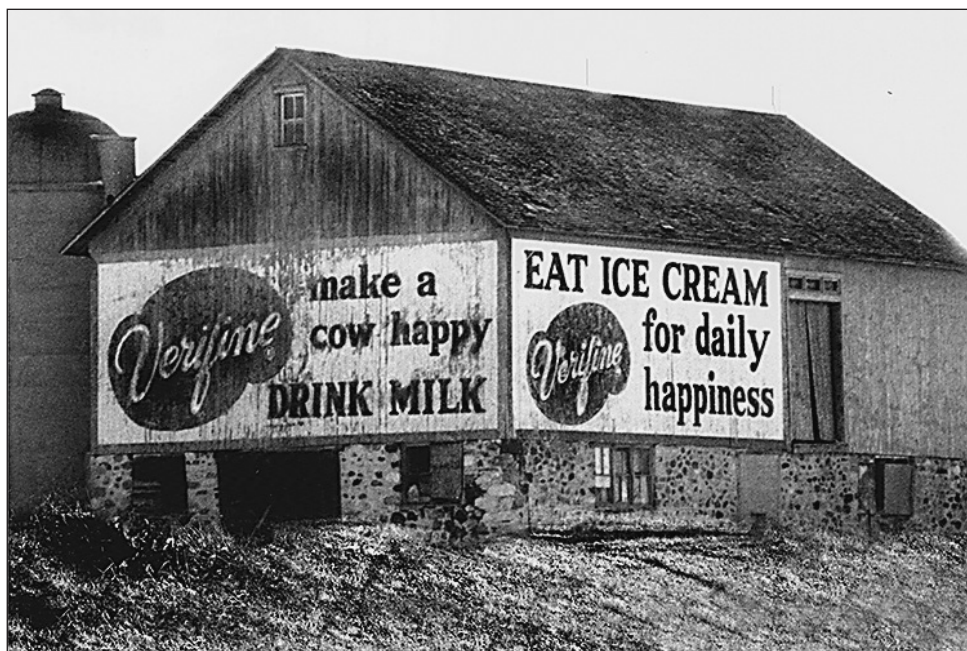
Admission to “Arts at the Waelderhaus” is free, and reservations are strongly

Elkhart Lake Village update

Trick or Treat to be on Halloween

The Trick or Treat hours have been set for the village.

Trick or Treat hours will be on Sunday, Oct. 31 from 3 to 5 p.m.

Cleveland State Bank ground breaking

The Village of Elkhart Lake sold property at 184 N. Lincoln St. to Cleveland State Bank. They are breaking ground on the site in early October. This location will be the site of their new office in Elkhart Lake. The village has been working with the bank over the last few years to see this project come to fruition. We are happy to welcome them into the community. Their temporary office is located at 91 E. Rhine St. until the completion of their new office.

Highway 67 project

The STH 67 portion of the project in the village of Elkhart Lake is completed. They are just finishing a few driveway approaches in the village. Currently there are full road closures that impact traveling to Plymouth and Kiel. STH 67 is fully closed to do bridge and culvert work. You will not be able to get into Plymouth on STH 67 and you will not be able to travel to Kiel on STH 67. These projects will last into October. If you have questions about the project, you can call the Village Garage at 920-876-2231.

Obtaining a building permit

Applications for any type of residential remodeling, roofing, decks, patios, windows, siding, additions, accessory buildings, fences, driveways, demolition, electrical or plumbing requires a building permit. Depending on the type of project, many permits can be issued when you bring your application to the Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer's Office. If you would like to fill out the building permit application ahead of time please complete the building permit form online at <https://elkhartlakewi.gov/wp-content/uploads/2017/03/2-Building-Permit-Application.pdf> and bring it to the Village Administrator/Clerk-Treasurer's Office at 40 Pine St.

Yard waste dumpster

The yard waste dumpsters are open for the year. The dumpster will remain unattended for the foreseeable future. Please follow the signs about using the dumpster—you are on camera. If you require assistance, we ask that you set up an appointment with the Public Works Department (920-876-2231) so someone can help you. The dumpster is provided at the village garage from the end of May through October. This dumpster is for yard waste only, not lake waste. A truck for large brush or trees can be obtained by calling the Village Garage at 920-876-2231.

