Vaccination Update from Livingston County Third Shot Recommended for Those at High Risk

People with weakened immune systems are especially vulnerable to COVID-19 because they are more at risk of serious, prolonged illness.

This includes people who have:

- Been receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood.
- Received an organ transplant and are taking medicine to suppress the immune system.
- Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system.
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome).
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that may suppress your immune response.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), people who have weakened immune systems may benefit from an additional dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to make sure they have enough protection against the virus. CDC is now recommending that people with moderately to severely compromised immune systems receive an additional dose of mRNA COVID-19 vaccine at least 28 days after a second dose of Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

People should talk to their healthcare provider about their medical condition, and whether getting an additional dose is appropriate for them.

CDC does not recommend additional doses or booster shots for any other population at this time.

SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

We continue with our study of "The Signers of Our United States Constitution." I pray you are enjoying our study.

Daniel Carroll was born on Saturday, July 22, 1730, at Marlborough Township, Prince George's County, Maryland, British Colony. He was one of only five men to sign both the Articles of Confederation and the United States Constitution and represented Maryland at the Second Continental Congress. He died on Saturday, May 7, 1796, at Forest Glen, Montgomery County, Maryland.

George Clymer was born on Monday, March 16, 1739, at Philadelphia, Province of Pennsylvania, British Colony. He signed the Declaration of Independence, represented Pennsylvania at the Second Continental Congress, was the first President of the "Pennsylvania Society for the Abolition of Slavery" and died on Saturday, January 23, 1813, at Morrisville Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania.

Jonathan Dayton was born on Thursday, October 16, 1760, at Elizabethtown, Union County, New Jersey, British Colony. He represented New Jersey at the Second Continental Congress, was the youngest person to sign the United States Constitution and to serve as a member of the U. S. House of Representatives, serving as its third Speaker and later serving in the United States Senate. He died on Saturday, October 9, 1824, at Elizabethtown, Union County, New Jersey.

John Dickinson was born on Thursday, November 13, 1732, in Talbot County, Maryland, studied law in Philadelphia and London and was called the "Penman of the Revolution". He represented Delaware at the Second Constitutional Congress and died on Sunday, February 14, 1808, in Wilmington, New Castle County, Delaware.

William Few was born on Saturday, June 8, 1748, in Baltimore County, Maryland. He represented Georgia at the Second Continental Congress and served as one of the first two United States Senators from Georgia from 1789 to 1793. He died on Wednesday, July 16, 1828, at Fishkill-on-Hudson (present day Beacon, Dutchess County, New York).

Thomas FitzSimons was born in October 1741 in Ireland. He represented Pennsylvania at the Second Continental Congress, and served in the U. S. House of Representatives from Pennsylvania from Wednesday, March 4, 1789, to Tuesday, March 3, 1795. He died on Monday, August 26, 1811, at Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania.

Benjamin Franklin was born on Sunday, January 17, 1706, in Boston, Suffolk County, Massachusetts, British Colony. He signed the Declaration of Independence, represented Pennsylvania at the Second Continental Congress, was called "The First American" and died on Saturday, April 17, 1790, at Philadelphia, Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania.

Nicholas Gilman, Jr., was born on Sunday, August 3, 1755, in Exeter, Rockingham County, New Hampshire, British Colony. He served as a soldier in the American Revolutionary War, represented New Hampshire at the Second Continental Congress, was a member of the United States House of Representatives, and served in the U. S. Senate from Monday, March 4, 1805, until his death on Monday, May 2, 1814, while returning home from Washington during a recess.

Lord willing, we will continue with our study next week. I would very much enjoy any comments you may have.

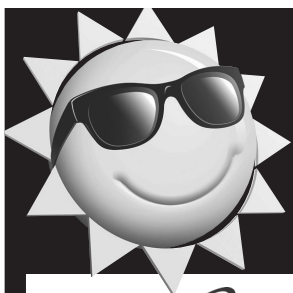

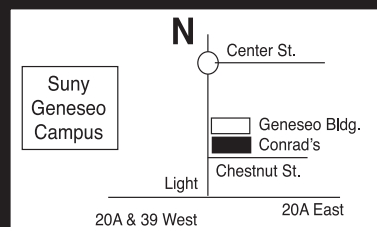

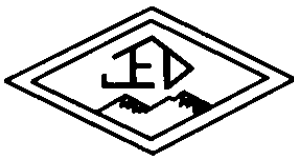

All such meetings are open to the public. Anyone wishing to attend must wear a mask and maintain a 6' separation from others.

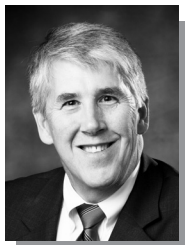

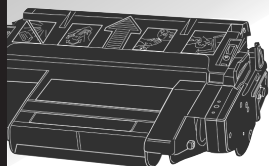

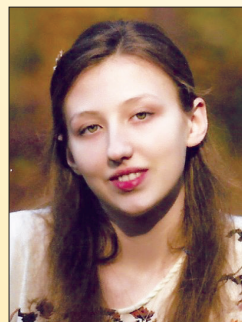
MEGAN GUY—Valedictorian

Livingston County Presents COVID-19 Update Mask Mandate not Coming; School Support Strong for In-Person Learning

With the COVID-19 Delta variant and breakthrough cases in the news of late, Livingston County would like to provide an update on COVID-19 trends and issues.

“Presently, cases are trending upward”, said Jennifer Rodriguez, Livingston County’s Public Health Director. “We must remember that these are just cases – confirmed, positive cases of COVID-19, both Delta and non-Delta cases. We have had no recent deaths, and currently, there are 4 hospitalizations, all of which are unvaccinated individuals.”

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recently released a recommendation that fully vaccinated people wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas of “substantial” or “high” community transmission as opposed to “low” or “moderate” areas. According to the CDC COVID Data Tracker, Livingston County is currently at a “moderate” level of community transmission.

Some local businesses are encouraging a return to universal mask-wearing; however, Livingston County government is not presently considering any county-wide indoor mask mandate.

“We encourage our residents to consider the following. One, COVID-19 is not going to go away so, to put it bluntly, we need to learn to live with the persistent threat of exposure to it. Two, vaccines work for protection against the worst of the virus’ impacts,” stated County Administrator Ian M. Coyle. “Therefore, the normal protocols of the last 18 months remain the same. Take precautions, get vaccinated, wash hands, maintain distancing, get tested if symptoms arise, and follow isolation and quarantine procedures for the COVID-19 positive.”

“The policies at the County government level for our internal operations will remain the same, more or less. We are striking the balance of safety and going about our business. Public access to services is still the same. We expect some slight changes with nursing home staff testing to add further transmission prevention efforts at that facility,” continued Coyle.

Public education back-to-school plans are in the works and the County remains steadfast in its support of the K-12 districts serving Livingston County residents. With no statewide regulations, the autonomy rests with the individual schools on what constitutes a safe opening for the fall.

Rodriguez said, “We are here for our schools. Last year, these districts led the way in terms of their flexibility and agility as they worked through the challenges of maintaining and sustaining in-person year-round learning. I see no reason why that cannot happen again in 2021-2022 due to the hard work of teachers and staff and the stick-to-itiveness of the school-age children.”
