





SPEAK OUT

Dear "Speak Out,"

This week we continue our study of beautiful Livingston County during its 200th year bicentennial.

Last week we finished the first two of the towns which were added after our beautiful county was established. This week we study the next two towns.

The Town of Nunda is located at the southwest border of the county and contains a village also called Nunda. It is pronounced "none-day". Nunda welcomes visitors with signs stating "Welcome to Nunda, a Nice Place to Live."

The name is derived from Nunda-wa-ono, the name given to it by a group of the Seneca people who once lived in the hills and valleys along the Genesee River and Keshequa Creek within the present-day town. In the Seneca language, "Nunda-wa-ono" relates to hills, and a popular translation is "Where the valley meets the hills".

In 1790, two small Seneca villages could be found opposite each other on the Chautauqua Hollow Trail which became State Street. Nunda was first settled around 1806 what is now near the village of Nunda. The town was formed in 1808 from the Town of Angelica, in Allegany County, before the creation of Livingston County.

In 1827, part of Nunda was used to form the new Town of Portage. Originally called "Nunda Valley", the name was shortened to "Nunda" by Charles H. Carroll in 1824. The Village of Nunda was incorporated as "Nunda Valley" and later "Nunda" in 1839.

On March 11, 2008, the Town of Nunda celebrated its bicentennial. In 1808, only three pioneer families lived in what is now Nunda. By 1830 the population had increased to 1,291, and by 1840 there were 2,636 residents. The population peaked at nearly 4,000 in the 1840s when the Genesee Valley Canal was built, which ran through the town until 1878. The population had fallen to less than 3,000 by the early 1880s.

The town is in the Keshequa Central School District which includes Dalton Elementary School and the Nunda Middle School/High School. The word Keshequa is of Seneca origin and means "Stick in the Mud".

Chester B. Bowen was a United States Army soldier and Medal of Honor recipient. Helen Hunt Jackson was an author. Gustavus A. Palmer was a Colonel in the Patriot War.

The Town of Portage is located in the southwest corner of our county and is located at the southern end of Letchworth State Park. The name of the town stems from the need to portage, or carry, canoes around the falls of the Genesee River. The ancestral home of the Haudenosaunee, an Iroquois tribe called the "People of the Longhouse" lived here.

European American settlers arrived in the Portage area by the early 1800s. Portage was formed from part of the Town of Nunda in 1827. The western border of the town is the Genesee River and the Genesee River Gorge.

The west town line is the border of Wyoming County, and the south town line is the border of Allegany County. New York State Route 436 is an east-west highway across the town, that intersects New York State Route 70 west of the community of Oakland.

Lord willing, we will conclude our study next week with the remaining Town of Ossian. I would truly enjoy any comments or memories you may have of our county's history. Ron Powell

Winter Safety for Children

Winter is almost here and that means there will be freezing temperatures, snowstorms, icy roads, and slippery sidewalks. The winter weather comes with a variety of health and safety hazards. Protect your children during the winter months. Follow the tips below to keep your children safe from injury or illness:

1. Layer up! Bitter cold and snow can cause frostbite. Dress your child in several layers, and make sure their head, neck and hands are covered. Dress babies and young children in one more layer than an adult would wear.

2. Play it safe. Even when roads are closed to traffic, it's not safe to play or sled in the street. Visibility may be limited due to snow banks and ice on the roads.

3. Check in on warmth. Before kids head outside, tell them to come inside if they get wet or if they're cold. Then keep watching them and checking in. They may want to continue playing outside even if they are wet or cold.

4. Use sunscreen. Children and adults can still get sunburned in the winter. Sun can reflect off the snow, so apply sunscreen to exposed areas.

5. Use caution around fires. Wood-burning stoves, fireplaces and outdoor fire-pits are cozy but can present danger – especially to small children. Use caution and put up protective gates when possible. If you've lost power or heat and are alternative heating methods like kerosene or electric heaters, be sure smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors are working.

6. Get trained and equipped. Children should wear helmets when snowboarding, skiing, sledding or playing ice hockey. And to avoid injuries, teach children how to do these activities safely.

7. Prevent nosebleeds. If your child suffers from minor winter nosebleeds, use a cold-air humidifier in their room. Saline nose drops may keep their nose moist.

8. Keep them hydrated. In drier winter air kids lose more water through their breath. Offer plenty of water, and try giving them warm drinks and soup for extra appeal.

9. Watch for danger signs. Signs of frostbite are pale, grey or blistered skin on the fingers, ears, nose, and toes. If you think your child has frostbite bring the child indoors and put the affected area in warm (not hot) water. Signs of hypothermia are shivering, slurred speech, and unusual clumsiness. If you think your child has hypothermia call 9-1-1 immediately. Sources: Save the Children, American Academy of Pediatrics, University of Michigan
