ASK THE ATTORNEY



My child was in a car accident while riding with another parent. Someone ran a stop sign. My child has medical bills and missed about a week of school. The insurance company for the other driver has offered to pay my child's medical bills and give her \$5,000 but said it would have to be approved by the court. Is that right? - Julianne, Muscle Shoals, AL

McCutcheon

Ask the Attorney is sponsored by local attorneys, McCutcheon & Hamner, PC, as a service to the residents of NW Alabama. Yes, that's correct. There is a Uniform Transfers to Minors Act that governs how much money can be transferred to a minor. The age of majority in Alabama is 19. Typically, the Court orders that money be held in an interest bearing account until the child turns 19.

The Court will appoint a lawyer who will act as a "Guardian ad Litem". The GAL will talk to the child and the parents. They may review some medical records to get a sense of the seriousness of the injuries.

Hopefully a GAL will look at each injury individually. I think sometimes people not involved in personal injury tend to focus on the major injury whether it's a broken finger or a broken arm and never consider the road rash injury or sprained ankle. It's important to consider each and every injury individually.

After the GAL has the opportunity to investigate the matter, the Court will schedule a hearing. The Court will want to know what the injuries were and how they have affected the child. The Court will want to know if the child has made a full or partial recovery. The Court will want to hear from the parents and the child and will consider the recommendations of the GAL.

Courts are free to decline to accept a settlement if the Court believes it is inadequate. The Court will want to make sure the money is held for the minor child or used in a way approved by the Court for the child.

The Court will order the insurance company to pay a reasonable fee to the Guardian ad Litem for their time involved in the investigation and that will not be deducted from the settlement of the child.

I hope your daughter has recovered. Cooperate with the Guardian ad Litem and share your feelings and observations about how your child is doing following the accident.

Talent Search Projects along with the other TRIO programs at Northwest-Shoals are an integral part of our said NW-SCC mission," Interim President Dr. Chris Cox. "The services they offer are designed to build a culture with their participants that encourages a postsecondary education. Without them many students across our area would not be able to fulfill their dream of a college degree.'

The three NW-SCC Talent Search programs serve specified schools in Colbert, Franklin, Lauderdale and Winston counties in Northwest Alabama, and Lawrence and Wayne counties in Tennessee.

Talent Search Director, Cindy Winborn, is excited about the opportunities for area students. "The Talent Search team at Northwest-Shoals is a dedicated, passionate team that is vital to the success of many area students," said Winborn. "We are looking forward working with our to existing schools, and our newly added area schools, Cherokee, Lauderdale County High School, and Waterloo.'

NW-SCC has a long history with Talent Search grants spanning over 20 years. One of the Federal TRIO Programs, Talent

Search identifies and assists middle and high school students who have the potential to succeed in education. At least twothirds of the students in each local Talent Search program from low-income are economic backgrounds and families in which neither parent has a bachelor's Talent degree. Search provides these students with counseling as well as information about college admissions requirements, scholarships and various student financial aid programs so that they can better understand their educational opportunities and options.

According to the U.S. Department of Education, 80% of Talent Search participants enroll in postsecondary institutions immediately following high school graduation. In FY20, more than 309,000 students are enrolled in 473 Talent Search TRIO projects in the U.S.

Talent Search began in 1965 as part of President Lyndon Baines Johnson's War on Poverty. It was the second of eight federal "TRIO" programs authorized by the Higher Education Act to help college students succeed in higher education.

The Talent Search program is one of three TRIO programs, including Upward Bound and Student Support Services, at NW-SCC. The programs are 100 percent federally funded by the U.S. Department of Education.



Medicare Minute"Medicare Part A & B Review"

The past couple of weeks we have discussed Medicare Parts A & B in detail. These are the two parts of Medicare that are received through the federal government. This week let's review what we have discussed.

Although Medicare Part A and Part B are great programs that cover a lot of services there are some things Medicare does not cover. They include most dental care, eye exams related to prescribing glasses, dentures, acupuncture and hearing aids.

Medicare Part A is primarily used to cover your inpatient care. Part A has a \$1,484 deductible for each benefit period, meaning the deductible can be applied more than once in a calendar year. This deductible covers hospital services, including semi-private rooms, meals, general nursing, drugs as part of your inpatient treatment, and other hospital services and supplies. Part A is "free" to most Medicare beneficiaries. "Free" meaning you may not have to pay Medicare to have Part A. It does not excuse the deductibles and co-insurance.

