# How Elkhart got its name

The Potowotomi Indians called it Great Lake since the lake's general shape resembled an elk heart. Since there were no drones at that time to get an aerial view I imagine they trudged all around the lake and perhaps jotted its shape on a piece of birch bark or deer hide.

They also believed the lake had curative powers and if they bathed in it they would become rejuvenated and handsome. I wonder if the Indian maidens also thought it might make them more beautiful-well, at least a little bit prettier.

This whole belief in the restorative powers persisted long after the Indians left the area since Otto Osthoff (over 133 years ago) brought his ill wife to Elkhart to cure her illness. Oh, yeah, while he was here he felt others would feel the same way so he built a hotel for 120 guests and called it the Munsterland Hotel. Muster land was a region in Germany where he was probably born. I don't know when he changed the name to Osthoff. Probably when other new hotels were named after the owners he thought "why not" use my name. (Good choice Otto).

Getting back to the Indians, there are a number of legends about the lake's name but I like this one the best-it has romance and intrigue:

A handsome Indian warrior (he obviously bathed in the lake) wanted to prove his bravery so he killed an elk and ate its heart and became know as Elk Heart. Well, needless to say, this act of bravery attracted the maidens (I assume they had also bathed in the magic waters) and he started wooing one of them by the name of Silver Birch. Back hiding behind a teepee was another maiden

who was also attracted to the handsome warrior. Her name was Singing Bird. One night while Elk Heart and Silver Birch were paddling on the lake with a full moon shining down on them Singing Bird in a jealous rage pulled out her bow and arrow which pierced Elk Heart who fell in the lake along with Silver Birch. Singing Bird plunged into the lake to try and save Elk Heart (never mind about Silver Birch) but her attempt failed so all three were lost.

Now when the moon is full the spirit of Singing Bird passes over the lake crying for Elk Heart. She's probably sorry for killing him. Silver Birch (his first love) is eternally silent.

Historical (and true) note: Having no connection to Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin-probably they never even heard of Wisconsin much less Elkhart Lake—in 1851 Sir Edwin Landseer was commissioned by the British House of Peers to have a painting done of a Scottish elk (aptly call Monarch Of The Glen). It was to hang in their dining room. Years later (they probably wanted a change) it ended up in the collection of the Scottish family that owned Dewars Scotch and eventually it ended up in the Guiness Beer Family. In 1905 Louis Laun (Elkhart Lake resident) owned a lithograph of the painting (he probably bought it when he was on a trip to England). And I'll bet he said, "By golly-this would be a good symbol for us folks back in the village". Yes it would be good and the village made it the official symbol. Check the beautiful stained glass window at the village hall.

My real question is when was the "E" taken out of "Heart" so that Lake Elk-Heart is now Lake Elkhart?


#### Winter rules begin Nov. 15

until 6 a.m.; at that time your vehicle must be moved.

PARKING REGULATIONS

All Night Parking Regulated. 6.04(2) (a) No parking of any motor

vehicle shall be permitted on either side of any village street or in the parking lot north of Square Street between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m., and no parking in the lot on North East Street from 6 a.m. until 9 a.m. commencing the fifteenth (15th) day of November and ending on the first (1st) day of April of every year.

(b) Any vehicle parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be removed from the streets and stored, and such removal and storage shall be at the expense of the owner of said vehicle.

Vehicles violating this ordinance will be ticketed.

Snow Removal

Ordinance 10.03 Removing Snow from Sidewalks: residents must clean snow and ice from sidewalks within 14 hours of any snowfall in a 24-hour period.

Snow cannot be blown or plowed onto village streets. Residents must also shovel out any hydrants near their home. Snow Removal Warning

As in past years, you will not be notified that snow needs to be removed. If you have not shoveled in the prescribed time, the village will shovel your walk and bill the property owner. Also, the entire width of the sidewalk must be shoveled. A path is not sufficient and you will be in violation.

# Fresh Meals on Wheels needs volunteer drivers

Fresh Meals On Wheels (FMOW) is seeking volunteer drivers to help deliver the approximately 1,500 meals prepared each week for Sheboygan County's elderly, disabled and homebound residents.

Delivering meals can be a rewarding experience for individuals, couples, friends, co-workers and groups from churches and other organizations.

"We appreciate all of our volunteers. Grab a friend, coffee group or Bible study and pick a day in the rotation that works for you. It's also great when service groups or businesses pick up one or two routes a month and rotate various staff members as volunteers," said Jennifer Madson, FMOW volunteer coordinator. It provides an opportunity for fellowship and team bonding when two go out for delivery together. "It also makes navigating much easier," Madson added.

Kohler Power Systems, Sheboygan Service Club, Ebenezer Church and First Congregational UCC are just a few of the organizations that have long been committed to delivering meals on a regular basis.

Volunteer applications are available online at FreshMealsOnWheels.org. A thorough background check is completed for all volunteers once an application has been submitted. Drivers must be at least 18 years old, have a valid driver's license and auto insurance card, and agree to wear a mask during delivery.

"Best practice recommendations for emerging from the pandemic safely include minimizing variables. To that end, we will continue to have volunteers wear masks while delivering meals, limit contact between volunteers and clients as much as possible during delivery and use only sanitized FMOW vehicles for delivery, which means all routes will be pickedup at FMOW," said CEO Kelly Anderson.

