Many of us have used an antique egg cup to hold a boiled breakfast egg, but few have ever seen an egg cup frame with six egg cups and spoons made of sterling silver over 200 years ago. New Orleans Auctions had many unusual serving pieces in an auction, and the rare 7-inch-high by 8-inch-wide egg cup frame brought \$1,625. It was made in London about 1808 to 1811 according to the hallmark. The silversmiths were Robert & Samuel Hennell. The hexagonal frame has six legs with lion's paw feet, a canopy with a shell and scroll finial, and receptacles for the six egg cups and spoons.

A frame was used for large breakfasts as a centerpiece and usually held soft boiled eggs, and there were many servants to dish out the food to each guest. A breakfast menu usually included eggs, bacon, sausage, mushroom toast, grilled tomatoes, baked beans and tea or coffee.

• I'm interested in selling a collection of over 200 Vera Neumann scarves. They were made throughout her career, no two are alike, and they're in very good condition. I'd like to sell them in groups or as a whole collection, not individually. How can I find interested buyers?

A: Vera Salaff Neumann (1907-1993) was known for her silk scarves with her signature, "Vera," on them. She was a fashion illustrator, textile designer and muralist. She and her husband, George, founded Printex in 1946. She designed placemats and other linens. The first silk scarves were made in 1947 after the company bought a supply of army surplus parachute silk. Designs were screen printed, based on Vera's watercolor paintings. She held the copyright for 8,000 designs.

George died in 1962 and Vera sold the business to Manhattan Industries in 1967. She sold her company, Vera Licensing, in 1988. Target bought the rights to reproduce 17 vintage Vera

scarves in 2013. Vera scarves are still popular. Check online shops to see what they are selling for. Shops that sell them will also buy them. Expect to get about half what the shop will sell them for. An auction gallery that sells clothing might buy the scarves, but 200 is too many to sell at one time.



Belmondo resisted "going Hollywood" and was content working exclusively in Europe. He was married twice, partnered with four women, including Ursula Andress, and sired four children. When he left us at age 88, you can be sure the ladies were lined up at the gates of heaven to get a glimpse of him.

Amid frequent hospital diversions and staffing shortages, Pittsylvania County Public Safety, along with the many volunteer EMS agencies across the county, is encouraging the community to seek the appropriate level of care when dealing with injuries and illnesses.

"It is essential that we reserve the highest level of medical care, both at the hospital and from our county EMS providers, for those that truly need it," said Chris Slemp, Pittsylvania County Public Safety Director. "We encourage anyone who is experiencing a true medical emergency to call 911, and we will provide the best service to that patient as quickly as we can. However, we request that those who are dealing with minor injuries and illnesses do not call 911 or attempt to get care from the hospital or emergency room. This will reserve those critical resources, including time, for the most serious medical emergencies where every minute matters."

As a result of an increase in COVID-19 patients and staffing difficulties, all the hospitals in the region have gone on diversion at different points in the past few months. When a hospital goes on diversion, that means it diverts incoming patients to alternate locations, putting an additional strain on the hospitals that are still accepting patients.

Diversions also put a significant burden on Pittsylvania County Public Safety and the many volunteer EMS agencies that work in the county. Typically, patients in Pittsylvania County that need transport service are taken to the hospital in Danville or the emergency room in Gretna, though it is not uncommon for patients to be taken to hospitals in Martinsville, Roanoke, Lynchburg, Halifax, or Eden, NC, depending on the severity of the situation and the area of the county where the emergency is happening. When hospitals go on diversion, patients can't be transported to the location that makes the most sense based on the location. Due to the size of Pittsylvania County, just one hospital going on diversion can result in increases in transport times.

When many hospitals go on diversion, and often at the same time, however, a few things happen:

(1) Transports end up taking significantly longer, which means that ambulances – as well as those driving them and working with the patient – are out of commission for longer. The increase in time needed per call leads to

(2) A need for additional staffing or volunteer availability to cover calls while the first crew is out transporting patients. Even when additional staffing can be found, this also leads to

(3) A need for additional ambulances and transport vehicles to be ready at all times.

Even while the hospitals have been short-staffed and going on diversion, the Pittsylvania County Dispatch Center has continued to see heavy volume of 911 calls. Over the past few months, the Dispatch Center has received approximately 100 more calls per month than the number of calls coming in two years ago, and many of these are for people who don't necessarily need emergency services. To ensure the highest level of service and that there are no delays for those experiencing true medical emergencies, Pittsylvania County Public Safety asks for everyone to use judgement before calling 911 and to consider visiting an urgent care location or primary care physician for minor injuries and illnesses.

