a shuttle service available for people who are in a wheelchair, small children, handicapped individuals, and seniors.

Through the years and the changes, one thing remains true, the Lincoln County Fair is community. It's a place to meet new friends and rekindle old acquaintances. It also serves as a homecoming for many families. Thanks to the volunteer fair board members and devoted citizens that work yearround, and the sponsors, the Lincoln County Fair will come to life once again on September 18th through the 25th, 2021 Save the date now for this authentic slice of Americana.





As you drive through Lincoln County's beautiful rolling hills with hues in every shade of green and pass by fields of corn or pastures dotted with livestock peacefully grazing, you are witnessing the community at its source.

Getting to know a place is not only about seeing the attractions. It's also about getting off the beaten path, meeting the people who live here, and discovering their livelihoods and passions. Agri-tourism offers such an experience. It's an authentic view into the lives of the stewards of the land — people deeply invested in place. They are the families, the growers, the producers, the makers, and most of all the locals. Meeting the families who plant the seeds and care for the animals gives us a renewed sense of gratitude and awe for a way of life that is at the heart of Lincoln County.

Henry's Family Farm

Henry's Family Farm specializes in authentic Jamaican hot sauces, vegan desserts, and beautiful cut flowers in a rainbow of colors. Toussaint and Kenesha Henry, and their two children, Brianna and Isaiah, grow their organic produce and flowers on a 15-acre farm south of Fayetteville. Originally from Jamaica, the family settled in Lincoln County when Toussaint came out of the military after being stationed in nearby Huntsville. They grow a variety of organic produce, including kale, peppers, cabbage, zucchini, green beans, and so much more. "We strongly believe in healthy soil, healthy

families, and healthy communities," Kenesha shares. They also offer a CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) beginning in March and ending on Thanksgiving. A CSA is a partnership between the farm and the neighboring community. Members purchase a "share" and receive biweekly fresh seasonal produce delivery throughout the designated time frame. What is their favorite thing about owning a family farm? "We love the scenery and being able to connect with nature. It's so peaceful," Kenesha says.

Pasture-raised, dry-aged beef, heritage pastured pork, and lamb are what Pilaroc Farms brings to the table. Owners Walt Patrick and Jennie Schutte-Patrick, with the help of a qualified team of professionals, also known as their children Wyatt, Tensie, and Colyar (ages 11, 6, and 3), are doing their best to remind folks how great meat is supposed to taste.

In 2020, Pilaroc expanded its operation to meet the increasing demand. However, they also had an even bigger picture in mind. They wanted to share their love of agriculture and livestock."We wanted a place where people can get their kids outside and see animals being animals, on a working farm," Jennie shares.

Their new vision is already taking shape in the form of weekend farm tours, which allow visitors an up-close view of cows, pigs, and sheep. However, keep in mind, this isn't a petting zoo. It's a working farm, and education is the first item of business. Tours provide an opportunity to learn about what the animals eat and how they spend their days. The Marketplace, a new retail store located on the farm, opened in 2021.

In the future, there are plans for day camps where students can experience hands-on learning. Farm to Table dinners featuring notable chefs and Pilaroc meats prepared to perfection are also on the agenda. Eventually, the Marketplace will include a custom USDA-inspected further processingcustom kitchen, where they will make their own bacon, jerky, salami, and more.

Buckley Farm

Pasture-raised pork and chicken, free-range eggs, seasonal vegetables, fresh-cut flowers, and handcrafted goat milk soaps and skincare products are a few of the things you'll find at the Buckley Farm Store. For Eli and Jessica Buckley, and their four children, life on the farm is good. They raise Berkshire hogs using an agroforestry practice known as silvopasture, a system that integrates trees, pasture, and forage. The system mutually benefits both the land and the animals. It allows the hogs to forage on fresh grass, grubs, and nuts, adding a unique flavor and marbling to the meat. Chickens rotate from pasture to pasture, which gives

them plenty of exercise and access to fresh grass and bugs. The natural and stress-free lives of the animals raised at Buckley Farm results in packaged meats and eggs with exceptional flavor. It's a hands-on family farm where nothing is wasted -- even their vegetables are grown with natural compost made on the farm. "Our goal for our farm and farm store is to provide Lincoln County and the surrounding areas another option for quality meat, produce, and other products, grown or made by local artisans," Jessica says."Knowing your farmer and where and how your food is grown is an important part of keeping our community strong and growing."

Visit the Buckley Farm Store, located 2 miles from the Fayetteville Square at 25 Boonshill Road, on Thursdays from 3:30-5:30 pm. They also offer a farm-todoorstep delivery service.

Dennison's Family Farm


When you see Dennison's Little Red House in Fayetteville, you'll know that strawberry season has arrived, and it's time to celebrate. Dennison Family Farm is a 3-generation farm in Elora that grows some of the sweetest, most fragrant, mouth-watering strawberries you'll ever taste. Overall, the farm includes over 50 acres of fruits and vegetables. However, it's their strawberries that steal the show. Six days a week, from late-April through June, you can find their bright Little Red Houses set up at three different locations, where they sell their delicious strawberries by the basketful.

