

REOPENING AND DISCOVERY

Main Line businesses adapt to shifting landscape

Challenging, uncertain, unprecedented, tumultuous.

There seems to be no shortage of words to describe the months following the coronavirus pandemic.

For businesses, there were restrictions and challenges that included closures, reduced capacity, working from home (with no notice), and worker shortages.

Bernard Dagenais, president and CEO of the Main Line Chamber of Commerce has another description for the pandemic's impact — "seismic."

After March 2020, businesses found themselves forced to develop new and creative ways of communicating with

customers and employees and new ways of operating their businesses — in order to stay in business.

Unfortunately, not every business was able to withstand the economic challenge the pandemic presented. Those that did, exhibited resilience, adaptability, creativity and courage — shifting their operations to do what they needed to survive — so they can continue to thrive.

"The surprise of the pandemic has been the level of resilience," Dagenais said. "Never in our lives have we seen so much change. And the greater Main Line region has adapted well. In any economic story there are winners and

losers. It's amazing how many companies of all types have survived this and done well."

RALLYING AROUND BUSINESS

Communities rallied around their local businesses — recognizing how valuable they are to the fabric of the community. They have been buying gift cards, ordering takeout and standing in line outside shops across the region in order to support these small, local businesses.

As these business owners work to continue their recovery, there have been lessons learned — about them-

selves, their communities and their businesses.

LESSONS LEARNED: ADAPT, SOLVE PROBLEMS

The Main Line Chamber of Commerce is comprised of about 900 member companies, according to Dagenais, varying from business to business and business to consumer and including office environments, retail, restaurants, residential real estate and the sectors that support it — things like painting and construction.

Every sector, he said, has had its challenges — including those businesses deemed essential and that experienced increased business.

Office settings needed to pivot overnight to work from home — in many cases adding the technology to allow employees to work from home.

Restaurants could offer take-out and delivery, and when outdoor dining was allowed, many scrambled to find the space to make that work.

Retail locations with no e-commerce capabilities had to decide if that was something they would offer, and then make it work. Many offered curbside

pickup and limited delivery, and made increased use of social media.

He added that businesses that were strong and in good financial position when the pandemic started, "could weather the storm and come out of it strong on the other side."

Dagenais said adaptability is a characteristic he has seen in area businesses.

"One of my favorite things to say during the pandemic was: 'it's not business

as usual, so we can't do things the way we always did them,'" he said.

He said the chamber mirrors the experiences of many office-based environments. Like many businesses, the chamber relied on Zoom conferencing technology to take the place of meetings and networking events.

"You can actually make more valuable connections in a well-run Zoom meeting than you can in a coffee line at an in-person event. You can have more follow-up interactions with people who are going to be useful to your business and that you can help, he said.

He said entrepreneurs also have to have the ability to look at things in a realistic way, while remaining optimistic.

"We have to be able to say, 'we don't have the answer today but we will figure it out,'" he said, adding problem solving as another characteristic. We had never gone through anything like this before. Although there has been a lot of tragedy and a huge impact on sectors of the economy, many of us are still standing and we're stronger."

CREATING CONNECTIONS

Deanna Doane is the president of the Wayne Business Association, which has about 200 members.

"Our mission is to connect commerce and the community," she said, adding that the association has a few more members now than it did in 2019 — which she said was a "banner year" for the organization.



CALM GETS THROUGH THE STORM

Cody Loeffler and his wife Emily Loeffler have been co-owners of Main Line Gym in Paoli, since 2014.

The gym offers personal one-to-one training, customer formatted training plans, and open access gym memberships, as well as a nutrition strategy session.

Loeffler said when the pandemic struck and gyms closed, "the first thing was — we didn't react. We took the news of the shutdown, and we relied on systems we have in place," he said.

"We waited, we were patient, we didn't jump to any immediate decisions."

Two weeks into the shutdown, Loeffler said the facility began reaching out to clients. He said he offered a discount on memberships, since clients didn't have access to the facility.

Closed until June, 2020 — when the Main Line region entered the green phase of Pennsylvania's recovery — Loeffler said many gyms transitioned to offering Zoom classes.

That isn't a step Main Line Gym took,

according to Loeffler. The gym uses the Trucoach app to develop and deliver workouts to its members on a daily basis.

"It is an all-encompassing interactive tool — like having a trainer in the palm of your hand," he said, adding it can go with the client anywhere on the planet.

That tool was already in place, with the majority of the gym's members making use of the technology.

During the course of the pandemic, Loeffler decided to install 24/7 access to the gym, for people that may want to go to the gym at times there are fewer clients there.

"There was a lot of time to reflect on what was happening and thinking about pivoting to something that was bullet proof," he said.

He said they also adjusted the internal layout of the 5,000-square-foot gym, to use the space in a different way to make it more effective.

The changes, he said, had nothing to do with how and what Main Line Gym delivers for clients.

"What makes or breaks a business is the relationships that you have with your people. Not just relationships, but the ability to meet them where they are and deliver on what you say you will," he said.

Loeffler said the gym has been experiencing "intense growth," with June and July 2021 "the best months ever."

"If your gym is going to last it's not what you have or what you did or how many online classes you created.

"We waited, we were patient, we didn't jump to any immediate decisions."

Two weeks into the shutdown, Loeffler said the facility began reaching out to clients. He said he offered a discount on memberships, since clients didn't have access to the facility.

Closed until June, 2020 — when the Main Line region entered the green phase of Pennsylvania's recovery — Loeffler said many gyms transitioned to offering Zoom classes.

That isn't a step Main Line Gym took,

according to Loeffler. The gym uses the Trucoach app to develop and deliver workouts to its members on a daily basis.

"It is an all-encompassing interactive tool — like having a trainer in the palm of your hand," he said, adding it can go with the client anywhere on the planet.

That tool was already in place, with the majority of the gym's members making use of the technology.

During the course of the pandemic, Loeffler decided to install 24/7 access to the gym, for people that may want to go to the gym at times there are fewer clients there.

"There was a lot of time to reflect on what was happening and thinking about pivoting to something that was bullet proof," he said.

He said they also adjusted the internal layout of the 5,000-square-foot gym, to use the space in a different way to make it more effective.

The changes, he said, had nothing to do with how and what Main Line Gym delivers for clients.

"What makes or breaks a business is the relationships that you have with your people. Not just relationships, but the ability to meet them where they are and deliver on what you say you will," he said.

Loeffler said the gym has been experiencing "intense growth," with June and July 2021 "the best months ever."

"If your gym is going to last it's not what you have or what you did or how many online classes you created.







the digital marketing agency for nearly 12 years. Doane said the company works with small business owners – building websites, handling social media and blog writing, “anything that would help a small business get found, drive traffic to a website, make the phone ring, and bring people in.”

Doane said the impact of the pandemic on Click Canyon wasn’t immediate, but as two weeks turned into two months – Click Canyon became more proactive – reaching out to clients.

“And saying ‘what can we do – to keep your business afloat. Does your website need to be updated? Have you updated social media? Do you need to send an email?’ We put a couple of packages together and said, ‘let us do this for you,’” she said, adding Click Canyon offered discounts to some existing customers.

“We took a hit in order to keep the business,” she said. She added that not every industry was slowed by the pandemic.

“We had some service providers that couldn’t – and still can’t – keep up with the business,” she added.

Doane said she and Brent Doane

knew the company would be fine, but “tightened our belts and looked at costs.”

“Those that had a good business sense to begin with were able to persevere,” she said.

By January and February 2021, Doane said clients started to call again, saying they could see a light at the end of the tunnel with the expansion of vaccines.

“Things started to open up and we got that little breath of fresh air,” she said. “We could start to feel it wasn’t completely over, but it’s going to be over.”

A lesson learned, according to Doane is to be prepared.