### Breast Cancer Awareness Get Your Mammogram: It's an hour that could save your life

According to the American Cancer Society (ACS), breast cancer is the most common cancer in women in the U.S., behind only skin cancers. In fact, the ACS puts the average risk as a one in eight chance that a woman will develop breast cancer in her lifetime. The risk is much higher in women with inherited mutations in BRCA1 and BRCA2 gene. According to the World Health Organization, breast cancer is now the most common cancer globally, claiming 12 percent of new cancer cases. Breast cancer is also the second leading cause of



cancer death in women in the U.S, superseded only by lung cancer. So, that's some not-so-good news. How about some good news? Breast cancer death rates have been dropping steadily. Statistics show that the overall death rate from breast cancer decreased by one percent each year from 2013 to 2018. Now, the question is "why?" Well, the decreases have been associated with several factors, including better treatments and earlier detection through screenings.

Here's some more good news. You can get screened by scheduling a simple, routine mammogram. A mammogram takes only about one hour, once a year, but it's benefits can last much longer. Mammograms help detect breast cancer earlier than waiting for symptoms to appear. Breast cancer, when detected early through routine non-invasive screening, is curable. It's an incredibly important weapon in the fight against breast cancer. Early detection can result in an easier, less intense, and more effective treatments.

While there are certain modifiable risk factors for breast cancer – including use of contraceptives, hormonal therapy, lifestyle-related risks such as obesity, as well as some risk factors you cannot change, like your family medical history and age – some breast cancer patients have no risk factors

The Danville Transit System has received the 2021 Outstanding Community Program Award from the Virginia Transit Association for its Reserve A Ride operations during the pandemic.

These modifications improved flexibility and convenience for Danville Transit's customers and contributed to a 40% ridership increase for the Reserve A Ride service, which also helped to stabilize total passenger revenue levels.







It was the year that the Federal income tax law was ratified, the year that gave us the first box of Cracker Jacks containing a prize and the year that Woodrow Wilson was inaugurated as the 28th president of the U.S. Meanwhile, says the Association of Mature American Citizens [AMAC], in Japan that year a pair of identical twin sisters were born and on November 5, 2021 they will celebrate their 108th birthday. Umeno Sumiyama and Koume Kodama have already received a birthday gift from the folks at Guinness who track world records-- a certificate proving that they are, indeed, the world's oldest living identical twins.

### THE "SPITE HOUSE"

A quirky little -- really little -- house in Boston with a history that goes back to the Civil War was sold to the highest bidder for \$1.25 million recently, according to the Association of Mature American Citizens [AMAC]. How Does Social Security Work When a Spouse or Ex-Spouse Dies?

Dear Savvy Senior,


Who qualifies for Social Security survivor benefits? My ex-husband died last year, so I would like to find out if me or my 17-year-old daughter are eligible for anything?

Divorced Survivor

Dear Divorced,

If your ex-husband worked and paid Social Security taxes and you and/or your daughter meet the eligibility requirements, you may very well be eligible for survivor benefits, but you should act quickly because benefits are generally retroactive only up to six months. Here's what you should know. they're still attending high school, are eligible for survivor benefits too. Benefits can also be paid to children at any age if they were disabled before age 22 and remain disabled. Both biological and adoptive children are eligible, as well as kids born out of wedlock. Dependent stepchildren and grandchildren may also qualify. Children's benefits are 75 percent of the workers benefit.

Budget to Stay Busy, Not Bored This Winter

This winter is not going to be a repeat of last year, at least not at my house. COVID will no doubt keep raging around the world, limiting our options for activities, canceling plans that were made with fingers crossed. But here at home I'm going to be busy, not bored. I've decided to spend a little mental health money that in a normal world I would have used for meals out, a few new outfits and maybe a couple of weekends away at a very nice hotel in the next state. To make up for the disappointments, I've renewed my Amazon Prime, not only for the free shipping but for the movies and videos I can watch for free. There are hundreds of documentaries, including ones on travel, giving me great views of places I can't currently go. There are thousands of movies and television series I can watch with my Roku device. And then there are the books, sent instantly to my Kindle, with font sizes I can change in a moment. If I'm in the mood for British television and movies, Adobe.tv has a big selection (even Australian!), only costing a few dollars per month. Brit-Box is nearly as good as Adobe, at almost the same price. I'm looking at an inexpensive exercise bike, possibly a recumbent one. These allow all the movements of riding a bicycle, but there is a seat back to lean against and two handles to hold. (If there is no space for a bike, there are pedal machines that can be used while seated in a chair.) And then there are the arts and crafts to fill the long days. I searched online for crafts for adults and found thousands of kits, including several types I'd never tried before. Some of them, if they turn out well, might end up being holiday gifts I won't have to shop for!

Under Social Security law, when a person who has worked and paid Social Security taxes dies, certain members of that person's family may be eligible for survivor benefits including spouses, former spouses and dependents. Here's a breakdown of who qualifies.

Widow(er)'s and divorced widow(er)'s: Surviving spouses that were married at least nine months are eligible to collect a monthly survivor benefit as early as age 60 (50 if disabled). Divorced surviving spouses are also eligible at this same age, if you were married at least 10 years and did not remarry before age 60 (50 if disabled), unless the marriage ends.


How much you'll receive will depend on how much money (earnings that were subject to Social Security taxes) your spouse or ex-spouse made over their lifetime, and the age in which you apply for survivor benefits.

