Antique Mixing Table

"Antique mixing table" is what the auction catalog said. Meant to mix what? How did you use it? When was it made? Where did it belong in the house? An online search was no help. Today the name "mixing table" refers to the electronic consoles that are used to create music recordings. A search of several large modern dictionaries, books on period furniture and more

explanation. But there was a clue. The auction's piece was probably made by Anthony Quervelle (1789-1856). He was a popular furniture maker who worked in Philadelphia about 1815. He specialized in carved wooden, usually mahogany, pieces in the Classical style.

The mixing table was used in a Southern dining room to mix drinks. There were special shelves to store bottles. Its marble, not mahogany, top was less likely to be stained if a drink was spilled. The top of the table was 40 inches from the floor, the perfect serving height. To add to the room's decoration, mixing tables were made with decorative scrolls and panels. A Neal Auction in New Orleans sold a mixing table attributed to Quervelle for \$3,200. Several other similar

tables sold in the past few years for a comparable price.

. In 1933 Franklin D. Roosevelt **1.** became the first president to travel in an airplane. His successor, President Harry Truman, was the first to give decks of playing cards to VIPs and guests who flew on the presidential plane. The presidential plane was not called Air Force One until 1953. The tradition of giving playing cards continued, except under President Carter, who thought the giveaway was a waste of taxpayer's money. The first playing cards to include the president's signature were those given by Johnson in the 1960s.

Unopened decks, still in their cellophane wrap, are worth more than decks that have been opened and used. Prices for memorabilia from some presidents are more than those from others. Recent prices for President Johnson's Air Force One playing cards include a boxed set of two unopened decks for \$125 and a boxed set with two decks that have been opened for \$50.

In 1964, Ruth Harrison, a British woman, wrote Animal Machines that was an expose on the livestock and poultry farming practices of that time. The public became very concerned and even horrified, and the British government appointed a committee to examine the welfare of animals used on farms and for the food industry.

The committee presented their findings a year later in an 85 page document coined "The Brambell Report" after the chief author, Roger Brambell.

A list of Five Freedoms of Animals was included in the report. At first, the Five Freedoms were written for farm animals. With the growing demand from the public for more humanely-raised food, the American Humane Association established their American Humane Certified program, which, according to their website, is "the first-ever U.S. farm animal welfare certification effort, which now covers more than a billion animals".

Although the standards of the Five Freedoms may have begun as a gold standard for the food industry, they have now been widely adopted as the gold standard of treatment for all animals by welfare organizations, including but not limited to the American Veterinary Medical Association, the World Organization for Animal Health and the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals.

The Five Freedoms are:

Freedom from Hunger and Thirst: by ready access to fresh water and a diet to maintain full health and vigor.

Freedom from Discomfort: by providing an appropriate environment, including shelter and a comfortable resting area.

Freedom from Pain, Injury, or Disease: by prevention or rapid diagnosis and treatment.

4 Freedom to Express Normal Behavior: by providing sufficient space, proper facilities and company of the animal's own kind.

Freedom from Fear and Distress: by ensuring conditions and treatment which avoid mental suffering.

Many years ago, the Board of Directors of the Danville Area Humane Society adopted these Five Freedoms as a guideline for all its policies and procedures. If an idea that is considered "progressive" does not protect this philosophy, it is not put into place for our shelter animals or for animals outside of the shelter realm.

HOLLYWOOD


HOLLYWOOD — In 1955, Clint Eastwood began his career in "The Revenge of the Creature" (from "The Black Lagoon"). He landed the lead in the CBS series "Rawhide" in 1958, then went to Italy in 1964 and starred in "A Fistful of Dollars," the first of three spaghetti Westerns. At 40, Eastwood directed his first film, "Play Misty For Me" (1971). He kept acting, but it was directing that earned him four Oscars (from 11 nominations). On Sept. 17, at 91, his 40th film will open, "Cry Macho," which he directed, produced and stars in.

Clint cast country singer Dwight Yoakum as his co-star. Yoakum's memorable films are "Sling Blade" (1996), "Panic Room" (2002), "Wedding Crashers" (2005) and most recently "Logan Lucky" (2017), with Channing Tatum, Adam Driver, Seth Mac-Farlane and Sebastian Stan.

