## Brainerd facility to serve as site to relieve hospital capacity

Sat., November 20, 2021

Governor Tim Walz announced on November 10 that a second skilled-nursing facility would act an alternative care site as part of the governor's efforts to relieve Minnesota hospitals treating a surge of COVID-19 patients.

An additional emergency staffing team of 14 Minnesota National Guard members and nine federal nurses will treat patients at Good Samaritan Society – Bethany in Brainerd. The site will help relieve hospital capacity in central and northern Minnesota by accepting up to 34 patients from area hospitals.

Patients eligible for transfer include those who no longer require acute emergency care but are not well enough to go home, such as those who are recovering from surgery. Hospitals usually are able to transfer these patients to long-term care settings to continue their recovery, but staffing and bed shortages have reduced long-term care capacity. Governor Walz announced an action plan last month to expand access to long-term care beds so hospitals can focus on treating COVID-19 patients and others requiring emergency care.

"We appreciate the opportunity to work with the state of Minnesota and our hospital partners to navigate capacity challenges in order to meet the needs of patients who are in need of care," said Nate Schema, vice president of operations at the Good Samaritan Society. "The available capacity at Good Samaritan Society - Bethany in Brainerd allows us to serve more people in need of post-acute care and services and will provide our hospital partners with additional flexibility as they continue to serve the community. I remain deeply grateful to our staff who continue to go above and beyond to take care of those who need them the most."

To ensure adequate hospital capacity for COVID-19 patients, Governor Walz took a series of steps in October to free up space at longterm care facilities, including expanding the Emergency Staffing Pool so that shortterm emergency temporary staff could be used to open up additional beds for patients ready to be discharged from a hospital; putting the National Guard on notice to provide staffing support at decompression facilities;

and directing the Department of Human Services to free up capacity at state-operated long-term care facilities.

Since Governor Walz announced the action plan, the Department of Human Services has increased admissions from community hospitals to state-operated facilities by 12.5%, a measure that has both created space for patients who need acute

hospital care, and allowed hospitals to refer patients who require complex behavior care to facilities that offer it.

Good Samaritan Society – Bethany is the second alternative care site to open in Minnesota. Last week, Benedictine St. Gertrude's in Shakopee made 30 beds available for patients after receiving support from the Minnesota National Guard and state-funded staff through the COVID-19 Emergency Staffing Pool.

The Administration received proposals from multiple nursing facilities around the state willing to receive patients from hospitals. The Minnesota Department of Health and DHS are working to determine facilities best suited to expand this program.

## Archer success at Camp Ripley hunt



Archery hunters who participated in the Camp Ripley hunt near Little Falls Oct. 29 through Oct. 31 had a strong harvest, according to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

"With the change in format to a single, three-day event Anthony Swenson of Waconia bagged this 11-point buck at the Camp Ripley Archery Hunt on Oct. 29. The annual hunt is administered by the Minnesota Department of Military Affairs and Central Lakes College Natural Resource Program in collaboration with the Department of Natural Resources.

we anticipated a lower harvest," said Dr. Bill Faber, head of the Central Lakes College Natural Resources Program. "But, with the robust deer herd at Camp Ripley, hunters still experienced about 14% success, well above the longterm average of nine percent for the hunt."

This year, 1,949 participating hunters harvested 273 deer, at least 10 of which were large bucks, Faber said. The largest was an 11-point buck taken during the morning of Oct. 29 by Anthony Swenson of Waconia. Last year, 1,864 hunters harvested 310 deer over two, two-day hunts.

"We have a strong partnership with Central Lakes College and Camp Ripley, and they did a fantastic job managing traffic and checking deer," said Beau Liddell, DNR wildlife manager at Little Falls Liddell. "The event is also a valuable experience for students pursuing careers in wildlife management."

## Energy Assistance Program has \$106 million more in federal funds



The Minnesota Department of Commerce has been awarded \$106 million in federal funds for Minnesota's Energy Assistance Program for the 2021-2022 season, which will help more Minnesotans than ever.

The Energy Assistance Program Dashboard published by the Commerce Department shows over \$28.5 million has already been paid to over 25,000 Minnesota households in just the past

30 days. The dashboard, which is updated weekly, shows county-by-county information for household average energy costs and energy assistance for Minnesotans who have already applied and qualified for benefits.

"As the weather turns colder, it's important for Minnesotans to take actions now to stay warm and safe," said Commerce Commissioner Grace Arnold. "Energy as-



energy bills more affordable. You shouldn't have to choose between paying your energy bill and buying groceries or prescription medications."

