Florence in Lauderdale, Colbert Recycling Benefit

FLORENCE-Representatives with the Alabama Department of Environmental Management were in town last Wednesday, and they did not show up empty-handed. Blake Schmidt and Rick Kelsey with ADEM's Materials Management division made stops at Shoals Solid Waste Authority Recycling Center in Tuscumbia and Florence Recycling Center on Terrace

The stop in Tuscumbia included a check presentation for \$120,647. The grant will help add a 42' x 60' structure onto an existing warehouse and make some other improvements according to SSWA Director. Mike Shewbart. The SSWA Director, Mike Shewbart. enlarged area is where baled materials are stored before being transported by

truck to buyers. The work will also include a covered loading ramp so workers and materials can stay dry during the loading process. Right now they are exposed to the elements. Later in the day, Kelsey and Schmidt

came to the Florence Recycling Center with a grant check for \$171,470

According to Florence Public Works Director, David Koonce, the grant will fund a new skid steer at the recycling center, five self-dumping hoppers, and 18 recycling dumpsters. In addition, \$5,000 will be used for recycling education and outreach.

The Lauderdale County Solid Waste Department will receive a one-

NA State Fair to Take Place

TUSCUMBIA — The 2021 North Alabama State Fair Board of Directors agreed to reduce the adult admission price of the upcoming fair since many popular events have been cancelled due to the continuing COVID pandemic.

According to
Board member **Roger** Creekmore, the board voted Monday to hold the fair scheduled the week of Sept. 21.

Adult admission is being cut from \$10 per person to \$5, which is the same price of admission for children. Children's admission price will remain at \$5.

The board voted last week to close the exhibitor, commercial, and children's buildings because of the difficulty of social distancing indoors.

Stage activities including the beauty pageant, the cheerleading competition, and the wagon contest were also cancelled.

Additionally, the board voted to cancel the popular demolition derby.

'We felt like there was just no other way with the delta variant being what it is, and the ventilation in those buildings, and the inability to social distance," Creekmore said. "It was just prudent to shut those buildings down."

The demolition derby was cancelled because there could be large numbers of people packed into the stands.

"The fair board just decided to do that as a measure of caution to downsize the event," said Creekmore.

Fair Board President David Isom said the majority of the board agreed the event should take place.

"They felt like it was something we need to go ahead and do," he said.

The 2020 fair was cancelled due to the pandemic.

There will still be the usual livestock shows and contests which are held in an open barn.

Many exhibitors who would set up in the exhibit buildings at the fair are not planning to attend this year.

However, there is a group coming from Florida who has a Transformers car that should attract some kids. There will also be a motorcycle rider who rides in a steel globe and on a high wire.

Wade Shows operates the midway and will offer advance tickets and armbands for unlimited

Additionally, ride prices are determined by Wade Shows.

The fair is Sept. 21-26 at the North Alabama State Fairgrounds on U.S. Highway 43 in Muscle



The announcement is being made locally by the Tuscumbia Historic Preservation Commission which worked with Carolyn homeowner Stewart to submit the application. Once the nomination was submitted by Stewart, a review by an AHC staff committee determined its eligibility based on criteria recognize buildings of state-wide historical and architectural significance.

The home is part of the Tuscumbia National Register Historic District. It is located at 606 East Eighth Street. It was built in 1920 for Dr. and Mrs. A.W. Davis. The doctor came to Tuscumbia in 1903 to serve the African American populations of Tuscumbia and Sheffield, playing an important role in the Tuscumbia community until his death in 1941. In addition to his medical practice, Dr. Davis owned a drug store with business partner Mr. G. W. Minor and was active in many civic and business organizations, including the Auxiliary School Board in Tuscumbia and the

