Senior Alert: Your Old Cellphone May Not Work in 2022

Dear Savvy Senior,

My 80-year-old father has an old flip phone he carries around with him for emergency purposes, but I've heard that these devices will soon be phased out. Is this true? If so, how can we know if his phone will be affected, and where can I find him a simple new one that he can operate. Searching Daughter

Dear Searching,

Yes, it's true! If your dad's mobile phone is more than a few years old, he will probably need to upgrade it in the very near future. Why?

Because all of the major cell phone carriers - AT&T, Verizon and T-Mobile - are shutting down their older 3G networks in 2022 to free up airwaves for 5G and other advanced services. So, if your dad is using an old 3G phone, like millions of other older Americans, he'll need to get a new device if he wants to make calls, text or reach 911.

But you should also know that it's not just older cellphones that will be obsolete. Older home security systems, medical devices and personal emergency response systems that still harness 3G will also be affected. Adding to the confusion, older 4G phones that don't support modern cellular voice technologies, such as Voice Over LTE or HD Voice, are impacted, too. Those

customers may need a software upgrade or a new phone. Here are the timelines for the 3G shutdowns: AT&T
Feb. 2022; T-Mobile - July 1, 2022; Verizon - Dec. 31, 2022; Sprint (which is owned by T-Mobile) - March 31, 2022; and Sprint LTE - June 30, 2022. Other smaller carriers like Tracfone, Cricket, Boost and Straight Talk, will also be affected, because they rely on airwaves from the big three

Is Your Phone Affected?

Cellphone carriers say they have been alerting customers who use older phones that services are ending, sending a combination of texts, letters, phone calls and emails. If you're not sure about your dad's phone, contact his carrier or check their website for a list of affected devices.

Another way to see if your dad's phone is 3G is to look up his international mobile equipment identity number which can be found by pressing *#06# on his keypad. Once you have it, go to *www.imei.info* and type it in the search bar to get the phone's details. If his phone has a frequency of 900 megahertz (MHz) or 2100 MHz, it's 3G. You can also look for a "3G" icon at the top corner of his phone, but not all 3G phones have that icon.

How to Upgrade

If you find that you do need to upgrade your dad's cellphone, carriers are offering discounts and special promotions on replacement devices. If you're worried about your dad having to learn your way around a new device, you'll be happy to know that there are plenty of modern new flip phones available that work on the nextgeneration networks.

Or, if your dad decides that he would rather forge ahead without a phone than upgrade, then he will need to cancel the service. Most carriers will let you cancel your plan without any penalty. However, if he forgets to cancel his phone plan and doesn't upgrade to a working device, the company won't automatically stop charging him just because he isn't able to access their network. How to Recycle

If your dad does have to replace his old cellphone, the best way to dispose of it is to recycle it. Large retailers, such as Best Buy, offer recycling programs for old electronics. Or you can search for local recycling programs on websites like Call2Recycle.org and . Earth911.com.



Collision Insurance

I had a lady with a bad knee injury talk to me about resolving her on the job injury case and leaving her medical bills open for life. I told her that it would certainly be an option for her to have the right to future medical care or receive a one-time lump sum payment in exchange if the case was settled and she wanted to close her medicals.

If the case was tried by the court, the judge would leave her right to future medical care open for treatment relating to the original on the job injury. That sounds like the better option and sometimes it is, but it's always good to know your options

it's always good to know your options and understand that future medical care is not as clear cut as it sounds.

On September 17, 2021, the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals decided a case that concerned the issue of whether or not an employer continued to be responsible for medical treatment for an on the job injury if there was a new incident that caused pain.

The facts of the case are that a Mr. Billups was injured on October 18, 2016, had back pain and surgery and eventually settled his case leaving his medical benefits open. On February 12, 2019, Mr. Billups was lifting a lift gate on his delivery truck when he felt a pop and a lot of pain. His employer claimed that this was merely a recurrence of the original injury and not a new injury. His current employer tried to put the blame and the bills on the old employer.

After the court heard the testimony of two surgeons and Mr. Billups (who had never been able to return to full duty following the 2019 injury), the court determined that this was a new injury and that his employer was responsible for the injury.

It's always important to remember that in worker's compensation cases no pre-existing condition exists if the employee is able to perform the duties of their job prior to the injury. That is one of the most important aspects of the Alabama Worker's Compensation Act.

Although it sounds really great that a person would have lifetime medical treatment for an on the job injury and sometimes it is, often the incident that causes new treatment after the case is settled is actually a new injury that terminates the employer's obligation for future medical treatment. You have to know and understand something about the future treatment you expect before you can make an informed decision about closing your right to that future medical treatment. Sometimes money now is better than a disputed right later.



The ancient Greeks excelled in philosophy, mathematics, technology, and theories of government



The Romans were great conquerors and great As they assimilators. conquered Greece, they took the mathematics technology and that the Greeks had created (Greek Arch) and altered it to their advantage (Roman Arch). Wealthy Roman families enslaved Greek philosophers, teachers, and scholars, mathematicians and used them to tutor their families. Since Rome was already a Republic ruled by a Senate, the Greek idea of a Republic was not new to them. The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act harassed by a third-party (FDCPA) is found at 15 USC § 1692. It is a debt collector under very powerful federal consumer statute packed into just six pages. The FDCPA was enacted by Congress on September 20, 1977 and became effective six months later. In formulating the Act, Congress articulated the purposes for the enactment of legislation as follows: "There is abundant evidence of the use of abusive, deceptive, and unfair debt collection practices by many debt collectors. Abusive debt collection practices contribute to the number of personal bankruptcies, to marital instability, to the loss of jobs, and to the invasions of individual privacy." 15 USC § 1692(a).

