convalescent plasma to help those fighting the virus. Convalescent plasma is needed by local hospitals as the virus again surges. Those who have recovered from COVID-19 are asked to help save lives by donating convalescent plasma.

The antibody test is authorized for use by the FDA and detects if someone has developed antibodies to COVID-19. A positive test result may indicate past exposure and some immunity to the virus. This antibody test is not a diagnostic test; it will not determine if the person currently has the virus, or whether the donor was exposed to the Delta variant.

Healthy blood donors who may have been exposed to or recovered from COVID-19 are asked to donate as soon as they have completed the recommended CDC quarantine guidelines. There is no deferral period for donors who have received the Pfizer, Moderna or Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine. As part of the normal blood donation process, a test will be

performed on the donor's blood to determine if antibodies are present in the plasma.

"Local hospitals and patients need the community's support every day — and especially now, as COVID-19 cases continue to rise. Donating blood and convalescent plasma is one of the fastest and most impactful ways to help our neighbors in this public health emergency, said Dr. Chris Lough, Vice President of Medical Services for LifeSouth Community Blood Centers.

Donors must be fully recovered from COVID-19 and symptom-free for two weeks before coming to donor centers or blood drives to donate.

I get the container that I need soil in and layer equal layers of peat moss, dry manure, and dry leaves (collected and saved from last fall) that I crumble between my fingers. After filling the container to the top with these layers, I mix it well with a trowel. Then, I place the plants into the soil. They thrive in this mixture, and the next spring, the pot is full of rich black soil, which has composted from the mix I made the previous spring. The *Times Daily* published commentaries by Cal Thomas on August 8 and 15 that contain misinformation dangerous to humans and other living things. He has a right to ignore science and medicine to mislead through distortion and political manipulation.

However, the paper should inform its readers with fact-based counterarguments and warnings. Thomas questions whether the Delta variant is a crisis, thereby contributing to reluctance by many Alabamians to wear masks and get vaccinated risking the health of us all.

Thomas praised Gov. DeSantis for refusing mask mandates even as the hospitals in Florida reach capacity and thousands more, including children, will die.

Thomas implies without evidence that the UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change is a political rather than scientific body, and therefore we should ignore its recent dire warnings about climate change.

Reputable scientists and observers recognize that man-made carbon and other emissions are altering the planet in dangerous ways that jeopardize the future for our grandchildren. Thomas disagrees and argues it is not worth the cost of reducing those emissions, even though we have the capability to do so.

Medicare Minute "Medicare Part B Coverage"

Medicare Part B is most used when you visit your primary care physician or specialist. But Medicare Part B is also used for many other medically necessary services. Medicare defines medically necessary as "healthcare services or supplies needed to diagnose or treat an illness services or supplies needed to diagnose or treat an illness, injury, condition or disease, or its symptoms and that meet accepted standards of medicine".

One of these other services covered by Part B is transportation by ambulance. Medicare covers and helps pay for ambulance services only if other types of transportation will endanger your health and will only cover and help pay for you to be transported to the nearest medical facility that's able to give you the care you need. If you choose to be transported to a facility farther away you may have to pay more.

Another service Part B covers is Durable Medical Equipment (DME). DME must be long lasting equipment that is used in your home for medical reasons and has an expected lifetime of at least 3 years. Medicare has a long list of equipment that falls under DME.

One of the most important benefits of Medicare Part B are the preventive services that it covers. These services include health care that is used to prevent illness or detect illness at an early stage.

Medicare.gov list 23 screenings and shots that fall under preventive services. They include things such as mammogram screenings, colorectal cancer screenings and flu shots.

Part B has an annual deductible of \$203 and a coinsurance of 20%. This means that if you have Original Medicare only, with no other supplemental coverage, you will owe the first \$203 filed on Part B each year and, after the deductible is met, you will be responsible for 20% of the cost of Part B services you receive.

out of Afghanistan were an unprecedented disaster.

How desperate do people have to be to run alongside a plane on a runway? To climb onto the side of an airliner or ride the landing gear out of a country? At least seven died in varied and horrific ways.