Famed director Frank Capra won six Oscars and made his last film at age 64. Alfred Hitchcock directed 59 films (and never won an Oscar, though he did receive the Irving Thalberg Award from the Academy), directing his last one at 76. While Capra had two wives and four kids, and Hitchcock had one wife and one kid, Eastwood juggled his career with two wives, two partners and eight children. At least five of his kids have successful acting/directing careers, including Scott Eastwood, who can be seen in the recent hit "The Suicide Squad." Clint had many memorable moments as an actor, but as a director, he's in a class of his own.

At long last, Shari Lewis (who died in 1998) and Lambchop — who made their TV debut in 1956 with "Captain Kangaroo" on CBS, won 13 Emmy Awards and a Peabody — will finally be the subject of an upcoming documentary.

Not so lucky is Johnny Depp, whom the San Sebastian Film Festival is giving a Lifetime Achievement Award and getting backlash from women's groups, including Spain's Association of Female

Filmmakers. It follows the decree of an English judge who found the accusation of Depp beating his ex-wife, Amber Heard, "was substantially correct" (despite her beating him too?).

More bad news for Harvey Weinstein. Pulitzer Prize-winning New York Times writers Jodi Kantor and Megan Twohey's bestselling book "She Said" is becoming a movie with Carey Mulligan playing Twohey and Zoe Kazan as Kantor, as well as Patricia Clarkson and "Brooklyn Nine Nine's" two-time Emmy-winner Andre Braugher, plus Brad Pitt as one of the producers. The film is a dramatic retelling of the sexual harassment investigation that took down Weinstein and sparked the #MeToo movement. It will focus on their efforts to uncover and expose decades of allegations against Weinstein, who has already been sentenced to 23 years in prison on charges of sexual assault and third-degree rape, and is now facing more charges in Los Angeles. Tick, tick, boom ... time's up!



Traffic Updates for Music Festivals






Below are the crossovers of Route 29 that will be closed or manned by law enforcement during the Rock Festival.


- Dry Fork Road: handled by Troopers (Right lane will be closed approaching this location going South)

- Blairs Fire and Rescue- closed





Surgery Is Valid Option for Severe Sleep Apnea

DEAR DR. ROACH: My son, who is 30 years old, was recently diagnosed with severe obstructive sleep apnea and currently uses a CPAP machine. He says does not want to use this for the rest of his life, therefore, he has researched surgery to correct his OSA. Recently he consulted with a sleep expert, and now has surgery scheduled with that doctor. My son will have a septoplasty and a palate expansion before a more radical surgery in a year called MMA. My son feels that these surgeries will give him the longest lasting cure for his OSA. I am very concerned about all of these surgeries. I value your objective opinion and hope you can give me some reassurance that these surgeries are worth the pain.

ANSWER: Although CPAP (continuous positive airway pressure, which works by using air to keep the airway open) is the usual treatment for obstructive sleep apnea, surgery is another effective way to treat OSA. Surgery is most appropriate for those who wish a surgical solution (some people can't stand the CPAP machine), those who have a surgically correctable problem (see below), and those who are good candidates for surgery; younger age makes surgery seem more reasonable to me.

The specific surgery chosen depends on an individual's unique anatomy. Surgery on the uvula (yes, the dangling thing at the back of the throat), soft palate and pharynx is the most common surgery, but maxillomandibular advancement surgery (MMA) has been shown to be successful in several well-known medical centers in the U.S., such as Mayo Clinic and Stanford. Success rates are high, and some studies have shown surgical cure of obstructive sleep apnea in over half of those who undergo the procedure. Not knowing your son and not being a surgeon, I can't give an objective opinion for him in particular, but I can say that in appropriate patients, surgical treatment of OSA is reasonable.

DEAR DR. ROACH: Is there any good way to find the correct blood pressure medicine that doesn't suck the life pep out of you, give you a headache, make you short of breath when walking or grapple with all of those side effects at once? Who should manage that program, your regular doctor or your cardiologist? Is there another specialist with the right insight and expertise? -- E.M.

ANSWER: Choosing the best blood pressure medicine for a person with high blood pressure starts with knowing as much as possible about the person's heart and blood vessels, and their other medical conditions. A person with blockages in the arteries should be on a beta blocker and ACE inhibitor most of the time. A person with diabetes should be on an ACE inhibitor or angiotensin receptor blocker. An older person with isolated high systolic pressure may get most benefit from a diuretic. However, it may still take some trial and error to find the best choice. Most people are able to find a blood pressure regimen that has very few side effects.