“Be organized with your business and have an idea of what your processes are – don’t wing it,” she said. “No one can prepare for a pandemic but it’s important to have your processes in place.”

She also stressed that “People are stronger than they realize. I think you learn what your strengths are.”

POWER OF BEING PREPARED

Anita Alvaré is the owner of Alvaré Associates – a full-service marketing communications firm specializing in

branding, media relations, promotion and digital communication. Alvaré said decisions she has made and lessons she has learned over her 40-year career prepared her for the pandemic.

The first was a decision Alvaré made several years ago that turned out to be a really good decision once the pandemic struck. Five years ago she closed her Bryn Mawr office and transitioned the business to remote operations.

“I was counting my blessings when this happened,” she said, adding the company’s three full-time employees had the technology they needed already in place. “We were very lucky we had all the IT bugs worked out. We had all this time to get it under control,” she added.

Another lesson learned that helped during the pandemic was one, Alvaré said she learned during the 2008 recession. At that time, Alvaré said she kept everyone employed, and used personal money to help her do that.

thing some particular owners needed to say this is not something I'm going to continue to pursue," he added. Taking the plunge at an unexpected time in May, 2021, restaurant veteran and New Jersey native Anthony DePaul announced the grand opening of his first venture into ownership, DePaul's Table: Modern Italian Steakhouse (7 E. Lancaster Ave.) in the former historic home of Haverford Trust Bank, which dates back to the early 1900s. The prominent location was once occupied by the French restaurant The Bercy.

"I'm married with four kids and sometimes you have to take a chance,"

said DePaul, who attended Widener University. "I risked a lot and hopefully it's a success. I'm a blue collar guy and if it doesn't work I'll figure it out. But right now things are going pretty well."

I'm at a point where I could take more reservations but I turn them away because of some of the staffing levels we have. We focus on the service and food," DePaul added. "Talking to other restaurateurs, people on unemployment are now needing to prove that they're actively looking for work and filling out applications."

In the kitchen, DePaul has tapped New Jersey-native Executive Chef Jose Galicia from The Chophouse, who will showcase Italian flavors, fine cuts of steak, large chops, fresh seafood, seasonal vegetables, big salads, savory flatbreads and fresh made desserts.

Elsewhere, handcrafted cocktails, a curated wine selection, and a collection of domestic, import and local beers with a rotating seasonal tap make up the beverage selections.

"I want DePaul's Table to reflect the values that I've come to love and adore from my 20-plus years' experience in restaurants: there is nothing more important to me than top notch service, the freshness of ingredients, and a dedication to our food and drink offerings," DePaul said. I took down the wall art and put some mirrors up," noted DePaul, who said he was struck by the potential of the building the first time he entered it.

"I walked into the space and just the grandness of it told me it could be a steakhouse," he recalled. "And that's what I rolled with, with an Italian spin and a little more approachable price point. The menu is pretty vast; you could come in and grab a salad, an appetizer and a glass of wine and spend maybe 30 bucks, or less if you come for Happy Hour. Or, you can have that special occasion dinner, where you can get a \$125 Tomahawk for two and all the fixings and a nice bottle of wine. So I kind of wanted to appeal to everybody and what I'm seeing now after being open five weeks is some people come in every single day. They might come in for a glass of wine after work, clams on the half shell, half a dozen oysters and they're out in an hour, or they might come in and watch the game – I have four TVs at the bar. It's very much a lot of

regulars, which is nice to see."

"The dramatic multi-level space is so grand and versatile - making it perfect for a power lunch, grand brunch, after-work cocktail, high-stakes business dinner, family celebration or romantic date night on the town," he said. "It also offers banquets and intimate spaces that are familiar and comfortable for neighbors and locals that want a new regular place to call 'a home away from home' one, two or three days a week."

The homespun name itself embraces everything its owner would like to offer: "DePaul's Table represents family, friends, guests, great food, well-made drinks and good times," DePaul noted. "Personally, for me and my wife, Tina whom we are the proud parents of four sons (Anthony, Dante, Roman and Franco) and everything happens at the 'Table.' In a world of hustle and bustle and both working full time jobs we always find time to sit down and talk/catch up on everything around the table. We talk about school, sports, reminisce all over a nice meal and some drinks. Some of the best times and memories happen around the table at my home. I want DePaul's table to be a place where our guests can feel at home and share their own memories and experiences together."

In April FCM Hospitality owner Avram

Hornik expanded the city to debut his first Main Line restaurant, Lola's Garden in Suburban Square, 51 St. Georges Road.

If the name puts you in mind of the classic Kinks song, you're right on track because that's what inspired it..

A press release noted that Hornik's newest open-air restaurant joins the ranks of FCM Hospitality's other outdoor restaurant and hospitality concepts, such as Harper's Garden, Morgan's Pier, Parks on Tap, Rosy's Taco Bar, Craft Hall, The Garden at Cherry Street and others.

Opening at Suburban Square was sort of a childhood dream come true for the restaurateur.

"I grew up in Merion, so I used to come to Suburban Square as a kid and I had kind of a soft spot for it with my childhood memories," Hornik said.

"Suburban Square is the country's oldest shopping mall and the area where I'm at is the interior courtyard and they've been trying to reimagine what to do with that. When Lifestyle Fitness opened kind of catty-cornered to us, they put this lawn area where people could gather as a public space and we built this four-season outdoor trellis, so in the summer it's open air and in the winter it's going to be enclosed and heated."

The release also noted that the indoor and outdoor restaurant, patio and beer/wine garden hybrid draws much of its inspiration from the company's popular Rittenhouse restaurant, Harper's Garden. The unique dining destination offers picturesque views of Suburban Square's inner green courtyard, while offering the sensibility of the company's waterfront-based Morgan's Pier, Hornik pointed out.

"I do mostly seasonal outdoor restaurants. We've been working on the project for two years or so," he added. "It's mostly outdoors; we have 300 seats of which 200 are outdoors. During the pandemic outdoors was seen as better than indoors so it seemed like a good concept. And we opened at the tail end of the pandemic. We were very optimistic that by spring and summer the pandemic would be winding down and it would be a time when people would be looking to get out and be with their friends and family and it was a good time for opening up."

The Modern American culinary at-

titude will be chef-driven and highlight seasonal local offerings from acclaimed Chef Andrew Wood, who hails most recently from BYO Russet, offering ample vegan, vegetarian, gluten-free and kids' options.

Besides an award-winning chef in the kitchen, Lola's Garden features lush plants, a massive outdoor trellis, room for socially distanced seating, and a robust bar program. The beer program will feature 15 all local Pennsylvania beers on tap. The wine program will feature all Pennsylvania wines including wines on tap and an intimate curated bottle list.

For Hornik, Lola's Garden continues to expand a company that during the pandemic saw the opening of Juno, The Garden at Cherry Street, River Street Beer Garden, Parks Pop-up and Parks on Tap: Cherry Blossom Edition.

"It's been a struggle at times," Hornik noted. "We're Center City-based, so we moved some of our core staff out here. The staff we have are really good and we're constantly hiring new people as we're expanding our hours. We feel good about the team we put together and that the team will continue to grow. The landlord is doing so much development and they changed the zoning around the train station in Ardmore to allow for higher density occupancy to allow for this mixed use, transit-oriented hub," he added. "I'm really excited to be part of that to help reimagine what the suburbs can be, as a walkable, community-centric space. Back in the early '90s, I owned several coffee houses and wanted to bring an outdoor coffee kiosk and seating to the very same spot at what will now become Lola's Garden. Now, 25 years later, my relationship with Suburban Square comes full circle. Kimco Realty is transforming what was one of America's earliest planned suburban shopping centers. Shopping centers and malls are no longer designed exclusively as a place for commerce. They are now community gathering spots with a much larger purpose of promoting and fostering socialization and interaction. We want to be part of that energy and the new direction for Suburban Square as it evolves into an urban pedestrian-friendly town center and community hub that includes a grocery store, gourmet farmers' market, restaurants, green space and much more. Exciting developments in the

Colleges move forward with lessons learned

As area colleges have embarked on the post-pandemic world of educating young adults and non-traditional students, one thing is clear – they want 2021-22 to look a little less like 2020 and a little more like 2019.

