



Shelter Grant for this Area

MONTGOMERY – Gov. Kay Ivey has announced the awarding of nearly \$2.8 million to help Alabamians who are homeless or at-risk of becoming homeless to obtain shelter and other related services.

The funds from the federal Emergency Solutions Grants program will enable 13 regional agencies to provide shelter, legal, and health services and other assistance to help individuals and families who face losing their homes or are already homeless.

Among those awards was \$300,000 to the city of Florence for disbursement in Colbert, Franklin, Lauderdale, Lawrence, Marion, and Winston counties. The city will contract with the Salvation Army of the Shoals and Safeplace Inc. to find housing for the homeless and assist people at risk of losing their homes.

The Memorial at St John's

TUSCUMBIA - The Annual Memorial Service at St. John's Episcopal Church in Tuscumbia takes place on Sunday, November 7, at 3pm.

The public is invited to attend this All Saint's Day service of Evening Prayer. The non-denominational service will be conducted from the 1928 Book of Common Prayer by the Rev. Danielle Thompson, Rector of Grace Episcopal Church, Sheffield. The original Packard Pump Organ will be played by organist Nancy Bolte and Christa Byrd will serve as music director. The historic church is located at 300 N. Dickson St. (corner of Dickson and Third Streets). St. John's Church

was founded in 1839. The present building, Alabama's earliest example of "Carpenter's Gothic" church architecture, was erected in 1852. During the Federal occupation of Tuscumbia in the 1860's, the church was used by the Union Army to stable horses. In 1874, the church was extensively damaged by the tornado that struck Tuscumbia and, as a result, the building was reinforced with iron rods and the later addition of buttresses.

The church contains early stained-glass windows which are undergoing careful restoration by stainedglass master craftsman, William Dodds. Chancel windows which memorialize a young man



high school athletes," said Cox. "As a former coach and community college athlete, I know how special athletics are to a college and its community. Athletics will add a tremendous opportunity for the college build even stronger bonds and relationships in our community.'

Northwest-Shoals Community College Patriots have been without athletic programs since they were suspended in March of 2011. Currently, the college is requesting to be placed on the December Alabama Community College System work session for approval to request bids on upgrades to the baseball and softball facilities. The college will initiate the bid process for those renovations once they are approved. Cox stated, "We plan to have state-of-the-art classrooms, the baseball and and softball facilities will be no different."

Portable Generator Safety Tips

When the power goes out due to storms, hurricanes, freezing temperatures, or other severe weather, it's always

unknown how long it will be before the power comes back on. If the electric service is interrupted at your home or you need power in a remote location, a portable



generator can provide temporary power when and where you need it. But as convenient as they are, generators are not without their safety hazards. The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) reports that more than 80 deaths occur each year as a result of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning from generators. And generators also pose potential electrocution and fire safety hazards.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, one 5.5kW generator can produce exhaust containing as much carbon monoxide as six idling vehicles.

Before starting your generator, consider the following safety tips:

- Your garage is not the ideal location for a generator. Portable generators should be placed outside and away from windows and doors so CO doesn't enter your
- Give your generator adequate "breathing" room leave at least three to four feet of space around the unit to ensure proper ventilation.
- As a safety precaution, always have working CO detectors and smoke alarms in your home.

Be aware of the electricity produced by a generator

- Keep generators on dry, level ground outdoors. If you must use a generator in damp or wet conditions, protect the unit with a canopy.
- Check out extension cords that might be used to connect an appliance to the generator. Be sure cords are grounded, and do not use cords if they are cracked, frayed or visibly damaged. Ensure extension cords are appropriately rated in watts or amps for the intended
- Never plug a generator into a wall outlet. Doing this creates an electrocution risk called backfeeding.
- Don't touch a generator with wet hands to avoid electric shock.

Watch for potential fire hazards

- Let generators cool before storing or refueling. If fuel spills on the unit's hot engine parts, it could ignite.
- Store generator fuel away from other fuels or combustible materials. Never store fuel in your home.
- Keep fuel in a proper storage container with clear labeling. Store fuel on a high shelf or in a locked cabinet where children and pets can't get it.

• Never smoke near a generator or the fuel.

Our debuted on Broadway recently! What a time we had! My only regret was that my husband was away on a work assignment. But Garrett's joy and excitement overflowed all over his face, his body and his ever-dancing feet! My heart couldn't stop grinning because of his happiness. So many black men's stories are about a dream deferred, but Garrett's dream just exploded before my eyes!

First, there was the Red Carpet Opening! Oh but, the afternoon before that, we met one of the many producers (which means they produce money when needed) who wanted Garrett to have a solid black suit for a photo. When we got to the shop on 45th, she already had them pull 4 or 5 suits for Garrett to try on. All the workers were buzzing around bringing shirts, belts, more suits and water. Everyone was offering opinions. It felt like "Pretty Woman." At one point, the producer bent over and got on her knees to pin Garrett's unhemmed pants. In the end, she, personally, In bought Garrett a suit, shirt, pocket square and cuff links! Then she called us an Uber and sent us to the theater with three suits that she had bought for another cast member to try on! Crazy!