Most generalists have expertise in blood-pressure medications, and are likely to know all your conditions. Cardiologists have more expertise in cardiovascular disease, and I refer to high blood pressure experts when I have difficulty getting someone's blood pressure under control.

Place warm beef mixture in large bowl and add cream cheese, sour cream, 1 cup salsa and mozzarella. Mix well until combined and pour into prepared pan. Top with blended cheese and sliced jalapeno, black olives and green onions, if desired. Bake until fully warmed and cheese is melted,

Top with small spoonfuls of salsa. Serve with tortilla chips.





A timeline of the morning of September 11, 2001

The following timeline, courtesy of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum, can help people fully understand how events unfolded on that late-summer morning two decades ago.

On the morning of September 11, 2001, 19 terrorists hijacked four commercial airplanes bound for California. The planes departed from airports in Boston; Newark, NJ; and Washington, D.C. September 11 would become an infamous date in American and world history, and the events of that day would forever change the world. As the world commemorates the 20th anniversary of 9/11, the following timeline, courtesy of the National September 11 Memorial & Museum, can help people fully understand how events unfolded on that late-summer morning two decades ago.


- · 5:45 a.m.: Two of the hijackers pass through security at Portland International Airport in Maine. The men will take a short flight to Boston Logan International Airport, where they will join three other hijackers and board American Airlines Flight 11.
- · 6:00 a.m: Two of the hijacked planes, American Airlines Flight 11 and United Airlines Flight 175, will eventually crash into the North and South Towers of the World Trade Center complex in New York City. The day was a significant one on the New York City political calendar, as polling stations opened at 6 a.m. for primary elections.
- · 7:59 a.m.: American Airlines Flight 11 takes off from Boston with 11 crew members, 76 passengers and five hijackers on board. The plane, which will eventually crash into the North tower at the World Trade Center, is filled with more than 76,000 pounds of fuel.
- · 8:15 a.m.: United Airlines Flight 175 takes off from Boston with nine crew members, 51 passengers, and five hijackers on board. This flight also is loaded with 76,000 pounds of fuel.
- · 8:19 a.m.: American Airlines ground personnel are alerted by flight attendant Betty Ann Ong that Flight 11 is being hijacked. This call lasts roughly 25 minutes and Ong reports that the cockpit is unreachable. In the moments before Ong's call, one of the hijackers stabbed Daniel M. Lewin, who was sitting in front of him in first class. Lewin is likely the first person killed in the 9/11 attacks.
- · 8:20 a.m.: American Airlines Flight 77 takes off from Washington Dulles International Airport. The flight has 49,900 pounds of fuel and is carrying six crew members, 53 passengers and five hijackers.
- \cdot 8:21 a.m.: The transponder on Flight 11 is turned off. This device is meant to allow air traffic controllers to identify and monitor the flight path of a plane.
- · 8:24 a.m.: One of the hijackers of Flight 11 unwittingly broadcasts a message to air traffic controllers alerting them to the attacks. The hijacker was attempting to communicate with passengers and crew within the cabin.
- · 8:30 a.m.: Around this time, roughly 80 people have already begun gathering on the 106th floor of the North Tower of the World Trade Center for a financial technology conference. The conference is one of many events on the Trade Center schedule that day.
- · 8:37 a.m.: The Boston Air Traffic Control Center alerts the military that a hijacking is under way.
- · 8:42 a.m.: United Airlines Flight 93 takes off from Newark International Airport. The flight was due to take off at roughly the same time as the other hijacked planes, but was delayed due to routine traffic. Seven crew members, 33 passengers and four hijackers are on board. The flight is filled with 48,700 pounds of fuel.
- · 8:46 a.m.: Five hijackers crash Flight 11 into floors 93 through 99 of the North Tower of the World Trade Center. Hundreds, including everyone on board the flight, are killed instantly. The crash severs all three emergency stairwells, trapping hundreds of people above the 91st floor.
- · 8:46 a.m.: Police, paramedics and firefighters are sent to the North Tow-
- · 8:50 a.m.: While visiting an elementary school in Florida, U.S. President George W. Bush is notified that a small plane has hit the North Tower.
- · 8:52 a.m.: A flight attendant aboard Flight 175 reaches a United Airlines operator in San Francisco and reports the flight is being hijacked. By 9 a.m., various passengers on Flight 175 have called family members.
- · 8:55 a.m.: The Port Authority informs people inside the South Tower

via a public address system that the building is secure and there is no need to evacuate.

