

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We have studied our wonderful United States Constitution over the past twenty-six weeks. We often refer to the phrase "Our Founding Fathers". But exactly who were these men?

During the next five weeks, we will, Lord willing, study, in alphabetical order, "The Signers of Our United States Constitution" and hopefully get to know them a little better:

Abraham Baldwin was born on Friday, November 22, 1754, in Guilford, Connecticut, British Colony, was graduated from Yale College, represented Georgia at the Second Continental Congress, founded the University of Georgia, and died on Wednesday, March 4, 1807, in Washington, D. C.

Richard Bassett was born on Friday, April 2, 1745, in Cecil County, Maryland, British Colony, served as a Captain in the Colonial Military during the American Revolutionary War, represented Delaware at the Second Continental Congress, served in the U. S. Senate from Wednesday, March 4, 1789, to Sunday, March 3, 1793, served as Governor of Delaware from Wednesday, January 9, 1799, to Tuesday, March 3, 1801, and died on Friday, September 15, 1815, on his estate, "Bohemia Manor", in Cecil County, Maryland.

Gunning Bedford, Jr., was born on Tuesday, April 13, 1747, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, British Colony, represented Delaware at the Second Continental Congress, served as a Judge on the Federal District Court of Delaware from Saturday, September 26, 1789, until he died on Monday, March 30, 1812, in Wilmington, Delaware.

on Monday, March 30, 1812, in Wilmington, Delaware. **John Blair, Jr.**, was born on Thursday, April 17, 1732, at Williamsburg, Virginia, British Colony, represented Virginia at the Second Continental Congress, served as a Judge on the Virginia Court of Appeals and on the U. S. Supreme Court. While on the Supreme Court, he influenced the interpretation of the Constitution on a number of important decisions. He died on Sunday, August 31, 1800, at Williamsburg, Virginia.

William Blount was born on Easter Sunday, March 26, 1749, at his grandfather's home at "Rosefield" near Windsor in Bertie County, North Carolina, represented North Carolina at the Second Continental Convention, and died on Friday, March 21, 1800, in Knoxville, Knox County, Tennessee.

David Brearley was born on Friday, June 11, 1745, in Lawrence Township, Mercer County, New Jersey, British Colony, represented New Jersey at the Second Continental Congress, served as Chief Justice of the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey from Saturday, September 26, 1789, until he died on Monday, August 16, 1790, in the City of Trenton, Mercer County, New Jersey.

Jacob Broom was born on Tuesday, October 17, 1752, in Wilmington, Delaware, British Colony, represented Delaware at the Second Continental Congress where he was especially conscientious, never missing a session. He became Wilmington's first postmaster. He died on Wednesday, April 25, 1810, in Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania.

Pierce Butler was born on Saturday, July 11, 1744, in Tinryland, Ireland, represented South Carolina at the Second Continental Congress where he introduced the Fugitive Slave Clause, served as a Brigadier General in the American Revolutionary War and died on Friday, February 15, 1822, in Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania.

Lord willing, we will continue our study next week.



Village of Nunda Special Election September 7, 2021 Proposition No. 1

Background Information:

On July 12, 2021, The Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Nunda adopted Local Law No. 2 of 2021, Opting Out of Licensing and Establishing Retail Cannabis Dispensaries and On-site Cannabis Consumption Establishments within the Village of Nunda.

The purpose of this Local Law is to prohibit retail cannabis dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption establishments in the Village of Nunda.

This local law was adopted by vote of the Nunda Village Board of Trustees, pursuant to Marijuana Regulation Taxation Act of New York State - Cannabis Law § 131, which expressly authorizes villages to opt-out of allowing retail cannabis dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption establishments within its boundaries.

The law will not take effect until:

- Forty-five (45) days have passed following the adoption of the law; and,
- The law is approved by the electorate of the Village of Nunda

The purpose of this special election and referendum, is to allow residents of the Village of Nunda to make a final determination regarding Local Law No. 2 of 2021. On July 12, 2021, the Nunda Village Board took all necessary actions to authorize this special election and referendum.

