Masking for Florence K-6

FLORENCE-Florence City Schools will require masks for any individuals inside K-6 schools beginning August 19. The decision to require masks in grades K-6 was made because children under 12 cannot receive the COVID-19 vaccination.

FCS strongly recommends the use of masks for grades 7-12. Because masks are strongly recommended and not required, contact tracing protocols will be in place for students in grades 7-12.

Exceptions to the inside masking requirement will include students involved in physical education and while eating. Faculty and staff exemptions include adults being alone in classrooms, offices, etc. Masking will not be required for individuals while outside a K-6 school building.

Florence City Schools will reevaluate its masking requirements as the 2021-2022 school year progresses. The Florence City Board of Education will have the opportunity to revisit the mask requirements for all grades as necessary.

Mixed Messages **Limit Vaccinations**

arnings are out there everywhere, but few it seems are listening. COVID-19 vaccination rates for Alabama and the Shoals are woeful. A greater susceptibility to the Delta variant makes vaccination imperative for everyone of age. Consequently, there is an ever-growing list of

opportunities and motivations to get the vaccine. Daily schedules were listed in this publication for months. Some large companies are going as far as mandating vaccinations for all employees.

Dear Savvy Senior,

I just found out I have stage 1 hypertension and my doctor recommended I get a home blood pressure monitor to keep an eye on it. Can you offer me any tips on choosing a good one? Hypertensive Helen

Dear Helen,

It's a smart idea! Everyone with elevated or high blood pressure (stage 1 and higher) should consider getting a home blood pressure monitor. Home monitoring can help you keep tabs on your blood pressure in a comfortable setting. Plus, if you're taking medication it will make certain it's working, and alert you to a health problem if it arises. Here are some tips to help you choose a good monitor. Types of Monitors

The two most popular types of home blood pressure monitors sold today are automatic arm monitors, and automatic wrist monitors that are electric and/or battery powered.

With an automatic arm monitor, you simply wrap the cuff around your bicep and with the push of one button the cuff inflates and deflates automatically giving you your blood pressure reading on the display window in a matter of seconds.

Wrist monitors work similarly, except they attach to the wrist. Wrist monitors are also smaller in weight and size, which makes them more portable, and a bit more comfortable to use than the arm monitors, but they tend to be a little less accurate. To help you choose the best monitor for you, here are several things to check into:

Make sure it fits: Be sure the cuff fits the circumference of your upper arm. Using a cuff that's the wrong size can result in an inaccurate reading. Most arm models have two sizes or an adjustable cuff that fits most people. Wrist models also fit most people.

Choose one that's easy to use: Be sure the display on the monitor is easy to read, and that the buttons are large. The directions for applying the cuff and operating the monitor should be clear.

Consider what extra features you want: Many automatic monitors come with additional features such as irregular heartbeat detection that checks for arrhythmias and other abnormalities; a risk category indicator that tells you whether your blood pressure is in the high range; a dataaveraging function that allows you to take multiple readings and get an overall average; multiple user memory that allows two or more users to save their readings; and downloadable memory that lets you transmit your data to your computer or smartphone.

Where to Buy

You can find blood pressure monitors at pharmacies, medical supply stores or online, and you don't need a prescription to buy one. Prices typically range between \$40 and \$100.

In most cases, original Medicare will not cover a home blood pressure monitor, but if you have a Medicare Advantage plan or a private health insurance policy it's worth checking into, because some plans may provide coverage.

The best automatic arm monitors as recommended by Consumer Reports include the Omron Platinum BP5450 (\$75), Omron Silver BP5250 (\$50) and the Omron 10 Series BP7450 (\$100); A&D Medical UA767F (\$45); and Rite Aid Deluxe Automatic BP3AR1-4DRITE (\$37). And the top wrist monitors are the Omron 7 Series BP6350 (\$80); and the Equate (Walmart) 4500 Series (\$40).

After you buy a monitor, it's a good idea to take it to your doctor's office so they can check its accuracy and teach you the proper techniques of how and when to use it.