Donald Taylor, president of Cabrini University in Wayne, said that an important aspect of the fall semester was getting student life back to what it was before the pandemic.



"We intend to have an as robust residential experience as we can for our traditional undergrads," Taylor said, of the school year starting in August-September 2021.

Like many schools, Cabrini moved

virtual at the beginning of the state-ordered lockdowns, but then opened up some areas this past year with a mixture of hybrid learning.

Other area universities had a similar viewpoint.

"We're hoping that 2021 is more like the fall of 2019," said Cheryl McConnell, provost and vice president for academic affairs at Saint Joseph's University in Merion.

One activity at another Main Line college is quickly getting back to pre-pandemic times, as Haverford College reopened its very popular nature trail to the general public. It had been closed to the public since the start of the pandemic.

Something that all agree is important is COVID-19 vaccines.

"At Villanova, I would also like to see a return to a more typical, on-campus experience, so I have decided to require that all students, faculty, and staff be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 by August 1, 2021," said Peter M. Donohue, president of Villanova University in a July interview.

By mid-June, most Main Line colleges had already or were expected to announce that vaccines would be mandatory for the fall semester.

Villanova officials said they conducted a vaccine survey at the end of the semester, indicating that most of those responding had already been vaccinated.



"My hope is that by requiring the vaccine for all community members, we can lift most of the mitigation measures from this past year and provide the safest possible environment for both the University and local community," said Donohue.

According to Villanova officials, vaccine documentation will be part of each student's health record through the Student Health Center and Human Resources will facilitate documentation for faculty and staff. As with other vaccines required to attend Villanova, the school allows for exemptions by request for medical and religious reasons. They also make provisions for international students to receive the vaccine once on campus if they were unable to meet this requirement in advance of the fall semester.

So what else looks different?

According to Taylor, over the past three years, Cabrini had already been updating much of its technology that allowed for a smoother transition to virtual learning.

Taylor said with the staff and students

getting more used to using Zoom and other online platforms, they know they can use them, leading to new ways to teach.

"We've learned that enhanced technology can be beneficial to learning," Saint Joseph's McConnell said. "We've also learned how important face-to-face interaction is to human formation and mental health. They seem like two conflicting ideas, but they're both essential to higher education."

McConnell said that means there might be expanded hybrid teaching where there is some physical teaching that is replaced by technology, but that will only evolve.

Saint Joseph's University took a different approach in the 2020-21 school year as they continued serving their students with an in-person residential campus experience. Approximately 70 percent of the courses had an on-ground component. Face-to-face, hybrid, hy-flex and online courses were offered.

For Saint Joseph's, keeping flexible remains an important component of the 2021-22 school year, and administrators continue to monitor changes in the pandemic such as new virus strains while approaching the future with hope.

"We look forward to having on-ground student orientation for incoming students. We look forward to on-ground events," McConnell said in late summer.




Lower Merion new middle school on track to open in September 2022

LOWER MERION – Lower Merion held a topping out ceremony in the summer of 2021 on the site of its new middle school in Villanova.

Before the top beam was put in place, future students and Lower Merion staff signed it. The beam was then hoisted up and at the top of the new building.

The students signing the beam



included middle school ambassadors currently in the third and fourth grades at Penn Wynne and Gladwyne elementary schools. They will be among the first students attending the new school when it opens in September 2022.

The new school is being constructed on the site of the now demolished Clairemont Farm/Morris Clothier Estate.

IMC Construction started building the 208,000-square foot, three-story middle school in September 2020.

The new building will feature multiple gymnasias and a theater with retractable seating in the public areas right off the main entrance, along with a "heart" area, where students can congregate to socialize and collaborate. Traditional classrooms will be replaced by "learning communities" – flexible spaces for either large-group team teaching, small group instruction, or student collaboration. The middle school campus will also have a multi-purpose field, a practice field, track and tennis courts.

"We're extremely proud to be bringing a brand-new middle school to the Lower Merion School District," said Robert Cottone, President and CEO of IMC Construction. "This school will bring new opportunities to the community, and the new features of the building will give students a unique learning experience."



Pandemic pups benefit from dog parks

HAVERFORD – If there's one thing we all learned over the course of the pandemic, it's the value of being outside.

And those who have added a new pandemic pup to their family know better than anyone the value of a good dog park.

"People who don't have fenced-in yards – and a lot of people don't – or they live in an apartment, need a place for their dogs to go, so they can safely run, play, and get some of their energy out," said Nicole MacLean of Haverford.

"And then, it's also a place for people to socialize – meet new people, get to know people. It's just a good thing for everybody, all around," she said.

MacLean is the former 'Paws-ident' ("President just sounded too official") of the Friends of Haverford Reserve Dog Park, a volunteer group established roughly a decade ago to lobby for, and then maintain, the Haverford Reserve Dog Park. Located at 9000 Parkview Drive, the dog park that pups prance around today is the result of years of planning, followed by roughly a decade of maintenance and upgrades, according to MacLean and Haverford Parks and Recreation Director Brian Barrett.

"Finding a good location is always a little tricky, but that park has been there since about 2010, and it's part of a community development project that did ballfields, a community center, and five miles of trails on the site, too," said Barrett.

"One of the reasons it's a good spot for a dog park is plenty of parking. It's not too near any neighbors, so that was a good feature, and we had some space to put it in. Trying to find a lot in a densely populated suburb was tricky," he said.

Residents had already been asking for a dog park for several years by the time the township had an opportunity to purchase a former state hospital

property in the late 2000s, according to Barrett. Few could have seen back then how perfect it would be for the pandemic year of 2020-21, but when most other events and activities shut down, the dog park was more than ready.

"The dog park definitely got more use during COVID. Walking their dog was one of the few safe activities you could go do, so we did get a lot of people there, and actually had to put signage up to tell people to maintain distancing, wear their masks, that kind of thing," he said.

Over the years, the friends group and township have worked together to add a water fountain, a pavilion, donated by a local Lowe's Home Improvement, plus a walkway with engraved pavers, and obstacle and agility courses for the dogs to run. The township was working in the summer on some stormwater management improvements to slow runoff from the park, Barrett said, and the roughly 25,000-square-foot play area has been divided into areas for small and large dogs – all of which have seen more use than ever thanks to COVID.

"The community really polices themselves. They talk to each other, about making sure they clean up after dogs, about overly aggressive dogs," Barrett said.

"Whenever I go, it's a very tranquil setting. The dogs are having fun, people are sitting, watching them, and we're working on additional capital improvements," like extra seating and more stormwater management.

One of those frequent visitors is MacLean, who said she has had dogs for her entire life, almost always adopted from various shelters.

"I didn't think it was right to go buy a pet, when there were so many that didn't have homes," she said.

Since the park opened, she's owned about half a dozen dogs, and that number doesn't include those she helps foster for others, these days largely



working with the Providence Animal Center. Anyone who's looking for a new four-legged family member can start there, and MacLean said her preference is for blend or hybrid breeds, "which I think are the best dogs in the world," because they tend not to have any issues with inbreeding or temperament.

"I'm not saying anything bad about people that want the hypoallergenic dogs, but I am saying that, if you want a specific dog, there is a rescue that will have that specific kind of dog," she said.

"To me, there's no reason in the world to go out and buy a dog from a breeder, when you could rescue a dog that doesn't have a home, from a rescue place that specializes in the type of dog that you want."