Negro Business League.
The architecture of Shady Dell is described as Dutch Colonial Revival with Craftsman influences. The two-story home has the characteristic gambrel roof with hipped dormers. The original clapboard siding was covered with asbestos siding sometime in the mid-20th century. The three-bay front façade has a hipped stucco porch and classical columns grouped in threes. The double-hung windows and front door with five side lights are original. Doors on either side of the house lead to a porch and to a fish pond, part of the original landscape. The interior of the home contains typical examples of Craftsmanstyle woodwork. A stone monument across the street from Shady Dell marks the site of Dr. Davis' office, which is no longer

standing.
After Dr. Davis and his wife died, their daughter, Sadie Mae Davis, inherited the home. Although Sadie and her husband lived in Savannah, GA, they visited the home often during summers and holidays. After their deaths, the home passed to their daughter, Edythe Jason, who eventually sold it to Glen Stewart and his wife Barbara, a former teacher at Trenholm High School. Mr. and Mrs. Stewart's three children, Carolyn, Wayne and Danita, now own the property and are presently renovating the

FREE DRAWER ORGANIZERS

Drawer organizers can be made from any box. The bottom few inches of a cracker box can hold paperclips. The bottom of a cereal box can separate the steak knives from the regular cutlery. Tape the top and bottom and use the sides of a cereal box to create two long drawer dividers and use one for the long spoons and the other for rulers and cutters in your sewing area. These boxes can be shallow or cut with higher sides to better fit the depth of your drawers. If they seem flimsy, strengthen them with a layer or two of masking tape. A shoebox in a dresser drawer can keep socks corralled. One of the best things about these is that they are free, and if you spill something on one, you can just toss it and maké a new óne.

Call about two weeks before your scheduled appointment and have the doctor's office send the necessary paperwork to the lab where the tests are done. Your test results will be sent back to the doctor before your visit. SENIOR Could I Have COPD and Not Know It?

I have struggled with shortness of breath for several years now. I just thought I was getting old and fat, but a friend recently told me about COPD. So, my question is could I have COPD and not know it?

Huffing and Puffing

Dear Huffing,

Yes. COPD, or chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, is a progressive lung disease that affects an estimated 30 million Americans, but about half of them don't know they have it.

Many people mistake shortness of breath as a normal part of aging, or a result of being out of shape, but that's not necessarily the case. COPD - a term used to describe a variety of lung diseases including emphysema and chronic bronchitis - develops slowly, so symptoms may not be obvious until damage has occurred.

Symptoms can include an ongoing cough or a cough that produces a lot of mucus, lack of energy and/or shortness of breath especially during physical activity, wheezing and chest tightness, blue lips or fingernails, or swelling in your feet, ankles or legs.

Those most at risk are smokers or former smokers over age 40, and people who have had long-term exposure to other lung irritants like secondhand smoke, air pollution, chemical fumes and dust. There is also a rare genetic condition known as alpha-1-antitrypsin, or AAT deficiency that can increase the risks.

If you're experiencing any of the aforementioned symptoms, you need to get tested by your doctor. A simple breathing test called spirometry can tell if you have COPD, and if so, how severe it is. Early screening can also identify COPD before major loss of lung function

If you do indeed have COPD, you need to know that while there's no cure, there are things you can do to help manage symptoms and protect your lungs from further damage, including:

Quit smoking: If you smoke, the best thing you can do to prevent more damage to your lungs is to quit. To get help, the National Cancer Institute offers a number of smoking cessation resources at SmokeFree.gov or call 1-800-QUIT-NOW. Or ask your doctor about prescription antismoking drugs that can help reduce your nicotine craving. If you smoke marijuana for a medical condition, talk to your doctor about edible versions.

Avoid air pollutants: Stay away from things that could irritate your lungs like dust, allergens and strong fumes. Also, to help improve your air quality at home, remove dust-collecting clutter and keep carpets clean; run the exhaust fan when using smelly cleaning products, bug sprays or paint; ban smoking indoors; and keep windows closed when outdoor air pollution is high (see AirNow. gov for daily air-quality reports).

Get vaccinated: The coronavirus and flu can cause serious problems for people who have COPD, so if you haven't already done so, get vaccinated for COVID-19 and get a flu shot every fall to help avoid getting sick. Also ask your doctor about getting the pneumococcal immunizations for protection against pneumonia.