The words US Air Force on that moving plane with hundreds of panicked people under, around, and on it may as well scrawl "Banana Republic" across our collective chest. It's no wonder that Afghan President Ashraf Ghani reportedly fled the country with over \$100 million in US cash.

How to Choose an Adult Day Care Services Provider

Dear Savvy Senior, Can you offer any tips on choosing a good adult day care provider for an elderly parent? My 81-year-old father, who just moved in with me, has dementia and needs attention during the day while I'm at work.

Need Assistance

Dear Need,

Adult day care services can be a great option for caregivers who work, or for those who just need a break during the day. Here's what you should know, along with some tips to help you find and choose one.

Adult Day Care The business of adult day care services has grown rapidly in recent years. According to the National Adult Day Services Association, there are upwards of 4,600 adult day centers across the U.S., the result of a 35 percent increase since 2002. Those centers provide services to more than 260,000 participants and family caregivers, which is a whopping 63 percent increase over the last two decades. As the name implice

As the name implies, adult day care provides care for elderly seniors who cannot care for themselves at home. While services will vary from center to center, they typically provide personal care, meals and snacks, various activities and social interaction in a safe supportive environment. Additionally, many centers also provide health services such as medication management, various therapies, exercise and transportation to and from the facility.

Adult day care centers generally operate programs during normal business hours five days a week. However, some centers may offer services in the evenings and on weekends, too.

and on weekends, too. Costs for care will vary as well, usually between \$25 to more than \$100 per day (the national average is \$75/day), depending on where you live.

Unfortunately, in most cases original Medicare does not pay for adult day care, but some Medicare Advantage plans, and many long-term care insurance policies do. But most seniors or their families pay for care out-ofpocket.

If your dad is lower income and can't afford this, state Medicaid programs provide financial assistance if he meets eligibility requirements, and some states have PACE programs that provide financial aid. Contact your state Medicaid office (see Medicaid.gov) for more information. The VA even provides adult day care to eligible veterans enrolled in their Medical Benefits Package. See VA.gov/ geriatrics to learn more. How to Choose

Your first step in shopping

for an adult day center is to determine the kinds of services your dad needs, and you need as a caregiver. After you do that, here are some tips to help you locate and choose a good provider. Start by contacting your Area Agency on Aging (call 800-677-1116 to get your local number) to get referrals to adult day service programs in your area. You can also search the National Adult Day Services Association (NADSA) database at NADSA.org/locator.

Once you have a list of a few centers, call them to find out their eligibility criteria, if they offer the types of services your dad needs, if they are accepting new clients, their hours of operation, if they're licensed and/or registered with a state agency (this is not required in all states) and what they charge.

After you identify a few good centers, go in for a visit. Find out about the staffing ratio (at least one staff member for every six participants is recommended) and what kind of training they have. While you're there, notice the cleanness and smell of the facility. Is it homey and inviting? Does the staff seem friendly and knowledgeable? Also be sure to taste the food and consider


making an unannounced visit. To help you rate your visit, the NADSA offers a helpful checklist of questions to ask at *NADSA.org* – click on "Site Visit Checklist" under the "For Caregivers" tab.

Then, after your visit, be sure to check their references. Get names and phone numbers of at least two or three families who have used the center you are considering and call them.

What Happens At Social **Security Disability Hearings?**

A well-known fact among those in Alabama applying for Social Security Disability Benefits is the chances of success at the initial application stage of the process are abysmally low. Alabama's allowance rate at the first level of review seems to stay below the national allowance rate.

Requesting A Hearing

So, like the vast majority, claimants who wish to continue pursuing disability benefits, the next step in the process is requesting a hearing. While the possible approval rate does increase, the wait time is often lengthy. The Florence Alabama Office of Hearings Operations is one of the best in terms of process period, but the process itself still takes some time. Their current average is 283 days. That is way ahead of Honolulu's 472 and Tacoma's 502 days of processing time. Hawaii is apparently not always a paradise! **Two Pre-Hearing Conferences**

While waiting for a hearing date, we will typically have at least two pre-hearing conferences. At the first we typically review the structure of the hearing, from which medical providers we need to order updates and complete a few documents the court requires. We then will schedule another prehearing conference to discuss potential testimony.

