

Where we are: Colbert County



Colbert County is named for George and Levi Colbert, noted Chickasaw chiefs who lived in the area. Tuscumbia is the county seat. Other cities in Colbert County are Muscle Shoals and Sheffield and the incorporated towns of Cherokee, Leighton and Littleville. The iconic recording studios that produced the music that put the Shoals on the map are located within Colbert County, as is the Alabama Music Hall of Fame. Colbert County's U.S. Census population estimate was 55,411.

Unincorporated but recognized communities are Barton, Colbert Heights, Ford City, Locust Shores and New Bethel. Sheffield Utilities provides electricity for unincorporated communities and most other services may be located through Colbert County.

Tuscumbia

Tuscumbia, the county seat and oldest city in Colbert County, is the home to Ivy Green, which is the birthplace of Helen Keller, often called “The First Lady of Courage.” Her childhood home is one of the area’s most popular attractions. Tuscumbia’s historic downtown district includes Spring Park, which offers a nightly water/light show and features a carousel, roller coaster and a small train that carries riders on a trip through the park. The city has a renovated railroad roundhouse that features railroad memorabilia and several railroad cars. The U.S. Census population estimate was 8,462.



Littleville is the youngest incorporated town in Colbert County, but it wasn't always a Colbert County town. It was in




The Logan Room is in the heart of historic downtown Sheffield.



The county is named in honor of Col. James Lauderdale, who died while serving with Gen. John Coffee's volunteer cavalry in the War of 1812. Florence is the county's largest municipality and

the county seat. It, too, was established in 1818. Historians said the Tennessee River, which separates Lauderdale and Colbert counties, was a major attraction in the early days and it remains a major

attraction today. The county population estimate is 93,368, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.



The fountain is dedicated to the memory of Princess Im-Mi-Ah-Key, wife of Chief Tuscumbia, for whom the city is named.





Pope’s Tavern Museum: 203 Hermitage Drive. Constructed more than 150 years ago, this facility has functioned as tavern, stage stop and Confederate hospital. The building houses a city museum with antiques and Civil War memorabilia. 256-760-6439.

Indian Mound and Museum: 1028 S. Court St. This great mound, called “Wawmanona” by the American Indians, is the largest of a number found in the Tennessee Valley. 256-760-6427.

Frank Lloyd Wright’s Rosenbaum House: 601 Riverview Drive. 256-740-8899. An Alabama jewel, the Usonian style was created by Frank Lloyd Wright during the Great Depression as an affordable option for middle-class families. Here are interesting facts about the structure

- The Rosenbaum House was the second Usonian House built by Wright. The first was the Madisonian prototype Jacobs House in Madison Wisconsin was the first, built in 1936.

- It is also the only structure designed by Frank Lloyd Wright in Alabama.

- The house was 1,540 square feet when it was built in 1939.

- After the Rosenbaum family had four sons, Wright designed an addition in 1948.

- 1,084 square feet was added to the home. Improvements included a larger kitchen, a guest bedroom, storage space and a room with four beds for the Rosenbaum children.

- Usonian’s base word is Usona, which is an anagram of United States of North

- Other Usonian homes are located in Madison, Wisconsin; Palo Alto, California; Mount Vernon, Virginia; Middleton, Wisconsin; Carmel, California; Ann Arbor, Michigan; Chattanooga, Tennessee; Seattle, Washington and Lake Dalton, Wisconsin.

- The Rosenbaum house was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1978.

- Mildred Rosenbaum lived in the Rosenbaum House longer than any other original Usonian home owner.

- The house was owned by the

Rosenbaum family until 1999 when Mildred Rosenbaum moved into a nursing home.

- The Rosenbaum family donated the house to the City of Florence and sold the furniture and contents of the house to the city for \$75,000.


- The city spent \$600,000 on repairs using original plans provided by the Wright Foundation.

- The home opened to the public as a museum in 2002.