Take prescribed medications: Bronchodilators (taken with an inhaler) are commonly used for COPD. They help relax the airway muscles to make breathing easier. Depending on how severe your condition, you may need a short-acting version only for when symptoms occur, or a long-acting prescription for daily use. Inhaled steroids may also help reduce inflammation and mucus and prevent flare-ups.

Mask Mandate Makes Sense

Editor:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that students, staff, and visitors inside school buildings wear masks always. The American Academy of recommends **Pediatrics** masking universal schools for several reasons including: (1) ineligibility vaccination of significant portion of the student population; (2) protection of unvaccinated students and reduction of transmission; and (3) continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children.

So why aren't we insisting on masks in all our schools?

COVID is transmitted predominately inhalation of respiratory droplets generated when cough, sneeze, people

sing, talk, or breathe. The logic of masks is straight forward. Masking effective in reducing the likelihood of children with infection asymptomatic spreading the disease to others.

Alabama schools reported 13,000 cases in a two-week period. The data shows a total of 9,195 cases recorded the week of August 30 in schools across the state and 4,337 cases the previous week. That's more than double in one week! And that's with only 84 of the 143 school districts reporting. Children ages 5-16 have accounted for 21% of new cases in the state, with the Delta variant overwhelming our health care systems.

The COVID positivity rate among students in

Hillsborough County Florida schools dropped 23% since masks were mandated just 2 weeks ago. Good news is that 90%

of Alabama schools have chosen to implement a mask mandate. Let's hope our school administrators make it 100%!

Medicare Minute "Physician Charges"

There are three ways your doctor can be paid if you are on Medicare. The three ways are through Medicare assignment, Medicare excess charges or by not taking Medicare at all. Today we will discuss these three methods.

The most common way a physician gets paid is by Medicare assignment. These physicians are called "participating doctors". After the Part B deductible of \$203 is met, participating doctors will accept the Medicare approved amount for their services. These doctors charge Medicare 80% and the beneficiary 20% of the cost of the benefit. For example, if your doctor charges \$200 for a service and Medicare only approves \$100, Medicare would pay 80%, or \$80, and you would be responsible for the other 20%, or \$20.

A "non-participating doctor" can choose to accept or not accept Medicare assignment. If the doctor does not accept Medicare assignment you may have to pay an additional 15% of the cost of the service the doctor provided. This is call a Medicare excess charge. It means you would be responsible for 35% of the Medicare reduced amount instead of 20%. If we follow the example in the previous paragraph, if your doctor charges \$200 for a service and Medicare only approves \$100, Medicare would pay 80%, or \$80, but you would be responsible for 35%, or \$35.

Doctors who opt out of Medicare can charge whatever they want for their services and you are responsible of 100% of the cost. The majority of doctors in north Alabama accept Medicare, so you won't be faced with this situation very often.

Most people who have Medicare also have a supplemental policy that helps cover the 20% Medicare doesn't cover. If you are just entering Medicare and would like to know which policies cover what Medicare doesn't pay, you can contact our office for more information





10 SAFE **DRIVING**

Joel and I handle injury cases and have since 1988. We help people pick up the pieces after an accident or injury. We know how much it costs to make a house wheelchair accessible. We know how much it costs for a handicap van and how many of those a person will need over their lifetime.

It's just better to not to be hurt. Here are some easy things to do to avoid having an accident.

First, make sure that your tires and brakes are working properly. Tires that have uneven pressure can cause a car to brake unevenly.

Secondly, stay calm and don't be frustrated with other drivers. Sure, some are aggressive and drive too fast, change lanes quickly and cut others off but studies show that taking a deep breath and not being that driver will keep you out of an accident.

Third, assume the other drivers are going to make a mistake. That means just because a blinker is on doesn't mean they are going to turn. When you approach an intersection don't assume everyone else will stop as they are supposed to. Number <u>four</u> is following too closely. The rule is 20 feet of distance for every 10 mile an hour of speed. When you stop make sure you can see the rear tires of the car in front of you. We always have cases where people are hit from the rear and then slam into the car in front of them (this is as known as the "Double Whammy".)

