



Little Known Social Security Program **Helps Seniors Manage Their Money**

Dear Savvy Senior,

Does Social Security offer any special help to beneficiaries who struggle managing their benefits? My aunt, who has no children, has dementia and struggles keeping up with her bills and other financial duties.

Inquiring Niece

Dear Inquiring,

Yes, Social Security actually has a little-known program known as the "representative payee program" that helps beneficiaries who need help managing their Social Security benefit payments. Here's what you should know

Representative Payee Program

Authorized by congress back in 1939, the Social Security representative payee program provides money management help to beneficiaries who are incapable of managing their Social Security income. Beneficiaries in need of this help are often seniors suffering from dementia, or minor children who are collecting Social Security survivors' benefits.

Currently more than 5 million Social Security beneficiaries have representative payees.

Representative payees also handle benefits for nearly 3 million recipients of Supplemental Security Income (SSI), a Social Security administered benefit program for low-income people who are over 65, blind or disabled.

Who Are Payees?

A representative payee is typically a relative or close friend of the beneficiary needing assistance, but Social Security can also name an organization or institution for the role - like a nursing homes or social-service agency.

Some of duties of a representative payee include:

- Using the beneficiary's Social Security or SSI payments to meet their essential needs, such as food, shelter. household bills and medical care. The money can also be used for personal needs like clothing and recreation.
- Keeping any remaining money from benefit payments in an interest-bearing bank account or savings bonds for the beneficiary's future needs.
- · Keeping records of benefit payments received and how the money was spent or saved.
- · Reporting to Social Security any changes or events that could affect the beneficiary's payments (for example, a move, marriage, divorce or death).
- Reporting any circumstances that affect the payee's ability to serve in the role.

As a representative payee, you cannot combine the beneficiary's Social Security payments with your own money or use them for your own needs. The bank account into which benefits are deposited should be fully owned by the beneficiary, with the payee listed as financial agent.

Some payees, generally those who do not live with the beneficiary, are required to submit annual reports to Social Security accounting for how benefits are used. For more information on the responsibilities and restrictions that come with the role, see the Social Security publication "A Guide for Representative Payees" at SSA.gov/pubs/EN-05-10076.pdf.

How to Get Help

If you believe your aunt may need a representative payee, call Social Security at 800-772-1213 and make an appointment to discuss the matter at her local office. Applying to serve as a payee usually requires a face-to-face interview.

Social Security may consider other evidence in deciding if a beneficiary needs a payee and selecting the person to fill the role, including doctors' assessments and statements from relatives, friends and others in a position to give an informed opinion about the beneficiary's situation.

You should also know that if you become your aunt's representative payee you cannot collect a fee for doing it. However, some organizations that serve in the role do receive fees, paid out of the beneficiary's Social Security or SSI payments.

COVID-19: **Technocracy Flowered** and Failed

Editor:

History littered with social and political movements which failed to survive as movements, but largely achieved their

The Prohibition Party's national conventions could take place in a phone booth these days. However, its disastrous single policy proposal was adopted as a constitutional amendment, mutated into the equally disastrous war on drugs, and continues to torment the modern marketplace with draconian regulation.

Most "socialist" parties have either disappeared into the dustbin of history, or find themselves reduced glorified supper loud clubs featuring loud arguments over whether the Soviet Union was a bureaucratic deformation or a degenerated workers' state. However, Socialist Party candidate Norman Thomas's 885,000 votes in the 1932 presidential election arguably led to FDR's "New Deal" and the modern welfare state.

Few people remember, or ever learned about, the technocracy movement of the 1930s. That movement failed in its formal goal of replacing democratic legislatures with boards so-called experts to run society (including the economy) in accordance with science.

But over time, concept took root in America's regulatory apparatus. Nearly every aspect of our lives has been subject to scrutiny and oversight by experts for several decades. The food we eat. The drugs we take. The cars we drive. The securities we invest in. You name it, there's government

bureau somewhere full of whirring computers and nerds with slide rules, figuring out what we may or may not do, or in what way we may do it.

While most of us gripe about particular technocratic edicts, few question the premise itself. It's just taken as obvious that the man in the lab coat knows more about air bags and crop yields than the Honorable Representative from Minnesota.

Technocracy took root. And with the COVID-19 pandemic, it blossomed into the man-eating plant from *Little Shop of Horrors*.

Starting last year, public health technocrats (with, of course, the assistance of opportunistic politicians) seized control over huge parts of our lives mass house arrests without charge or trial, mask mandates, vaccine mandate and "passport" schemes, etc. -- then then proceeded to vacillate and scrap among themselves over the divvying up of their new power, as more than 600,000 Americans died and the economy

To add insult to injury, the parts of the country the "experts' where enjoyed less deference seem to have fared no worse. In some cases it fared better, than areas where politicians slavishly and without slavishly and without question enforced every technocratic edict.