Before Haverford's dog park opened, MacLean said, she used to frequent Kent Park in Upper Darby, which does charge visitors who use the park. That fee was not replicated in Haverford, she said, in order to make it available to as many people as possible.



Business owners throughout the Main Line are voicing optimism about the future.

Faced with economic challenges during the pandemic that dictated how — or if — a business could operate, retail business owners responded with resilience, grit and courage. Many of them have come through the pandemic scarred but intact.

Brick and mortar establishments pivoted to put ecommerce operations in place, take telephone orders, bolster their social media efforts and offer

curbside pickup or even delivery.

Retail is the nation's largest private sector employer. In Pennsylvania, nearly 163,000 retail establishments, including stores, food services and drinking places directly employ more than 1.2 million Pennsylvanians, according to the National Retail Federation. The organi-

zation reported that retail sales experienced "solid growth" in June, increasing in most categories.

Matthew Shay, National Retail Federation president and CEO, anticipated the back-to-school shopping season would see "record sales" as families prepared for in-person learning.

Key to the successful return of local shopping is — the local shopper!

Bernard Dagenais, president and CEO of the Main Line Chamber of Commerce, said the organization will be urging people to support local retailers over the next year, asking consumers when considering a purchase or service to first consider "who could do this for me locally?"

"We are trying to give an opportunity to those independent small businesses that are important to our community — we want to keep them here," he said.

Dagenais said it is easy to purchase things online.

"That won't go away. The question is, can you have a larger portion of your spending going to local business?" he added.

Small Business Saturday — or Shop Small, as it has become known — encourages people to shop small and support local businesses and has become a Main Line tradition on the Saturday after Thanksgiving.

According to the results of the American Express 2020 Small Business Saturday Consumer Insights Survey, 2020's Small Business Saturday was the biggest so far. Shoppers spent a record

\$19.8 billion in 2020, up from \$19.6 billion in 2019.

For retailers on the Main Line that were able to operate during the closures by instituting online ordering, curbside pick-up or delivery, their customers responded. And when stores reopened in June 2020 with limited occupancy, it wasn't unheard of to see a line outside local storefronts.

LOYALTY IN BUYING

Braxton's Animal Works in Wayne is a third generation pet supply store, offering pet food and supplies for dogs, cats, birds and small animals. The store also offers self-wash pet baths.

Operating for more than 82 years, Braxton's has always catered to domestic animals, according to co-owners Dave and John Braxton. Like other stores across the Main Line, Braxton's was forced to close its doors in March 2020, remaining closed until June. The store did not stop serving its customers, however. Braxton's began offering curbside pickup and implemented a local delivery option — both new services that came about during the pandemic. Braxton's Animal Works will continue to offer those options to its customers.

According to Dave Braxton, the store's customer frequent buyer program "literally saved us" during the three months the store was closed. When customers started calling and emailing to see if they could make purchases, Braxton's was able to look them up and see what purchases they made in the past. About 95% of Braxton's clientele participate in the program.

"People were happy to be able to get their supplies locally," said John Braxton.



The first quarter of 2020 was a good one for Braxton's Animal Works, he added. Just before the shutdown was ordered, there was a "tremendous" surge in buying.

"It was like the holiday season for us," he said.

Then, business dropped by about 45%.

"While we lost some customers due to them getting their supplies delivered to their homes — we got at least as many back — including some people we hadn't seen for years," he said. "That was a nice feeling. We were able to help them out and they helped us out."

He said sales have been improving each month, and by December 2020

were pretty much back to normal. This year, he said — “is better than normal.”

Asked how they compete against the big box and increasing online pet supply presence, Dave Braxton said, “You don’t.”

“Our goal has always been to find the best quality products and have the best pricing,” he said, adding that Braxton’s has a loyal clientele that is more likely to shop local for pet supplies.

Since the pandemic, the Braxtons said they are looking at their products, adding and eliminating items where it makes sense, enhancing the existing space and making sure employees are training and communicated with so they have the information they need.

FAIR TRADE SUPPORT

Ten Thousand Villages in Bryn Mawr is part of a 501c3 nonprofit retail organization based in Lancaster. Ten Thousand Villages is the first fair trade organization in the U.S., according to Bryn Mawr store manager Melanie Ford. The mission of the organization — which is 75 years old — is to “create a marketplace in the U.S. for marginalized people around the world who wouldn’t be able

to otherwise sell their products."

Ford said during the pandemic, the organization relied on its ecommerce sales to support its mission.

"The ecommerce site was pretty good but during the pandemic there was 2-3 times as much traffic on the ecommerce site," she said. "It's really great our customers were able to be directed to the online store."

Locally, Ford said while the store was closed, it held Facebook Live events and virtual sales, mailing items from the store. The Facebook Live events and virtual sales were not something the store had ever done before.

She added that they began curbside pickup and offered a mystery gift box program, where customers ordered a fair trade gift and the store employees would choose the items — generating some income through the store even though it was closed.

"One thing I'm really proud of is that when we reopened the store in June 2020 to in-person shopping, we started a gift card drive," she said, adding customers purchased Ten Thousand Villages gift cards, then gave them back to the store, to be donated to the Bryn Mawr Hospital ICU department.

Ford said something that surprised her during the pandemic was the increase in ethical shopping that has occurred.

"More folks than ever are saying they want to try to buy fair trade," she said.

She added that she has also seen a surge in people shopping local, especially during the 2020 holiday shopping season. She said Small Business Saturday has always been a success for the store, but in 2020, "folks still came out and waited in long lines to support us." She said at that time the store occupancy was limited to 10 people, and despite the limitations the store met its sales budget for the day.

Since April, Ford said the store sales have been increasing and have been tracking at, or exceeding, 2019 levels.

TASTE OF CHOCOLATE

Delice et Chocolat in Ardmore is a French pastry shop in business since 2017. Starting with 700-square feet of space on Station Road, the pastry shop expanded about a year later — around the corner

onto Lancaster Avenue. The shop is owned by brothers Joseph and Antoine Amrani, who came to the U.S. from Grenoble, France — using their culinary skills to open a business of their own.

Delice et Chocolat did not close during the pandemic. When indoor seating was prohibited, the pastry shop turned to curbside pick-up.

To help the pastry shop make it through the year, Delice et Chocolat began offering meals to go — featuring some traditional French dishes.

Amrani said during the pandemic, Delice et Chocolat was about 30% down in sales year over year.

"The interesting part of 2021 is that under projecting is just as bad as over projecting. We saw a surge — and saw some of best single days immediately followed by some of our worst days. It's really hard to forecast that — production wise and labor wise," he said.

Amrani added that they are looking for answers heading into the holiday season — the pastry shop's busiest time. Will people want to splurge? Will they be more cautious about spending?

"We really don't know, so we're trying to keep a finger on the pulse of figuring out how to go into the holiday season and see the other side successfully," he said.

LOVE YOUR LINGERIE

Bra Spectrum is a lingerie shop on Lancaster Ave in Bryn Mawr. The tagline for the store is "Fall in love with your bra." That is what owner Tatyana Ponomareva tries to do every day, by properly fitting women with this critical

foundation garment.

Ponomareva opened the store in November 2016 and operates with the belief that a well-fitting bra encourages self-esteem and body acceptance.

All of the products Ponomareva carries in the store are imported from Europe — most of them from Poland.

"We want people to understand that the best bras are made in Poland," Tom Dorsey, director of the company and Ponomareva's husband, said. "We also carry bras from Lithuania, from Italy, Spain and Latvia. But the highest volume we sell are the bras that are made in Poland. They are well made and they fit."

Bra Spectrum is adding a line of sports bras to its offerings, manufactured by the Polish brand Nessa.

Bra Spectrum was closed from mid-March to June 6, 2020. The store has never sold its products online, and Dorsey said of the practice — "we're not changing our behavior in face of all of this."