The Red Carpet was lined with tall theater lights and reporters. I wore a knee-length black dress with a black chiffon circular overlay with shimmery champagne and wine flowers intertwined with muted olive and silver leaves. Ha! ABC's more than eight decades of selling liquor has been brought to you in large part by an unholy alliance of lobbyists, government bureaucrats, and religious groups—not to mention the landlords and special interests who collect millions from leasing land and providing other services to support the state's alcohol operation.

An op-ed by political columnist Steve Flowers in the Dothan Eagle, and several other newspapers around the state, captures many of the arguments special these interest groups have used to lucrative maintain the liquor monopoly. First, the claim that there's alcohol consumption would increase without ABC; that nearly 900 Alabama ABC employees involved in the retail and warehouse operations of ABC would be left work; without and most importantly, that privatization would cause Alabama to lose millions in revenue.

These arguments sound compelling at face value. However, not one of them is true.

Evidence from states have undergone privatization—Iowa, West Virginia, and most recently, Washington found that privatization either had no effect or led to a decline of liquor consumption. This aligns well with the data that show no distinguishable differences in alcohol consumption between states that control alcohol sales and those that don't. At the end of the day, whether or not someone purchases their liquor from a state-owned store or a private business is not likely to change their behavior. Rather, the drivers of alcohol consumption in the U.S. are highly regional, based on cultural differences rather than government monopolies—something noted in a letter to the editor by Dr. Scalettar, former chairman of the American Medical Association.

If anything, data indicate that the Alabama ABC board may be doing a worse job at controlling alcohol consumption than non-control states. According to the CDC, while prevalence of binge

drinking in Alabama is comparable to other states in the region, the severity of it is far worse. Intensity of binge drinking is among the highest in the Southeast. Additionally, Alabama ranks ninth in the nation and first in the Southeast in economic cost per drink. Excessive alcohol consumption in Alabama costs taxpayers nearly \$4 billion annually.

Proponents of ABC point to relatively lower per capita consumption of alcohol in Alabama as evidence that the ABC monopoly is doing its job. However, the reality is that Alabama is one of the most religious states in the country and has one of the largest shares of evangelical protestants in the nation, one of the groups least likely to binge drink. Religion and culture, not government control, shape the drinking habits Alabama residents. To truly understand the state of alcohol control in Alabama, one must look Alabama's residents that do binge drink. The evidence shows that these individuals engage in far riskier behavior and cause more damage than neighboring (non-control)

Furthermore, there is no reason why privatization should lead to less revenue. In the state of Washington (which in 2012 underwent privatization) the state government carefully crafted the tax structure of alcohol sales to ensure that tax collections were unaffected, actually raising more revenue, leading to increases in annual state and local tax collections more than \$250 million and \$220 million respectively. Alabama could simply maintain the same tax regime or adjust it. Therefore, revenue would only decrease if revenue consumption declines (something that would be considered a win by the standards set out by Mac Gipson in his op-ed to the *Montgomery Advertiser*).

Additionally, privatizing ABC could lead to significant cost savings, as taxpayers would no longer foot the bill for approximately \$100 million in operating costs, some of which is going to subsidizing unprofitable stores in low-income and rural communities, and

much of which ends up in the pockets of well-connected Alabama former bureaucrats and politicians who have managed to secure lucrative leases at the expense of taxpayers. Finally, bringing ABC back under the purview of the general fund would bring back accountability to Alabama taxpayers. State leaders would be able to evaluate ABC and allocate funding in the same way that they would any other agency.

With regard to ABC's 900 employees involved in its retail and warehousing operation, the details of the phase-out could be structured to ensure the transition is as smooth as possible. However, with Alabama's unemployment rate among the lowest in the nation, and with businesses actively struggling to fill job openings, we should cheer at the opportunity to see the state stop competing with private businesses for employees while spending nearly \$40,000 per employee funding state retirement benefits and health insurance.

Tradition is important. However, when it comes to ABC's more than eight-decade monopoly, it is time to end the gravy train for lobbyists, politicians, and former bureaucrats, and get the state out of the liquor business.



Medicare Minute

"Medicare Advantage Plans

A Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) is a type of Medicare health plan offered by a private insurance company that contracts with Medicare to provide you with all your Part A and Part B benefits. There are six things to consider when choosing a MA plan. We discussed three of those things last week; the premium, copays and coinsurance of the plan. This week we will talk about deductibles, provider networks and drug formularies.

A deductible is the amount you are required to pay for your health care services before your health insurance begins to pay. Most MA plans do not have a deductible on services as long as you receive the services from an in network provider. If you receive the services from an out of network provider you may have to meet a deductible before the plan pays or you may not have coverage at all depending on the type of plan you have.

