Carbon Monoxide Poisoning **Prevention**

Every year, hundreds of people die and thousands are injured from unsuspected exposure to an odorless, colorless gas-carbon monoxide (CO). Studies by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention indicate that, while people recognize CO gas is poisonous, they perceive CO as less dangerous than other household hazards. CO poisoning is most prevalent when furnaces are turned back on to fight cold winter temperatures, but also commonly occur after summer and winter storms and accompanying power outages, when people tend to rely on portable generators for electricity.

Here are some simple steps to protect yourselves and your family:

 Install battery-operated CO detectors near every sleeping area in your home.

Check CO detectors regularly to be sure they are functioning properly.

Have gas or oil furnaces inspected by a gualified professional every year.

Never use a generator inside the home or garage, even if doors and windows are open. Only use generators and power washers outside, more than 20 feet away from the home, doors, and windows.

Never use a charcoal grill inside the home.



Dear "Speak Out,"

This week we will continue our study of our beautiful Livingston County during its 200th year bicentennial.

This week, as I mentioned last week, we will begin our study of all seventeen townships in our county. The Town of Avon is in the northern part of our county and the Village of Avon is in its northwest corner. The area around and including what would become Corn Village was inhabited for millennia by Paleo-Indians and later by the Seneca people, the westernmost tribe of the Iroquois Confederacy.

After the Iroquois title to the land was extinguished in 1788 with the Phelps and Gorham Purchase, settlement of the area began. In 1789, Dr. Timothy Hosmer, Major Isaiah Thompson, William Wadsworth, and others from Hartford, Connecticut, purchased a tract east of the Genesee River and named it "Hartford" after their homeland.

The town was organized in 1797 and its name was changed to "Avon" in 1808 to avoid confusion with another Hartford in Washington County, New York. In 1818, part of the town was removed to form the new Town of Rush. County lines shifted as well, Avon and Rush were part of Ontario County until the formation of Livingston County and Monroe County in 1821.

The first permanent white settlers of Corn Village were Gilbert and Maria Wemple Berry in 1789, who operated a tavern and a rope ferry on the east bank of the Genesee River. When Gilbert died in 1797, Maria Berry continued serving travelers in the inn until about 1812.

The town's first gristmill was built by Captain John Ganson in northwest Avon in 1789 and the first sawmill in 1797 on the Conesus Outlet was built by Dr. Hosmer. Mineral springs were an important resource of the early town.

Beginning in the 1820s, people became interested in water as a therapy for all sorts of maladies, and mineral waters in particular for their reputed health benefits and even as cures. Avon, redolent in natural springs, soon became extremely popular with the afflicted. The wealthy, too, seeking relaxation and leisure, flocked to the town from far and wide. Numerous hotels and spas sprang up to take advantage of this fad, and bottling companies packaged the mineral water for sale.

By the late 1890s to early 1900s, most of the hotels that had not closed due to the decline of the spa era had succumbed to fire or were soon razed. The Avon Inn is the only spa structure still standing in the town.

The Town of Caledonia is located in the northwestern part of our county and contains the Village of Caledonia. The Seneca Indians had a village in this area called "Canawaugus" (or Conawagus) which was located on the west side of the Genesee River. The site has since been absorbed by the town of Caledonia.

Chief Complanter was born here around 1750 into the Wolf clan of his Seneca mother. His father was a Dutch fur trader, John Abeel, whose family had been established in Albany. Complanter was known as a statesman as well as a war chief, and he was influential in inviting Quakers to teach Seneca children on his land.

The Town of Caledonia was established in 1803 as the "Town of Southampton", having previously been known as "Northampton". Settlers from Scotland renamed the town "Caledonia", the Latin name for Scotland, in 1806.

Lord willing, we will continue our study next week. I would very much enjoy any input from all the historians in our county. Ron Powell Nunda

Dear "Speak Out,"

In response to Mr. Powell's letter last week in the Speak Out section about Livingston County's Bicentennial, I would like to share what has been happening this year to commemorate, celebrate, and educate county residents.

The County Historian's Office kicked off the year with a special meeting of the Board of Supervisor's on Tuesday, February, 23rd. Given the situation with COVID-19 at the time and concern for public safety, capacity in the county board room was limited but was streamed live on Zoom so the public could participate. There was a full program that included speeches, a video montage, music and more.

Since February, the Historian's Office has sponsored several interactive programs that combine history, entertainment, and opportunities for residents and non-residents to participate. Examples include the first county-wide Geocaching Trail with more than 30 sites spread across all the towns in the county, three new Heritage Trail Tours added to the five existing tours, and a Cheers to 200 years craft brew trail with monthly offerings from the breweries, wineries, cideries, and coffee maker in the county!

The Historian's Office has also dedicated three new historical markers placed at the Courthouse, the site of the County Poorhouse in Geneseo, and on Murray Hill in Mount Morris. In conjunction with the county poorhouse marker, there was a ceremonial event to honor more than 300 people who were buried in numbered or unmarked graves, whose names were read out loud at the county poorhouse cemeteries.

One of the largest events was the Classic Car Cruise in August with 60 cars that wound through every town in the county and culminated with 99 classic cars on display at Millennium Drive in Geneseo. Other events included Livingston County Day at Genesee Country Museum with a tour of the 17 buildings from our county, and an "Art and History Affair" show at the Genesee Valley Council on the Arts on Murray Hill with over 30 paintings from 10 historical societies in the county. In addition, we partnered with the Genesee Valley Conservancy to distribute and plant oak trees across the county.

Meanwhile behind the scene at the County Historian's Office, Deputy Historian Holly Watson and I have been working on a soon-to-be released book entitled, Livingston County Women's Biographical Review: Achievers, Leaders, and Role Models. This book will feature 200 women associated with Livingston County from all eras and walks of life. We are hoping (fingers crossed!) to have a release before the holidays. To wrap the year up we plan to place a time capsule at the Government Center and publish a post-bicentennial souvenir booklet.

Despite the challenges that the corona virus pandemic and economic conditions have presented, Livingston County, along with numerous organizations and dozens of citizens, have stepped up to the task at hand and taken the opportunity to share our rich cultural heritage as widely as possible. 





Protect Yourself from Diseases While Hunting

If you hunt, you should be aware that it can put you at risk for two common diseases that can be prevented. These two diseases are Lyme disease and rabies. The Livingston County Department of Health offers information about each disease and tips for you below.

Lyme disease is transmitted to humans by the bite of an infected tick. Typical symptoms include fever, headache, fatigue, and a circular skin rash with a target-like appearance. Tips to stay safe from Lyme disease while hunting include:

- · Wear insect repellant or use odorless permethrin on clothing
- Tuck your pants into socks, and shirt into pants
- Check for ticks daily
- Shower soon after being outdoors

Rabies is transmitted through direct contact such as broken skin or mucous membranes in the eyes, nose, or mouth of an infected animal. Symptoms can include general weakness or discomfort, fever, or headache. Tips to stay safe from rabies while hunting include:

- Staying clear of animals that have trouble walking, is drooling, or has an appearance of "drunkenness," aggression or even tameness
- Wear gloves when dressing or butchering game
- Wash hands thoroughly afterward
