
Moms in Prayer Group Calling all moms and grandmas of children of all ages in and

FALL of 2021 City of ARNOLDS PARK

Newsletter

Pickleball Courts have been constructed at Sawmill Park. The four courts are used frequently by both residents and visitors to Arnolds Park. The contractor for this project was Diamond Concrete.

Full-depth removal and replacement of Pillsbury Point Park Road, and a mill and overlay of Prairie Lane and Circle Drive began at the end of September. This project was postponed from last year due to funding and the uncertainty associated with the pandemic. The entire project has a completion date of December 1, 2021; however, dependent upon weather, construction could take as little as four to five weeks. Access to property and residences throughout the entire project may be limited at times. The contractor on this project is Blacktop Service Company; the subcontractor is Beck Excavating.

The Phase 3 portion of the Lakeview Boulevard Pedestrian Walkway will begin as soon as SHPO approval is received from the State of Iowa. This portion of the walkway will continue around Pillsbury Point on both IDNR and City property to Monument Drive. This will connect Lakeview Boulevard with the sidewalk from the Amusement Park. Included in the project will be the cleanup of the West Okoboji shoreline around Pillsbury Point in cooperation with IDNR and Imagine Iowa Great Lakes who is providing the funding. Restoration of the shoreline will be similar in nature to Clare C. Wilson Park, and the Hattie Elston boat ramp. The contractor for the Pedestrian Walkway is MLS Landscape & Design.

Utility Billing

Utility Bills are sent out at the end of each quarter and are to be paid by the 20th of the month in order to receive a discount. Bills that are not paid by this date are considered past due and are subject to being disconnected.

You may pay by check or cash at City Hall, or online using a credit card at <u>www.arnoldsparkcity.com</u> (there is a small fee for this service). Another option is to have your payment automatically deducted from a checking or savings account. Please contact City Hall for more information on automatic withdrawal.

ATV, ORV & Snowmobile Ordinance All persons operations a valid motor vehicle license and provide proof of current registration

and proof of insurance as required by the Iowa Code Chapter 321I. ATV's, ORV's, and snowmobiles may be operated in the City twenty-four (24)

hours a day and must be equipped with operating headlights and taillights. ATVs, ORVs, and snowmobiles will

be allowed to cross Highway 71 at Broadway Street and at 202nd Street, but are **not** allowed to operate on Highway 71; however, they are allowed on all other City streets at a speed no greater than thirty-five (35) miles per hour. It is illegal to operate an ATV, ORV or snowmobile in any City Park, playground, or upon any other City property without permission of the City.

Police Department

Pet Owners: Reminder of the Leash Law in Arnolds Park. Pets must be on a leash with a maximum 10 – Foot leash. Please clean up after your pets. All animals must be in a secure location away from electric, gas, and water meters to insure your meters are read properly.

Winter Reminders: All vehicles must be off City streets following a snowfall of 2 inches or more for snow removal. If they are not removed, they will be ticketed and/or towed. Residents of Arnolds Park that would be leaving for winter may come to the Arnolds Park Police Department and fill out a House Watch form. This allows the police department to contact you should there be an incident that involves your residence. If you have questions or concerns, please contact the police department at (712) 332-2227 Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. After hours, you make contact the Dickinson County Communications Center at (712) 336-2525.

Yard Waste & Open Burning

The City has proper disposal methods for yard waste and we ask that it never be blown onto or placed on the streets, public roads, or neighboring lots.

If you wish to have your yard waste (no dirt or rocks) picked up it must be placed in City bags, tied shut, and placed at the curbside by 7:00 a.m. on Tuesdays. The bags must not weigh more than 50 pounds. Cut branches in 4 feet lengths and bundle with a city bag attached. Yard waste is picked up from April through October (dependent upon the weather). City bags are available for purchase at City Hall. If you need to dispose of yard waste outside of this time frame, you will need to drop off your bags at the Dickinson County Regional Collection Center located at 2260 220th Street (A34), Milford, Iowa; charges may

apply. If you choose to burn your yard waste, please be courteous to neighbors and use good judgment based on weather conditions. All fires must be attended by a person 18 years of age or older at all times. Any yard waste you burn on your property, must originate on your

property. The burning of garbage, rubber, or anything of a toxic matter is strictly prohibited. Yard waste cannot be burned on City property.

Snow Removal Town and Coun

Town and Country Disposal will not empty commercial dumpsters if there is snow in front of or blocking the dumpster. Businesses are responsible for snow removal and ensuring the path is clear for the garbage trucks.

