# Foxfire Farm provides secure storage

Tyler Luedtke has always had a fascination with business.

After watching his family members be involved with business throughout his upbringing, he began his own business taking pictures in high school. Now Luedtke has just graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater with a degree in Finance, International Business and Sales, and has been helping run Foxfire Farm, his family's farm and storage facility, since 2020.

"In some sense I've always sort of been an entrepreneur," Luedtke said. "I grew up in the Plymouth area and started a little side gig taking photos in high school. I've always loved business, and then to have the opportunity for a hands-on experience like this is amazing and I am really enjoying meeting customers, talking to them and having the opportunity to build connections with them."

Foxfire Farm specializes in storing boats, RVs and cars in both heated and unheated spaces, depending on customers' preference. The facility has been open since 2020 and has over 30,000 square feet of storage space along with 14-foot doors to make sure people can get almost anything in the building.

"The storage idea came from talking to community members and friends and asking, 'Hey, what do you see a need for here? What would you like?' Being situated directly between Crystal Lake and Elkhart Lake, we thought this would be an awesome addition to the community, and to serve the local boat owners," Luedtke said. "Then, with that, we thought, why limit it to boats? We could accommodate RVs and cars as well."

## Cleaning up the building

Luedtke and his family had been eyeing the building for a few years before taking the plunge and deciding to clean up the existing barns to allow for storage in the unused space. They were looking for something with the idea that it could be a family endeavour, he said. After cleaning it up and repairing the facility, not only did they have a new business, but the area had one more nice building.

"It was an old horse facility that had sat vacant for a few years and it had sort of fallen into disrepair," Luedtke said. "There was a lot that went into cleaning it up and making it presentable. We heard from many people in the community it had sort of turned into this eyesore and so our goal was to clean it up, make it look presentable, make it look like it fits in with the Elkhart Lake community."

Last year, Foxfire Farm reached capacity with customers coming from all over the state to store their boats, RVs or other vehicles at the facility. He said the numberone thing he finds that customers like is that there is someone keeping an eye on their property when they cannot be there.

"The big thing we heard was that people like the idea of being able to bring their unit, drop it off, and have it in a secure location that somebody else is keeping an eye on it as well," Luedtke said. "When it comes to mini storage units you're sort of on your own. But with us being there, we're able to have more of a personal interaction and build some awesome relationships with our customers which I don't think you can get anywhere else."

There are no set prices, but rather it depends on what people want to store. Prices are based on how large the boat,

RV or vehicle is. Foxfire Farms works hard to provide the best bang for a person's buck, and in most instances will have very competitive prices compared to other storage companies, he said. Questions about pricing and availability can be directed to Luedtke at 920-918-2656.

"We really do our best to work with the community and try to serve everybody as best as we can," Luedtke said.

## Farm operation as well

Foxfire Farm has truth in their name. The reason they call the storage facility a farm is because the land surrounding it doubles as a farm operation for him and his family. Outside of taking care of boats and vehicles while in storage, there are two things in which Luedtke prides himself. The first is his dedication to customer service, the second is his passion for Elkhart Lake.

As a young, local entrepreneur, Luedtke is aiming to do his best for his family and especially his community. He loves what he does, and at the age of 22, he is doing his best to enjoy running a business.

"I like the aspect of being young, of being able to serve the community and really have fun with it at the end of the day," Luedtke said.

As someone raised in the community, he said he is lucky to have grown up in a small town with community members who helped him. He said he hopes to be able to give back one day, and his first step is by helping to run a local business that benefits the surrounding economy.

"I graduated from Plymouth High School in 2017, and coming through high school I had a lot of opportunities to work with local businesses on various projects," Luedtke said. "There were an abundance of generous business owners in our community who were very willing to give back, something very characteristic of our community. They acted as awesome role models for me, and I'm hoping in my life that I can mirror that by continuing to work in the community, give back, and just be someone people know they can trust and rely on."

# Ownership putter passed at business

Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce member Tom & Jerry's Mini Golf & Batting Cages held a unique "passing of the putter" ribbon cutting celebration Thursday, July 15 to celebrate the transition of this family business from its retiring founders, Tom and Jerry Wieser, to the McMullen family.

Cutting the ribbon on behalf of the Mc-Mullen family was Shea McMullen, surrounded by her parents, Mark and Sarah, her brothers Keegan and Reilly, Jerry and Mary Wieser, Tom and Terri Wieser, Dennis McMullen, Stephanie Wieser, and members of the community. The ribbon cutting commemorated the original grand opening of Tom & Jerry's on July 16, 1994, and kicked off a 27th anniversary celebration featuring weekend mini golf specials.