During the pandemic, "occasionally someone would send an email and we would mail them a bra," Dorsey said. "We have clients that buy bras they can't find anywhere else."

The store also sold masks.

"We imported cotton masks and did that for the community, we made those available," he said. "We were selling them in packs — trying to help during the height of things last year."

When the store reopened, Dorsey said sales were at about 25% of what they normally would have been during the first two months. Since then, Dorsey said the store has continued to focus and grow — and that growth has "been substantial."

He said he looked at the average of sales for July 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 and compared it against July 2021's results.

"It was 52% up on average of what we had been," he said.

Comparing sales results for July 2021 against July 2019 — Dorsey said sales are up 28%. He added that the sales numbers in the store are being made despite reduced store operating hours.

Dorsey adds that Bra Spectrum has proved that they could open a store and not have name brand bras and be successful.



It's a 'seller's market' on the Main Line

While the Main Line has long been an attractive area to buy a home, the housing market here lately has been hotter than ever.

As pandemic restrictions lifted and the American economy reopened, the business of buying and selling homes roared back to life.

Would-be homebuyers may be in for a rude awakening if they had postponed buying a new home during the pandemic and are now beginning the search. As much of the nation – the Main Line included – is experiencing a "seller's market" for houses, homebuyers may find that the process of purchasing a home is more competitive and more expensive than in recent years.

However, the conditions of this "seller's market" with high demand and low supply in the Main Line already peaked in the spring of 2021 and slowly

started to decline, according to Deb Dorsey, an associate broker and Realtor at Berkshire Hathaway, HomeServices, Fox & Roach, who's been selling homes for more than 30 years. Her office is located in Rosemont, and her area of service includes towns along the Main Line in Chester, Delaware and Montgomery counties.

"It seemed the peak demand came during the tail end of the worst of the pandemic, last February, March and April of this past spring," she said in a July interview. "But by the time restrictions were lifted – in May and June of this year – the serious buyers had already found something, and the more casual buyers had started to find other things to do with their time: graduations, going out to dinner, social gatherings, and generally people getting back to their lives; so May seemed slightly less busy and competitive for buyers.

"At the same time, more homes started coming on the market, and many sellers finally decided to list their homes since they had been hearing so much about this fabulous 'seller's market.'

"So, the combination of a slightly greater supply, at a higher price, and less pressing demand combined to have a somewhat cooling effect on the market as we headed into the summer months, which tend to be slower in general."

Last year there was a high demand for condo or apartment living along the Main Line, but that demand cooled during the pandemic, Dorsey said.

"Folks wanted to be a little farther apart from their neighbors," she said, "and since many started working from home or started working even more from home, some buyers/home owners may have felt that the condo or apartment was just too small for them.

"So we definitely saw a shift there away from the smaller apartment/condo to the larger house and a little greener space."

Dorsey said the demand for purchasing homes remains strong as interest rates have stayed low but have been threatening to rise.

"Folks want to lock in that low mortgage interest rate and not miss out," she said.

"There will however always be demand for rentals in the area as folks continue to be in transitions – either from divorce or separation, job changes, or relocation or other life change – and not ready or able to due to financial or other constraints to commit to a purchase.

"Some consumers want or need flexibility. So, renting is an option and remains strong. Renters want the same as buyers, good home condition and prime locations."

Apart from high demand for homes, Dorsey said another recent trend in real estate she's noticed is that buyers want homes that are completely fixed up and don't require extra repairs or maintenance, and they're willing to pay more for a home in top condition.

"It's always been 'location, location, location' in real estate, but condition is important too," she said.

She said an increased number of younger folks are also looking at buying homes.

"Younger generation are more interested in buying now, during and post-COVID," she said.

"Prior to COVID, consumers in their 20s and 30s did not want to own a home. This seems to be a welcomed shift, although it's also putting pressure on housing inventory.

"Consumers are also interested in something a little larger than has been popular in recent years – again the work from home and home school factoring in here – so a little larger and a little better condition is what folks want today."

She noted that smaller homes had been a trend after the financial crisis in 2008-2012.

Dorsey said there are several reasons why people are looking to buy homes in the Main Line area, including good schools and a good economy.

"Our top schools are a big plus," she said. "There are excellent public and private school options, a reasonable commute to the city and corporate

centers and to New York City and Washington, D.C.

"The diversity of our Philly economy has meant that we have not had huge swings in prices – the economy tends to be stable – prices have been predictable and safe.

"With education, health care, pharmaceutical, telecom and insurance, etc., if one of the sectors is lagging, the others will contribute to effectively smooth out the big swings that other areas may have seen.

nice suburbs, such as New Jersey suburbs."

Dorsey said there are a variety of people seeking to buy homes in the Main Line, including retirees, families and young professionals.

"The trend prior to COVID had seen many folks, young and old, moving into the city of Philadelphia," she said. "The arrival of the pandemic halted and, in some cases, reversed that trend; it remains to be seen if the previous trend will resume.

"As for those that are selling we find that many are moving near family – wherever that is. Some working people are finding that they will be able to work from home, allowing them to live where they want.

"Some have bought a second home at the shore or in the South and want to spend more time there, and are taking advantage of the strong real estate market to seek their dream or retire earlier than planned.

"There is an attitude of don't waste any time because we could have another COVID or other life-altering event."

Golf courses and tennis courts welcome back the faithful

When Main Line golf courses and tennis courts reopened following the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown in March 2020, local residents flocked to these outdoor facilities in large numbers.

Activity on area golf courses and tennis courts in 2021 exceeded pre-pandemic levels.

"We probably had about a 30 percent increase in rounds played at our course during the pandemic," said Dave McNabb, head professional at Applebrook Golf Club in July, 2021. "That continued for the first part of this year; now we're starting to see a little bit of a return to pre-pandemic levels, but it's still slightly busier than what it was before the pandemic."

Adam Brigham, Head Golf Professional at Waynesborough Country Club, noted, "Waynesborough has seen a dramatic increase in rounds of golf played since Pennsylvania courses reopened after the lockdown [of 2020] – just over 45 percent compared to pre-COVID levels."

"Our membership [level] has gone through the roof since the pandemic. The past several years we were 15-20 members shy of having a completely full golf membership, and now, we have about 20 [new members] on a wait list, and trending to be about 30-40 on the list by the end of the year," he said in July.

"We've seen a lot of younger families joining here in the past year, and that includes a significant number of newer golfers – we had to hire another teaching professional. Our junior instruction program, specifically camps and clinics, has doubled in size since the beginning of the pandemic."

Merion Station resident John Jenchura, part-owner of Honeybrook Golf Course and author of the book, "Golf: A Good Walk and Then Some" noted that one result of the COVID pandemic and its aftermath at Honeybrook has been an increase in the number of first-time golfers.

Jenchura said, "When the courses reopened [in May 2020], people wanted to get back out in the fresh air, and

we started getting a large number of first-time golfers. The number of rounds [played at Honeybrook] is up from where it was before the pandemic, and the number of lessons we've given has increased tremendously. This year, it's been harder to get tee times, and our lessons are booked morning, noon and night.

"In fact, we had so many people wanting lessons that we assigned one of our golf pros to give lessons only. And we expanded the building where we give golf lessons."

"Golf has been booming since we reopened after the pandemic last year," said Dan Malley, Director of Golf Operations at Paxon Hollow Country Club. "We're actually getting more rounds played now than we had before the COVID pandemic. For every good weather day, we're getting closer to 100 percent sold-out days. The demand is through the roof for things like clinics and lessons, too – it's a good problem to have, but it is a problem. In fact, because of the demand for golf since the pandemic, some courses have



jacked up their rates."

One of the effects of the COVID pandemic on some local golf courses is that intervals between tee times were increased. At Paxton Hollow, this change eventually worked to the golfers' benefit.

