Your entire day can derail within ten seconds of the rising sun. You can wash your coveralls. They won't look any cleaner, but they will smell much nicer.








APPLE PEAR CAKE

15 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 2 cups shredded peeled tart apples
- 2 cups shredded peeled pears
- 2 cups sugar
- 1-1/4 cups canola oil
- 1 cup raisins
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 2 large eggs, room temperature, lightly beaten
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon salt

CREAM CHEESE FROSTING:

- 3 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 3 cups confectioners' súgar
- 1/4 cup butter, softened
- 2 tablespoons 2% milk
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions

1. In a large bowl, combine the first 8 ingredients. Combine dry ingredients; stir into the fruit mixture. 2. Pour into a greased 13x9-in. baking pan. Bake at 325° until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, about 1 hour. Cool on a wire rack. 3. For frosting, in a large bowl, beat the cream cheese, confectioners' sugar and butter until smooth. Beat in the milk and vanilla; frost cake. Store in the refrigerator.





ORANGE AND PEAR **UPSIDE DOWN CAKE**

10 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter, cubed
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons grated orange zest, divided
- 2 medium ripe pears, peeled and quartered
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup coconut oil
- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 1-1/3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1-1/2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup half-and-half cream

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. Place butter in a 10-in. cast-iron or other ovenproof skillet; place pan in oven until butter is melted, 3-5 minutes. Carefully tilt pan to coat bottom and sides with butter. Sprinkle with brown sugar and 1 tablespoon orange zest. Arrange pears in a single layer over sugar. 2. In a large bowl, beat sugar, coconut oil, egg and remaining 1 tablespoon orange zest until well blended. In another bowl, whisk flour, baking powder and salt; gradually beat into sugar mixture alternately with cream.

3. Spoon over pears. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 45-50 minutes. Cool 10 minutes before inverting onto a serving plate. Serve warm.

GRANDMA'S PEAR PRESERVES 6, 8 0z jars

Ingredients

6 cups peeled, cored, and sliced pears

1 cup water

1 tablespoon lemon juice

- 1 (2 ounce) package powdered fruit pectin
- 8 cups white sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground allspice
- 2 teaspoons ground nutmeg
- ½ cup brown sugar

Directions

1. Sterilize jars and lids in boiling water for at least 10 minutes. Let simmer while making jam.
2. In a large saucepan, combine pears, water, and lemon juice. Cover, and simmer for 10 minutes. Stir in pectin and bring to a full boil. Stir in the white sugar, and continue boiling and stirring uncovered for 1 minute, until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat, and stir in brown sugar, allspice, and nutmeg.
3. Quickly fill jars to within 1/2 inch of the top.
Wipe rims clean, and top with lids. Process jars in boiling water for 10 minutes to seal.



PEAR TART

12 Servings

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup finely chopped walnuts
- FILLING:
- 1 package (8 ounces) reduced-fat cream cheese
- 1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon sugar, divided
- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 can (15 ounces) reduced-sugar sliced pears, drained well and thinly sliced
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 425°. Beat butter, sugar and cinnamon until crumbly. Beat in flour and walnuts. Press onto bottom and up sides of a 9-in. fluted tart pan with a removable bottom coated with cooking
- 2. For filling, beat cream cheese and 1/4 cup sugar until smooth. Beat in egg and vanilla. Spread into crust. Arrange pears over top. Mix cinnamon and
- remaining sugar; sprinkle over pears.

 3. Bake 10 minutes. Reduce oven setting to 350°; bake until filling is set, 15-20 minutes. Cool 1 hour on a wire rack. Refrigerate at least 2 hours before serving.

PEAR CRISP

10 Servings

Ingredients

- 6 large (about 2-1/2 pounds) peeled, cored and thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup warm water 1 juiced lemon
- 2 cups rolled oats
- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 2 cups brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons ground cinnamon 1 1/4 cups (2 1/2 sticks) melted butter

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 °F.


Combine pears, water and lemon juice in an 8 by 8inch baking pan. In a bowl, combine oats, flour, sugar and cinnamon. Pour in the melted butter and stir to make a crumbly mixture. Spread the topping evenly over the fruit. Bake for 45 to 55 minutes or until the topping is crisp and browned.

PEAR HONEY

10 Servings

Ingredients

- 1 (20-oz) can crushed pineapple with syrup
- 16 cups (about 6 lbs) pears, peeled, cored, and chopped



1 tablespoon lemon juice

Directions

Mix all ingredients and cook until pears are tender and mixture thickens, approximately 30 minutes. Place in sterilized jars and seal while still hot. Makes 12 to 16 half-pint jars.



PEAR BREAD

20 Servings

Ingredients

- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 3 eggs
- 2½ cups pears peeled, cored and chopped
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Lightly grease two 8x4 inch loaf pans.
2. In large mixing bowl combine oil, sugar and eggs, beat well. Stir in pears, pecans and vanilla. In another bowl, combine flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. Stir dry ingredients into the pear mixture; mix well. Pour batter into prepared loaf pans

3.Bake in preheated oven for 60 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into center of a loaf comes out clean. Allow loaves to cool in pans for 10 minutes before moving to a wire rack to cool completely.

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

Don't curse your struggles. They are your blessings in disguise.





When all seems totally crazy with the world there is nothing like time in the garden to bring things back into perspective, close to God's miracles of growing beautiful, edible, life-giving things from the soil and the tiniest of seeds. Getting my hands into the soil that is the foundation of life



in the garden or in containers is so satisfying, relaxing and life-renewing that it draws me back to the Creator who designed the whole thing for our enjoyment and time with Him. What a gift!

**Soon we'll see the cooler days of fall and what needs to be planted now. According to the SOW app from Auburn Extension Services and Texas A& M University we can plant carrots, cucumbers, eggplant, kohlrabi, lima beans, peppers, snap beans, summer squash, white potatoes, and winter

squash. Who would have guessed that some of these summer crops are still good to plant for the fall? If you are keeping a compost pile, you can mix some in the soil before planting, and "side dress" the seeded areas with small amounts of compost. A shovel full of soil from a wooded area does miraculous things when mixed in the garden.