Business owners: It is your responsibility to remove snow and ice promptly from the sidewalk in front of your business. If this is not done within a reasonable time, the City may do so and assess the costs against the property owner (City Ordinance and Code of Iowa).

Winter Utility Shut Down

Do you plan to travel over the winter? If you leave your home unoccupied during the winter months, it is recommended that you have your home winterized. This could avoid a disaster in the event of a power outage or other unforeseen event.

Garbage & Recycling

Garbage for residential customers from Labor Day to Memorial Day is on Mondays only. Recycling will continue to be picked up on the second and fourth Fridays of each month. Carts must be curbside prior to 7:00 a.m. for pickup. If you do not have your container out in time, it will not be picked up until the next designated collection day. Commercial trash is picked up on Monday and Friday weekly.

Recycling must be placed in the correct container and must be recycling items only, no garbage. Accepted recyclables include: cans (steel, tin, aluminum), plastic containers (bottles, tubs, jugs), flattened cardboard, paper (newspapers, office paper, junk mail, magazines). Shredded paper and plastic bags need to be bagged separately in clear plastic bags. Do not recycle the following items: glass (bottles, jars, baking dishes), styrofoam, ceramics, porcelain, toys, clothes, shoes, rubber, waste & food, pizza boxes, hazardous materials (paint, lead, glue, oil), electronics (TV's, keyboards, batteries, bulbs), furnace filters. Please call City Hall with any questions regarding garbage or recycling.


Pausley Appointed to Postpartum Support International Board The Cherish Center Board of Directors is pleased to announce




Knights of Columbus Soccer Challenge



Food Safety Escape Challenge Training for Child Care Providers



Manhattan Short Film Festival September 30, 2021: Film lovers in Okoboji, Iowa, will join over 100,000 film enthusiasts around the world during September



Cyclones September Struggles Continue

ISU head coach Matt Campbell is in my opinion the best coach that the Cyclones have ever had, taking a program that was the joke of the Big 12 to a team that played in the Big 12 Championship game last year and won the Fiesta Bowl. This year looked to be even better, with 20 of 22 starters returning and a preseason #7 ranking, but the same woes that have plagued Campbell and the Cyclones in the first month of the season during his tenure have reared their ugly heads again as ISU slipped to 2-2 this September with a very disappointing 31-29 loss at Baylor on Saturday. Campbell has an impressive 37-30 record at ISU that includes a first season 3-9 mark, but his teams have struggled mightily in September, going 9-13 overall during his first five seasons. One major reason for these struggles reared its ugly head again in Saturday's defeat, special teams.

Iowa State gave up a kick-return for a touchdown, had a punt partially blocked that went 16 yards and resulted in a Baylor touchdown and then had another short punt returned to the ISU 16-yard line that resulted in a 4th quarter field goal that gave the Bears a 31-23 lead. That totals 17 points pretty much surrendered by your special teams, and when you're playing on the road in a conference game against a 3-0 team, that is just too much to overcome. Iowa State did everything else right to win this game (except go under center for the 2-point conversion at the end of the game, but we don't have the time/room to get into that decision). The Cyclones had 27 first downs to Baylor's 15; outgained the Bears 469-282; had 15 penalty yards to Baylor's 100 and won the time of possession 36 minutes to 24 minutes but still lost the game because of the 17-0 deficit rendered by the return teams. ISU dodged a bullet on their punt return team when they fumbled a punt at their own 15-yard line right before halftime but recovered it or that amount could have been 24-0! While the defense struggled to slow Baylor down in the first half, giving up 21 points, they got things figured out and held the Bears to just three second half points and that was on a drive that started deep in ISU territory due to the above-mentioned poor punt and coverage. ISU's defense was so dominant in the second half that they gave up -7 yards in the fourth quarter.

One could argue that ISU's last five losses in the last two years are pretty much due to losing the special teams battle; two returns for TDs in a 14-31 loss against Louisiana; two missed field goals in their 21-24 loss at Oklahoma State; horrible kick-coverage in their 21-27 loss to Oklahoma in the Big 12 Championship; a botched punt-return and constant poor field position due to Iowa's stud punter Tory Taylor pinning the Cyclones deep in Iowa's 27-17 win; and then Saturday's debacle. Iowa State is a very talented team, but they are still a team that is going to have to, as coach Campbell always says "win in the margins" and until they can figure out how to win or even just draw even in special teams, they will continue to lose games that they could have, and like Saturday, should have won. The good news for ISU is that the calendar turns to October and we all know what that means, Broktober is heading our way and let's hope that means another magical October/November ride for our Cyclones!