"Before the COVID pandemic, our tee times were nine minutes apart," said Malley. "When we re-opened in May of 2020, we blocked out every other tee time to make it 18 minutes between tee times. Later, we spaced the intervals between tee times to 15 minutes, then we made it 12 minutes at about the same time that Pennsylvania said it was OK for two non-related people to share a riding cart. We could have gone back to nine-minute intervals and we would be doing a lot more rounds and generating a lot more revenue, but we made the choice to stay at 12 minutes because it is a much better customer experience as far as pace of play, course conditions, and overall enjoyment."

When Honeybrook reopened following the lockdown in May 2020, intervals between tee times were increased from nine to 15 minutes, no more than four people were allowed in the pro shop, everyone in the building had to wear a mask, golfers were to show up not more than 15 minutes

before their scheduled tee time, reservations for tee times were online only, green fee payments were by credit card only, and only one person was allowed in each riding cart.

As the local population became vaccinated, restrictions lessened at Honeybrook and other area courses, although in Honeybrook's restaurant, the servers continued to wear masks. Intervals between tee times returned to the pre-pandemic nine minutes at Honeybrook.

"Honeybrook is in good shape, post-pandemic and vaccination," noted Jenchura.

McNabb said, "Early in the pandemic, we were using forecaddies instead of caddies carrying the golfers' bags, but then we went back to using caddies around the middle of last year. Golf is an outdoor sport, and golfers are naturally socially distant by and large, so there hasn't been much of an adjustment [due to the pandemic] with the golf – the adjustments were more with the indoor areas – the clubhouse and the dining rooms."

Brigham said that Waynesborough was probably one of the more conservative golf clubs in the area in 2020 regarding COVID restrictions.

"We held with the one-rider-per-cart

restriction all last year – we didn't do two riders per cart unless they were in the same family," said Brigham. "We eliminated all shotgun starts during the pandemic, because we felt that the areas where people would congregate [with shotgun starts] would be the locker rooms, the driving range and putting greens. We didn't reinstate the shotgun starts until mid-May of 2021."

Like golf, participation in tennis – particularly the outdoor variety – has remained strong during the pandemic on the Main Line.

Former long-time Radnor High School wrestling coach Skip Shoemaker, who helps organize the adult tennis program at Conestoga Swim Club (a round-robin competition twice a week), said, "Our number of players have remained the same during the pandemic – tennis is a perfect sport to play during a pandemic because you're socially distant and usually outside. I know that during the pandemic, different clubs had certain rules they would follow, like taking away the benches, or the water coolers which people would be touching – but they've started to relax those rules now."

"Last year, the USTA recommended that players bring their own can of balls, and only touched those that they brought. However they determined the chances of contracting COVID from touching a tennis ball was very low, so most players just shared one can as they always had."

Paul Waltz, who recently retired as Great Valley High School tennis coach after 29 years, said, "I've seen more people playing tennis outside than ever during the pandemic. The outdoor courts at Great Valley have been very busy."

Waltz also is the tennis pro at Springton Racquet Club, and noted in July, "Springton did everything they could indoors during the pandemic – you had to wear a mask for tennis, they kept the doors open, they kept the fans going, you couldn't cluster. They were probably one of the most diligent racquet clubs in the area for following all of the COVID precautions. Now at Springton, you don't have to wear a mask to play. They're trying to get back to normalcy."

Taking to the trails for beauty and recreation

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the allure of socially distant hiking and biking on local trails proved quite popular on the Main Line. When COVID restrictions eased, the local trails remained more popular than ever.

One of these Main Line trails is the Cynwyd Heritage Trail, a two-mile twin-surface rail-to-trail project in Bala Cynwyd that offers vistas of the Schuylkill River, as well as many historical markers.

"Activity on the Cynwyd Trail has seen an explosive growth since the pandemic," said Chris Leswing of the Lower Merion Township Building Department. "I don't have the exact numbers, but so many more people are using this trail, it's very popular."

As the Cynwyd Trail has become more popular, access to it has increased as well. For example, in the past decade Lower Merion Township developed an easement in partnership with West Laurel Hill Cemetery to extend the trail into the cemetery.

Currently, the township is working on a project to make the 500 feet of roadway from the lower gate in West Laurel Cemetery on Righters Ferry Road to Pencoyd Landing safer for pedestrians.

"We're working in partnership with West Laurel Cemetery to make a safe, multi-use off-road connection from the cemetery to Pencoyd Landing – the Landing has a nice restaurant, public trail and gathering places. It's really great," said Leswing.

A trail then leads from Pencoyd Landing to The Royal Athena, a recently-built upscale apartment building.

"When Royal Athena was built, it was required to put in a waterfront trail along the property," said Leswing. "We're working with the city of Philadelphia to eventually extend the trail over the [nearby] Towpath Bridge to the Manayunk towpath. If you're coming from Valley Forge on the Schuylkill Trail where it dead-ends at Manayunk, you would then be able to continue to Lower Merion over the Towpath Bridge by Royal Athena, and

then you would go over to the Pencoyd Bridge [toward Philadelphia]. By having this trail over the Towpath Bridge, it will help to complete a safe off-road connection to the Schuylkill Trail."

The Towpath Bridge is an existing single-track railroad bridge on which service was discontinued about two years ago. Lower Merion Township and the City of Philadelphia are working in partnership to develop it into a pedestrian bridge.

Plans are underway to further expand the Cynwyd Heritage Trail, linking it to several additional spots along the Main Line.

"The beauty of the Cynwyd Trail is that it links into Cynwyd Station, and we're developing something called the Main Line Greenway, a series of on-road bike trails on roads that don't have a lot of car traffic," said Leswing. "We're developing a route that would basically take you from Cynwyd Station out to Villanova."

Leswing said that funds are available to extend the trail from Cynwyd Station to Bala Station. Currently, the township is working with SEPTA to develop plans for this trail extension.

"The project to extend the trail from Cynwyd Station to Bala Station is what is known as rail-with-trail, instead of rail-to-trail," said Leswing. "This railroad line has two tracks, and what's going to happen is that one of the tracks will be used for trains – they will come and go on the same track – and the other track will become a trail.

"The train stations there can't build any more parking, there's not enough room. Our strategy is to increase access to those stations by providing bike and pedestrian connections to the trail, so people who live close by can very easily walk or bike to the station."

Another Main Line trail that has proved popular to pedestrians and bicyclers is the Chester Valley Trail, which runs about 13 miles from Exton to King of Prussia.

Former long-time Great Valley High School track & field coach Paul Hadzor,

who lives near the Chester Valley Trail where it crosses Route 30 in Exton, said, "Chester Valley is a nice trail; people riding bicycles on it are very courteous to walkers. You see all kinds of wildlife on the trail – foxes, deer. There's a pond near the trail at Church Farm School where sometimes people go to fish, and I've seen beavers in it. It's great for bird-watching, too.

"On Thursday mornings, I used to see a group of 20-25 senior citizens with binoculars watching birds near the playground at Church Farm. And the county does a great job maintaining the trail – if it's icy, they'll salt it – it's in better shape than some of the roads around here."

Jeannine Stefanelli of Malvern said, "Our family loves the Chester Valley Trail – honestly, it was a godsend to my family during the quarantine."

About a mile from the eastern end of the Chester Valley Trail is Valley Forge National Historical Park, and its walking trails. The Valley Forge park trail connects with the Schuylkill River Trail, a multi-use trail which runs eastward for about 20 miles, through Conshohocken, Norristown and the western end of center city Philadelphia.

Radnor resident and runner Jen DiLella, who several years ago founded Radnor Steps, a group that walks the Radnor Trail every Friday morning at 9 a.m., watched the pandemic guidelines closely and was encouraged by the return of the group's regular walkers with the easing of COVID restrictions this summer.

