## Ingredients

- 3-1/2 cups white baking chips, divided
- $1 / 2$ cup butter, softened
- 3 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 2 tablespoons dark rum
- $1 / 4$ teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 tablespoons shortening
- Ground nutmeg, optional


## Directions

1. In a microwave, melt 1-1/2 cups baking chips; stir until smooth. In a small bowl, cream butter and cream cheese until smooth. Add rum and vanilla. Beat in melted chips. Refrigerate, covered, 1 hour or until set.
2. Shape mixture into $1-\mathrm{in}$. balls; place on a waxed paperlined baking sheet. Refrigerate 2 hours or until firm and slightly dry to the touch.
3. In a microwave, melt shortening and remaining baking chips; stir until smooth. Dip balls in mixture; allow excess to drip off. Return to baking sheet; if desired, sprinkle with nutmeg.
4. Refrigerate 2 hours or until set. Store between layers of waxed paper in an airtight container in the refrigerator.

## TEXAS PECAN PRALINES

## Ingredients

- 3 teaspoons butter

 CHIRISTMMAS- $1 / 2$ cup butter, cubed
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 cup half-and-half cream
- $1 / 2$ cup sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tablespoon light corn syrup

- Dash salt
- 3 cups pecan halves
- $1 / 2$ teaspoon vanilla extract


## Directions

1. Line 3 baking sheets with foil and grease the foil with 1 teaspoon butter each; set aside.
2. In a large heavy saucepan over medium heat, melt cubed butter. Stir in sugars, cream, milk, corn syrup and salt; cook and stir until mixture comes to a boil. Cook, stirring occasionally, until a candy thermometer reads $236^{\circ}$ (soft-ball stage), about 20 minutes.
3. Remove from heat; stir in pecans and vanilla. Cool, without stirring, to $170^{\circ}$, about 20 minutes. Stir with a wooden spoon until mixture just begins to thicken but is still glossy, about 2 minutes.
4. Quickly drop by rounded tablespoonfuls onto prepared baking sheets. Let stand until pralines are set and no longer glossy. Refrigerate until completely set, about 1 hour. Store in an airtight container in the refrigerator.

## PEANUT BUTTER SNOWBALLS

## Ingredients

- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- $1 / 2$ cup creamy peanut butter
- 3 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 pound white candy coating, coarsely chopped
- Chopped peanuts, optional


## Directions



1. In a bowl, combine the sugar, peanut butter and butter. Chill in freezer for 30 minutes or until the mixture is easy to handle. Shape into $1-\mathrm{in}$. balls and place on a waxed paperlined baking sheet. Freeze for 30 minutes or until firm.
2. Meanwhile, melt the candy coating in a microwave-safe bowl. Dip each ball and place on waxed paper to harden. If desired, sprinkle with chopped peanuts.

## CREAMY ORANGE CARAMELS

## Ingredients

- 1 teaspoon plus 1 cup butter, divided
- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1 can (14 ounces) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 teaspoon orange extract
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract


## Directions

1. Line an $11 \times 7$-in. dish with foil, letting ends extend over sides by 1 in .; grease foil with 1 teaspoon butter.
2. In a large heavy saucepan, combine the sugar, corn syrup and remaining butter. Bring to a boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Reduce heat to medium-low; boil gently, without stirring, for 4 minutes.
3. Remove from the heat; gradually stir in milk. Cook and stir until a candy thermometer reads $244^{\circ}$ (firm-ball stage). Remove from the heat; stir in extracts. Immediately pour into prepared dish (do not scrape saucepan). Let stand until firm.
4. Using foil, lift out candy; remove foil. Using a buttered knife, cut caramel into scant 1-1/2x1-in. pieces. Wrap individually in waxed paper; twist ends.

## CHOCOLATE CARAMELS

## Ingredients

- 1 teaspoon butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 3/4 cup light corn syrup
- 2 ounces unsweetened chocolate, chopped
- 1-1/2 cups heavy whipping cream,
 divided


## Directions

1. Line a $9 \times 5-\mathrm{in}$. loaf pan with foil and grease the foil with butter; set aside.
2. In a large heavy saucepan, bring the sugar, corn syrup and chocolate to a boil over medium heat; stir until smooth. Add 1/2 cup cream; cook, stirring constantly, until a candy thermometer reads $234^{\circ}$ (soft-ball stage). Add another $1 / 2$ cup cream; return mixture to $234^{\circ}$ (soft-ball stage). Add the remaining cream; cook to $245^{\circ}$ (firm-ball stage).
3. Immediately pour into prepared pan (do not scrape saucepan). Let stand until firm, about 5 hours or overnight. Using foil, lift candy out of pan. Discard foil; cut candy into 1 -in. squares using a buttered knife. Wrap individually in waxed paper; twist ends.

## BUTTER PECAN FUDGE

## Ingredients

- 1 teaspoon plus $1 / 2$ cup butter, cubed
- $1 / 2$ cup sugar
- $1 / 2$ cup packed brown sugar
- $1 / 2$ cup heavy whipping cream
- $1 / 8$ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
- 1 cup coarsely chopped pecans, toasted


## Directions

1. Line an 8 -in. square pan with foil; grease foil with 1 teaspoon butter.
2. In a large heavy saucepan, combine remaining butter, granulated and brown sugars, cream and salt. Bring to a rapid boil over medium heat, stirring constantly. Cook, without stirring, until a candy thermometer reads $234^{\circ}$ (soft-ball stage). Remove from heat. Add vanilla to pan (do not stir).
3. Cool, without stirring, to $110^{\circ}$, about 30 minutes. Beat with a spoon until fudge just begins to thicken. Gradually stir in confectioners' sugar until smooth; add nuts and continue stirring until fudge becomes very thick and just begins to lose its sheen. Immediately spread into prepared pan. Cool.
4. Using foil, lift fudge out of pan. Remove foil; cut fudge into $1-\mathrm{in}$. squares. Store between layers of waxed paper in an airtight container.

## CLAYBANK MASTER GARDENERS

Greetings gardeners \& growers from Lower Alabama (LA),
**Did our chilly
November nights send you scurrying for sheets or towels to cover your tender plants to protect them from frost damage? Double layers of sheets are best, or a thick layer of pine or leaf mulch, or even an overturned larger pot. At our November Claybank Master Gardener meeting we exchanged ideas for frost protection, and some of the above were recommended. I have filled gallon jugs with hot water to set under the covers next to the most tender plants for seriously freezing weather, with good results. Plastic covers are not recommended unless they are resting on something to keep them from touching the leaves, because they can cause frost burn on the leaves they touch. Remove covers after the sun comes up so the plants can get air and sun. A good watering before the freeze will also give the plants a better chance to survive.
**Taking the Master Gardener class taught me way more than I ever expected, and it was so much fun meeting other folks in the area with interests and experiences that continue to educate me. Starting February 3, 2022 the course is being offered both in person at the Houston County Extension Office and online through Zoom. See details on the poster with this column. **You can still plant seeds for December if the soil temperature is at $35^{\circ}$ for these plants: lettuce, onions, parsnip, and spinach. At $40^{\circ}$ you can plant beets, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, Swiss chard, parsley, radishes, and turnips. **Claybank Master Gardeners meet at 11 AM the second Wednesday of each month at Hoppergrass Restaurant, 129 S. East Avenue in Ozark. You can buy lunch if you wish, feel free to come join us. We welcome new faces!