The provider network of the plan is a list of doctors or health care facilities that have agreed to accept the plan. If you are considering a MA plan for the first time you will want to verify with your agent that any doctor or facility you may want to visit is in your plan's network. If you are already in a MA plan you will want to verify with your doctor that they will accept the plan in 2022.

A MA plan's drug formulary is a list of drugs that are covered by the plan. This will include the tiers and copays of the drugs and any deductible you may have to meet on the prescriptions you are taking. Don't overlook the formulary of the plan because MA plans do not cover every prescription drug that is manufactured.





BUYING AND SELLING USED CARS

A bank or other lending institution will keep the title to an automobile until it is paid off.

In Alabama the only way to have a valid security interest in a motor vehicle is by a notation on the title.

Don't buy a car without seeing a clear title. You might consider going to the place holding the title and paying them directly for the car with the balance going to the owner who gives you a bill of sale. If you don't know who has the title, don't buy the car.

If you sell a car you need to realize that what you say about the car can become part of the bargain. Representations about the car such as "it's never been wrecked" can come back to haunt you if it turns out the car has been wrecked. Even if you didn't know it had.

If you tell someone this is "a really good car" and it doesn't get them home, they can sue you and they might win. If you intend for there to be no further entanglements with the car, use the phrase "no warranty expressed or implied - as is where is".

Include the make, model, year, and VIN of the vehicle on the bill of sale. Both people need to sign the bill of sale. Plan on that so that you have either a way to make a copy or a photograph of the bill of sale which when it contains language regarding the warranty or lack thereof becomes a contract. Keep the copy or print the photo.

If you really want to seal the deal, you can add that the buyer has had an opportunity to inspect the car or have the car inspected and they are satisfied with its condition. Used cars have gone up in value and we're getting more and more calls about problems people are having with used cars that don't work as expected. Writing and signing goes a long way both morally and legally. If you buy a car without a warranty, consider having a mechanic inspect the car.







FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

First Presbyterian Church was organized
April 13, 1824, by Scots-Irish settlers. The
sanctuary, erected in 1827, is the oldest in continuous use in Alabama. Its Georgian Gothic style
remains essentially unchanged. The brick walls
are laid in Flemish Bond and massive hand-hewn
beams are joined with wooden pegs. A rare
feature is the original wrap-around slave gallery,
supported by two levels of columns. The walls
were reinforced with iron bars after the 1874
tornado and stained glass windows were added
in 1904. The church is listed in the Historic
American Buildings Survey and the National
Register of Historic Places.

assistance from, and state and local coordination with, its National Security Branch Counterterrorism Division, as well as any other federal agency with relevant jurisdictional authority and oversight."

That's a long list for school board concerns. Why couldn't we get a few of these entities involved in real war-zone, destructive riots in our cities last year? Why are these groups not investigating who is responsible for the carnage in Afghanistan or the wide-reaching malfeasance associated with the four-year Russia collusion hoax?

The drama of "As continued, letter the threats grow and news of extremist hate organizations showing up at school board meetings is being reported, this is a critical time for a proactive approach to deal with this difficult issue...

"School board meetings have been disrupted in California, Florida, Georgia, and other states because of local directives mask coverings protect students educators from COVID-19... threat also calls the school board member a "filthy implies traitor," of pension funds, and labels the school board as Marxist.

Attorney General Merrick Garland, sent a General follow-up memo without substantiating any of the letter's assertions. As the Attorney General, he never questioned the details and didn't direct a law clerk to check the details or make any follow-up phone calls.

Of course, the NSBA letter never referenced the parent who was forcibly taken to the ground in Loudoun county, Virginia and arrested last month when objecting to the school board's coverup of his daughter's rape in the girl's Stone Bridge High School restroom. This was the same male who was just arrested again for a similar crime at Broad Run High School in the same county on October 6.

Just after the second arrest, hundreds students simultaneously walked out of their classrooms at Broad Run High School, Riverside High School, and Stone Bridge High School on October 19. "Loudoun County protects rapists," a group of students chanted outside Broad Run.

I'd say that parent deserved an award for excessive patience, as 90% of parents would not have shown the same level of long-term restraint, and fathers would many have shown FAR less, far sooner.

If that is Garland's opinion of something parental outside

jurisdiction, he has no business being allowed around teens or younger, much less employed the USAG. Thank God he was never confirmed to the Supreme Court.

Numerous state school board chapters school board members quickly distanced themselves from the NASB, strongly objecting to the theatrics in the letter and calls for Patriot Act and other anti-terrorist aggression against angry parents.
The NSBA has since

apologized and distanced from much of letter's contents. itself the Nonetheless, some state associations have severed the relationship completely.

If these increasingly progressive progressive school boards around the US listening more were and weren't rendering decisions that fly in the face of public opinion, parental authority, and common sense at every turn, NONE of this would be happening.
