






has named Dr. Sonia Sather, hospitalist with their loved one. Dr. Sather personally phone number and often contacted the

of the 2021 Hospital Hero awards. As such, Sather will be honored during IHA's virtual annual meeting in October.

"Dr. Sather has been a hero to many, helping patients manage complex medical conditions, while doing the extra things that exemplify her compassion," commented hospital president Bill Bumgarner. "She is an extraordinary and skilled physician who takes a personal interest in each of her patients."

Carole Feldhacker, one of the nurses on the hospitalist care team, noted in her letter of support for Dr. Sather's nomination that routinely, she observes the kind physician going the extra mile to meet patients' needs.

"Sometimes it's the little things," Feldhacker wrote. "We had a patient who wanted gum but due to having dentures, couldn't chew the kind we had available. She queried him to determine his preferences and went out and got it herself. She simply said she needed to get out in the fresh air for a few minutes anyway."

She continued, "Other times, it's the big things. A year or so ago, we had a hospice patient who needed inpatient



checked for hospice volunteers, music therapy, clergy and others who could sit with the patient in the family's absence. And, she personally spent as much time as she was able to with the patient. Dr. Sather even sang to her and played music from her phone for her!"

Jennifer Dau, Vice President of Patient Care at Spencer Hospital, also wrote a letter supporting Dr. Sather's nomination. She shared this story in her letter: "There are so many examples of her kindness. Here's one that comes to mind. We had a long-term skilled patient who had been in and out of our facility and a tertiary facility in Sioux Falls for months. Dr. Sather patient's spouse during off hours. When the patient's birthday rolled around, she make a raspberry cheesecake, purchased a gift, and coordinated the staff singing Happy Birthday."

The Iowa Hospital Association initiated the Hospital Heroes Award in 2007 and through 2019, more than 100 healthcare professionals have been recognized. In 2020, IHA honored all hospital workers in recognition of outstanding efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic and response to the derecho windstorm in August of 2020. This year, 11 people were selected from a pool of nominees to be recognized as Hospital Heroes.

me each week as I become a tourist in our backyard to explore a few of the spots that make the Iowa Great Lakes special!

This week I explored the Barney Peterson Memorial Trail at Gull Point State Park. This well maintained, 1.5 mile natural trail loops through a wooded area and along the canals.

I was eager to get outside and enjoy some changing fall col-



ors, and knew this trail would be just starting to pop with color. There is a lot of sumac throughout the trail that is starting to turn a bright red. The trail is also a good spot to enjoy some bird watching. I'm terrible at actually seeing the birds, but I could hear them! The other sound I could hear was "fall." It was so quiet and peaceful at times that I could literally hear the leaves falling.

I grabbed a guide at the kiosk when I entered so I would have the opportunity to learn about it more about the history of the trail and points of interest along the way. 





He was preceded in death by his parents, his friend and brother Vern Scott; sister, Mary Haugland; brother-in-law, Harlan Schumacher and many friends.







This is part of a 2,000 mile pipeline through Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska and the Dakotas. It would end in North Dakota and stored 1 mile underground.

When they made their presentation to the county board, they said any land that would be affected would be through voluntary easements from land owners, but in their talks with Iowa and South Dakota individuals, they can use eminent domain if it is deemed that it serves a public good. (The September 24 and October 1 issues of the Farm Forum go into depth on these issues also if interested.)

The capturing carbon is nothing more than a shell game or pyramid scheme, take your choice. They plan to make their money through this sequestration tax credit and other benefits these plants get from lowering their carbon footprint.

Everyone needs to contact their town boards, county commissioners, and state senators and representatives to insure that this project does not see the light of day.

Even if this one may not directly affect you, there is another one coming down the road. Navigator CO2 Ventures is planning a pipeline through these same states. It is time to stop these individual corporations from running over individual property rights just so they can make money from it.



### **Republican Economic Myths**

Recently as well as historically, we have seen commentary from both of our Iowa senators, our house representative and other Republican legislators or mouthpieces decrying Demo-

crats as the "tax and spend" party. The problem is the facts do not bear this out! More realistically Republicans should really be branded as the "untax and spend" party, particularly given the party's actions the past forty years. Deficit spending by administrations from Truman through Carter averaged \$82.6 billion with GDP averaging 3.36%. In 1980 this all changed with President Reagan embracing supply side economic theory which claimed big tax cuts would drive unprecedented growth and prosperity for all. GDP did grow at 3.9% and 16.5 million jobs were gained, but deficit spending ballooned to \$1.412 trillion, tripling the national debt. Much of this spending related to the military including refitting WWII ships and other older systems that had no on-going economic value unless we went to war! The next president, H.W. This coupled with a disastrous Iraq war and run-away housing initiatives led to a massive \$3.293 trillion deficit, a 2.4% GDP, huge unemployment and financial collapse/ recession for the next president. Obama's administration came into a no-win situation; continuing wars, a looming potential global depression and Republican-led Congress, after approving the TARP program, blocking any further actions he proposed. He had to agree to a tax cut to avert government shutdowns thus his deficits recorded \$6.781 trillion with GPD growth at 1.7%. However, after rescuing the auto industry, his administration saw annual deficit spending reduced from \$1.5 trillion to \$665 billion with 8.9 jobs created and a rebounding economy for President Trump. Predictably, Trump with a Republican-led Congress enacts the largest individual and corporate tax cut ever! These tax cuts were justified to assure capital investment, job creation and GDP growth. In reality, around 80% of corporate cuts went to stock buybacks, dividend increases and executive bonuses. Individual cuts widened wealth gaps. In only four years, tax cuts and spending coupled with total bungling of the COVID-19 crisis, led to \$6.612 trillion in deficit spending, no growth, mushrooming wealth gaps, spiked unemployment and again a recession for President Biden; guaranteeing his first term would have to show huge deficit spending to right the economy. Now after supporting a COVID-19 relief package, Republicans are right back at blocking any new legislation, refusing to raise the government debt ceiling and threatening government shutdown due to Democratic Party "tax and spend" policies. What hypocrisy!! Since 1980, Republican administrations have run up nearly \$12.5 trillion in spending deficits with no legislation toward a crumbling infrastructure, global warming, healthcare affordability, wealth gaps, immigration policy, gun violence, racial inequality or women's rights. Their focus has been only on power retention at any cost, tax cuts and judicial appointments; rendering Congress and specifically the Senate inoperative. In fact, during this same time period, only Democratic administrations have pulled us out of recessions, addressed spending deficits and proposed any meaningful legislative priorities. Legitimate government and economic bureau backed facts and numbers do not lie! Stop believing this on-going Republican Party mythical propaganda. It's bad economics and non-legislative purpose leading our democracy perilously toward authoritarian rule.