"Our family is excited to carry on the Wieser's legacy of providing family fun," said new owner Sarah McMullen. "We feel blessed to have had such great support from the Wieser families as we have made this transition, and are extremely grateful for the community's warm welcome and overwhelmingly positive response to the updates we have made."

Jerry Wieser recollected the years prior to building Tom & Jerry's how he, Mary, Tom and Terri would mini golf with their young families every time they were on vacation, and would casually talk about opening a course in Plymouth. In a 1994 Sheboygan Press article just prior to their grand opening, Jerry said, "The city needed it. The whole county needed it." The brothers designed every hole themselves, embracing the natural terrain and elements of the property, and began construction in September 1993. It was clear soon after the opening of the Shady Trails course in July 1994 the brothers had, in fact, fulfilled a community desire, and they made plans during the off season to expand.

## Batting cages added

In 1996, the Wiesers added batting cages on the opposite side of the property as the mini golf course. It featured a unique monopole "big top" design and six automated, token-operated pitching machines, three for baseball at various speeds and three for softball. In their first summer season, Tom Wieser shared in an article in Plymouth's The Review, "We've had good compliments on the variety of pitching speeds. It'll capture the Pee Wees on up to the Flames." Today, Tom & Jerry's sports 45 and 55 MPH baseball lanes, three slow pitch softball lanes, and a new 50 MPH fastpitch softball lane. "The fastpitch lane has been a really popular addition.... We've seen not only girls from Plymouth, but from all of the neighboring communities," McMullen noted. "We're pleased to have filled an additional need for our local athletes."

"In May, after letting their imaginations run wild, Tom and Jerry expanded their mini golf course to include a second 18-hole course and clubhouse," reported The Sheboygan Press in 1998. The Stoney Creek course fit like a puzzle piece between the original Shady Trails course and the batting cages. Showcasing the talents of Tom, a skilled cabinetmaker, and Jerry, a skilled plumber, the new course featured a water wheel and an 850-gallon stream running through it, offering additional interest and obstacles. The gentlemen constructed it to stand the test of time, and Mary, a horticulturalist, and Terri, an avid gardener, ensured the landscape would





change with the seasons. "The courses are as beautiful as they are challenging," commented McMullen. "The landscape literally changes daily, with new blooms, scents and wildlife making each visit a unique experience."

Encouraged by the Wieser families to make Tom & Jerry's their own, the Mc-Mullens' freshened the look of the course as soon as the weather broke this spring, requiring the whole family to get involved. In mid-March, RPM Yard Care LLC, also owned and operated by the McMullens, safely extracted 43 dead ash trees from the Shady Trails course, the victim of emerald ash borer. Then, at Shea's prompting, they spent the unseasonably warm Easter weekend together painting the buildings an eye-catching national anthem blue, a bold backdrop for their fun and colorful new logo. By mid-April, with the help of Marshall Sign of Plymouth and Sparkworks Marketing of Chilton, they debuted their new look on the buildings and online. Finally, GT Graphics of Sheboygan made sure Tom & Jerry's new print materials were ready for their season opening April 30. "It was a whirlwind labor of love," McMullen said. "It made me smile to think about what it must've been like for the Wiesers to work together as a family to prepare for their first season."

#### Working together almost daily

Now in the heart of the summer, Sarah and Shea enjoy working together nearly every day, whether they're prepping the course for play, tending to the gardens, maintaining the pitching machines, or greeting customers. "Having my daughter as my partner is a mother's dream," Sarah said. "Our time together is simply irreplaceable, and I particularly like brainstorming and implementing new ideas together." They are currently working on a concept called "Silly Saturdays" that will introduce some fun and interactive challenges to mini-golf play on these special days. Follow Tom & Jerry's on Facebook to keep up with special events and new introductions.

Shea said she especially enjoys interacting with customers. "I even enjoy their smiles when they come back to the counter to get a new ball because they lost theirs in the pond," she said. "I can't help but laugh the next day when I'm pulling 105 golf balls out of the pond." Also an avid fastpitch softball player, Shea also likes watching (and sometimes helping) younger players improve their hitting when they practice at Tom & Jerry's. "I've really gotten to know some of our regular hitters," Shea said. "It's fun to wish them good luck on their way out, and to find out how well they did at their game when they come back."