Meals are delivered in two shifts—10 a.m. to noon and 12:15 to 2:15 p.m. All drivers use FMOW vehicles for delivery. The food is preloaded and ready to go when they check in with the volunteer coordinator.

FMOW is also seeing vaccinated volunteers to help in the kitchen with packaging, food prep and cookie dough scooping.

If anyone would benefit from freshly prepared meals to meet various dietary needs, please contact Fresh Meals On Wheels. There are no age or income requirements. Meal recipients have the option of selecting from three delivery models—bulk delivery (one hot meal with a number of frozen meals delivered once a week), daily hot meal delivery, or daily hot and cold meal delivery (dinner and supper). A full color hot meal Choice Menu makes meals selection easy and fun.

Jim Lanser said he thought it was Coast to Coast Hardware in Plymouth on Mill Street. But the correct answer came from Mike Crawley who said it was Fremont Street in Kiel in the 1890s.

## October mystery photo



The October Down Memory Lane photo generated a number of responses.

Tamara Harvey wrote to say the photo is from the farm of Ray Meerstein at the intersection of STH 57 and CTH C in Plymouth. The current owners are two of Ray's grandchildren, Jeff and Jay Kohlmann.

Paul and Kathy Sartori of Plymouth wrote, "The 'Verifine Dairy' barn sign is located just east of STH 57 on CTH Road C (old Hwy. 23) on the south side of CTH C. The barn is still there, owned by Jay Kohlmann and Family (Covenant Plumbing & Heating). The painting is hard to read, so this photo must be from at least 30 or 40 years ago. The Verifine Dairy, located in Sheboygan, was owned by the Grasse brothers from Sheboygan.

"Whenever you would ask the Grasse brothers 'How are you today?' their response would always be "Verifine, thank you." Great old photo from the past...nice to see it in clear, vibrant colors."

Marilyn Brott of Plymouth wrote, "The Verifine picture in the paper was the southeast corner of highways 57 and now Business 23.... I can remember my grandpa Henry O. Miller driving up the ramp for 57 traffic to use to get to 23. He was going the wrong way. I must have been about 5 so it was around 1951. It was when two-lane roads were just starting and they would confound those already driving on a onelane road. I enjoy the paper very much."

Katherine Suemnicht wrote, "The Verfine Barn is on the outskirts of Plymouth on CTH C. This was my aunt and uncle's farm, Ray and Leona Meerstein. Many days my family would visit and play. My aunt and uncle raised mink and had a small farm. Today my cousin Jay Kohlmann lives there with his family and has a hobby farm there. It's over 60 years old."

"This is at W4785 CTH C, just east of STH 57," Tammy Harvill wrote. "My brother always said you can't eat ice cream in the winter. A few days later we saw the barn that says eat ice cream for daily happiness, so I took a picture of it and sent it to him. This happened a few years ago, so we would like to get the framed copy so we can give to him."

John Struebing and Jim Lanser also knew the right location, while Heather Zimbal said, "I know exactly where that photo is located. Then when I got engaged, my now husband and I had our engagement pictures taken there. We even bought ice cream and have more pictures of that."

His career culminated as the vice commander of Air Forces Europe/Air Forces Africa with responsibilities that encompassed 104 countries.

He is a command pilot with over 4,440 flying hours in nine different aircraft. Gen. Zadalis is a combat veteran earning two Bronze Stars, an Air Medal, and the U.S. Army Combat Action Badge.

In retirement, General Zadalis supports the Air Force leadership development program as an adjunct professor, the Air Force Research Laboratory as a researcher/ operational expert, and supports Road America as a volunteer military ambassador.

# Van Horn to develop property in county

The Town of Sheboygan and Van Horn Development, LLC recently approved an agreement for the development of a 99acre property located northeast of the I-43 and STH 42 interchange in the town of Sheboygan.

The mixed-use development is expected to include office, retail, multi-family, townhomes and single-family pocket neighborhoods, as well as open spaces and recreational facilities. The Town of Sheboygan will invest approximately \$4.7M for land acquisition and \$7.2M for infrastructure. Van Horn will invest more than \$48 million for building improvements. The town will finance and pay for its portion of the development using the tax increment revenue generated by the development over the next 20 years. The town's newly-created Tax Incremental Financing (TIF) district allows for the project to pay for itself without affecting current tax rates.

The development and repayment of the town's investment is secured by a Van Horn guaranty as well as an irrevocable letter of credit.

Town Chairperson Daniel W. Hein emphasized that TIF financing and the security provided by the developer will protect the town from unnecessary risk and prevent an increase in the town's tax rate. Town taxes Hein said will not go up because of this development. Furthermore, the development agreement prohibits this property from being annexed, ensuring that the property and the development remain in the town.

Hein and town officials have been working on the development of this property since at least 2017 and established the Town of Sheboygan Tax Incremental District No. 1 in 2020. "We're excited to work with Van Horn Development to bring this project to life" Hein said. Chris Merklein, vice president of Van Horn Development, added, "We studied other mixed-use developments across the United States and took the ideas that would best fit the town of Sheboygan. There is nothing else like it in the area."


Final site design is under way and is expected to be complete by the end of the year. Construction will begin summer of 2022.