Technocracy finally got its big shot at proving itself, and failed miserably. Why? Because "public health" technocracy isn't technocracy isn't about the health of the public. It's about policy, which is about politics, which is about power.

technocrats The exercised their power abusively ineffectually to boot. It's time to take that power away.







What We Need To Know About Your Worker's **Compensation Case**

When people are injured on the job, they usually have a worker's compensation case. There are employers that are exempt from the Worker's Compensation Statute, but the vast majority of people working in Alabama and the United States are covered by a worker's compensation scheme.

On the job injuries are divided into two main categories, the first being a scheduled injury such as an injury to a hand, foot or limb and the second being a vocational injury where someone has an injury to their back,

neck, hip or shoulder and cannot return to their usual occupation or now has injury related work restrictions.

Because payment for these injuries is to some degree based on an injured worker's pay history. We need to know how much the injured worker made and what benefits they had such as health insurance. We occasionally see people injured on the job soon after being hired and in those instances, the law provides seeing what other employees, doing the same job, earn to establish the wage of an injured worker in that situation.

Our job is to get the best result possible given the facts of the case. That means we will need to know about how you were injured and when you were injured. We need to know where you were injured and what you were doing. We need to know who treated you and what they did. We need to know how your injuries affect you.

We always look for a bigger case than just a worker's compensation case. We recognize that worker's compensation benefits are limited. We always look for third party liability. An example of third party liability would be someone on the job injured in an auto accident where the other party was at fault. That is the best outcome for the injured worker because worker's compensation does not pay for pain, suffering and the loss of enjoyment of life. Worker's compensation does pay for medical treatment and weekly benefits while a person is recovering from their injuries. We see cases where an employer has disabled a safety device so that production numbers stay high. When those disabled safety devices cause an injury, those cases are not just worker's compensation cases.

We need a lot of information to fully evaluate a case to make sure that we get the best outcome for the injured worker.

How does telematics work in my car? How can it help lower my insurance premium?

What is auto telematics?

Auto telematics is a method of monitoring a vehicle. Through a combination of cellular, GPS and on-board diagnostics telematics can gather and transmit data about the vehicle like:

- The vehicle's exact location. This data can be communicated with police and other emergency responders in the event of a crash, or a tow truck driver if you're in an unfamiliar location.
- The distance the vehicle has traveled. Along with other information like speed, braking or turning, the distance a vehicle travels could be used by your insurance company to help determine if you qualify for discounts on your insurance policy.
- How the vehicle is performing. A mechanic or technician can review the information to possibly help identity an issue with the vehicle more efficiently.

Why should I consider allowing access to my vehicle's telematics?

It's important to remember that auto telematics communication goes both ways, so data can also be received, which adds to its benefits:

- Assistance. If you have an emergency, need directions or just want to make reservations at a nearby restaurant, telematics systems connect you to the appropriate live support. Sometimes in the case of a crash, the vehicle automatically notifies a monitoring service who dispatches emergency vehicles immediately.
- Convenience. Many systems offer access to email, weather, traffic reports, stock quotes and even social media.

You can choose from several features for an auto telematics system from multiple providers. To help determine which is right for you, ask yourself what you'll benefit from the most. For example:

- If safety is your concern and you have a car equipped with OnStar[™], you can activate the system for a monthly service fee. Once activated, you will have access to all the benefits of OnStar.
- · If saving on your car insurance premium is a priority, check with your insurance company to see if they have an auto telematics program and what equipment might be
- · If understanding the condition of your vehicle is your concern, check with your mechanic or dealership to see what they would recommend.



Medicare Minute Medicare "Donut Hole"

September and October are two months we get calls on the coverage gap or "donut hole". This happens because there is a temporary limit on what your drug plan will pay while you are in the gap. The good news is not everyone will enter the coverage gap. The coverage gap begins after you and your plan have spent a certain amount on covered drugs. In 2021 once you and your plan combined have spent \$4,130 you will enter the coverage gap.

Here's the way the coverage gap works. Imagine you have a prescription that retails for \$400 per month. Your copay, hypothetically, is \$30. This means your plan would pay the rest of the cost or \$370. Medicare will track what you paid (\$30) and what your plan paid (\$370) and count the cost of the drug as \$400 for that month. Let's also say that the other prescriptions you are taking equals \$100 per month. You are now at \$500 per month. In this example you would reach the coverage gap sometime in September.

Under most plans in 2021 once you have reached the coverage gap your plan will temporarily stop paying anything on your drugs. This means you will be responsible for the entire cost of your prescriptions. The silver lining around this very dark cloud is Medicare has negotiated a discount on the drugs you use. For name brand drugs and/ or generic drugs you will pay 25% of the retail price.

If you are eligible for Medicare but still on employer coverage you may wonder why you have never reach the coverage gap. This is because employer coverage does not have the "donut hole". The coverage gap only applies to Medicare prescription drug plans. Also remember that Medicare drug plans can vary which means your coverage in the gap can vary.
