





SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with week twenty-five of our study of the United States Constitution. Article VI – Clause 1 reads "All Debts contracted and Engagements entered into, before the Adoption of this Constitution, shall be as valid against the United States under this Constitution, as under the Confederation."

After the end of the American Revolutionary War, the Articles of Confederation were our first form of government. As a young country we had acquired some debt and had entered into some treaties. This clause was intended to affirm that our country under our new Constitution would honor those debts and treaties.

Article VI – Clause 2 reads "This Constitution, and the Laws of the United States which shall be made in Pursuance thereof; and all Treaties made, or which shall be made, under the Authority of the United States, shall be the supreme Law of the Land; and the Judges in every State shall be bound thereby, any Thing in the Constitution or Laws of any State to the Contrary notwithstanding."

This clause reinforced the concern of our founding fathers that we would become one country and that everyone in every state would adhere to any and all federal laws in our Constitution and future laws of Congress. Under the Articles of Confederation, each individual state had its own laws which often differed from other states.

Article VI – Clause 3 reads "The Senators and Representatives before mentioned, and the Members of the several State Legislatures, and all executive and judicial Officers, both of the United States and of the several States, shall be bound by Oath or Affirmation, to support this Constitution; but no religious Test shall ever be required as a Qualification to any Office or public Trust under the United States."

This clause mandated that all state and federally elected officials and judges would pledge allegiance to the United States Constitution by saying the following oath of allegiance: "I, do solemnly swear or affirm that I will support the Constitution of the United States."

This oath is used for all federal officials except the President whose oath is prescribed specifically in Article II - Section 1 - Clause 8. This clause also mandated that all state and federally elected officials and judges were not required to be a member of any religious denomination or sect. Our founding fathers did not wish to have a national religion or to insist that a person be a member of a particular religion to hold public office.

The First Amendment to the Constitution later reinforced the beliefs of our founding fathers by reading "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances."

Lord willing, we will study the Amendments to our Constitution sometime in the future, but for now, we need to understand that the First Amendment does not propose a "separation of church and state" as some liberals believe. That phrase was taken from a letter of reply from President Thomas Jefferson to the Danbury Baptists Association on Friday, January 1, 1802, which read "the legislature should 'make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof,' thus building a wall of separation between Church & State."

Next week, Lord willing, we will continue the study of our Constitution.

THINK TICKS!

Ticks spread disease. Take steps to protect yourself and your family.

How to Avoid Ticks

- Wear light-colored clothing to spot ticks easily.
- Wear enclosed shoes, long pants and a long-sleeved shirt. Tuck pant legs into socks or boots and shirt into pants.
- Check clothes and skin often for ticks while outdoors.
- Use insect repellent.
- Stay on cleared, well-traveled trails. Walk in the center of trails. Avoid dense woods and bushy areas.
- Bathe or shower within 2 hours after going indoors to wash off and easily find ticks.
- Do a full-body tick check at the end of the day and remove ticks right away.

How to Remove a Tick

- Using fine tipped tweezers, grasp the tick near mouthparts as close to skin as possible.
- Pull tick in an upward, steady motion away from skin.
- Clean the bite site with soap and water, rubbing alcohol, or hydrogen peroxide.
- Record date and location of tick bite. If a rash or flu-like symptoms appear, contact your health care provider as soon as possible.
- The risk of Lyme disease is lower if the tick is removed within 24-36 hours.