In most cases Part B is used to cover your outpatient services. These include visits to your primary care physician and/or specialist. It also may cover transportation by ambulance, durable medical equipment, preventive services and mental health treatment. Part B also entitles you to an annual "Wellness" visit to a qualified provider. Most Medicare beneficiaries joining Medicare Part B for the first time in 2021 pay a monthly premium to Medicare of \$148.50. Part B has an annual deductible of \$203 and a coinsurance the beneficiary pays of 20%, after the deductible is met.

To cover the deductibles and coinsurance that Part A and Part B have you would need to look at some type of supplemental policy sold through private insurance companies. These include Medicare supplement plans or Medicare Advantage Plans. 

It is billed as the longest running Labor Day celebration in the nation. The is year 102. Last year's event was cancelled because of COVID-19.

Labor Council Secretary-Treasurer Belinda Phillips said this year's event will begin at 10am with a parade on Main Street from Deshler High School south to Spring Park.

Colbert County Sheriff Frank Williamson is this year's grand marshal. The parade will include the Colbert Heights High School band, vintage car clubs, pageant participants, motorcycle and ATV clubs, state and local officials local union floats, and plenty of candy for the kids.

"It's a morale booster on top of everything else, as far as just giving people a sense of normalcy," said Mac Sloan, president and organizer of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 558.

Sloan said there has been an increase in union membership in both apprenticeships and nonunion electricians who want to become members.

New apprentice classes have seen 90 or more students, when the norm used to be 30. Since the 2019 Labor Day Celebration, Sloan said IBEW membership has grown 35%-40%.



we wanted to give back. The pain of losing a child is crushing and allconsuming. Some days it seemed impossible to pick up the pieces and move forward with our lives, but we knew we would find a way. We found that way by helping other families who were just beginning their NICU journeys.

From our loss, Sadie's Purpose was born. Our mission is to provide support to families with babies in the NICU to help ease their stress in a small way. We offer support to both parents and siblings



by providing hospitals with support packs that they can give to their families upon admission to the NICU.

Our support packs for parents will include items such as toiletries, notepads, pens, hand sanitizer, handheld mirrors to see their tiny miracles as they cuddle them, and more. The support packs for siblings will include Amanda Knight with Sadie Courtesy photos

coloring books, crayons, books, stuffed animals, and other small, quiet toys to keep them entertained while parents tend to their baby brother or sister.

Be Savvy When

Changing Jobs



The tight labor market is enticing many people to evaluate options to start a new career. If you're among those who plan to quit your current role in search of a better opportunity, it's important to consider how doing so could affect your finances. Dear Savvy Senior,

My husband and I are moving to a different area of the country to be near our daughter. Will this affect our Medicare benefits? Will we need to adjust our coverage or re-enroll in a new blan?

Dear Moving,

Moving Away

Moving can indeed affect your Medicare benefits depending on the type of coverage you have and where you move to. If you and your husband are enrolled in "original Medicare"

Part A and Part B, you'll be happy to know that you won't need to change your plans when you move because they're the same throughout the U.S. You will, however, need to notify the Social Security Administration of your change of address, which you can do at SSA.gov/myaccount/change-of-address.html or by calling 800-772-1213.

But, if you're enrolled in a Medicare (Part D) prescription drug plan, or a Medicare (Part C) Advantage plan and you move out of your plan's service area, you'll need to choose a new plan that serves your new area. Here's a breakdown of what you'll need to do depending on the type of coverage you have.

If you have a Part D plan: If you're in rolled in original Medicare and have a stand-alone Medicare Part D prescription drug plan, you'll need to contact your Part D plan to find out if it will work in the area you're moving to. If it doesn't, you'll need to enroll in a new plan that provides coverage in your new location.

You can make this switch the month before you move and up to two months after the move.

Otherwise, you'll need to wait until the next open enrollment (in the fall) and could be penalized for having no acceptable prescription drug coverage.

If you have a Medicare Advantage plan: If you're enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, again, contact your plan to find out if it will serve your new area. If it doesn't, you'll need to enroll in a new plan that does. To shop for new Advantage and/or Part D prescription drug plans in your new location, see *Medicare.gov/plan-compare*.

You can switch Advantage plans the month before you move and up to two months after you move.

But be aware that if you relocate out of your Medicare Advantage plan's service area and fail to enroll in a new plan in your new area, you'll automatically be switched to original Medicare. This will happen when your old Medicare Advantage plan is forced to disenroll you because you don't live within its service area anymore.

If you have a Medigap policy: If you're enrolled in original Medicare and have a supplemental (Medigap) policy, you'll need to notify your provider that you're moving, but you should not need to change insurance companies or plans. (Note: there also are Medicare Select plans, which are Medigap plans that are network-based and are available in a few states. These plans may require you to change.)