As with any crop, a good harvest depends on the weather. For Dennison's strawberries, the ideal growing season is cold weather through February and then a gradual warm-up. A chilly winter keeps the plants from blooming too soon and promises a good crop in the Spring. Strawberries thrive with clear skies and warm sunny days. On the farm, a deep well provides the berry plants with just the right amount of water through a drip-water system. They also use over seven acres of fabric row covers for late-season frost or freeze protection. As the strawberries ripen, a skilled crew harvests the berries at their peak flavor. The short window of strawberry season lasts only about two months, so make plans now to enjoy this seasonal treasure. The Dennison Farm also grows a fall crop of pumpkins.

Where to find them

Beginning in late April, look for the Little Red House at 1200 Huntsville Hwy in front of the River Oaks Shopping Center in Fayetteville. There is also a Little Red House located in Decherd, TN, and one in Madison, AL. Follow @ Dennison's Family Farm on Facebook.



ABOVE **&BEYOND**

The Lincoln County Health Department and First Responders do whatever it takes to meet the needs of the community, one day at a time

This past year, the COVID-19 outbreak has required us all to make difficult adjustments. However, for first responders and healthcare workers, it has meant much more than making a few adjustments — in reality, everything has changed. Our deepest gratitude goes out to the Fayetteville City Police and Fayetteville Fire Departments; Lincoln County Sheriff's Department; Lincoln Health System; Lincoln Medical Center Ambulance Service; Lincoln County Health Department; Lincoln County Volunteer Fire Department; first responders; frontline workers; and many others who went above and beyond the call of duty throughout challenging and uncertain times. For all of these workers, providing essential services through a public health crisis has required long hours, late nights, and at times, an overwhelming workload. However, their willingness to go the extra mile has not gone unnoticed. Through everyday acts of service and kindness, they continue to be an encouraging source of hope and a shining example of what it means to serve one another in love.

FIRST RESPONDERS

If you have ever dialed 911 or needed immediate help in an emergency, you've met a first responder. Whether it's a fire, a car accident, or a medical emergency, they are the first ones on the scene — the law enforcement officers, firefighters, and the Emergency Medical Service (EMS). First responders are heroic men and women who make it their business to take immediate action in a time of need.

Doug Campbell, Director of the Lincoln County Emergency Management Office, understands better than most how everyone has had to make adjustments on how they do things due to COVID. "Each response that we are called to (fire, car wreck, medical, etc.) can require different levels of PPE (Personal Protective Equipment), so the mask became part of the "any call" response. We also implemented additional cleaning processes into our SOP's (standard operating procedures)," Doug shares. "On the EMA (Emergency Management Agency) side of the office, the additional workload has, at times, almost been overwhelming," he adds. "These adjustments hopefully have helped us to become better at taking care of one anothe."

Every responder has to consider not only protecting the individual but themselves and their fellow responders. Even after their work is done, they have to take extra precautions when they get in their vehicle to go home, so they don't carry the virus back to their family. "While some may say this is part of the job, our county fire [department] is a volunteer fire department. No one is paid anything for responding, training, cleaning, or whatever the need is. This makes getting up and going to something even more special when you consider that each one is doing this because they want to and not because they have to," Doug explains. "I would have to say that all of our emergency services have embraced this issue, rolled up their sleeves, and went to work."

LINCOLN COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Public health is for everyone. It's a service that empowers people with information and education about making healthy decisions, like eating right, exercising, and quitting smoking. It also provides the community with access to a broad range of services that promote a healthy lifestyle, from vaccines, nutritional programs, doctors, and much more.

On a typical day, providing such services was all in a day's work for Pam Browning, Public Health County Director for Lincoln, Coffee, and Moore counties. However, these days, there is no such thing as a typical day. For Pam and her staff, daily responsibilities now include curbside service, outdoor drivethru testing for COVID infection, and administering COVID

vaccines. "We've had to adjust our day-to-day operations to work with those environmental changes to ensure the safety of our patients and staff," Pam says."Keep in mind that the traditional work of public health did not cease because of this pandemic. We have had to be innovative in finding ways to continue services while also taking extra steps with sanitizing, masking, and social distancing," she adds.

Through hot summer heat and cold winter days, the Lincoln County Health Department does its best to keep the community as healthy as possible. "Everyone realizes the importance of this work. They volunteer to stay late and work weekends and holidays because they know what we do is saving lives," Pam comments.











Parks & Fun

Don Davidson/Lions Club Complex

The complex has 5 softball fields and 1 baseball field. It has a newly built dog park with water stations and has a divided area to separate dogs from each other. It has a lake with a nature walking trail around it which leads into the woods below it, where you can walk around the lower perimeter of the complex.

Easter Eggstravaganza

The Easter Eggstravaganza is the Easter egg hunt celebration! Hosted at Don Davidson Ballfield, the Eggstravaganza includes bounce houses, face paintings, prize drawings and more.