Besides Shea, Tom & Jerry's employs 13 other part-time student team members, and the McMullens consider themselves fortunate to have a great mix of new and returning team members in her first season. "It's really rewarding to be a student employer, and to coach and watch them grow in confidence with customers," Sarah said. "Each one of these fantastic youth and young adults helps to make the Tom & Jerry's experience special."

After the ribbon cutting, the group enjoyed an old fashioned ice cream social complete with orange push-ups and ice cream sandwiches on the deck at Shady Trails, mingling with the families and looking at photographs and newspaper clippings from the previous 27 years. During the event, McMullen shared her favorite thing about owning Tom & Jerry's. "Joy has a sound," she said. "It's the sound of giggling kids, friends and families cheering a hole in one, and the crack of the bat when the ball's hit just right. I don't think I'll ever get tired of hearing it."

## Lakeshore Tech swears in new board members

The Lakeshore Technical College Board of Trustees swore in two new board members and one incumbent board member who began their terms at the board's annual organizational meeting July 12.

The Board of Trustees also elected officers for the next term.

LTC has an appointed board consisting of nine members—two employer members, two employee members, three additional members, one elected official member who holds a state or local office, and one school district administrator. Three members are appointed to the LTC Board of Trustees each year by a committee comprised of the county board chairs of the counties making up the Lakeshore district—Sheboygan, Manitowoc, Calumet and Ozaukee. Terms for the three board members sworn in July 12 expire June 30, 2024.

Curt Brauer, business representative for the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 494, serves as an employee member. He leads strategic planning efforts to communicate organizational priorities and mobilizes stakeholders to advocate for labor-friendly legislation on the local, state and federal levels. With applications to Lakeshore Technical College (LTC) for this coming fall at a level not seen by the college since 2012-2013, interest in gaining an education appears to be on the rise in the lakeshore area.

Applications are up 38 percent over this past school year.

"This significant increase in applications tells us lakeshore area residents are not only seeing the value in obtaining an education today, but also doing so close to home," said LTC President Dr. Paul Carlsen. "Many of our students are working and raising families while attending LTC. Being able to gain a high-quality education close by is important to them."

Carlsen stated other reasons for the increases may include the fact LTC has been offering in-person learning since last fall and recently announced guaranteed inperson learning for fall 2021. In addition, the college's streamlined admissions process does not require testing or high school transcripts, and there is no application fee. Applications for fall 2021 are still being accepted.

# **RA win...50 years later** DeMay looks back on taking checkered flag in '71 race

The Road America race track has a special place in the heart of Elkhart Lake resident Ron DeMay, as it does for many other residents and racing fans throughout the world.

Not many of those fans can say that they were once behind the wheel of a race car which came in first place in a race at Road America—but DeMay can.

This year marks the 50th anniversary of his first victory at the track, but it was not an easy path for DeMay to even be allowed to race at Road America.

"As a child I loved race cars," he said. "Dad took me to Soldier Field to watch stock cars. In 1963 I bought a MGA and joined a group of friends, all who had British sports cars. That's how Road America became part of my life. My best friend Jerry Sabul commented as we sat on Fireman's Hill turn 12, 'We can do this.' I agreed and six years later I was attempting to obtain my SCCA National Competition license to race at Road America."

DeMay added, "I had the national license in 1971. We were now with Ricon Racing Formula Vee #21. As the month of May rolled around there was no Driver Entry Form for me. I called Chicago Region registrar and she told me, off the record, I would not receive one. Apparently the leaders of The Chicago Region SCCA decided I did not fit the image— their image—that race at this wonderful event.

"My racing partner Burt Richmond contacted two members of the Chicago Region, Frank Issacson and F. Sturavent who met with me to resolve this issue. Well, long story short—they were successful in changing some minds and I received the paperwork and was able to register.

"So June Sprints 1971 was my first race at Road America. Burt won the race and I finished 10th. Then there was to be the first Regional Race ever held there, The Kettle Moraine Regional, September 1971. I applied with no problem, won the pole position, and led each lap and won the race! So my determination came full circle. I raced there two more times, The June Sprints in 1972 finishing seventh and then The Kettle Moraine Regional that same year as defending champion, settling for fourth place. A long story for another time."

DeMay said, "I absolutely love Road America. I have attended so many events over the years but nothing could ever compare to my winning the first Kettle Moraine Regional 1971—50 years ago!"