It's not every day Major League Baseball's all-time hits leader is in Florence. But here Rose is on Thursday evening at the Marriott Shoals Conference Center, the featured speaker for the North Alabama Lions Athletic Club's 2021 Lion Pride Dinner and Auction.

It's here Rose is in his element. He welcomes the attention, the questions of his playing career, the ability to relive the path that led him from an undersize youth in Cincinnati, Ohio, to

become one of the best hitters of all time. He'll answer the questions about his ban from baseball in 1989 and the mistakes he's made along the way.

Rose has a way of making people feel at ease. He'll tell stories of some of baseball's greats — Hank Aaron, Willie Mays, Mike Schmidt, Stan Musial — and crack jokes.

"Every position on the field, I've played with a Hall of Famer," Rose said. "If that's not going to work and having fun, I don't know what the (heck) is."

Rose has lived quite a baseball life. Filled with plenty of big moments and moments that he wished he could have back.

But nervous? No. Baseball and everything around it was natural.

He wasn't as he approached Ty Cobb's record for hits that stood 61 years. Although the nine-minute standing ovation in Cincinnati made him break down into tears seven minutes in. He wasn't during his 44-game hit streak in 1978 as he made a run at Joe DiMaggio's mark of 56. Or in any of the six World Series he played in, with three ending in wins.

There was one time he can remember that happening around anything to do with sport. It involved the daughter of Babe Ruth, the greatest player ever by his estimation, a decade ago in Cooperstown, New York, outside the Baseball Hall of Fame.

"She walked three blocks down the street to say hi to me to tell me her dad would have appreciated the way I played the game," Rose said. "That's the most nervous I've ever been and I've met seven presidents, OK, and I've been in front of federal judges. To meet to Babe Ruth's daughter ... I hope people say that to my daughter."

NOT AN EASY CHOICE

Pete Rose — SEC football player? It sounds strange. Imagine if Rose never played professional baseball. It nearly happened. At Western Hills High School, baseball wasn't even Rose's best sport by his own estimation. That was football. The way he later barreled over former Cleveland Indians' catcher Ray Fosse in the 1970 MLB All-Star Game offered a pretty good idea.

As Rose rounded third, Fosse attempted to get in Rose's way and block the plate only for Rose to run over Fosse. The catcher suffered a fractured and separated shoulder that went undiagnosed until the next year. Rose came way with a bruised knee. "I almost went to the

"I almost went to the University of Tennessee for football," Rose said. "But I didn't like school."

It didn't help either that when Rose graduated from high school in 1960, he weighed 158 pounds. So when it came time to decide what he wanted to do, Rose's choice was baseball. There was no classroom work that had to be done once he signed a professional contract.

The only problem was the Reds were leery of signing him. It wasn't until his uncle, Buddy Bloebaum, who worked for the team as a scout, convinced Cincinnati to take a chance on the hometown kid.

"If I didn't have an uncle, my mother's brother, who worked for the Reds, I'd never gotten an opportunity to play," Rose said. "I was too small. ... Everyone in my family developed late and my uncle knew that. I was always one of the most aggressive guys on the field."

It didn't take long for Rose to reward the Reds. By 1963, he was the National League Rookie of the Year. He helped lead the Big Red Machine Reds to back-to-back World Series titles in 1975 and 1976, the franchise's first two since 1940. On May 5, 1978, he became just the 13th player in MLB history to record his 3,000th hit.

After a four-year stint with the Philadelphia Phillies that included another title in 1980 and another National League pennant, and a half season with the Montreal Expos in 1984, Rose returned home in pursuit of Cobb's record. It fell on Sept. 11, 1985 with a single against Eric Snow of the San Diego Padres.

"That was the first time in my life I didn't know whať to do on a baseball field," Rose said. "They come out and took the base. My son came out. My teammates came out. Marge Schott, the owner, got me a Corvette. I told her I wanted a Porsche. ... And I was fine for seven minutes. Then all of a sudden at seven, seven and a half, eight, eight and a half (minutes) you start thinking about all the people who helped you

get there. "... That's what brings a tear to your eyes. I held it pretty good for seven

minutes." Rose retired at the end of the next season and spent the next three years as the Reds manager before he voluntarily accepted a permanent place on baseball's ineligible list in August 1989 for betting on Red games.