Facilities: Tennis Courts, Gun Range, Skate Park

The tennis courts are available to the public 24 hours a day. You are asked, if using the courts at night to make sure you turn off the lights when leaving the courts. The gun range has three different shooting areas: two are for pistols only, one roughly 30 yards and the other roughly 50 yards. The rifle targets are roughly 100 yards. Shotguns cannot be shot at our targets, and you must bring and set up your own targets. Keys can be purchased at the Recreation Center during business hours to go to the range. A daily pass is \$3 per person or a yearly pass is \$30 per person.

TWRA stocks the Stone Bridge Park pond with 2,500 pounds of catfish in preparation for the event.

Kid's Park

Located next to the Kiwanis Baseball Field, Kid's Park is an enclosed space that offers many different type of outdoor equipment for children to enjoy. This park became available due to numerous contributions from the community, along with a state recreation grant. This park has pavilions and benches throughout the perimeter of the park to help parents keep a good view of their children.

Kiwanis Park

The Kiwanis Park is nestled in the sub-divisions of Fayetteville, right behind Ralph Askins Elementary School. This area provides easier access for children to play after school, and has a wide area away from any major roads. The park offers wide spaces and event pavilions, with access to public restrooms.

Kiwanis Recreation Field

There are two baseball fields at this facility. One is a Little League field and below it is the Pee Wee field. Around and below the field is a asphalt, lighted, walking track that circles them and kids park. There are restrooms located at the facility. There is also a batting cage and skateboard park beside the little league field.

TN Promise & tnAchieves

Clearing obstacles and leading the way to a brighter future

TN Promise provides every graduating high school senior in the state the opportunity to attend a local community or technical college tuition-free with mentor support. Students apply during their senior year, attend two mandatory meetings and complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to remain eligible for the scholarship. More than 67,000 students from the Class of 2020 applied for the scholarship.

TN Promise is one initiative of Gov. Haslam's Drive to 55 Alliance — a mission to get 55 percent of Tennesseans equipped with a college degree or certificate by the year 2025. According to predictions, that goal will be reached well ahead of the deadline. Since the program's launch in 2014, TN Promise has accepted more than 170,000 students and placed more than 33,000 students into college with assistance from the scholarship. Data from the first year of the program indicates that TN Promise students are graduating at a rate almost three times their peers at the same institutions. Program administrators believe eliminating the financial barrier, coupled with support from a mentor, is the reason students are graduating at significantly higher rates.

Most of the TN Promise applicants will be the first in their family to go to college. Understanding that many obstacles can exist for first-generation college students, each applicant is assigned a volunteer mentor. Volunteer mentors provide the guidance and encouragement students often need to be successful. tnAchieves mentors support students as they navigate the college-going process and provide the nudges many need to earn a college credential.

tnAchieves has begun its effort to recruit 9,000 volunteer mentors to meet its goal of providing every TN Promise applicant from the Class of 2021 with a local support system. The time commitment is small, only about one hour per month, but the impact is significant. New volunteers are needed every year. The organization provides a one-hour training session, a handbook, and weekly communication to ensure the mentor is fully equipped to serve his/her students.







"Student success is the rudder that pilots Motlow's mission. Every vision, plan, and investment we make pivots on its ability to advance student success. Emerging technologies are a market reality in industry. That means all Motlow students must demonstrate technical acumen."

The College features Virtual Reality Labs inside libraries in both Moore County and Smyrna. Locating technologies in library spaces improve accessibility, engagement, and organic student exploration. XR technologies are multi-modal, crosscurriculum tools that accommodate both broad exposures to new topics, and deep learning of targeted subjects.

A student's introduction to XR could be through gaming, teleconferencing, virtual tourism, or guided exercise. Motlow's vision is for XR to help students learn more deeply in the classroom, engage new technologies across the spectrum of their careers, and use technology to advance their business ideas.

"The goal is to embed and infuse a variety of technologies in classrooms, across curriculum, into non-credit training, and to make it accessible in exploration spaces outside of formal learning environments," said Dr. Tony Millican, chief learning officer. "This is not a vision for the future, but rather our binding, present-day obligation to student success. We want XR to fuel student success, community development, economic development, and entrepreneurism," added Torrence.

Motlow is also developing public/private partnerships and using philanthropic grants to fund maker-spaces to fuel and inspire the deep learning required for high-wage, high-demand technology careers. Recent technology-related additions at Motlow include:

- College-wide infrastructure upgrades
- New Articulation Agreements with universities in technical fields such as mechatronics, agriculture, and engineering.

Motlow's Moore County campus is nestled on 187 acres halfway between Tullahoma and Lynchburg just off Highway 55. The tree-filled, picturesque setting is home to Motlow's original campus, with additional campuses in Smyrna, McMinnville, and Fayetteville with a growing Sparta location. The College opened in fall 1969 with 551 students. In fall 2019, Motlow set a new enrollment record with over 7,000 students.