If you wait until your full retirement age (which is 66 for people born in 1945-1954 and will gradually increase to age 67 for people born in 1960 or later), you'll receive 100 of your deceased spouses or ex-spouses benefit amount. But if you apply between age 60 and your full retirement age, your benefit will be somewhere between 71.5 – 99 percent of their benefit.

There is, however, one exception. Surviving spouses and ex-spouses that are caring for a child (or children) of the deceased worker, and they are under age 16 or disabled, are eligible to receive 75 percent of the worker's benefit amount at any age.

Unmarried children: Surviving unmarried children under age 18, or up to age 19 if

Dependent parents: Benefits can also be paid to dependent parents who are age 62 and older. For parents to qualify as dependents, the deceased worker would have had to provide at least one-half of the parent's financial support.

But be aware that Social Security has limits on how much a family can receive in monthly survivors' benefits – usually 150 to 180 percent of the workers benefit.

### Switching Strategies

Social Security also provides surviving spouses and ex-spouses some nice strategies that can help boost your benefits. For example, if you've worked you could take a reduced survivor benefit at age 60 and switch to your own retirement benefit based on your earnings history – between 62 and 70 – if it offers a higher payment.

Or, if you're already receiving retirement benefits on your work record, you could switch to survivors benefits if it offers a higher payment. You cannot, however, receive both benefits.

You also need to know that if you collect a survivor benefit while working, and are under full retirement age, your benefits may be reduced depending on your earnings – see SSA.gov/pubs/EN-05-10069.pdf.

Bacteria Are to Blame for Stinky Shoes, Feet



DEAR DR. ROACH: My nephew has foot odor. Even after showering, his feet have a bad odor. His shoes smell bad and have to be replaced often. What is the remedy for this problem? -- B.C.

ANSWER: Foot odor is caused mostly by bacteria living on your feet. Bacteria thrive in warm and moist environments, so people who sweat a lot from their feet are at high risk. Some people are also colonized with particularly bad bacteria, such as Kytococcus (formerly Micrococcus), Corynebacterium or Dermatophilus. These bacteria do not cause disease, but they break down dead skin cells into unpleasantly smelly chemicals. A careful look at the

skin on his feet may reveal small pits in the skin, especially around the heel, after a long day in socks and shoes.

Treatment may include disinfecting skin solutions (such as chlorhexidine), antibiotics (topical erythromycin or clindamycin) and keeping the feet as dry as possible. This may require application of antiperspirants to the feet, either regular over-the-counter or prescription varieties. He also should wear lighter, more breathable footwear. Washing (and then drying) the feet several times daily and putting on new socks each time may also help during the treatment phase.

Although ultraviolet-light shoe sanitizers exist, I'd recommend getting new footwear while trying to get rid of as much of the bacteria as possible.

DEAR DR. ROACH: My husband is 75. I am 68. Our family doctor says that our blood pressure average is fine at 140/80 with no medicine. We thought it should be 120/70, but he says the limit is higher for seniors in order to decrease falls. This is pretty confusing. Do you think it's OK? -- S.M.

ANSWER: The best goal for blood pressure has been the subject of controversy. For the overall population, a level of 120/80, slightly less than the average blood pressure in the U.S. and Canada, is associated with a lower risk of heart disease, stroke and death than a blood pressure of 140/80. But the difference is pretty small. A blood pressure of 160/90 has a significantly higher risk, and at blood pressures above 160 systolic (that's the first or "top" number), the risk for stroke and heart disease rises steeply.

A recent trial (the SPRINT trial) showed that among older people with high blood pressure who had increased risk for heart attack, a systolic blood pressure goal of 120 was better at reducing risk than a blood pressure goal of 140. Both groups had a diastolic (the second or "bottom" number) goal of less than 90. However, the goal among people at lower risk is not as clear.

Most experts would not treat people with medication unless their average blood pressure is over 140 systolic or over 90 diastolic. In people treated with medication, some experts prefer a goal of less than 130/less than 90, while others would treat to less than 120/less than 90. It is true that more blood pressure medication and more intensive goals can lead to greater side effects, including falls. However, in the SPRINT trial, there was NO increase in fall risk and a slight 0.6 percent increase in the risk of fainting. Nondrug therapy, which includes modest salt restriction, regular exercise and stress reduction, can lower the blood pressure enough that people do not need medication.

### **BLUE RIBBON PUMPKIN BREAD**

1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> c. sugar <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> c. butter 2 eggs 1 c. pumpkin 1/3 c. water 1<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> c. flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp. baking powder 1 tsp. soda <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp. salt <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp. cinnamon <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp. cloves <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp. pumpkin pie spice <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> c. raisins (optional)



Cream sugar and butter. Add eggs. Add pumpkin and water; mix well. Add dry ingredients. Mix to moisten. Don't over-beat. Fold in raisins. Pour in greased loaf pan about 2/3 full. Bake at 350° for 1 hour for large loaf. Test with toothpick.