He still holds the major league records for games played (3,562), at-bats (14,053), hits (4,256) and singles (3,215). Rose is also the only player in MLB history to play at least 500 games at five different positions (first base, second base, third base, left field and right field). He was the first player to have 10 seasons of 200 hits or more, which was later matched by Ichiro Suzuki with the Seattle Mariners.

"I played 24 years in the big leagues and I only got to play in six World Series," Rose said. "Eighteen years were wasted as far as I'm concerned. I'd rather be Joe DiMaggio. No, I wouldn't because he's dead. ... But Joe played 11 years and won 10 World Series championships. Those are the kinds of teammates you want. Ten out of 11 is pretty good. But one out of four isn't bad either."

STATE OF THE GAME

By Rose's estimation, he watches at least two MLB games every day at his home in Las Vegas. But baseball, he concedes, has been tough to watch.

"It's boring," he said. There are too many strikeouts — Rose's career high in a season was 76 twice. Mark Revnolds holds the record for most by a hitter in a season with 223. Adam Dunn is next at 222. Too many players are flying out, trying to hit home runs. There are currently 13 players hitting .300 or better this season. Then there's also the

time it takes to play. According to Baseball-Reference, the average time a MLB takes to play is three hours and eight minutes.

'All of these bad hitters, and they're going to check the pitcher's gloves and hats between every hitting?" asked Rose, who hit .300 or better in 15 of his 24 seasons. "C'mon now. In the last 10 years, what rules has baseball changed to make the game better for us as fans? Nothing. You can't break up the double play. You can't slide into the catcher. You can't pitch inside. ... They don't address what they need to address. What they need to address is quicker games. The games are too long.

There's also the matter of the game's star players missing time. More importantly, they haven't come up big when needed.

"There's gambling in almost every state now," Rose said. "They have a place to gamble at the new ballpark in Vegas for the Raiders, eight-tenths (of a mile) from where I live, where you can go at halftime to bet on the team — at the ballpark. Now, they're doing it at all these facilities. Everyone is against gambling, but they're OK doing it."

Rose has since applied multiple times for reinstatement. He cannot appear at any official MLB event without the commissioner's approval and is still ineligible for the Hall of Fame. But each time, the commissioner in charge has opted not to act on his application. In 1992, Fay Vincent,

Giamatti successor, chose to leave Rose's ban in

place. Bud Selig followed suit in 1998 and 2003. Rob Manfred, MLB's current commissioner, denied Rose's request in 2015 and has yet to make a decision on the 2020 application.

"I like Rob Manfred," Rose said. "He don't help me out, but I'm the one who screwed up. Any commissioner in any sport has a lot of problems because of us players. We create the problems. I'm sorry I bet on baseball. But he wasn't around."

Even after the question of what he thought about Manfred, Rose still had another 11 minutes worth of stories to tell. But there were other things to do. It was time to meet the

ill-informed, uneducated, listening to the wrong people, or believing a neighbor's misinformation.

For some, that may be the case. However, I'm sure others have invested dozens of hours if not more in researching all they can about the virus, its mutations, and valid points for and against the vaccine. This is a lot more than some others who lined up the first day eligible with no questions.

The message to be vaccinated would probably be received more favorably by skeptics if it were not so repetitively condescending.

As of this writing, the Mayo clinic website showed Vermont as showed Vermont as leading the nation with residents having at least one dose of a vaccine, at 68%, with some other New England states close behind in the 60's. Several southern states, and Wyoming and Idaho lagged behind in the midhigh 30's. Alabama was at the bottom with only 35% having at least one dose. Admittedly, that is woeful, but it cannot be attributed solely to politics or inaccurate information.

Mix messaging and/ concerns about or presentation have to be in play. Even in New England, more than one out of three are not taking it. In a potentially lifethreatening situation, 1/3 not taking precautions is a lot.

