

## Two protesters who climbed into Enbridge pipe rescued and booked

Two protesters who climbed into an Enbridge pipeline at the Willow River crossing in Aitkin County

were rescued and taken into a trapped air environment custody on Sunday, July 25. The pipe itself was capped

at one end, which created



for the two protesters who had climbed inside. The trapped air inside the pipe was estimated to be near 130 degrees with reduced oxygen concentration according to a press release by the Northern Lights Task

A firefighter, wearing a self-contained breathing apparatus and harness, entered the pipe to attempt to remove the two people. The self-contained breathing apparatus allowed for 30

minutes of air in the tank. The firefighter reached the people in roughly 15 minutes, but they refused to exit with him and remained in the pipe with their gear. Having used 20 minutes of air, the firefighter signaled other emergency personnel and was pulled back to safety outside the pipe.

A member of the law enforcement team then donned self-contained breathing apparatus gear and entered the pipe. When he reached the two people in the pipe, he noted they were wearing respirators, but were exhibiting signs of fatigue and heat stroke. One of the two announced they had 3.5 minutes of oxygen left in their respirators. After numerous attempts to assist them in leaving the pipe voluntarily, the team member signaled there was only 5 minutes of air left. Because the people still resisted leaving the pipe, and air was running out, force was used to rig the individuals with ropes so the exterior crew could pull them out to safety.

Upon exit, both people were treated by an ambulance crew for abrasions sustained by contact with the pipe and oxygen and heat related issues.

Amory Lei Zhou-Kourvo, 21, of Ann Arbor Michigan, and Madeline Olivia Bayzaee, 20, of Northfield were taken into custody and booked into the Aitkin County Adult Detention Center. The matter has been turned over to the Aitkin County Attorney's Office for possible charges.

The Northern Lights Task Force is comprised of numerous law enforcement agencies throughout northern Minnesota and their mission statement is "To provide a safe environment that protects life, property, and free speech through a respectful approach by well trained, disciplined peace officers relating to the lawful activities conducted by those who wish to exercise their First Amendment rights in Minnesota."

## **Expanding broadband network**

The lack of High-speed Internet is an issue for many. Mille Lacs Energy Cooperative (MLEC) has announced that MLEC Fiber Internet will become available for more of their customers in 2022. The Phase 5 project will pass approximately 300 homes and businesses and will provide up to one Gbps symmetrical

Fiber-to-the-Home (FTTH) Internet service. MLEC has partnered with Consolidated Telecommunications Company (CTC) on the construction of this project which includes the west side of Farm Island Lake, runs east to Sunset Lake, then along Tame Fish Lake Road all the way to Highway 6. The

Phase 5 project will create a redundant link to CTC's existing infrastructure. This will make the fiber network stronger and prevent Internet outages.

In addition to Phase 5, MLEC Fiber has continued construction on Phase 3, Phase 4, and East Lake proj-

## Rep. Dale Lueck legislative update

The Legislature adjusted state income tax law at the end of the special session to compensate for federally tax-exempt funds that were distributed to Minnesota businesses and workers through the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) program and federal unemployment bonuses.

The changes impact the federal portion of unemployment compensation, PPP loan forgiveness, and other retroactive provisions affecting tax years 2017 through 2020. Visit the Minnesota Department of Revenue (DOR) website for updated Minnesota tax forms for tax year 2020.

If you filed a 2020 state income tax return that included unemployment compensation or PPP loan forgiveness, DOR will either adjust the return or will ask you to amend it. Here is a summary of the options.

If DOR can adjust the return, they will send a letter describing what they changed and any refund you may receive. DOR indicates they are committed to adjusting as many returns as they can.

If you will need to amend solely due to Minnesota tax law changes, wait until you hear from DOR before filing. DOR will let you know if they can adjust your return or if an amendment is needed.

If you have not yet filed a 2020 return or filed for an extension, you may file using the updated forms to claim the recently passed unemployment and PPP loan forgiveness income exclusions/deductions.

This week marked the announcement of a \$26 billion multi-state agreement with the nation's three top pharmaceutical opioid manufacturer. Minnesota's share is expected to be about \$337 million, which will be provided over the next several years.

Share clinical trial data under the Yale University Open Data Access Project.

States have 30 days to sign onto the agreement. Local governments in the participating states will have until Jan. 1, 2022, to join to secure a critical mass of participating states and local governments.


### RICHARD NORTIN