•Check eligibility for Part D Extra Help

•Understand options if currently not enrolled in a drug plan This is a great opportunity for people on Medicare to review and choose what coverage they want for 2022. Every year Medicare Part D and Medicare Advantage plans can change their premiums, deductibles, co-payments, benefits, and the drugs they cover. To avoid costly surprises on January 1, a free, confidential counseling appointment with a SHIIP volunteer may be beneficial. Appointments are held at Lakes Regional Healthcare. Those with SHIIP appointments are encouraged to enter the hospital through Door A, which is the main door on the west side of the hospital off of Highway 71.

Although counseling services are available year round, the open enrollment period for Part D drug coverage and Medicare Advantage plans runs from October 15 through December 7.

Fred Gilbert - More than a Park

Fred Gilbert, known by many as the "Wizard of Spirit Lake" for his outstanding competitive trap shooting skills, had deep roots in Dickinson County. His life as an international figure from 1895 to 1927 has been well documented, but little is known about his family and early days growing up east of East Lake Okoboji in what was Tusculum township.

John F. Smeltzer, an Orleans resident with deep interests in Dickinson County history, genealogy, and all things outdoors will share stories, photos, and information about Fred Gilbert, encouraging us to know the man behind the worldwide fame. Smeltzer says, "we need to know where he came from to understand his path through life."

Smeltzer's interest in Fred Gilbert is three-fold. Like Gilbert, Smeltzer is an active competitive trap shooter. Smeltzer calls the Orleans lakeshore where Gilbert's "Indian Shoots" were held home, and Smeltzer's probable relative, John F. Schmelzer, was the sponsor of one of the many trophies Gilbert won during his career.

Smeltzer will be speaking as part of the Dickinson County Historical Society and Museum's "History LIVES!" Series Thursday, September 30 at 7:00 at the museum. All are welcome!

Clay County Fair Returns in Big Way

Following a one-year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Clay County Fair powered by SMU returned September 11-19 with sunny skies and smiling



'There was much uncertainty heading into this Fair with the pandemic, a labor shortage, supply chain issues, and a 721-day break since the last Fair," said Fair Manager Jeremy Parsons. "However, the enthusiasm of our fairgoers to simply be at the Fair put that uncertainty to rest once the gates opened."

Fairgoers reacted favorably to many programming changes, including a new home for poultry and rabbits in the Farm Nutrients Small Animal Barn; stellar entertainment on the Midway Stage; the Manufacturing Expo presented by ISU Extension Clay County, which involved nine area high schools; the Fair's first-ever Hispanic Festival on Sept. 12: a new shuttle route which traveled the southern edge of the fairgrounds; and 31 new foods.

"When the enthusiasm of the fairgoers mixed with the determination of our vendors, exhibitors, volunteers, staff and Board to put on the best Fair possible under the circumstances we were in, it created a beautiful nine days," he said. "We are grateful and thankful."

Parsons continued that the success of the 2021 Clay County Fair can be measured in several metrics, including:

Youth Involvement · 708 4-H and FFA exhibitors from 42 counties in Iowa, Minnesota, and Nebraska participated in livestock and human sciences events at

Approximately 1,300 third and fourth grade students from 16 regional schools visited the Fair as part of the AgCiting and SciCiting field trip programs coordinated by ISU Extension Clay County.

Fairgoer Spending

Preliminary fairgoer spending on food, beverage, specialty concessions, and carnival rides totaled \$2,537,345.95, breaking an all-time record set in 2017.

Preliminary fairgoer spending set three single-day records for the first Sunday (Sept. 12), Wednesday (Sept. 15), and the second Saturday (Sept. 18).

GoldStar Amusements set single-day records for carnival ride revenue eight of the nine days of the Fair, including an all-time single-day record on Saturday, Sept. 18.

Exhibitor Participation

456 commercial exhibitors, concessionaires, and vendors showcased at the Fair. With at least 150 ag-specific exhibitors, the Fair again hosted the largest farm machinery and ag equipment show at any fair in the United States.

· 1,127 exhibitors participated in various open class livestock and non-livestock competitions.

· The Sleep Number Grandstand attracted 18,585 fairgoers to multiple stage performances and dirt events. The top two attended events were Skillet with special guest Ledger (2,763) and Josh Turner with special guest Dillon Carmichael (2,698).