The actual hearings with social security are private, usually with only five people in attendance: the Judge, the claimant, the vocational expert and the court reporter and us (your attorney). There is no gallery of spectators listening in like in other courts and right now due to COVID, hearings are actually being held telephonically from the comfort of your home. The other participants will also be calling in from safe locations.

Direct Testimony

Usually, the Judge will start off with a few of what I call "softball" background questions, e.g. name, age, date of birth, address, telephone number, height, weight, level of education and so on. Then the Judge most often will hand it over to us, and we will elicit direct testimony from the claimant about what ails them, with what specifically

keeps them from effectively working full time. During the direct testimony, the Judge may ask some follow up questions.

What Does The Vocational Expert Do At A Hearing?

The Judge will then ask the vocational expert about the claimant's past work, what sort of education and physical abilities were required to perform them, etc. The vocational expert will then respond to a series of hypothetical questions from the Judge, such as:

- What is the claimant's age?
- What is the claimant's education? Work experience? • If
- subjected to certain emotional or physical limitations, would the individual be able to perform his/her past or other work in the national and regional economy?

Other than saying hello, the vocational expert and court reporter usually don't have much interaction with the claimant.

The Ruling

The Judge typically won't issue a ruling at the close of the hearing as they are supposed to put everything in writing. Unfortunately, this can tack on additional months to the process depending on the Office of Hearings Operation's workload. The whole process as stated earlier just take time and sometime years if the Judge enters an unfavorable decision and you decide at that point to appeal further.



Insurance Insights Things Have Changed Since You Learned to Drive

If you have a child taking driver's ed, it's time to learn the latest updates to the subject.

If you've been driving for 20 or more years, you know how to teach your teenager the driving basics, right? Maybe. But some things have changed since you took driver's education. If you have a new teen driver in your house, here's a look at new developments.

Hand Position On Steering Wheel

Lower your hands. You probably learned to keep your hands at the 10 and 2 o'clock positions on the steering wheel. Today, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) recommends drivers put their hands at the 9 and 3

o'clock positions. One reason for the change is to potentially keep hands out of the way if the airbag deploys.

Also, don't cross over. Drivers used to learn a handover-hand crossover method for turning the steering wheel.



Now to execute a turn, your teen will be advised to 'push up' on one side of the wheel while 'pulling down' on the other. **Turn Everything Off**

Today's distractions include more than just a radio. It's likely your teen will have a cell phone when he or she drives. Remind your teen to never text while driving, and encourage them to pull over before making a call. Even with hands-free devices, taking or making phone calls, searching for tunes on a media player or playing the radio too loudly all contribute to heightened risks for new and experienced drivers alike. Be a good role model for your teen.

Gradually Learn To Drive

Familiarize yourself with the graduated drivers licensing (GDL) laws in your state. Today's learning drivers have new limits for such things as the age at which they can get their learner's permit or license, the hours they can drive and the number of passengers they can carry. These laws limit the exposure of teen drivers to the most dangerous situations before being given an unrestricted license. And according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, GDL laws have reduced teen crashes by 57% from 1996 to 2018.

Keep Your Distance

You may have been taught to keep one car length per every 10 MPH between your vehicle and the one ahead of you. Today, instructors recommend a simpler three-second rule: Keeping an eye on the car in front of you, spot a fixed object that's even with that car. Then count how long it takes for your vehicle to reach the same object. If it's less than three seconds, allow more following distance behind the vehicle ahead.

Remember The Basics

Today's vehicles are far more 'intelligent' than the cars you grew up driving. And while many of the features are designed to keep drivers safer, such as anti-skid controls, automated parallel parking and sensors that stop a car before collision, it's always a good idea for teens to learn to make

their own decisions and react to different driving situations.