"You can't do much to control the cleanliness of public places, but you can take steps to protect yourself from the consequences of any exposure," advises Brooks. "At home or in the office, remember to pay special attention to 'high touch' surfaces. Doorknobs, faucets, countertops, appliance handles and knobs, the steering wheel of your car, your phone – these are examples of surfaces that you should get in the habit of wiping down at least daily with a disinfectant designed to kill viruses."

At the end of the day, says Brooks, personal accountability is the single, most important factor in controlling the spread of viral infections, including the seasonal flu. Stay home if you are sick and follow suggested guidelines. The CDC offers additional "stay healthy" tips here: *https://www.cdc.gov/flu/prevent/actions-prevent-flu.htm*.

### Hawks Flying High

Fresh off their thrilling, come from behind 23-20 victory over Penn State on Saturday night, Iowa has climbed all the way up to #2 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls that were released on Sunday and Monday. The Hawkeyes continued to play Iowa football on Saturday, winning the turnover battle 4-1, using All-American punter Tory Taylor to continually flip the field, have stellar defensive play holding the Nittany Lions to just three second half points, and hit a big play on offense just when it was needed the most when Spencer Petras found Nico Ragani for a 43-yard touchdown with 6:26 left to give Iowa the 23-20 lead that you knew their defense would hold.

This is turning into a dream season for Iowa, and with any dream season you have to be really good, you have to have vour players believe, and vou have to be a little lucky. Iowa is definitely really good, especially on the defensive side of the ball where they continue to turn teams over at an amazing rate with 16 interceptions in six games and have an average of +2.5turnovers per game, which is number one in the nation. Iowa also is giving up a stingy 3.9 yards per play, is ranked # 4 in scoring defense while allowing just 13 points per game, and is #8 in the country giving up only 274 yards per game. Iowa's special teams are also playing at an extremely high level and that continued on Saturday. Taylor pinned Penn State twice at their 2-yard line and once at their 4-yard line. Placekicker Caleb Shudak was also clutch on Saturday, kicking three field goals including a 48-yarder into the wind near the end of the third quarter that pulled Iowa within seven points. Iowa definitely believes in their style of play and the players have bought into it 100%. They are fine with playing possession football while waiting for their defense to come up with a big play or get great

field position due to a Taylor punt and they firmly believe that they will win the game playing this way, which is huge, especially in a game like Saturday where they got behind 17-3 and did not panic. Here's a crazy stat for you regarding Iowa's style of play and how they use punting as a weapon: Iowa is tied for 4th nationally in the number of punts, which is not normally a category you want to be in the Top 10 in. The record of non-Iowa teams in this Top 10 is 12-45 while Iowa is 6-0, which shows just how elite Taylor and the Iowa defense has been. I'm not writing this lucky part because I'm an Iowa State fan, I'm writing it because it is true, any team that has a truly special season has some luck go their way during that season. Iowa State had it last year when they played a Kansas State team that had a lot of guys out with Covid-19 and also an Oregon team that was not at full strength in the Fiesta Bowl. Iowa caught a big break on Saturday when Penn State quarterback Sean Clifford was knocked out of the game in the second quarter with the Nittany Lions leading 17-3. With Clifford in the game Penn State had 17 points on five drives and zero penalties, with backup quarterback Ta'Quan Roberson in the game, the Nittany Lions had 3 points on 11 drives and nine penalties. Give Iowa credit, they took advantage of this opportunity of facing an inexperienced QB while their offense also picked up their play and scored 13 points in the final half. The Iowa crowd also played a big part of those penalties, as the 69,000+ black and gold fans were at a frenzied level the entire game, especially in the second half and were responsible for many of those nine penalties.

Iowa now faces a portion of their schedule where they will be favored in each of their remaining six games, and they have put themselves in a fantastic position to win the B1G West, which will give them a great opportunity at making the College Football Playoffs. Hawkeye fans, enjoy this ride and soak in every minute of this special season. That game and atmosphere on Saturday was an all-timer and one that Iowa fans and that program will be talking about for a very long time. If this team can continue to make their 2021 gameplan work, there will be plenty more for Hawkeye fans to fly high about this year!