For there to be a violation of this Act, there must be a consumer debt, a debt collector, and a violation of the Act. It is important to note that this Act covers consumer debts only and does not cover commercial or business debts. The debt has to be for personal, family, or household purposes such as medical bills, utility bills, insurance bills, personal loans or credit cards or the like. The following areas DO NOT fall under the FDCPA: child support, income tax, or tort claims such as car accidents. The debt collector involved must be a third-party debt collector. Note that the original creditor itself is excluded from the definition of a debt collector and only applies to a thirdparty debt collector.

Whether the communication or other conduct by a debt collector violates the FDCPA is determined by the courts by analyzing it from the prospective of the least sophisticated consumer, and that is to ensure that the FDCPA protects all consumers, the gullible as well as the shrewd. There are four keys in deciding whether there is a violation of the FDCPA: Was the communication untruthful, unfair, undignified, or disrespectful? Interestingly, whether the debt is actually owed or not is immaterial.

If you believe you are being unfairly

Additionally, please use search engines such as Google or Bing to see who is contacting you and, if at all possible, get the full name of the debt collector as well as the full mailing address, city, state and zip code. Additionally, it is very important to keep detailed notes if you start getting harassed in an untruthful, unfair, undignified or disrespectful manner by a debt collector. Please write up detailed notes every time you are contacted in this disrespectful manner and make sure you write down the time of the call, the date, the number the call came from, how the person identified himself or herself, and exactly what was said by them and by you. It is also very important to make sure you keep all letters and/or correspondence received from the debt collector.



Rittenhouse in Kenosha that night claiming that they were there protecting property / businesses. Neither the police nor the owners seemed to take issue with it, because not much else was being done.

Sure, we can always say Rittenhouse had no business being in Kenosha that night with his "assault-style" weapon. We can also realize that

We can also realize that those who were paid to keep order in that town were failing miserably and had disengaged from the situation. Had Rittenhouse come to

Had Rittenhouse come to town planning to use that weapon aggressively, he had plenty of opportunity before he finally did.

We should also realize that looting, pillaging, and burning of businesses is not acceptable behavior, period. Since there appeared to be no efforts all year by law enforcement to protect the public through arrest and prosecution, it looks like the only way of dissuading rioters. Someone had to at least look like they were doing something. The Rittenbouse case

The Rittenbouse case went to the jury November 16 to consider his fate on five felony counts, including first-degree intentional homicide.



We can thank our lucky stars that in spite of all the despicable tampering, intimidation, stalking, and threats employed by the prosecution, activists, media hacks (and alleged freelancers), this jury still had the courage to do the right thing, and acquit Rittenhouse on all charges. This verdict may have been the only thing keeping this nation out of total chaos. If one can't legally defend himself/ herself when facing eminent danger, injury, or death, there is no recourse for law-abiding citizens.

It's unfortunate that the police shot and killed Jacob Blake on August 23, 2020, regardless of whether or not they had to.

It's unfortunate that the protests over the shooting turned into a multi-day riot. That neither brought Blake back to life nor did it determine whether or not the police action was justified.

Granted, Rittenhouse was a 17-year-old who made a hasty decision to show up to a riot. Regardless, he had the right to act in self-defense when others made an equally-hasty decision to aggressively assault him. There are only a few

There are only a few points of benefit from this case.

The jury concluded there was not enough evidence to convict Rittenhouse of

murder. That still leaves open the possibility that self-defense is a legitimate reason to use deadly force in the United States - at least for the time being.

Hopefully, this case will also save other lives, causing protestors to think twice before initiating an attack on armed adversaries.

get We further affirmation, however that unfortunate, the rabidly partisan national media can tout the stories they want, in the manner they want, with the details they want, and then double down on any resulting inaccuracies in an attempt to save face and alter public perception of reality.

That is worth remembering.





specified period of time, usually 7 to 10 years. Although enslavement ended in Catholic Europe, it continued to be practiced everywhere else in the world.

The Renaissance Period in Europe was a time when knowledge and learning became a cherished pursuit. Books and scrolls hidden away for centuries became treasured, but to learn from the books and scrolls, a scholar had to be fluent in Latin and Hellenic Greek. The Classic Education became a necessity for European scholars. The assimilated knowledge of Ancient Greece and Rome was now available for study. Europeans presented new ideas in mathematics, science, technology, industry, astronomy, and government in Latin because Latin was the intra-European language. The entire mental acumen of Europe could be shared, studied, debated, accepted, or refuted.

The white men of European descent that wrote the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution were classically educated. They read, wrote, and spoke Latin. They read and wrote Hellenic Greek. They had studied Plato's Republic, Homer, John Locke, Cicero, Marcus Aralias, Martin Luther, Aristotle, etc. The ideas that they put into those two documents were philosophic, not racist nor White supremacist. The words that they put into the two documents had very specific meanings for over two thousand years, and they had no reason to believe that those words would not have the same meaning for two thousand "We hold more vears. these truths to be selfevident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness."

signers The of the Declaration of Independence knew the difference between "unalienable" and "inalienable". Do vou? Their ownership of Sub-Saharan (Black) Africans was not racist. Slavery

was still a part of the Sub-Saharan culture. It was Sub-Saharan Africans that captured, chained, and sold other Sub-Saharan Africans (watch Dr. Henry

Louis Gates, Jr's: Africa's Greatest Civilizations). The U.S. Constitution's threefifths clause applied to ALL persons that did NOT have self-determination. It starts with "the indentured" – white Europeans – then adds the "Negro slave" (Negro is the Latin word for black), and the "Chinese manservant". Note: In his youth, Benjamin Franklin was indentured. Critical Race Theory

is not based in fact; it is an agenda based in bias, prejudice, and perhaps, an uninformed, misinformed, or revisionist version of history.