Help reduce chloride levels—softeners, salt and you

Background
It is estimated that most of the groundwater in the U.S. has some degree of hardness. Basic hardness is produced by the presence of calcium and magnesium dissolved in water. These minerals—if not removed from your water—may build up as scale on pipes and porcelain or metal fixtures. They coat water heater elements. They may cause increased laundry detergent usage. This is why most people have water softeners.

The problem

The chlorides discharged from the home water softeners end up at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. The Wisconsin Department of Natural

Resources (WDNR) is asking the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to reduce these chloride levels.

What can our customers do about our chloride problem?

They can have their water softening equipment inspected and adjusted to make them more efficient, reducing the chlorides going to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. When replacing or upgrading old water softeners use a high efficiency softener that is metered demand. Our goal is to reduce the chlorides entering the environment by reducing the rate of salt used by our water softener, while still delivering continued quality water. This, in turn, will simply help keep long-term sewer rates down. You may also see some reduction in your water and salt usage, thus saving you money!

Planning Commission update

The Planning Commission has been meeting about some potential changes to our zoning ordinance and conditional use permits. They have also had a few rezoning requests come before the commission. There will be public hearings on these changes before the Village Board on Oct. 4, 2021. Village Ordinance 8.32—Animal Feces

Any person owning or having control of any animal shall clean up the feces of such animal immediately and dispose of it in a sanitary manner when the animal has defecated on the property of another or on public property. Please be aware, the sidewalk, the area between the sidewalk and street (parkway), the street, Lake Street Walkway, and all parks and parking lots are public property.

Dog owners—refuse stations

Just a reminder to please pick up after your dogs. We have installed bag stations throughout the village for your convenience. These stations will dispense plastic bags to help in the cleanup effort. The dog stations are