## STH 67 project

The State of Wisconsin contractors continue to work on STH 67. We are expecting the pulverizing and relaying of the roadway to begin in August. Many of you may notice all the new crosswalks they are constructing. They are building these to be ADA compliant for the slope, which means small curbs are being added behind the sidewalk at many of the intersections. ### **Planning Commission update**

The Planning Commission continues to approve the final plans for the new Cleveland State Bank project on STH 67. We hope that construction on the facility will begin in the fall. The Planning Commission has approved nearly all the plans and is just working through some final details. In the meantime, Cleveland State Bank is opening a temporary branch at 91 E. Rhine St. We hope to see this open in August. The commission also has been approving sign permit applications for the bank and SwitchGear.

## 2020 Water Consumer Confidence Report available

The village is always testing its water for contaminants. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the EPA prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Elkhart Lake Water Utility annually files a Consumer Confidence Report about the water quality in the village. The 2020 Consumer Confidence Report can be found at http://elkhartlakewi. gov/departments/water/, or obtained at the Village Office at 40 Pine St., Elkhart Lake, WI 53020, or can be requested by calling 920-876-2122.

### **Boating Regulations**

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "slow no wake" is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m. to 10 a.m. each day. "Slow no wake" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "slow no wake" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the "no wake" buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

6. No Sunday operation of motor driven boats, beginning the second Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 mph on the water.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc. and during the times of highvolume boat activity.

It's been a fast five years since Road America's official store, The Paddock Shop, opened its new 5,000 square foot building just in time for the 2016 Spring Vintage Weekend.

Countless events later, the store has far exceeded what the track leadership envisioned. While they knew the larger space would hold more souvenir and apparel options, the immediate surprise was the way race fans and the general public embraced the shop as a year-round shopping destination. Now in its sixth season, Road America's retail business continues to grow onsite and through e-commerce sales.

One specific success story is the popularity of items featuring images from the track's extensive archives. Retail Manager/ Buyer Julie Sebranek has found ways to make those images available in formats that appeal to different design tastes, spaces and budgets. For example, Trans-Am Series enthusiasts really appreciate 1970s-era images which are available on large banners, smaller canvases, apparel and even artisan-made purses. New images are added to the collection frequently, making fresh impressions on the track's repeat customer base.

Apparel sales also have done extremely well because of the variety and options which change frequently. What you see in the shop in May and June is completely different from what you see in July and August. A perennial fan favorite is the track-map T-shirt—thousands are sold



each season and a new version is released in time for the winter holidays. Sebranek says hats "sell like hotcakes" making the hat wall one of the most popular stops in the shop. With its extensive selection of styles and colors it meets the demands of finicky hat wearers.

Sebranek said she firmly believes the changing merchandise and unique product mix has been instrumental in spreading the Road America brand through the retail side of the business. One of her favorite parts about working in the shop is hearing people comment on the merchandise or laugh at the light-hearted novelties.

What's ahead for the Paddock Shop? More of the same, she said, things that enhance fan experience and things that make fans come back, a win-win for the track and its loyal and growing fan base.

The shop is open to the public most weekdays, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Access may be limited during race events or other track activities. Guests are encouraged to call ahead, 920-892-8116, or check with the security staff at Gate 6 on STH 67. Online shoppers may visit www.shop. roadamerica.com.

# EL Library welcomes new director

Elkhart Lake's new executive director at the Public Library is hardly a new face at the popular village facility.

Rachel Montes worked at the Elkhart Lake Public Library for seven years as a library assistant to retiring director Betty McCartney.

Montes said working in libraries "checks all the boxes" for her. She said she loves being involved in the community and has always had a deep care about children's literacy programs.

The Wisconsin native has worked in libraries since 2005 and said she is inheriting a very well-run library from Mc-Cartney.

In recent years the Elkhart Lake Library merged into the Monarch System and went through a complete renovation. During the pandemic they made several changes, noting that people did not seem to want more virtual programs. They expanded the Discovery Kids programs and introduced new services including teaching people to play the ukulele or knit, bird watching and pickle ball as examples. Montes is assisted at the ELPL by Angela Ruh, who has worked there for five years. The library also recently hired a new second assistant to complete the team.

Festival activities will kick off Wednesday night with artists using projectors to sketch mural outlines. The Plymouth Library will be the center of activities hosting an outdoor movie on Friday night. On Saturday, a portion of Division Street will be closed for entertainment and activities including a children's mural, face painting and carnival games. The Plymouth Downtown Arts and Merchants will host a brat fry along with a variety of food options.

The Plymouth Advancement Association, Inc. is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization founded in 1994 with a mission to enhance the quality of life for the residents of Plymouth and the surrounding area.
