MAPLE OATMEAL PIE

Ingredients

Dough for single-crust pie

4 large eggs, room temperature

1 cup sugar

3 tablespoons allpurpose flour

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon salt

1 cup quick-cooking oats

3/4 cup corn syrup

1/2 cup maple syrup 1/4 cup butter, melted

3 teaspoons vanilla extract

1 cup sweetened shredded coconut

Vanilla ice cream, optional

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Trim crust to 1/2 in. beyond rim of plate; flute edge.

2. In a large bowl, combine eggs, sugar, flour,

cinnamon and salt. Stir in oats, syrups, butter and vanilla; pour into crust. Sprinkle with

coconut.

3. Bake until set, 50-60 minutes. Cover edge with foil during the last 15 minutes to prevent overgrowing if necessary. Cool on a wire rack. If desired, serve with ice cream. Refrigerate leftovers.

CARAMEL PECAN PIE

Ingredients

36 caramels

1/4 cup water

1/4 cup butter, cubed

3 large eggs, room temperature

3/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/8 teaspoon salt

1-1/3 cups chopped pecans, toasted

1 frozen deep-dish pie crust (9 inches)

Pecan halves, optional

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a small heavy saucepan, combine the caramels, water and butter. Cook and stir over low heat until caramels are melted. Remove from the heat and set aside. 2. In a small bowl, beat the eggs, sugar, vanilla and salt until smooth. Gradually add caramel mixture. Stir in chopped pecans. Pour into crust. If desired, arrange pecan halves over filling.

3. Bake until set, 35-40 minutes. Cool on a wire

rack. Refrigerate leftovers.

CANDY APPLE PIE

Ingredients

6 cups sliced peeled tart apples 2 tablespoons lime juice

3/4 cup sugar

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon salt

Dough for double-crust pie

2 tablespoons butter

TOPPING:

2 tablespoons butter

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 tablespoon heavy whipping cream 1/4 cup chopped pecans

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 400°. In a large bowl, toss apples with lime juice. Combine sugar, flour, cinnamon and salt; add to apples and toss lightly. 2. On a lightly floured surface, roll one half of dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Add filling; dot with butter. Roll remaining dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle. Place over filling. Trim, seal and flute edge. Cut slits in top.

3. Bake until golden brown and apples are tender, 40-45 minutes.

4. For topping, melt butter in a small saucepan. Stir in brown sugar and cream; bring to a boil, stirring

constantly. Remove from the heat and stir in pecans.

5. Pour over top crust. Bake until bubbly, 3-4 minutes longer. Place on a wire rack. Serve warm.

SPICED EGGNOG PUMPKIN PIE

Ingredients

Dough for single-crust pie

1 can (15 ounces) solid-pack pumpkin

1-1/4 cups eggnog

3/4 cup sugar

2 large eggs

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg



1. Preheat oven to 425°. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Trim crust to 1/2 in. beyond rim of plate; flute

Place remaining ingredients in a large bowl; beat just until smooth. Pour into crust. Bake 15 minutes. 3. Reduce oven setting to 350°; bake until a knife inserted in the center comes out clean, 30-35 minutes longer. Cover edge loosely with foil during the last 15 minutes if needed to prevent overbrowning, Remove foil, Cool on a wire rack. Store in the refrigerator.

RAISIN PECAN PIE

Ingredients

Pastry for single-crust pie (9 inches)

1/2 cup boiling water

1/2 cup golden raisins

3 large eggs, room

temperature 1-1/2 cups sugar

1/2 cup butter, melted 2 teaspoons cider vinegar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1/2 teaspoon ground

cinnamon 1/2 teaspoon ground

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmea

1/2 cup chopped pecans

Directions

1. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to a 1/8-in.-thick circle; transfer to a 9-in. pie plate. Trim crust to 1/2 in. beyond rim of plate; flute edge. Refrigerate 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 350°. Pour boiling water over raisins in a small bowl; let stand 5 minutes. Drain. In a large bowl, beat eggs, sugar, melted butter, vinegar, vanilla and spices until blended. Stir in pecans and drained raisins. Pour into crust.

Bake on a lower oven rack until filling is set, 35-40 minutes. Cool on a wire rack. Refrigerate

leftovers

COCONUT MACAROON PIE

Ingredients

1 sheet refrigerated pie crust

2 large eggs

1 can (14 ounces) sweetened condensed milk

1/4 cup butter, melted

1 teaspoon almond extract

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/4 cup all-purpose

1 package (14 ounces) sweetened shredded coconut



Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°. Unroll crust into a 9-in. pie plate; flute edge. Refrigerate while preparing filling. 2. In a large bowl, beat eggs, milk, melted butter, extract and salt until blended. Stir in flour. Reserve 1/2 cup coconut; stir remaining coconut into egg mixture. Transfer to pie crust. Sprinkle with reserved coconut.

3. Bake on a lower oven rack until golden brown and filling is set, 35-45 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.

Refrigerate leftovers.

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

now is, when the true worshipers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship Him. **John 4:23**