This year, the Commerce Department raised eligibility and benefits, paying up to \$3,200 to cover energy bills for income-eligible Minnesotans. The Minnesota Energy Assistance Program helps people who own or rent their homes to pay for current and past-due bills for electricity, gas, oil, biofuel and propane, emergency fuel delivery and repair/replacement of homeowners' broken heating systems, and could also cover water and sewer bills. With higher income eligibility, a family of four could have income of almost \$68,000 and still qualify. The program only considers the past three months of income for a household.

For households heated by propane or heating fuel, the homeowner or renter should apply for energy assistance before paying to fill your tank so energy assistance can help pay for the cost of the fuel. Otherwise, the energy assistance will be credited to your account by your utility and be applied to future energy costs.

Minnesotans pay as high

## More benefits to residents and challenges to human services

The global pandemic has impacted many families in many ways. But the changes to their service delivery and the increased benefits going out to county residents has kept Aitkin County Health and Human Services on their toes this past year or so.

Jessica Goble, financial services supervisor, talked to the Aitkin County Board earlier this fall.

"Every financial services program has had changes throughout the pandemic," Goble explained. This had led to county financial workers having to relearn their jobs and institute new programs at a dizzying rate.

Pandemic-related changes include:

Health Care: Maintained enrollment in Medical Assistance and MinnesotaCare recipients for the whole year. Got extra funds to pay for this. Enrollees could only be taken off programs if they died or moved.

Access to SNAP (food stamp) programs was simplified.

Emergency SNAP of an extra \$95 in benefits a month began, as did summer SNAP for students and \$325-a-month school year benefits for students who are on free and reduced lunches.

 Statistics are up for programs compared to a year earlier:

• 4,228 families were on health care programs in 2021, compared with 3,663 in 2020.

• Over \$61,000 was given out in family cash programs in January 2021, compared with \$35,540 in 2020.

• SNAP benefits soared to over \$231,000, in February 2021 compared to \$108,167 the year before.

Goble had this to say about her team navigating all the extra work and new programs:

"The Financial Workers have been doing an amazing job navigating all of the difficult new policies and processes put into place over the last 18 months. The Office Support and Case Aide Staff have kept us running smoothly through remote work support and adjusting their work right alongside the Financial Workers and the rest of the staff. I cannot say enough about how intelligent, resilient and strong this team has been while maintaining good humor!"

## **Expenses likely reimbursed**

County Sheriff's Office staff have been training for the Line 3 pipeline replacement project. This training was justified from familiarity of DAPL (Dakota Access Pipeline) and other protested pipelines. The training was 100 percent intended to reduce issues in Aitkin County through sound policing, knowledge of constitutional rights, and an awareness of the laws and processes. Like any large project, this project went through extensive governmental review and delays, and in December 2020, the project started in Aitkin County.

Over the next nine months Aitkin County Law Enforcement (LE) used the training and skills learned on a daily basis. When we needed assistance outside agencies came to help, to include the MN State Patrol, MN DNR, and many other great LE agencies from MN. We supported the rights of demonstrators who, while following the laws of MN, were here to voice their opinions to all who would listen. Our teams disconnected and detained people from sophis-

For several years, Aitkin ticated devices used to attract national media coverage. We investigated crimes and arrested protestors who intentionally violated laws in an effort to get the court system to listen in hopes the project would be stopped. We also arrested criminals that were here to cause civil unrest, with no respect to public laws or authority, and we responded to the needs of the residents facing issues related to this project.

In those nine months, LE met with leadership from the constructions crews and leadership from the opposition to the project. We shared space with both sides, and spent our time in the middle of the situation, keeping the peace. We have seen things no one could have predicted for northern MN. We have listened to chants disrespectful to our officers and ignored them, choosing to take the high road, and we treated everyone with respect and dignity.

The dedicated staff and resources of this department were challenged, and they rose to the occasion. For all the employees this has been a very exhausting effort and the staff of the Ait-

kin County Sheriff's Office is pleased the process is over. We have resumed normal staffing levels, normal patrols, and normal day-to-day operations.

At the beginning of this process, the MN Public Utilities Commission required Enbridge to establish an escrow account to reimburse local agencies for their response to Line 3. This account was established to help northern agencies prepare for the large-scale event. The MN PUC account ensured local taxpayers would not carry the cost of the response.

The project is complete and we have gone back and reviewed the expenses. Our LE road staff and those responding to scenes spent approximately 4,373 hours on public safety response for Line 3. The Aitkin County Sheriff's Office staff also spent 450 staff hours in specific training for the pipeline construction. These expenses will be submitted to the PUC escrow account manager for reimbursement within 180 days of the project completion.