Number <u>five</u>, be careful in bad weather. When you hit a puddle it can pull the steering wheel, cause your car to hydroplane and warp your disc brakes. Just slow down when it's raining. <u>Sixth</u>, WEAR YOUR SEATBELT. Number <u>seven</u>, don't drive drowsy. Your response time slows down and at highway speeds in two seconds you travel about 200 feet. Eight, don't drive distracted. Studies show that talking on a cell phone slows your reaction time and so does putting on makeup and looking at your radio. Keep your eyes on the road and your hands on the wheel.

Number nine, don't speed. You don't really save that much time but you can increase your risk of a crash by as much as fifty percent. And that doesn't count getting a ticket. And last but not least, more than thirty percent of all fatalities are the result of drunk driving. So, number ten is don't drive drunk.

Dear Dave,

Are umbrella insurance policies worth it, or do they just entice people to sue more frequently?

Dear Tammi,

I don't think there's any indication umbrella policies entice folks to lawsuits more frequently. If you hadn't noticed, we live in a lawsuit-happy world. There are lots of greedy people out there who would try to sue for absolutely anything—no matter how ridiculous.

I think these types of policies are worth the money. You can get a \$1 million umbrella policy that attaches to the top of the liability coverage on your car and homeowners for \$200 to \$300 a year in most places. So, if your original car and coverage homeowners was \$500,000, you'd have \$1.5 million in coverage with an umbrella policy.

If you've got a substantial net worth, or if there's just something that gives the impression someone might be able to get a lot out of you, an umbrella insurance policy is a smart buy.

a small business. We have a large account providing wholesale items to a client. Our original agreement was to work on 30-day payment periods, but he is months behind on the bill. We live in a small town, and the businesses here stick together and help each other out, so we don't want to ruin the relationship. Do you have some advice on handling this situation?

Dear Hollie,

From what you said, I assume this guy's not a cheat or anything like that. He's probably like a lot of small business owners in that he's just a little disorganized. Still, you need to correct this behavior.

If it were me, I'd go to his office and have a friendly, sit-down meeting about things. There's no reason to start throwing threats around, but he needs to understand you can't be his bank. You're a small business, too, and you need your money.

Ask a few questions, and find out what's really

going on. Then, let him know it will help matters if he can get current on the bill by a certain date. You've provided goods and services, and he owes you money, so this is a fair request. You might think about adjusting your payment agreement to reflect that once he's current, payment must be within 10 days of delivery

from that point on. If that's not workable, you may have to switch to a cash-only basis—where payment is due on delivery. Dear Dave, And if none of these My husband and I own options work, well, you should probably tell him to find another supplier.



Six Open Enrollment Questions

Ivermectin is being taken off label by some people as a preventative against Covid-19 instead of the vaccine, and is also taken as a treatment when contracting the virus. Ivermectin is available for human use by prescription and is prescribed by some physicians occasionally as a treatment. ago. The mental giant who tried to magnify the deceptive story with the photo apparently didn't think that everyone in heavy coats in 90 degree heat would be questioned.

Rolling Stone admitted it had no proof whatsoever to back up its report, and it has issued several updates. Yet, the original story was still up as of this writing. Yahoo has revised it's story, even though it kept reiterating the false elements. No one else admitted any errors.

We all know that initial stories and allegations are read 100 times more than a correction or update. It matters not to what degree each is littered with assumptions and falsehoods.

Dr. Jason McElyea, the lone source for the story, insists he was mis-quoted.

McElyea is an employee of an agency that staffs emergency departments throughout the United States including several emergency departments in rural Oklahoma.

The official statement from Northeastern Health System Sequoyah said, "Dr. McElyea has not worked at our Sallisaw location in over two months. NHS Sequoyah has not treated any patients due to complications related to taking ivermectin."

This story was manufactured to fit an agenda. It is the type that was accurately referred to as "fake news" for several years.

Yet, nothing has been flagged Twitter bv misinformation. Maddow's account has suspended, been not even though as of this writing the false tweet and comments are still up. And no one, especially Maddow, will be corrected or reprimanded. I can think of some colorfully accurate descriptions and appropriate terms for the people involved, but we are trying to take the high road, bite a lip, and keep this clean.