CDC The finally published a report in early August that said about three-fourths of people infected in a Massachusetts Covid-19 outbreak were fully vaccinated against the coronavirus with four of them ending up in the hospital.

The new data published in the CDC's *Morbidity* Mortality Weekly and Report also found that fully vaccinated people who get infected carry as much of the virus in their nose as unvaccinated people, and could spread it to other individuals, vaccinated both and unvaccinated.

The CDC also reversed course on its prior position and now recommends that fully vaccinated Americans living in areas with high Covid infection rates resume wearing face masks indoors. The guidelines cover about

THIS PAST YEAR HAS BEEN A BANNER YEAR FOR SCAMS. Once the Rona made news, it took all of 30 seconds for scammers to find ways of taking advantage of our concerns over the pandemic.

Here's a roundup of some of those scams. My regular reader will recognize many of these as variations of scams I've written about in the past. So this article serves as

not let their guard down. Early last year, lots of us received an email from the "World Health Organization" suggesting you read an attachment with official information on how to protect

that reader to



yourself from the coronavirus. If you were goofy enough to open the attachment, it would install a little program called a keylogger that records every keystroke you make on your keyboard and sends that information to scammers. Those keystrokes can be mined for all sorts of juicy information including usernames and passwords to your secure sites. The people most susceptible to these are those of you still using Yahoo, AT&T, Bellsouth, and Comcast email addresses. These companies do not care about you at all and send all these

scams straight into your inbox. I highly recommend you change to a quality provider such as those from iCloud, Microsoft, or Google. Do that, and you'll hardly ever see any spam at all, much less scam email like this.

Then there were the phishing emails and text messages from "The CDC" that asked you to log into the legitimate-looking CDC website then provide personal information such as your social security number so that the CDC could send information on how to protect yourself and your family. That information could be used to steal your identity. Before safe and effective vaccines were released, scammers were selling doit-yourself vaccines kits for \$4.95. Of course there were tons of supplements and fake Covid cures being sold even on Amazon. Honestly, if you fell for one of those, well, bless your heart.

Billions of dollars were paid out in fraudulent unemployment claims last year. People from all over the world were filing for unemployment claims using identities they were able to find online. Those claims have slowed to a trickle for now, but the sharp uptick of recent Rona cases will probably result in an uptick again. You will know that you've become a victim if you receive a letter from your local unemployment office or your boss invites you to the office to have a little talk.

In this era of constant claims of miracle cures and treatments, there will be plenty more opportunities for scammers to devise ways of tricking desperate people. Please keep that in mind as we get through this latest round of yuckiness from our friend, Rona. You can do your part by reporting suspected fraud schemes by calling the National Center for Disaster Fraud (NCDF) hotline (1-866-720-5721) or by e-mailing the NCDF at disaster@leo.gov.

Before we begin talking about Medicare Part B I would like to clear up something that was in last week's article concerning Medicare Part A. As I stated in the article Part A has a deductible of \$1,484 per benefit period. I also stated that if you paid into Medicare for 40 quarters that Part A was free to you. I was referring to the fact that you would not have to pay a premium to Medicare for Part A, not that it would exclude you from paying the deductible.

Medicare Part B is the part of Medicare that is billed when you receive services as an outpatient by a Medicare approved provider, such as your primary care physician (PCP) or specialist. Although a visit to your doctor is the primary way that you will use Medicare Part B, it also covers many other services. We will discuss the other services in next week's article.

If you are turning 65 in 2021, Medicare Part B will have a premium of \$148.50/mo. Because there is a premium attached to Medicare Part B this coverage is optional. This means you are not required to enroll in Medicare Part B. There are two important things to remember about Part B being optional. First, if you opt out of Part B you will have no coverage under Medicare for your outpatient services. Second, if you decide at a later date to enroll in Part B there can be a late enrollment penalty applied that will last as long as you live and have Part B. There are exceptions to the late enrollment penalty that we will discuss in future articles.