- · 8:59 a.m.: The Port Authority Police Department orders both towers evacuated. One minute later Captain Anthony Whitaker expands the order to include all civilians in the entire World Trade Center complex.
- 9:02 a.m.: An evacuation order is broadcast in the South Tower.
- · 9:03 a.m.: Five hijackers crash Flight 175 into floors 77 through 85 of the South Tower. All onboard the flight are killed, as are an unknown number of people inside the building. Two of the three emergency stairwells are impassable and most elevator cables are severed, trapping many people above the impact zone and inside elevator cars.
- 9:03 a.m.: A second call for mobilization brings the total number of New York City Police Department officers responding to the scene to roughly 2,000. In addition, the FDNY issues a fifth alarm and deploys several hundred additional firefighters to the scene.
- 9:05 a.m.: President Bush is informed that a second plane has crashed into the World Trade Center.
- 9:12 a.m.: Flight attendant Renée A. May calls her mother and tells her that hijackers have seized control of Flight 77. When May's call is disconnected, she calls American Airlines.
- · 9:30 a.m.: Amidst reports of additional hijacked planes, the Mayor's Office of Emergency Management at 7 World Trade Center is evacuated.
- · 9:37 a.m.: Hijackers crash Flight 77 into the Pentagon. All 53 passengers and six crew members perish, and 125 military and civilian personnel on the ground are killed in the fire caused by the crash.
- 9:42 a.m.: The Federal Aviation Administration grounds all flights, ordering all civilian planes in United States airspace to land. Departures also are prohibited.
- · 9:45 a.m.: Evacuations at the White House and the U.S. Capitol begin. Both the House of Representatives and Senate are in session at the time the evacuation begins.
- 9:58 a.m.: Flight 93 is flying so low to the ground that passenger Edward P. Felt is able to reach an emergency 911 operator in Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania.
- 9:59 a.m.: The South Tower collapses after burning for 56 minutes. The tower collapses in just 10 seconds.
- · 9:59 a.m.: Continuity-of-government procedures are implemented for the first known time in American history.
- · 10:03 a.m.: Four hijackers crash Flight 93 into a field near the town of Shanksville, Pennsylvania. All 33 passengers and seven crew members on board perish. Passengers and crew had stormed the cockpit, and the plane ultimately crashes just 20 minutes' flying time from Washington, D.C.
- · 10:15 a.m.: The E Ring of the Pentagon collapses.
- · 10:28 a.m.: The North Tower collapses after burning for 102 minutes. More than 1,600 people are killed as a result of the attack on the North
- · 11:02 a.m.: New York City Mayor Rudolph Giuliani urges the evacuation of lower Manhattan.
- · 12:16 p.m.: The last flight still in the air above the continental United States lands. Within two and a half hours, U.S. airspace has been cleared of roughly 4,500 commercial and general aviation planes.




- * For a little extra visibility in the basement, try applying glow-in-the-dark or reflective tape on the edges of the stairs.

BEST EVER BUTTERMILK BLUE-BERRY MUFFINS



INGREDIENTS

2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour 3/4 cups grapulated sugar

3/4 cups granulated sugar

1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup buttermilk

1/2 cup oil (canola, vegetable, or avocado) 2 eggs

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract

1 1/2 cups fresh blueberries

3–4 teaspoons coarse sparkling sugar

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Line a standard size muffin tin with parchment paper liners and spray each one with nonstick spray for baking.

In a large bowl, mix together flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. In a small bowl, whisk together buttermilk, oil, eggs, and vanilla extract until smooth. Gradually mix the buttermilk into the flour mixture, stirring gently and being careful not to overmix.

Gently fold the blueberries into the batter. Use a large scoop to divide the batter evenly into each muffin well. They will be filled to the very top. Sprinkle generously with sparkling sugar!

Bake at 400 degrees for 22-26 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center of the muffin comes out clean. Cool for 5 minutes in the pan and then transfer to a cooling rack. Store in an airtight container.