Medigap plans are standardized across the country; for example, Medigap Plan F offers the same coverage in one state as it does in another state (Massachusetts, Minnesota, and Wisconsin have waivers from the federal government allowing them to standardize Medigap plans differently, so plan designs are different in those three states).

But be aware that Medigap costs vary by location, so your monthly Medigap policy premium may be higher or lower depending on the cost of medical care in your new area.

Call your provider and tell them the new ZIP code, and they'll let you know the cost. Sometimes you'll be pleasantly surprised that it's lower.

If it's not, you could look for a cheaper policy. However, you may have to undergo medical underwriting. Medigap policies come with their own rules for enrolling, and some states have different enrollment standards than others.

WALMART IS **ON MY LIST** by "The Computer Skeptic"

I'm being picky. Their burgers under a lot of stress so was a are the best Anyway, Walmart is on my

list. They helped a scammer scam one of my clients. I've written about a similar scam recently. I even called their corporate office and talked to a person who assured me that Walmart didn't do exactly what they just did to my client.

The backstory: Yesterday, yet another client dropped her computer off at my shop after realizing she was scammed. She is a bit elderly. Her husband is very sick. She was

perfect target for scammers. She received a fake email from "Comcast" informing her that her account was about to be charged \$1,600 for some stuff she didn't sign-up for. She called the 1-800 number and the scammers terrorized her into purchasing \$1,600 dollars worth of gift cards. She first went to DollarTree and the cashier there didn't bat an eye when she purchased \$500 in gift cards. She then traveled directly to Walmart with \$1,000 cash, and that cashier didn't bat an eye at

the purchase. The scammers then instructed her to take a picture of the numbers on the back of those cards and email the pictures to them. Once the scammers have those numbers, the damage can't be undone. That money is gone.

The cashiers could have prevented this scam at the onset. All they had to do was ask, "Hey, are you buying these for a loved one or did someone demand them?" If it's the latter, the cashier should be required to alert a manager who is trained in informing the customer that they are being scammed. There is simply no reason this should happen to anyone anymore. Walmart and DollarTree and everyone else selling gift cards are profiting off these scams and that's just not right.

I'm in the beginning phase of developing an organization to help combat this stuff locally by educating and working with local merchants. I'll provide more details in the next excitin g installment once I think my way through it. But, y'all, enough is enough! Our local merchants HAVE to help us out. If you have ideas on how to proceed, let me hear them. Together, maybe we can put a dent in this horrible crime.

I am not oppressed. I'm not oppressed, and I'm not a victim. I'm neither oppressed nor a victim. travel all across this country of ours, and I check into hotels, and I fly commercially, and I walk into retail establishments, and I order food in restaurants. I go wherever I want whenever I want. I am treated with kindness, dignity, and respect, literally from coast to coast. I have three children.

They are not oppressed, either, although they ARE victims. I've taught my children

they are victims of three things; their own ignorance, their own laziness, and their own poor decisionmaking. That is all. My children – we are

not victims of "America." We are not victims of some unseen 190 year old force that kinda floats around in the ether.

Putting Critical Race Theory in our classrooms is taking our nation in the wrong direction. Racism

in America would by and large be dead today if it were not for certain people and institutions keeping it on life support. And sadly, very sadly, one of those institutions is the American education system.

Requesting a **Farm Number** It's Important

Editor:

Any farmer or rancher interested in who is programs conservation the through Natural Resources Conservation Service is required to have a farm number for the application process.

Farm numbers are issued free and allow access to key U.S. Department of Agriculture programs including working lands conservation, farm loans, and others that require farm records to be shared as part of the application process. There is no minimum acreage requirement to register as a farm. Having farm number also makes the farmer eligible to vote in county Farm Service Agency (FSA) elections and to serve on their local FSA county committee.

Unlike other ways to identify farmers, such as the Schedule F tax form, farm numbers stay with the land, not the farmer. Farmers who buy or rent land that already has a number do not need to register for one, but the landowner may need to update boundaries and acreage figures. Ask your landowner whether the land has a farm number.

To register for a farm number, set up an appointment at the FSA

office and take along the following documents:

Proof of identity: driver's license or Social Security number/card.

Proof of ownership: a copy of the recorded deed or rental agreement as evidence of land ownership or control. Farmers and ranchers do not need to own property to participate in FSA programs.

Entity identification and status: This is only applicable for those who may have partnership agreements, trust, and documents, estate or articles of cooperation.

Financial and production particularly imare important if you apply for a farm ownership or operating loan.

FSA will then enroll the farm or ranch in the FSA database. This involves creating a map that outlines the boundaries with acreage figures. Be prepared to spend 30 minutes to an hour on this process.


