Masks in Class at NW-SCC

MUSCLE SHOALS--Northwest-Shoals Community College will offer students online and traditional face-to-face classes this fall with the use of face coverings being required indoors on the Phil Campbell and Shoals campuses

According to NW-SCC President Dr. **Glenda Colagros**s, NW-SCC will follow the guidance of Center for Disease Control (CDC) of wearing face coverings indoors to start the fall semester. 'Our goal is to offer our students classes in a safe environment that is the most comfortable for them," said Colagross. "With our vaccination rates as a state being as low as they are and the Delta variant being so easily transmissible, we want to do our part to prevent outbreaks among our faculty, staff, and students. We are even exploring incentives for faculty, staff, and students who choose to be vaccinated."

This requirement will be for all faculty, staff, and students who are indoors and not isolated in an office setting. Masks or facial coverings are not required outdoors.

Classrooms will continue to be arranged to meet social distancing guidelines. As part of the NW-SCC COVID-19 plan, face coverings have been purchased for employees and students, and sanitization and social distancing signage has been placed on both campuses. Sanitation and cleaning protocols for each area of both campuses has also been established as part of the plan

"We will continue to carefully monitor the conditions in our area

and adjust accordingly," added Colagross.

DOES MY MOM NEED LONG-TERM CARE **INSURANCE?**

Dear Dave.

My dad passed away about a year ago, but he left my mom in really good shape financially. They never had any consumer debt, the house is paid for, and they had about \$1 million in assets. Dad also left her a \$500,000 trust. Mom is going to be 60 next year. She is in good health, but considering her age and financial situation, do you think she needs long-term care insurance? Darby

Dear Darby, I'm so sorry to hear about your dad. Losing a



spouse, or a father, is tough at any age. The good news is your dad did a great job of planning to take care of your mom. He left her in fine shape money-wise, but yes, she needs long term care insurance and a good estate planner. You need to help your mom do everything possible to handle her situation wisely.

I usually suggest folks wait until age 60 to buy long-term care insurance, because the likelihood of filing a claim before then is very slim. **In fact**, about 95% of long-term care claims are filed for people over 70. That's why, in most cases, it doesn't make sense to get long-term care insurance earlier than age 60.

Insurance isn't a one-size-fits-all kind of thing, though. If someone has a

family history of illness or other health issues at a younger age, they may need to get long-term care insurance earlier. But you shouldn't buy long-term care coverage at a young age just because you're paranoid of what might happen, or because you think you'll save money. That's just not true.

In the event your mom becomes unable to take care of herself at some point, long-term care insurance would be an absolute necessity. The cost of nursing home care these days is astronomical. Again, your mom is in a great place financially, but a prolonged stay in a nursing home somewhere down the road could eat up her nest egg in a hurry.

Long-term care insurance is a wise part of any good asset management plan. –Dave

Fun Facts Learned in Law School

You're not a lawyer until you pass the bar. The "bar" can refer to the entire legal profession, a formal portion of it, or the bar exam itself. Each state court system, federal court, and the U.S. Supreme Court is a separate bar with its own standards of admission and practice.

You can't pass the bar until you're a lawyer. A courtroom is divided into two parts by a railing or similar barrier called the bar. Only lawyers, their clients, and witnesses who are called to testify may traverse it. The use of "bar" to refer to the legal profession as a whole derives from the tradition of barring non-participants from the trial area of the courtroom.

Law school doesn't teach laws. One attends law school to learn how to think like a lawyer, not to memorize laws. Laws change; how they are properly analyzed does not.

<u>Most of what happens in a civil trial happened</u> <u>before the trial.</u> In civil cases, litigants are required to exchange information before trial. Through the discovery process, each party may depose (question under oath) the opposition and any other individuals who may provide relevant information. Consequently, each side knows the other's case well before the trial begins.

<u>A judge is also involved well before trial.</u> A judge reads pretrial pleadings and motion from the two sides, researches relevant issues, settles disputes that arise during discovery, issues warrants and summonses, and supervises jury selection. Most cases settle before trial, making pretrial work the court's main work.

Not guilty doesn't always mean innocent. In issuing a verdict of guilty, a jury asserts its belief that a criminal defendant is responsible for a crime beyond a reasonable doubt. A jury that believes a defendant is "probably guilty" must vote to acquit. A reasonable doubt must be derived rationally from the evidence, or from a lack of evidence presented by the prosecution. It cannot on sympathy for the accused, unfounded theorizing, or fanciful conjecture.

Useful evidence isn't necessarily admissible evidence.

<u>Relevance</u>: Is the evidence connected to the issues at trial? Will it make an important alleged fact in the case more or less probable?

<u>Authentication</u>: Can the evidence be shown to be what its proponent says it is? Can a proper chain of custody be shown, for example, by bringing to court police officer who found it?

<u>**Hearsay:**</u> If the source of the evidence cannot appear in court, can the evidence be admitted under a hearsay exception?

<u>**Privileges:**</u> Will any privileges (spousal, attorney-client, etc.) prevent the evidence from being admitted?

masks who oppose such mandates could choose to move their students into a school without such restrictions. Either way, families throughout Arkansas would have a choice and be able to put their children in the environment they think is best for their students' health and academic excellence. And that is what school

And that is what school choice is all about–families having the option to decide the best learning situation for their children. Many families already leverage this choice because they have the means to do so. If the public school they are zoned for doesn't align with their point of view or their expectations for a high-quality education, it's not a problem. They can afford other options.

with their point of view or their expectations for a high-quality education, it's not a problem. They can afford other options. However, what about those families without such means? Are they less deserving of choice than others based on their income? Certainly not.