Whether it's encouraging positive habits through adequate sleep, healthy eating and exercise, maintaining financial well-being, supporting positive relationships within our family, at work, or in the community, we all spend time working on this valuable part of our life experience.

If any of these areas are out of balance, we can be subject to illness physically, mentally, and emotionally. Mental Illness Awareness Week (October 3-10) reminds us all that 1 in 5 adults here In the U.S. have a diagnosable mental illness in their lifetime. That makes it safe to say that many of us have conditions that require attention and treatment to have a better life at home, at work, and in the community.

Since we Americans value productivity, it's inherent at work that individuals tend to hide mental illness because of fear of jeopardizing their employment. Likewise, students who experience mental health conditions also struggle to participate effectively. At the same time, managers/teachers may recognize behaviors that affect performance and are puzzled or sometimes exasperated by the individual's inattention, mood changes, or

absenteeism. It takes a shift in attitude to separate a person's worth from their behavior. There may be a tendency to equate a person's

Likewise, in school, educators and staff may have challenges working with students who are distracted, over-stimulated, or shut down emotionally, Persistence, compassion, and a longer-term investment are required to support a person with mental illness and their treatment to achieve a better place of functioning.



Iowa Dairy Industry Survey Results Now Available

In 2020, the Center for Survey Statistics and Methodology - Survey Research Services at Iowa State University was contracted to conduct an online/mail survey with dairy farmers in Iowa to learn about their current operations, needs and expectations for the future.

The survey consisted of 903 Grade A and B dairy producers in Iowa and was part of a research effort coordinated by Jennifer Bentley, Fred Hall and Larry Tranel, dairy specialists with Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, who served as principal investigators on this project.

Results provide insight on the current state of the dairy industry in Iowa and will be summarized through reports for educators, industry collaborators, elected officials, and the general public.

"This information will help educators and industry collaborators determine educational programming areas in the short and long term," Bentley said. "Additionally, results will help all audiences better understand the demographic of dairy farms, management practices used and the future of the industry."

ISU Extension and Outreach received generous support from industry collaborators who helped make this project a success, including the Iowa Area Development Group, Iowa Corn Growers Association, Iowa Farm Bureau Federation, Iowa Soybean Association, Iowa State Dairy Association, and the Midwest Dairy Association.

Key findings include:

- The typical dairy herd in Iowa has less than 250 predominately Holstein cows with a rolling herd average between 18,000-26,000 pounds.
- A growing number of operations have parlors, predominately parallel, with an increased installation of robotic milking systems.
- Herds are maximizing overall herd health, longevity and
- profitability by using sexed and beef semen strategically. The dairy industry continues to see operations retire or discontinue milking, yet the number of cows will likely be maintained or increase, indicating expansion of existing dairies.
- Farmer mental health has become more of an issue over the past five years, with over half the respondents indicating high personal stress, with instances that prompted them to take action or intervention.

Three Corridor Housing Projects to Receive Tax Credits

Awards totaling more than \$2.4 million were announced yesterday for three housing development projects in the Iowa Lakes

Corridor Development Corporation (Corridor) Region through the Iowa Economic Development Authority's (IEDA) Work-

force Housing Tax Credit program.

In total, the state awarded nearly \$30 million in tax breaks for 49 projects across the state.

The three projects in the Corridor region were:

• Berkley Heights, a 15-unit development in Spirit Lake

• Westfield by IGL Phase II, a 24-unit development in Spencer • Sunrise Pointe, a 94-unit development in Storm Lake

"The Workforce Housing Tax Credits awarded in the region will support the development of additional housing units needed to accommodate workforce housing goals," said Corridor President & CEO Shannon Landauer. "Housing has been identified as a significant challenge in rural communities when recruiting

workforce to our communities. The Iowa Lakes Corridor is hap-

py to support projects like these for the growth of the region.' IEDA's Workforce Housing Tax Credit (WHTC) program offers tax benefits to developers to provide housing in Iowa communities that meets one of four criteria: housing development on a brownfield or grayfield, upper story housing or rehabilitation, dilapidated housing stock or new construction in greenfield space. Total project costs in rural communities may not exceed \$215,000 per unit for new construction.

For the fiscal year 2022 application round, \$12 million dollars in credits were available for award under the WHTC program's Small Cities Set Aside component. IEDA received 137 applications requesting \$85.9 million in tax credits. Projects are scored competitively based on readiness, financing, need and local support and participation.