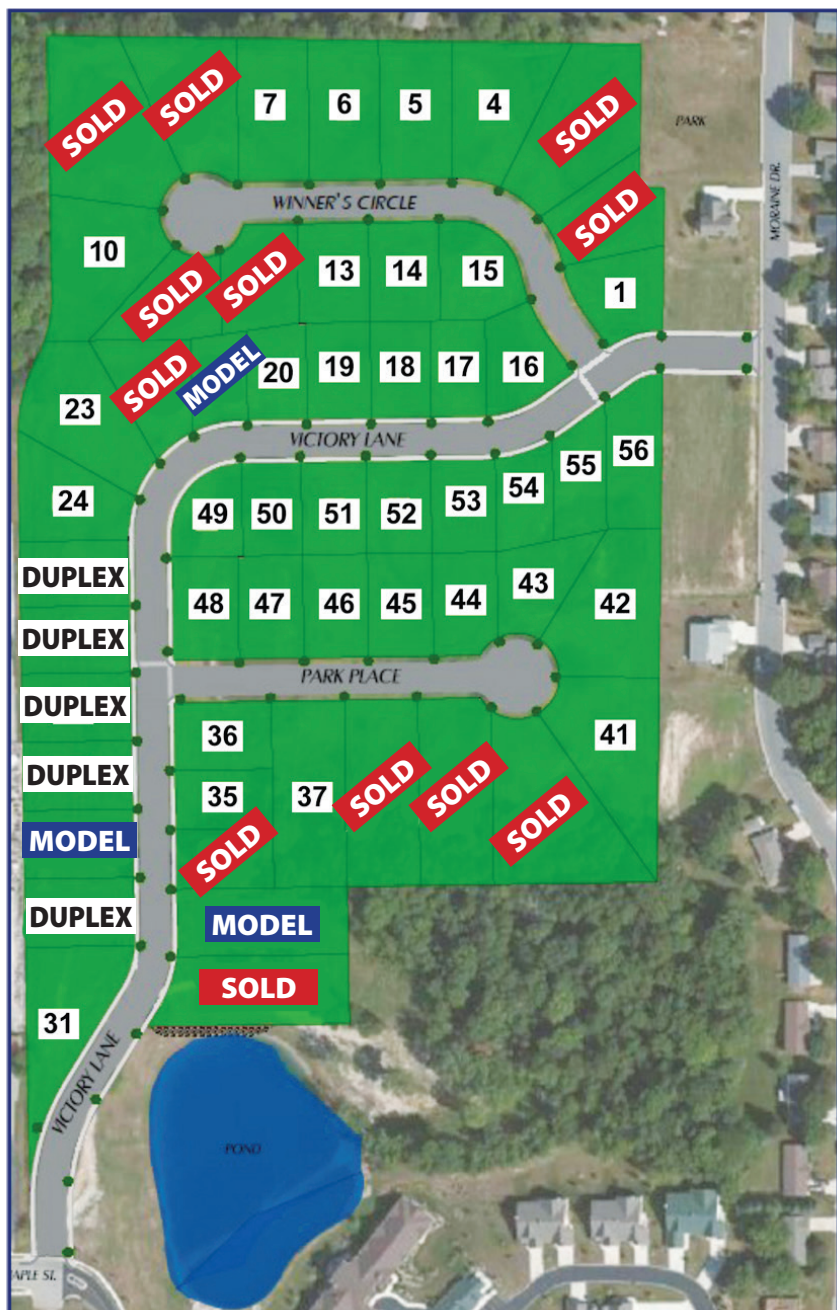

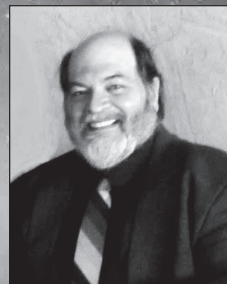

LTC graduate pledges \$100K in scholarships

Philanthropy is alive among those in the lakeshore community who believe technical education is a viable means to job security.

A retired Lakeshore Technical College graduate who credits his success to faculty members who mentored and guided him is giving back to his alma mater. Two Rivers resident and retired U.S. Army Reserve 1st Sgt. Jesse L. Klein is providing scholarships for generations of LTC students with his \$100,000 pledge to the LTC Foundation.

“Knowledge is power, and it will take you places you can never imagine,” Klein advises students. “With enough hard work, you too will be able to pay it forward someday.”

Klein earned associate degrees at LTC in IT-Network Specialist and IT-Computer Support Specialist in 2014, after completing deployments overseas during Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan. He retired from the military in 2016 after serving 33 years.

“Jesse will support students with this

generous gift made in honor of LTC faculty and staff members who led him into a successful career after he returned from serving in the U.S. Army. Generations of LTC students will be impacted by his gift,” said LTC Vice President of Advancement Kristy Liphart, who oversees the foundation.

The first Jesse L. Klein Memorial Scholarship was awarded to a student attending LTC this fall semester. Scholarships will be awarded each semester. All LTC students who are enrolled in an associate degree program and have financial need are eligible to apply by completing the foundation’s online application.

Klein’s pledge adds to the positive donor activity the LTC Foundation has experienced over the past year, according to Liphart. “We are grateful for the generosity of donors during the ‘Save a Seat’ campaign we launched during the pandemic. Thanks to them we provided students with approximately three times the amount of emergency grants and scholarships than we did the prior year, which helps get them closer to completing their degrees and out

into the workforce.”

Donors provide dozens of scholarships through the LTC Foundation. To apply, visit yourlctcfoundation.com/scholarships. The deadline to apply for spring 2022 scholarships is Oct. 25.

Each year nearly 10,000 people enroll in courses at Lakeshore Technical College. They rely on LTC for job preparation, to earn a degree, upgrade a specialized skill, train as an apprentice, or seek a high school equivalency.

LTC is a nationally recognized technical college. The college was ranked the #2 two-year college in the nation for adult learners by Washington Monthly, #20 in the nation for two-year college educational outcomes by WalletHub.com, a top-150 two-year college by the Aspen Institute, and a top 10 Bellwether Award finalist for two consecutive years.

Approximately 800 students graduate from LTC each year, and LTC’s associate degree graduates earn a median salary of approximately \$52,000 per year. In addition to the Cleveland campus, LTC serves students in Manitowoc and She-