"Our regular walkers are back, and some of the occasional walkers are back too," said DiLella. "The strength of the Radnor Steps program is its consistency and openness to all fitness levels – people can jump in and jump out whenever they want. There's never a need to sign up or an obligation to show up regularly. We're hoping to reach anyone who is interested in walking with our group on Fridays at 9 a.m. at the West Wayne Avenue entrance of the Radnor Trail."

People flocked to public gardens in pandemic; popularity seems to be sticking

When the government-ordered pandemic lockdowns began in March 2020, most people ran to the grocery stores.

But as those initial 14 days "to slow the spread" turned into months, it wasn't long before people began looking for other places to go – outdoors.

The search to get outside seems to have led to a new appreciation and enthusiasm for parks that has continued post-pandemic. Those parks included visitors flocking to their public gardens. And with Philadelphia being known for its public gardens, even smaller ones on the Main Line became more popular than ever.

Ethan Kauffman, director of Stoneleigh: a natural garden in Villanova, described visitation as very good in spring, 2021. During a typical spring week, around 1,200 – 1,300 people visited the 42-acre garden. Some weeks the numbers swelled closer to 1,500 visitors.

For Stoneleigh, that meant an increase of about 60 percent from 2019 – the last spring season the garden was open. Those numbers, he expects, will continue to increase.

"We anticipate that this number will



increase as we begin to hold more tours and events," he said.

"It's been meaningful to provide our guests with a connection to the solace and beauty of nature during a challenging time," he added.

Officials from other public gardens on the Main Line say they've also seen increased interest in nature and people wanting to get outdoors as well as get ideas for their own backyard spaces.

According to Tom Smarr, executive director at the Jenkins Arboretum in Devon, being free of charge, they don't typically track the exact number of visitors, but they've been able to notice an increase.

Smarr said they recorded higher numbers of visitors to Jenkins in both 2020 and 2021.

"People are excited about going places," Smarr said. "I think it's excitement about going places and looking for places that are outdoors."

The nature trail at Haverford College has been a popular destination for students and the community. But when the pandemic hit, it was closed to the community.

The nature trail runs through the arboretum on the campus, but saw a new resurgence in visitors since reopening in spring 2021.

Clint Springer, director of the Institute for Environmental Stewardship and Director of the Barnes Arboretum at Saint

Joseph's University, said they too had seen higher visitation numbers as more people have been coming to outdoor venues.

"We've seen our guest numbers go up quite a bit, especially early in the spring when our lilacs are blooming and the magnolias are blooming," Springer said.

Saint Joseph's signed a long-term lease with the Barnes Foundation to run the historic Barnes Arboretum at the former home of famed art collector Albert Barnes.

Besides taking advantage of the quiet time during the shutdown to catch up on routine maintenance and continue preparing for next year's 100th anniversary, they didn't institute any new programs, but some other area gardens did.

Back at the Jenkins Arboretum, Smarr said they expanded their educational opportunities.

One of the things they began during the pandemic was Wednesday Walkabouts consisting of two to five-minute videos and then posted online.

"Those immediately became popular," Smarr said. "I think it allowed a lot of people to still enjoy the garden."

Another thing Smarr said they did at Jenkins while it was closed was to add a one-way path system for visitors.

"That was trying to mitigate people passing each other on the narrow paths," he said.

Compassion shines in senior centers

ARDMORE — People across the Main Line answered the call of hope to carry on and support one another during the pandemic as citizens suddenly experienced shutdowns, lockdowns and isolation.

But with reopening, centers continued operations to support the most vulnerable people -- adaptively via perseverance, technology and hope.

Long before the coronavirus reached the region in 2020, the Wayne Senior Center had been helping people since their inception in 1975.

Wayne Senior Center focused on food security and socialization, said Katie Mahon, executive director of the Wayne Senior Center.

"Our closure was very sudden," she said. "Everybody left the center on Friday, March 13th of 2020 and on the 16th we were closed for what we thought would just be a couple weeks."

From that point forward, swiftly updated state-mandated changes occurred.

Wayne Senior Center took the moment to pivot.

And despite the building's closure

from March 13, 2020 until July 6, 2021 operations and services never ceased. For one, at the start of the shutdown, the center soon launched contactless meal deliveries.

The Wayne Senior Center delivered nearly 50,000 meals during last year's nationally acclaimed "unprecedented" crisis.

In 2021 and 2022, the Wayne Senior Center is doing well as a local source to learn, grow and connect.

Membership today has increased by nearly 250 percent compared to prior to the pandemic, Mahon noted. Members range in age from mid-50s to 103.

Action to help others, while being flexible to change, has enabled the center to remain "fluid" to change ever since. Instead of chaos, transformation.

PANDEMIC FORCED CHANGE

Back in March 2020, the Wayne Senior Center quickly launched virtual opportunities for members to reconnect. During those last days of winter, millions of seniors around the nation were suddenly living in isolation, with many even afraid to go to the supermarket.

So the Wayne Senior Center did

something else. New ideas happened.

Innovation that swiftly took flight to support homebound senior members included the creation of a Tech Lending Library, the launching of community events on Zoom, a new educational training program that taught members how to use digital devices to communicate, explore and reconnect via Tech.

The Wayne Senior Center launched a new focus to support seniors — teaching them technology. This opportunity for seniors to stay social, while learning, empowered people. Bringing tech to members was key for the Wayne Senior Center through the pandemic and has become a key part of programming going forward.

Yet thanks to the launch of Wayne's new Tech Lending Library, seniors can learn new skills with contemporary digital devices such as tablets but also take advantage of the center's WiFi hotspots outside.

Wayne also offered Tech Tuesday drop-in sessions on Zoom. This began a key tool to connect with others, especially valuable for homebound seniors living alone.

Membership services were offered for free during the pandemic, Mahon said. Every meal. Every Zoom event. Every trip to the Willow Parks Preserve. None of the 650 members were re-

quired to pay a cent. They were always welcomed, showing that community is not only powerful and enduring, but also sacred and priceless.

Of seniors, Mahon said, "Their overall renaissance has been really inspiring."

The Senior Center is launching a virtual campus for 2021-22. Connection is accessible via the organization's website as well via a new app available for download on digital devices such as tablets and iPhones.

CHURCH PROVIDES SERVICE TO SENIORS

Elsewhere along the Main Line, Our Mother of Good Counsel united parishioners and led a year-long effort to communicate with congregants during the shutdown of 2020-21 without the ability to attend church services or even see family in the same room, at nursing homes and assisted living care facilities, for instance.

The power of compassion, kindness and care took root and grew with a plan, blossoming into the launch of Care Calls to support seniors.

"We called every single parishioner," said Michelle Marchetti of Our Mother of Good Counsel. "We started calling all the seniors just to check on them and see if they would need anything," she said, recalling the pandemic.

Folks offered to bring over groceries, and did so on numerous occasions, while sometimes the Care Calls would simply connect two people over the phone to talk, with some calls lasting beyond an hour.

After a year, more than 800 calls have been made by the volunteers, spanning all ages, within the church community, in an outreach program that continues.

During the last days of winter in March 2020, Father Liam O'Doherty wanted to reach out and support seniors during the crisis. The program created a connection, empowered the community, and a fluid platform where everyone could show they care.

Eventually, the program was extended to include calls to all parishioners.

Our Mother of Good Counsel also works with Interfaith Hospitality Network of the Main Line, based in Norristown, which helps home and feed the homeless, often composed of senior citizens, who live across the Greater Philadelphia Region including at its western heart,

and along the Schuylkill River, of the Main Line.

The work of Interfaith Hospitality Network is to help the vulnerable overcome the most difficult situations

imaginable in society: homelessness. This mission never ceased a day in light of the pandemic or in wake of a shut-down in 2020.

