



SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,'

It is important to understand that our United States Constitution was not automatically the law of the land when the framers signed it. Communication was not as quick as we experience today.

Our United States Constitution was signed by 39 founding fathers on Monday, September 17, 1787. Copies had to be transcribed and began being presented to the states of America on Friday, September 28, 1787.

to the states of America on Friday, September 28, 1787. Delaware was the first state to ratify the Constitution on Tuesday, December 7, 1787, and Rhode Island was the last state to ratify the Constitution on Saturday, May 29, 1790.

The authors of the Federalist Papers argued in favor of ratification and sought to convince the American people that the new government would not become tyrannical as many Americans were very concerned that we might have another monarchy such as we had with England.

During this time the Articles of Confederation were the law of the land. The ratifying conventions served the necessary function of informing the public of the provisions of the proposed new government. They also served as forums for proponents and opponents to articulate their ideas before the citizenry.

Significantly, state conventions, not Congress, were the agents of ratification. Our Constitution was ratified on Saturday, June 21, 1788, when New Hampshire became the ninth of the thirteen states to approve it. The Confederation Congress, which operated under the Articles of Confederation chose Wednesday, March 4, 1789, as the day to hand over power to the new constitutional government and was the Constitution's first official day to be the law of America.

The United States Education Department outlined on Tuesday, May 24, 2005, that it planned to enforce a littleknown provision that Congress passed in 2004 which reads: "Every school and college that receives federal money must teach the Constitution every Sept. 17th, the day the document was adopted in 1787".

Constitution Day was originally named Citizenship Day in 1952. I encourage everyone to contact your local school superintendent and school board members to inquire if they teach our United States Constitution on September 17th. If not, a friendly reminder that their continued federal school aid depends on their adhering to this law will encourage them.

So now the question is "what are we going to do with all this information?" Knowing the contents of our United States Constitution will educate each of us as to our freedoms and responsibilities as citizens of the United States of America.

Today our freedoms are under attack by people who would turn our country into a socialist dictatorship. One of my favorite sayings is that "we should leave America in better condition than when we arrived on the scene."

Unfortunately, this has not happened as our country's freedoms are being eroded. I am sure that we wish our children and grandchildren to have an even better life than we have had.

Another of my favorite sayings is "So where are you men and women of courage?" If our founding fathers risked life and limb to adopt our Declaration of Independence and United States Constitution and many of our men and women have served and some have given their all to preserve our freedoms, it is our responsibility to care and preserve these hard-fought freedoms.

Lord willing, we will begin another study next week. Have a wonderful week.





IN THE 1970s, unscrupulous industrial and residential developers talked farmers into selling off their road frantage claiming that doing so would lower their taxes. It had the opposite effect. Many were forced to sell their family farms to large corporate or bank owned farms.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) 2021–2022



Regular HEAP opens on October 1, 2021. Emergency HEAP opens January 3, 2022.

Apply for HEAP on-line at **<u>myBenefits.ny.gov</u>** beginning October 1, 2021.

Applying on-line is easy, applications are received by the agency right away, and allow the applicant to track the application and benefits. Interviews can be done over the phone.

Most individuals or families **receiving either Temporary Assistance or SNAP benefits** on September 19, 2021 will receive a one-time Regular HEAP benefit through that case and do not need to apply separately.

Livingston County residents who are unable to apply online, may request an application be mailed by calling (585) 243-7300. HEAP applications are accepted and mailed starting <u>October 1, 2021</u> at the Livingston County Department of Social Services 1 Murray Hill Drive, Mount Morris, NY 14510

- Non-heating electric shut offs cannot be paid with Regular HEAP Benefits.
- Do not wait until you are out of fuel to apply for HEAP. Let us know when you are low on fuel (less than a quarter tank).
 "Off Route" delivery charges will be deducted from your HEAP grant, so you will receive less fuel from your HEAP grant.
- If you have a shut off notice on your natural gas or electric, contact us **prior** to being shut off. If service is shut off, the company does not have to accept the HEAP grant to turn it back on.

Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention

Every year, hundreds of people die and thousands are injured from unsuspected exposure to an odorless, colorless gas-carbon monoxide (CO). Studies by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicate that, while people recognize CO gas is poisonous, they perceive CO as less dangerous than other household hazards. CO poisoning is most prevalent when furnaces are turned back on to fight cold winter temperatures, but also commonly occur after summer and winter storms and accompanying power outages, when people tend to rely on portable generators for electricity.

Here are some simple steps to protect yourselves and your family:

✓ Install battery-operated CO detectors near every sleeping area in your home.

✓ Check CO detectors regularly to be sure they are functioning properly.

✓ Have gas or oil furnaces inspected by a qualified professional every year.

✓ Never use a generator inside the home or garage, even if doors and windows are open.

✓ Only use generators and power washers outside, more than 20 feet away from the home, doors, and windows.

✓ Never use a charcoal grill inside the home.
