## THINK TICKS!

Ticks spread disease. Take steps to protect yourself and your family.

## How to Avoid Ticks

- Wear light-colored clothing to spot ticks easily.
- Wear enclosed shoes, long pants and a long-sleeved shirt. Tuck pant legs into socks or boots and shirt into pants.
- Check clothes and skin often for ticks while outdoors.
- Use insect repellent.
- Stay on cleared, well-traveled trails. Walk in the center of trails. Avoid dense woods and bushy areas.
- Bathe or shower within 2 hours after going indoors to wash off and easily find ticks.
- Do a full-body tick check at the end of the day and remove ticks right away.


## How to Remove a Tick

- Using fine tipped tweezers, grasp the tick near mouthparts as close to skin as possible.
- Pull tick in an upward, steady motion away from skin.
- Clean the bite site with soap and water, rubbing alcohol, or hydrogen peroxide.
- Record date and location of tick bite. If a rash or flu-like symptoms appear, contact your health care provider as soon as possible.
- The risk of Lyme disease is lower if the tick is removed within 24-36 hours.

## Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week twenty-four of our study of the United States Constitution. Article IV - Section 4 - Clause 1 reads "The United States shall guarantee to every State in this Union a Republican Form of Government, and shall protect each of them against Invasion; and on Application of the Legislature, or of the Executive (when the Legislature cannot be convened) against domestic Violence."

You have read many of my articles in the past emphasizing that we are a "republic" and not a "democracy". Our founding fathers wanted us to have a republican form of government and not a democracy.

A few weeks ago I quoted several opinions of democracy of our founding fathers and how a democracy has always shown itself to self-destruct into anarchy. Many supposed conservative Republicans often refer to our form of government as a democracy which demonstrates that they are either ignorant of our Constitution or actually wish our country to be a democracy.
The primary purpose of the federal government is to protect the United States of America from invasion and not for all the liberal social programs which are draining our financial resources. This clause restates what an earlier clause stated that the Congress has the authority to declare war and not the Executive Branch unless there is an imminent threat of an invasion.

Apparently the Congress does not understand this fact as they have ignored past Presidents who declared war unilaterally and therefore limited the concept of their military encounters to merely conflicts and not actual declared wars. Our Congress needs to wake up and assert themselves as to their responsibility and authority.
Article V - Section 1 - Clause 1 reads "The Congress, whenever two thirds of both Houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose Amendments to this Constitution, or, on the Application of the Legislatures of two thirds of the several States, shall call a Convention for proposing Amendments, which, in either Case, shall be valid to all Intents and Purposes, as Part of this Constitution, when ratified by the Legislatures of three fourths of the several States, or by Conventions in three fourths thereof, as the one or the other Mode of Ratification may be proposed by the Congress; Provided that no Amendment which may be made prior to the Year One thousand eight hundred and eight shall in any Manner affect the first and fourth Clauses in the Ninth Section of the first Article; and that no State, without its Consent, shall be deprived of its equal Suffrage in the Senate."
Congress can propose Amendments to the Constitution with two thirds of both Houses in agreement. When two thirds of all fifty states request a Convention regarding a proposed Amendment to the Constitution, Congress must comply and hold such a convention. Three fourths of all the state legislatures must ratify any proposed amendments for them to become part of the Constitution.

As I mentioned previously, the representative from South Carolina to the Second Continental Congress would not sign the Constitution if the abolition of slavery was included. He promised that slavery would be abolished within twenty years which was the reason for the year 1808 being included. This eventually led to our Civil War. There are currently twenty- seven Amendments to our Constitution.

Next week, Lord willing, we will continue the study of our Constitution.

## Dear "Speak Out,"

It saddens me to think that our Nunda Community has been duped and led on with false hopes, regarding the issue brought before the Village Planning Board, concerning the application of a Dollar Tree store to be built across the street from Nunda Shop and Save, and the existing Dollar General.

The first I heard of this was when I saw a petition opposing the proposed business that Cindy Wolfe, owner of our grocery store, placed in the lobby, with hundreds of signatures, in early July. I was under the assumption that the Planning Board was "considering" this, and welcomed input from local citizens.

WRONG. It seems like the Planning Board had already made up its mind to accept this application because it was submitted in the proper format. I definitely do not understand how Planning Boards conduct their business, but it would seem to me that its purpose is to serve the NEEDS of the community and exert discrimination in what it decides is beneficial to the welfare of the citizenry.

In this case, and probably others, it seems like community opinions do not matter AT ALL. The Board has become a rubber stamp in that the members are bound by law to accept whatever comes along, just because the paperwork was satisfied.
I am appalled that no one in authority can make a sensible decision - perhaps for fear of being sued?

I went to 2 subsequent meetings, and both were a waste of time. In the weeks ensuing I have spoken with dozens of people, and NOT A SINGLE PERSON has told me that allowing The Dollar Tree in, is a good idea.
We are only harming an ESSENTIAL business by allowing a store duplicating Dollar General's stock, to compete even further. Why are we turning our back on Cindy and her brave, faithful staff, who served us unwaveringly during the pandemic, with courtesy, cheer, resolve and courage?

Will a distant corporate CEO half-way across the country even CARE about our citizens? Of course not!
One of the rallying cries since the pandemic has been, "Buy American." A grocery store does bring in some imported fresh fruits and vegetables, but most of its products are American made. The Dollar stores are full of what I term "Cheap imported junk, and you can fill in the blank as to where it comes from. It is a sad day when we are "compelled" to allow whatever business decides to rear its ugly head in our area, "just because they crossed the t's and dotted the i's."

This should have been stopped at the first inquiry. Yes, it is time to get the laws updated and maybe put teeth in them, so another fiasco just looming around the corner, will not happen again. I have a mind to send the Planning Board my bill for $\$ 11$ in gas money and wear and tear on my car, for every trip I would have to make to Dansville, in the eventuality of Shop and Save closing.
Meanwhile, I do not understand how the Hornel Tribune can be the "official" paper for Nunda news, when I don't know a single person who subscribes to it.

Thank you, Mount Morris Shopper, for giving us a voice, when it is obvious that we have no voice in the Planning Board meetings. It's a façade and it makes me angry that hundreds of voices are being ignored.