Please note that in voting for or against the following proposition, a vote of "Yes" is a vote to prohibit Licensing and Establishing Retail Cannabis Dispensaries and On-site Cannabis Consumption Establishments within the Village of Nunda, while a vote of "No" is a vote not to prohibit such licensing.

Livingston County Presents COVID-19 Update Mask Mandate not Coming; School Support Strong for In-Person Learning

With the COVID-19 Delta variant and breakthrough cases in the news of late, Livingston County would like to provide an update on COVID-19 trends and issues.

"Presently, cases are trending upward", said Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County's Public Health Director. "We must remember that these are just cases – confirmed, positive cases of COVID-19, both Delta and non-Delta cases. We have had no recent deaths, and currently, there are 4 hospitalizations, all of which are unvaccinated individuals."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently released a recommendation that fully vaccinated people wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas of "substantial" or "high" community transmission as opposed to "low" or "moderate" areas. According to the CDC COVID Data Tracker, Livingston County is currently at a "moderate" level of community transmission.

Some local businesses are encouraging a return to universal mask-wearing; however, Livingston County government is not presently considering any county-wide indoor mask mandate.

"We encourage our residents to consider the following. One, COVID-19 is not going to go away so, to put it bluntly, we need to learn to live with the persistent threat of exposure to it. Two, vaccines work for protection against the worst of the virus' impacts," stated County Administrator Ian M. Coyle. "Therefore, the normal protocols of the last 18 months remain the same. Take precautions, get vaccinated, wash hands, maintain distancing, get tested if symptoms arise, and follow isolation and quarantine procedures for the COVID-19 positive."

"The policies at the County government level for our internal operations will remain the same, more or less. We are striking the balance of safety and going about our business. Public access to services is still the same. We expect some slight changes with nursing home staff testing to add further transmission prevention efforts at that facility," continued Coyle.

Public education back-to-school plans are in the works and the County remains steadfast in its support of the K-12 districts serving Livingston County residents. With no statewide regulations, the autonomy rests with the individual schools on what constitutes a safe opening for the fall.

Rodriguez said, "We are here for our schools. Last year, these districts led the—way in terms of their flexibility and agility as they worked through the challenges of maintaining and sustaining in-person year-round learning. I see no reason why that cannot happen again in 2021-2022 due to the hard work of teachers and staff and the stick-to-itiveness of the school-age children."

Vaccination Update from Livingston County Third Shot Recommended for Those at High Risk

People with weakened immune systems are especially vulnerable to COVID-19 because they are more at risk of serious, prolonged illness. This includes people who have:

- Been receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood
- · Received an organ transplant and are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- · Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome)
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that may suppress your immune response

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), people who have weakened immune systems may benefit from an additional dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to make sure they have enough protection against the virus. CDC is now recommending that people with moderately to severely compromised immune systems receive an additional dose of mRNA COVID-19 vaccine at least 28 days after a second dose of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

People should talk to their healthcare provider about their medical condition, and whether getting an additional dose is appropriate for them.

CDC does not recommend additional doses or booster shots for any other population at this time.

Livingston County Donates School Supplies to Students in Need

Livingston County once again partnered with Catholic Charities Steuben/Livingston to provide school supplies to County students in need through the charity's Livingston County School Supply Drive.

Livingston County challenged employees to "Fill the Bus," a cardboard cutout in the shape of a school bus, with back-to-school item donations. The county collected backpacks, binders, pencils, paper, and more, said donation organizer Sandy Johnson of the Livingston County Real Property Tax Services office.

"As soon as I put the poster out announcing the charity drive, everyone here was so willing to help out. They usually shop on the weekends and come in Monday and they have the boxes almost all filled up that day. I think our employees are very generous and they look forward to helping out the kids each year."

This is the eighth year Livingston County has participated in the Livingston County School Supply Drive with Catholic Charities Steuben/Livingston.