Our Mother of Good Counsel is one

of many parish churches in Southeastern Pennsylvania that supports the Interfaith Hospitality Network of the Main Line, Marchetti noted.

The Bryn Mawr parish has a long-standing history of hosting people enrolled in Interfaith Hospitality Network of the Main Line for extended visits. Our Mother of Good Counsel provides these families with both housing and meals during their stays.

Parishes across the Philly region support Interfaith Hospitality Network of the Main Line, Marchetti said. Because of mitigation efforts in 2020-21 to mitigate the pandemic in Pennsylvania, the parish no longer hosted Interfaith Hospitality Network of the Main Line visitors, but continued to share support for the people enrolled with Interfaith Hospitality Network of the Main Line via continual food donations.

"Things do not matter. What matters is community. We need to come together in unity," said Marchetti.

"There's a lot of people here," Marchetti said of the parish community in the heart of the Main Line. "And a lot of parishioners are generous with their time."



Surrey Services celebrates 40 years with vision for future

RADNOR -- Smartphones didn't exist and the internet was a futuristic concept when Jeanne La Rouché formed a grassroots organization named Surrey Services for Seniors in the attic of her Radnor home 40 years ago. Her idea was to create a group of volunteers who believed in the philosophy of Neighbor Helping Neighbor to drive older adults to doctors' appointments and provide assistance with grocery shopping.

Today 40 years later, Surrey's mission and work in the community has never been more relevant. With the support of dedicated volunteers, community partners and friends, Surrey demonstrated leadership, resourcefulness, innovation, and resiliency as it moved beyond its physical centers and into the greater

community to carry out its mission of inspiring and enabling people as they age to live with independence and dignity, and as engaged members of the community.

ADAPTING AND THRIVING

At the beginning of the pandemic, Surrey immediately pivoted -- offering virtual programs via YouTube and Zoom and changing its chef-prepared Surrey café meals to Grab and Go. It adopted strict protocols to ensure that essential transportation to medical appointments and in-home care would continue uninterrupted. "A benefit of our virtual programs was that it grew our global community and brought people together who are geographically distant," said Jean Kozicki, Surrey board chairwoman in recalling the changes in 2020.

Surrey also launched its Technology Lending Library, to help reduce isolation among older adults by providing easy-to-use technology and support. This initiative was made possible thanks to generous grants from The Chester County Nonprofit Innovation & Resilience Fund, administered by the Chester County Community Foundation; Hoxie Harrison Smith Foundation; Charles C. Knox Charitable Trust; TE Connectivity; and individual donors. "Participants are able to take a Surrey virtual exercise class, visit with their grandchildren via Zoom, check out books using the library system, and have Telemedicine visits," said Jill Whitcomb, Surrey president and CEO.

FUTURE PLANS

To create its vision for the future, Surrey collaborated with community members, volunteers, business leaders, elected officials and friends to gain input about how to have the greatest impact in the future. The insights gained led to the development of Surrey's Strategic Plan, an evergreen plan for the non-profit organization.

Surrey will continue to expand virtual and center-based programs and activities; it will provide support and assistance to older adults who want to age in place; it will bring regional organizations together to share resources and expertise; and it will expand the reach of Surrey to a wider, diverse population to improve the quality of life for older adults.

Several Strategic Plan initiatives,

including The Beilenson Institute for Innovation in Aging, named for the current board member and former Chair John Beilenson, are already underway, quickly moving from concept to action. The Institute will bring innovative





Future of Main Line health care shaped by pandemic

While hospitals settled into a "business as usual" mode, they also acknowledged long lasting changes brought on by the pandemic.

"It's something that's still evolving, as we're slowly coming out of everything with COVID right now," said Jonathan Stallkamp, interim Chief Medical Officer for Main Line Health, which includes Lankenau Hospital, Bryn Mawr Hospital, Paoli Hospital, Bryn Mawr Rehab Hospital and Riddle Hospital.

"What will things look like after COVID? It's probably not going to look 100 percent the same as it did pre-COVID. I would say that's probably the case with the Main Line and probably the case with a lot of places out there recovering from COVID."

As it is with many companies, the

matter of employees working remotely is one of the biggest issues.

"We are seeing it ourselves, and a lot of other organizations are saying, 'do all of our employees need to be onsite to work?' Even though we're a healthcare organization, even though the majority of our staff are on the front end helping to take care of our patients, we have a lot of backend staff doing our billing, phone centers, IT support, which can all be done remotely. We'll bring some people back but we've kept other people remote, or at least partially remote. We think it's a long term benefit for our patients and for our staff. They've all been in-person before but we're keeping a lot of those people at home now, which is a change for us. And that's a change for a lot of organizations out there."

The question of what Main Line Health will look like in the future is perhaps best exemplified by Riddle Hospital in Media, which has been undergoing construction for more than a year.

"What buildings do you need, what space do you need? We've taken a look at the new building that we're building right now at Riddle. Even in the middle of the pandemic we went and took a look at the design as the steel was going up," Stallkamp noted.

"Was there something in the design that we needed to change to be able to handle another pandemic that comes through? Looking at what we've gone through being prepared for things like SARS, H1N1, and now after really experiencing a pandemic with COVID-19, the question is how do we



design our buildings differently to be able to isolate better and to take care of our patients better when they need to be in isolation status? So we've looked at some facility changes to that new building that we're putting up because it's a heck of a lot cheaper now than to be able to isolate things. So a lot of things will get looked at. We were building anyway. We had decided to build this new hospital at Riddle ... new ORs, new critical care, and while we were building it we did some changes to make sure if the pandemic comes forward again we can isolate rooms better and treat our patients better from the lessons we learned from COVID before we get to the final pieces of putting up some walls. Main Line Health is a strong financial system and we're going to be here for our patients on the Main Line and we thank them for their support during this. The community has been amazing."

As noted at mainlinehealth.org, Riddle Hospital's Campus Master Plan will mark the most significant facility improvement in its existence and among the largest capital investments in Main Line Health history. The modernization project will include a new patient pavilion, as well as renovations to existing care units and support areas and will also include new parking. Once completed in 2024, the hospital will be equipped with all private patient rooms, contemporary facilities and advanced technology to support the evolving needs of the community.

During the modernization construction, the campus will also undergo changes in traffic flow, with free valet parking offered.

Having endured several distinctive phases of COVID taught the "How the world has evolved after COVID is going to take years to know what happened. ... I guarantee we're not the only business on the Main Line that is looking at how much real estate they have and how many people they want to have in their offices, and how much they can do with all the new tools like videoconferencing that they never had before, things that were there but weren't adopted and then they were forced to be adopted. When they were adopted we realized there was no reason to not

continue that," Stallkamp said.

The telehealth genre was a major development for Main Line Health during the pandemic that will likely only become more relevant as times goes on.

"I think there's a benefit to being in



person for a lot of things," Stallkamp said. "I know you want to see your doctor for your annual checkup, to check your blood pressure and to discuss certain issues, but if you have a cold, do you really want to have to come into the office to get seen? Wouldn't it be better to set up a time to do that from home when you're not feeling

well? We hope the state and the insurance companies agree that things like telehealth are a benefit for patients and they want to continue to pay for those services. The state didn't like us doing it from a regulatory standpoint and the insurance didn't want to pay for it. But

I think Medicare is realizing the benefit of it and there are going to be a lot of changes going forward with it."

Historical events like COVID-19 have long had tremendous impact on the medical world, Stallkamp pointed out.

"A lot of changes happen in medicine when there's a big event. When you think about World War II, when antibiotics and penicillin really came into use," he said. "And the idea of

helicoptering somebody during the Korean War, transporting somebody to a MASH unit, that we now see routinely with helicopter and ambulance transport. A lot of great things have come out of these big events that push medicine further, and COVID is another one of those things that will change medicine forever."