Most Alabama legislators disagree. This session alone, three bills that would have given families in Alabama more choice in determining their children's education were rejected. One would have funded charter schools more equally and resulted in more charter schools (and therefore more choice) in the state. Another would have made Alabama the 48th state to allow open enrollment (North Carolina and Maryland are the only other states that don't have a statewide policy allowing out-of-district public school transfers). A final measure would have expanded choice greatly to military families, those with special needs, and adopted foster children.

None of them was as expansive as what Arkansas is considering. And none of them garnered enough support to pass even one body of the legislature, much less both.

Even with a Republican supermajority in both houses and polling showing that 80% of Alabamians support expanding school choice, Alabama is about to be left behind. While Montgomery struggles to approve minimal school choice legislation, other states with apparently more conservative legislatures are poised to offer school choice to everyone.

Think I'm exaggerating? West Virginia, a state with a Democratic U.S. Senator, adopted universal school choice just this year. Armed with positive polling and a parent population angry at restrictive Covid-requirements and the liberal social agenda present at many public schools, other state legislatures are following in their footsteps.

If this last year is any evidence, Alabama is not going to be one of those states. Not with the current legislature. Instead, Alabama legislators will likely continue to be distracted by gambling and ideas that will have a much less positive impact on our state's future than securing school choice for every single family. Meanwhile, states like West Virginia, Arkansas, Florida, South Dakota, and others are being bold in their policy proposals and making the conservative vision a reality for residents.

However, there is hope. Parents and families have massive influence over their legislators that often goes untapped. If they are unhappy with the social liberalism that is being taught in some classrooms, mask requirements, or any other reason in how schools are being run, and if they tell their representatives so, it might steer them in the right direction. And if it doesn't, there's an election year just around the corner and an opportunity to put in truly conservative lawmakers.

If, that is, we don't want to be left behind.



sister, and neighbors. By high school Cara was creating her own patterns for outerwear and dresses, and in college she was deploying both rigorous knitting techniques and boundary-pushing crochet. Her capstone project, Capturing Nature, was the central exhibition in her university's annual art show for senior students. Looking back at how she conceived of fully immersive fiber sculpture after years of following traditional Celtic and sweater Scandinavian patterns, Cara attributes her inspiration to the caverns and geological formations she explored on the Cumberland Plateau while a student at the University of the South.

Allen began her career by designing sweaters for Free People/Urban Outfitters Inc. She next moved to the mountains of Colorado where she reapplied pattern-like order to her motif of stacked, earthen material and named her business Brick Knitwear. With her vintage knitting machine that she held onto since the days of The Yarn Barn, she produced ready-to-wear accessories and sweaters.

"Layer by layer, rocks tell us of the passage of time. I began to see the connection between the knots I was forming with my hands and needles and the strata that have taken billions of years to form. Yarn is a soft, organic substance. Yet, I found myself trying to imitate stone deposits. Where I was used to patterned, mathematical construction, I looked to the hills, wind-eroded walls of caves, and punchbowl waterfalls around me to challenge the



notion that knitting had to be a linear, methodical artform".

Allen set aside her yarn and needles when other business opportunities surfaced in Dallas. However, during the COVID-19 pandemic, she, her husband, and their three dogs relocated to rural, verdant setting of Posey Mill where Allen was once again inspired by the possibility of fiber. While restoring her family's 19th century farmhouse, she came upon

a hefty industrial tufting gun and contemplated the bare walls of her husband's childhood home. Thus, the idea for this collection was born.

"Medicare Part A Part 2" Last week we discussed how Medicare Part A will cover you if you are admitted into the hospital. A hospital, under Medicare, can be acute care hospitals, critical care hospitals, inpatient rehabilitation facilities, long term care hospitals or

mental health care. The one aspect of Medicare Part A we get the most questions about is coverage at a skilled nursing facility (SNF). To be covered by Medicare at a SNF certain criteria has to be met. First, of course, is you must have Medicare Part A. Next your doctor has determined that you need daily skilled care given by, or under the supervision of, skilled nursing or therapy personnel. Your skilled nursing care will have to be in a SNF that is certified by Medicare.

What a lot of people don't know is that you must have a "qualifying" hospital stay to be covered at a SNF. Under Medicare a "qualifying" hospital stay is at least a 3-day inpatient stay prior to being admitted to the SNF. If you go to the ER and are held one day for observation and are admitted into the hospital for two days this does not constitute a "qualifying" hospital stay. If you are admitted on a Monday and discharged the following Wednesday this is not a "qualifying" hospital stay. In the two examples above those are 2-day inpatient stays. A good rule of thumb is you must be admitted as inpatient for at least three midnights.

You also need to know that Medicare Part A will only cover you for 100 days at a SNF and only 20 of those days are at 100%. In other words days 1-20 are covered at 100%. Days 21-100 you will pay the first \$185.50 per day and Medicare pays the rest of the cost. Starting with day 101 you will pay 100% of the bill
